# Albin Stromgren, 93 Jupiter Township's Oldest Citizen, Tells of Early Incidents; Citizen of Kittson 70 Years

Albin Stromgren, 93, Jupiter township's oldest citizen, was interviewed Sunday, January 27th for this special Pen Portrait series. Mr. Stromgren, born (March 11, 1863 in Smalend, Sweden is approaching his 94th birthday with a keen recollection of the pioneer ara of Kittson County. His vivid description of the challenging ear. ly experiences as a new citizen here were distinctly expressed. Mr. Stromgren, the fourth child of a family of six children born to Carl and Kajsa Stromgren, emigrated to America at the age of 23. He arrived in Kittson County in 1887, making his first short stay at the Nils Johnsons. Mrs. Johnson was his sister. This farm in section eight in Jupiter is now operated by Albert Johnson. Mr. Stromgren's first year in this county was spent working on the Two River and Forte farms. Albin was anxious to start his own farming operations so a year later he purchased a quarter section of land in Section 7 in Jupiter from the St. & M. M. Railroad for the modest price of \$460. This was not such a low figure in those days considering the fact that he had to pay 7 percent interest on his investment. Mr. Stromgren told of how the late Bengt Sundberg encouraged him to buy a team of horses which he helped finance through a loan at 10 percent interest. This was the beginning of his long struggle to develop the homestead which has been his home for 70 years.

The first order of business for

young Mr. Stromgren back in 1889 after he acquired the land was to build a house. In his characteristic, articulate manner Albin told of

his first trip northeast of Lake Bronson one cold winter day when he and a friend set out with team and sleigh to find some attraight spruce and tamarack for the construction of the new home. They went far east, approaching the Roeau County line and the International Boundary, Here, Mr. Stromgren says, "we found just the right trees for a log house". As noon approached they were visited by some Canadian Mounties who came to greet them. The heavy load was all the team could handle, but Strongren tells us, "that his horses could really pull" and they made the long trip successfully. This was the years of trial when it meant much to say, " it can be done". There was no other recourse if they were to survive. On June 2, 1894 Mr. Stromgren chose as his wife, Mathilda Dahl the youngest of a family of three children of Carl John and Johanna Dahl. The ceremony was conducted at Stephen.

To this union nine children were born. Namely; Signie, at home; Nancy, who died at the age of 27 in 1923; Albertina, who died in infancy; (Esther), Mrs. Elof Mattson, Kennedy; Carl, Lake Bronson; Gottfried, who died at the age of 14 in 1918; Leonard, Lake Bronson; (Elphie), Mrs. Norman Bogestad, Donaldson and Marvin who now operates the home place. Mr. Stromgren also has 10 grandchildren and great grand child.

His wife died at the age of 86 on January 20, 1955.

Mr. Strongren was confirmed and baptized in the Lutheran faith in Sweden. He also received basic training in the Swedish Army. He is the son of a carpenter and followed this trade in a limited way when his father became ill. His knowledge of building helped him considerably as he built on his new farm.

Mr. Stromgren and his wife were Charter Members of the West Em. maus Lutheran Church. In answering the many questions for this interview Mr. Stromgren seemingly enjoys most to talk about the years way, way back. For example, he told of how the Indians one time threatened an outbreak on his farm where they were camping. Albin, in company with six other Swedes, fearing consequences of possible hostilities sought the help of the county sheriff and they made a trip to Roesau to find out what caused the trouble. Albin states, "the Indians were whooping their war dances and it was proved that they were at odds with members of another tribe in the Roseau area". Through the vigi-lance of Mr. Stromgren and his neighbors, peace was secured.

