My grandfather, Anton Pederson, and his wife Abilena Hornborstad and their two children Peder age 12 and Christine age 7 left Norway on the steamship "Norway" from Bergen to America on May 4, 1972. They entered this country at Port Huron by way of the St. Lawrence River.

Another family from the same area in Norway was on the same chip. Benson was their common destination. They took up their homesteads in the same section of the township which was to be known as Torning. It was too late in the year to plant a crop, but the two families had brought seed potatoes with them, which they planted and harvested.

Anton's first wife died in 1876. In 1877 he married Brita Olsdotter Navelsaker (who had changed her name to Brita Olson when she came to this country in 1870). Brita had lived in the neighboring community of Hornindal in Norway.

Brita was the grandmother of the present owner. Brita bore five children, two of whom survived, Lena and Anna. Anna was my mother.

Anton (aka Anthon) and Brita and all of their children were active members of their community. At one time, about 1905, a crowd of a thousand people attended a community gathering at their home. There was a baseball game between the Benson and DeGraff teams, the Benson band played and concession stands were set up in "the Pederson Grove". This information is verified by the historical notes in the Swift County Monitor News.

The township of Torning was named for a place in Norway called Tonning. The name was mistakenly entered into the county records as Torning. Since everyone concerned felt that that sounded better anyway, the mistake was allowed to stand, and the name remained Torning. When several of the young folks from the area took up homesteads in Ward County, North Dakota, they named their township Torning for their home township in Swift County, Minnesota.

Three of these grandparents lived in Valresplokile one grandfather, Ole Andreas Rederson, lived in Trondheim They all emigrated to America in the 1860 A and 1870 sand settled in Minnesta Ole a. Rederson Carre to the United states in a sailboat in 1866. The trip took seven weeks After landing Ole stopped a short time in Kentucky Defore storting his westward trip through Niscorain and then settling in primesota. In 1867 he Somesteaded the present farm hear Berson, Minn. on the south shore at Lake moore. Ite first years on this bonestead were not always so pleasant Besides the harsh winters and hotpummers, the also had a few Chippewas to contend with But these few Indiane were fuite friendly with ale andrews. In fact one Indian used to come into ales cobin quite often. Ole also used to be finte hospitable to strangers who stayed over hight in his Cabin. One to be wet down to the lake and ate muskrat with the Indians.

another time the Indians went to town in the morning and came back in the evening and worted to get into ale's Cabin. The Irdians had had some fire water so Ole thought they might set fire to the Cabin. He had no gan, only ar at to defend himself . But all the Indiana dif was to tear up the gooseberry Busles planted year the Cabin, That was the last that Ole sow of these Indians. I he size of Oles log born determined the amount of livestock he oured to He had two open, haved Brown and Spot. four horses and about half a dozen Cows and a few calves and sleep, on some of the Coldest nights they would take some at the young sheep into the cellar of the Cobin Many eveninge the children would play hide and seek in the barn. Most of the land was in woods and grassland,

with little in farmland. But the amount of farmland grew as the grasslands become plowed. The open played a big role in this development. To Ole andreas Rederson and Gurine Svenson, who were married in 1869, eight Children were born, my father was their sixth Child and was born on harch 18, 1883. My father and mother were married on June 12, 1912. They settled on the old homestead which my father then purchased from his brothers and sisters.