As this reporter proceeded to interrogate Mr. Stromgren relative to the economic crisis which he has gone through and the years which stand out in his memory, he thought awhile and said; "the third year I farmed the wheat was \$.57 cents per bushel". We kept threshing until the 4th of March the following spring and many farmers never did get their harvest done due to wet weather". We can well imagine what hardship this caused the pioneers who needed every penny in order to make a living. Mr. Stromgren said that he managed to hold on to his farm despite the depressions which caused a crushing economic blow. Thinking along the same line Mr. Stromgren added; "I remember how I used to walk to Hallock for groceries. There was only one store there then and it was operated by a certain Mr. McCullum, a grand country merchant". In discussing the early schools Albin told us that the first classes were held in various homes and later the pupils met in the building now known as the East Emmaus Lutheran Church. School was held for only a few weeks a year and the educational standards were a far cry from the present ones.

Mr. Stromgren recalls that much of the early pioneer's success was attributed to the close association with neighbors. Albin mentioned a few of his pioneer neighbors with whom he had much in com-

mon. They were; Ole Johnson, Nils Johnson, C. A. Johannson, H. P. Hemmingson, Pete and Gustaf Concarson. When it came to sharing in the fall work the neighbors pitched in to help each other. This interdependence was what built the social structure and economic stability of the pioneer community.

Albin Stromgren thinks that people now days are too much in a hurry and for that reason often receive so little happiness out of life. He feels that the real challenge to youth today is a self-help program where the value of money, time and energy is placed into a proper relationship. Albin is a deeply religious man. He stated in his final remarks in this interview; "the hope of the world is not in the philosophy of political parties but through faith in God".

Albin, now 93 years of age, is very comfortable with his son Marvin and family. He has suffered of late with rheumatism, weak vision and an arm injury causing him much pain. He is not known to complain, though he would like to see spring soon so that he may take his jaunt around the farm and then visit with some of his closest neighbors, a favorite passtime. While he has not been in public service, he has always worked for the betterment of his commun. concentrating his main interest in breaking the land on his fine farm, constructing modern buildings and providing the best possible living for his family.

As we interview these pioneers we are reminded of how little this generation knows about economic

# A GRANDCHILD REMEMBERS

The yellow buttercups would soon begin to bloom in this far north land where Adalbjorg and Gudjon were packing their belongings in a small trunk, in preparation for their journey to a new land, America! The farm was sold and all the family were eager to depart - oh there would be lots of hard work, but they were used to that - and it's true, they would miss the snow-capped mountains that had always looked down upon them here at Grundarhol, but they knew that they could not forget their homeland, this country where love of family mattered more than anything else. The grass would soon be getting green in the sheep pasture, and the hay would be coming up, but they would be farmers in the new land, too. They would miss the warm bright evenings in July, but the summer sun is warm in far away Minnesota; and they would find there, good soil, free fram hummocks that made farming so very difficult here in Iceland.

Sailing from Husavik in a small ship and then to Great Britain, the travelers had a taste of the long sea voyage to follow. It was hard to accept how crowded they were in the cramped steerage quarters which brought them and countless thousands of others from over-crowded and poverty-stricken Europe to the generous shores of America. Our special family was destined to take part in one of the greatest political, social, and economic phenomena of recorded history - the massive movement of Europe's emigrants to the land of the free, the United States. The repressive colonialism of the Danish government and the adverse climatic conditions, as well as the ever present battle with disease, made the people of the little island of Iceland ready for change.

Straight and tall with her dark hair parted in the middle and drawn back, Adalbjorg Jonsdottir took charge of her family. while her handsome husband with the eager and deft movements he was to demonstrate throughout his life was always by her side. These taw had a working arrangement - they understood one another; married just one year before, they had a baby to bring on the journey, as well as a small son by her first marriage. Adalbjorg was already displaying the strength of character which proved to be the cornerstone of the new American family. Her first marriage at twenty had been to a man years her senior and she was a good stepmother to the three sons and one daughter of that first husband after his death. But now, upon the ocean, that June of 1879, Adalbjorg would gaze across the endless expanse of water toward an uncertain horizon, and recall all the long winter nights when she used to read to her family as they performed their many tasks. And in the distant future. her grandchildren would have as one of their most vivid memories of their Grandmother, the sound of her strong rhythmical voice, reading aloud the Icelandic papers to Grandpa. can she continue, never even stopping to breathe?" they would ask their young Mother, as they listened to this white-haired

lady sitting in the dining room, her resonant tones sharing the news of the day with her attentive husband. The words sounded strange to the children, and it would be a few years before they were to realize that they indeed were listening to the Old Norse, the classic speech of the mighty Sagas, and more years yet, perhaps, before they could fully comprehend that noted scholars sought with reverence to study this language and its literature, so perfectly preserved for a thousand years in the tiny island, isolated there in the far North, hovering just under the Arctic Circle. But now, sitting in his rocker, Grandpa quietly listened, but he could not indulge too long in idleness - there was work to do, and he soon summoned his now middle-aged sons to transform the tamed sod into yet another bountiful harvest. But wait, we are back in June of 1879, and the Isfelds are young - and they are beautiful - and they are full of hope!

The two weeks on the ocean were tedious and the party from Thingeyjarsyla were relieved when the ship took anchor in the harbor of Quebec. Had they not been so busy with amenities that greeted newcomers to the North American continent, they would have been wistful for just a mement, reflecting on the clear running streams and the blue sky above the treeless landscape, now left behind, and that they would possess only in memory the rest of their lives - when you are builders in a new country you do not go back to Iceland - there is too much to do here - you must leave the old behind - this is your home now. If only they could have spanned a hundred years and seen that their lives of loving concern and unselfish toil afforded their progeny the leisure to explore luxuriously as well as remember what has gone on before.

But here in 1879, the railroad, that irrepressible link between the "Old Country" and the endless expanse of prairie in the midlands of America, carried our party of Icelanders first to Winona, where they were met by agent, Jack Frost, and then on to Minneota, the center of a budding Icelandic community. Adalbjorg and the other ladies in their sweeping full skirts and little black skull caps, stepped out onto the ground of southwestern Minnesota, an area they would rarely leave again. One possibility for land purchase was Lincoln County, and here the Isfeld family settled on Grund, short for Grundarhol, Gudjon's family home. It was too late to plant crops that first season, and the Isfelds, together with three other families, lived in the "old" house, which had been hastily built, with one corner of privacy for each family. Gudjon worked for more established farmers at very low pay, so he could earn the price of his own land. It would have been far easier if homesteads had been still available, but in the seventeen years since that significant legislation became law, the acres were all claimed. Latecomers must find other ways to get a start long days of arduous work for others, to help them harvest their corn, before one could plant something for yourself and your loved ones.

The freezing blasts of winter storms greeted our newly arrived residents - they used large stalks of "slough-hay" twisted together for fuel; and the young men, home at last

after a strenuous workday must wearily take turns staying awake to keep the fire from going out - it was a hard time! Then spring came and the first seeds were planted, the homes for the other families secured, and the intensity of establishing a new life in this, an new land, had begun in earnest. The first harvest was small actually, but it was to be followed in the years ahead with huge monuments of grain, enough to fill silos and granaries - and to feed American soldiers in two World Wars. The "bread basket of America" it came to be called, as the pioneer families like the Isfelds vigorously turned the tall grass prairie into vast fields laden with lifegiving crops. There are aging matrons today who remember the exhilaration of "threshing time" on the farm, their grandmother patiently working long hours in the kitchen, and their grandfather, cut off somewhat by his blindness, doing an extra share of the milking on those extra busy days. And what 'lieutenants' they had in those days - John running the rig, Arne in charge of the operations in the field, Strengrim over from his place to drive a team and Auntie Rose, assisted by Margaret and Ina, turning out meals and lunches by the bushel basket full. Even the late summer sun had fallen by the time Grandma had finished washing the separator - five a.m. would soon be here - the night was short.

But now we are talking about years earlier, and how the folks at Grund suffered in the winter of 1880-81, one of the worst seasons North America ever experienced. The tales of struggle and heroism are legends today, especially in the farm states and the cattle country of the Far West - food was short, the trains could not get through, sickness was everywhere, many were ruined financially, and the colossal drifts produced a raging spring thaw - but the Isfelds prevailed! They joined other settlers in the formation of a library (does anyone even now read more than Icelanders?), and the long trips to Granite and Redwood Falls to have the mills grind the wheat into flour, became part of prairie life.

In all, nine children were born to Adalbjorg and Gudjon in the first two decades on the farm in Lincoln County, but only five survived. Living was hard in those days, but you must rejoice in three strong sons and two warm-hearted daughters. A silent reminder of the sacrifices one must endure can be found in the graveyard by their own little white Church - it had been a sign of progress, however, when the initial meeting house was replaced with a real Church - God was never forgotten! In 1904 the house was expanded, and things were happening at Grund, exciting things - the farm was prospering, the children were a true blessing, and the Isfeld home was the center of hospitality for the Icelandic community, now burgeoning with many native Americans in their midst. How much the early pastors of the church loved to spend a Sunday in the country! How pretty the young ladies looked in their long batiste dresses with the fine tucking! How great it was for the boys to demonstrate the new automobile! Yes, there was

no doubt about it - Lincoln County, State of Minnesota, United States of America, was a good place to be!

Then the teens brought lots of changes. Margaret graduated from Minneota High School in 1915, and in 1916 we have the first wedding when Stengrim and Ina were married on September twentieth. That same year also, the "big house" was built - all the more fun to visit at the Isfelds, but, too, all the more reason to work hard, to keep on building - thus was the pattern of life in the new American family, now so firmly established. In 1917 the first grandchild was born to Ina and Stengrim, and on January 1, 1918, Margaret and Chris and John and Bertha were married in the bay window of the majestic new house. Then, it was wartime and Christ was in uniform and absent when Margaret gave birth to her first child, a daughter, upstairs in Grandpa's room, just eleven days after Bertha's and John's little son had arrived. Adalbjorg looked with loving pride upon all these new-generation additions to the family - her outstretched arms and reassuring eyes are still remembered by her grandchildren as they recall how often they ran to greet her in their childhood.

And now with the War over, and Chris back home, it looked as if things were once again on course - Stengrim and Ina had a second daughter in the year 1919 - but then came a time marred with sadness - John's young wife was stricken with the dreaded influenza which swept unchecked from home to home across the nation, and she did not have the strength to withstand its savage attack. It was the Mother who stepped forward to comfort her grieving son, and it was she, Amma, who made his tiny son "her own special boy" all the rest of her life!

And the days went on - busy ones, productive ones, challenging ones. There was deep concern when Gudjon's failing eyesight worsened, but the great doctors at the Mayo Clinic hopefully could do something, and the new electric lights were a sight to behold. How well Willard and the girls remember when the sleek blue car which had taken John, Grandpa, Rose and Margaret to Minneapolis to see another eye specialist drove back home into the driveway. It was impossible to understand why Grandpa could not be better and that soon he would be blind. Still, these were such happy years for the grandchildren. Grandma and Auntie Rose were so generous about letting us run up and down the two big staircases, and what great Christmas dinners they prepared! Uncle Arne was so helpful when the "big kids" hid from the little girls; and it was he who lifted us up so we too could play in the huge hay mow in the giant red barn. And dearest Grandpa, who but he could first cut such even pieces of firewood, and then stack them in such a symmetrical tower? And wasn't the "old house" a wonderful place, with the romance of the old days still there what could we know of the heartache and the tenuous hold on life that had been present in this little dwelling that first long ago winter?

It was hard to keep your pink and white striped knee socks up, in the summer of 1928, and to sit still while the minister droned on, as you impatiently waited for the home-made ice cream and cake which would be served later on. But what a grand occasion that was - the Fiftieth Wedding Anniversary of Adalbjorg and Gudjon, celebrated here at Grund - what neighbors could stay away, from Canada, even, the well-wishers came! Forty-nine of those fifty years these two had spent on this very site, the home place - who more can lay claim to the title "Pioneer"?

Times were hard on the farm in the early depression years, but another landmark would soon be reached - on February 18, 1933, Grandmother celebrated her eightieth birthday, a warm and friendly gathering of family and friends at what turned out to be a loving farewell to this, their precious Mother, who died unexpectedly a week later. What was it like for Grandpa to stand there in the frozen ground by the Church, alone for the first time after such a long journey through life always shared with this strong and beautiful woman, now forever gone? But Grandpa was not a quitter, and then even more alone with the death of Rose the following October, still he kept on doing his own special chores, keeping track of each field and what was planted thereon.

The grandchildren were growing up now, were getting married and starting families of their own. Time was running out - Gudjon joined his wife in death December 21, 1943. How strange it was not to have gentle Grandpa with his curly beard and warm embrace, there to greet you when you visited the farm.

It takes courage to stand erect when it would be easier to bend with the cares of the day. It demands strength to keep on when your heart is breaking from the anguish of grief. Most of all, it shows the POWER OF LOVE when you lead a new family in a new land into a WONDERFUL FUTURE! That is the noble legacy we have inherited from our beloved Grandparents!



HOME..CHURCH..SCHOOL were the perimeters of the lives of the C. L. Peterson family who came to Martin County in 1885 from Pecatonica, Illinois. Claus had come from Västergötland, Sweden, in 1868 at the age of 20, the first of his family to emigrate, bringing the others (even the old folks) in succeeding years. His wife, Ida Johnson, to whom he was married April 4, 1875, in Pecatonica, had come with her parents when was two years old from Östergötland, Sweden, in 1856.

Ida began teaching at age 17 in Winnebago County, Illinois, in 1871. She was to continue teaching in Minnesota's rural schools 1886-1899.

It may have been an advertisement in the Pecatonica News in late 1884 that pushed Claus and Ida toward Minnesota: "Farming Lands in the corn belt of Southern Minnesota! — Join one of the cheap excursions from Pecatonica." Claus' brothers were dying — TB or pneumonia — and Ida thought Minnesota fresh air would be more healthful; also \$1.25 an acre was heard to be the price of land there.

They left Pecatonica May 1, 1885. By October, the Fairmont <u>Sentinel</u> reported that "Mr. C. L. Peterson has opened a first class grocery store in Mr. Ward's building on Main Street, recently vacated by Mrs. Blanchard." Choice family groceries, a full line of gloves and mittens were sold.

The Petersons had brought their four young children — Elmer, Elna, Ben, Amy — with them. In Fairmont a pair of twins was born, but died in a few months. They had moved to Lake Fremont Township, housed temporarily a mile east of the land they had bought October 19, 1886:  $F_2^{\frac{1}{2}}$  of NW  $\frac{1}{4}$  and SW  $\frac{1}{4}$  of NE  $\frac{1}{4}$ , Section 11, Township 101, Range 33. The even numbered sections, viz 2, 4, 6 were homesteaded in the 1870's, homesteader paying \$1.25 per acre; and the odd numbered sections were given to the Southern Minnesota Railroad Company by the State of Minnesota as inducement to build a railroad.

That first winter in Lake Fremont Township (1886-7) reads like the storybook pioneer sags in the letters exchanged by Ida, teaching school in the building at the end of the lane (which was to be when their own home was built) and caring for

her four little ones; with Claus, working at Atwater. There was sub-zero cold with bitter winds and blizzards which necessitated hanging their rugs in front of windows and doors. Coal supplies and flour, coffee, cornmeal diminished frighteningly. Wolf tracks in the snow around the house in the morning explained the awesome howling in the night (perhaps the attraction was the fresh pig, cost \$10., hacked to pieces with dullknives on the kitchen table). Elmer's worn boots tied on with rags left their marks as snow was pushed away to find the well to get a little water.

School was often closed that winter, the teacher with frozen limbs, no coal to heat the place, sometimes no schoolbooks. Church services, too, failed when parishioners couldn't survive roads and stormy weather. The Petersons had joined the Blooming Prairie congregation (Lutheran Church, begun in 1871) and were active members all their lives. Ida wrote in 1903 the <u>History of the Women's Twenty-five Cents Society</u>, the group that was organized to gather funds for a church in the future, and for benevolences. That church became Immanuel Lutheran Church in Dunnell, where generations of Petersons have belonged. Ida was an early part of the turns from church tradition which permitted women to sit with their husbands at services and the English language used regularly.

Second generation Petersons found their own ways to live out the family priorities of stewardship of the land and love of gardening, contributing to the quality of life which they found so good in Martin County, and the patriotism due their native land.

The oldest son, Elmer, who had been a teacher, got the north half of his Dad's acreage in Jay township and started farming and family in that location. Youngest son Linus bought the home farm when his parents retired to Dunnell. Here the gracious lawn served as the site, as many county farms did, for 4th of July celebrations (with fireworks), family picnics, and was a showplace of flower and vegetable gardens, landscaping and orchard. Linus was on the Martin County fair board 14 years, and served with the Rural Credit Bureau.

Ben was graduated from Gustavus Adolphus College in 1909 and served as teacher and administrator in Minnesota and North Dakota schools for a long career .

Elna received a certificate from the Normal Department of Gustavus Adolphus College in 1900 and taught in Martin County rural schools and in the Immanuel Lutheran Sunday School for forty years.

Amy also attended academy at Gustavus Adolphus College for training in music. She married Albin Linder and with him farmed the Andrew Linder homestead south of Dunnell.

It was Laura, the youngest child, who chronicled with everyday occurrences the history of homes, farms, schools and community, and churches in Lake Fremont. She had been trained at Gustavus Adolphus College and Mankato Teachers College for teaching 1913-52. During this time she was on the Dunnell school board for 20 years, president and program chairman for Sherburn and Dunnell PTAs, many years on the state PTA board. For 35 years she reported Dunnell news for the Fairmont Sentinel, Sherburn Advance-Standard, and Estherville, Ia., Daily News. Her intense interest in pioneer stories resulted in a number of histories of the PTA and schools in Dunnell on the occasion of the move to Sherburn; Immanuel Lutheran Church histories (where she was confirmed in Swedish); Dunnell Women's Study Club history, as a charter member and Martin County Jewel (35th anniversary).

Since the death of Linus in 1968, the C. L. Peterson farm has been operated by his nephew E. Keith Swanson of LaCrosse, Wis., and niece Marian Swanson Johnson, St. Peter, Minnesota, both Gustavus Adolphus College graduates in the family tradition. The railroad right-of-way sold by Grandpa Claus brought in the \$300. with which he built the barn the same year in 1899. Some 80 years later, the barn was razed and the railroad right-of-way was sold back — in the same year — to the granddaughter and grandson of Ida and Claus, and the farm is again one contiguous piece. And the railroad property was restored to the original contours of the prairie by a great-grandson of Ida and Claus, Joe Eiden, grandson of Elmer.

This farm currently producing corn and soybeans has never known a crop failure. Overlooking the land as it must have appeared when Claus and Ida Peterson first saw it in 1885-6, now without the farmstead buildings, members of this family lie at rest in Lake Fremont Cemetery:

#### THE "PETERS" FAMILY OF MARTIN COUNTY

This "PETERS" family of Martin County, Jay Rownship, started from Germany in latter part of the 1800's. There are other "PETERS" families in Martin County but none are related that we know of, the name Peters was common in parts of Germany.

Carl Peters and his brother Henry came to this country to help rebuild Chicago after the Great Fire of 1871, carpenters were in demand. Their brother Adolph came later, he had jumped ship to leave to leave Germany but was allowed

to go to Chicago rather than transport him back.

In 1886 Carl bought land in Jay Township Section 21 and moved here in 1888. Two houses were built that year and eventually three houses stood on the northwest three 80's of section 21.3%\*\*töwnship According to Mabel Karnatz, Henry's grandaughter, the lumber was hauled from a sawmill in Jackson. The brothers built barns and other buildings in the neighborhood including Jay Center School District 113, now used as Jay town hall.

Carl brought his bride from Chicago and they reared four children on this farm, Albert, Clara (Carlson), Hilda (Ostgaard), and Paul. My father Paul, stayed on the original farm which came to be known as "Peters Evergreen Nursery". The first seedlings were planted here about 1929 and the nursery moved to Sherburn in 1946. Many thousands of Spruce and Pine and Honeysuckle and ornamental trees and shrubs are growing in Martin county that originated from this farm in Jay township.

Paul married Martha Becker and to them were born

Willard, Jewel (VonRuden), and Laurel (Hughart).

Willard married Jean Greethurst and to us were born Terrie(Hlavac), Nancy(Smith), Douglas and Lori. My grandmothers father, Carl Stutzriem, also lived

My grandmothers father, Carl Stutzriem, also lived on this farm part of his life. He and my grandfather dug in by hand many hundreds of feet of tile to drain land in Section 20 and 21, these tile are still functioning. Carl was a sheepherder in Germany but when the landlord thought a dumb sheepherdersopinion asn't worth much he packed up his family and moved to America, settling in northern Ohio.

Many more stories could be written about the Peters family but I'm surethe same stories could be told about other families and how they got here too. It seems that history shows us that people move away from turbulent or unsettled conditions created by political means. My ancestors left Germany for that reason, came west to Chicago, when the politics got hot they moved west again. Here it is 1988 and politics are still warm but there is no new west to move to now.

I still live on the farm my grandfather bought and in the house he built. Many changes have been made on this piece of prairie and I'm sure many more will be made in the next

hundred years but the land will still be here.





Grandpa Louis Becker and Grandma Mary Becker bought this 160 acre farm on October 23, 1888 from W.J. Hansen of Chicago, IL.

Grandma Becker had asthma and a heart condition and died in 1931.

Grandpa Becker lived in this house until the time of his death in September of 1941. He fell on the farm, injuring his hip, and died about 10 days later.

Grandpa and Grandma's first child, Adeline, died at the age of 3 years.

Their next child, a boy, born in 1890, was named Ferdinand Louis. He married Caroline in 1916 and lived about 3 miles north of here. They had 3 children, Edith, Donald and Elayne.

In 1892 they had another boy, Albert. He farmed 2 miles north of here. He had 2 sons, Glen and Larry. Albert moved up north to live close to his son, Larry. He had a stroke and then resided in the rest home at Sandstone, MN where he died in 1965.

Walter was born in April of 1894. Walter served in World War I in France and Germany. He was married to Florence O'Sell in 1923. They took over this farm in 1939. They had 7 children-Arlyne, Dwayne, Joyce, Bev, Gordon, Sharon and Gloria. Gloria died at the age of 17. Walter had a series of strokes and after Florence had cared for him for 4 years, he was admitted to Jackson Rest Home where he died on Veteran's Day, Noy. 11, 1980. Slorence broke her him for A 1986, and died 2 weeks later on Dec 23 1986

The next child of Louis and Mary Becker was a baby girl named Francie. She was born in 1896. She married Ernest Bergmeier in 1917 and they farmed on the old Bergmeier farm near Alpha. They had 6 children, Lawrence, Evelyn, Orville, Raymond, Ernest Jr. and Shirley. Evelyn died as a teenager. Francie died of a heart attack in 1960.

Next was a sister for Francie, Martha. She was born August 30, 1899. She married Paul Peters in June, 1922 and lived around the corner from here on the original Peters estate. They had 3 children, Willard, Jewel and Laurel. Paul and Martha retired from farming and Paul continued his nursery business in Sherburn, Martha died of cancer in 1961.

Their last child, Arthur, was born in 1901. He farmed with his father and brother Albert. He never married. He died at the age of 41 years in May of 1943.

Ronald and Beverly (Becker) Schafer, daughter of Walter, bought the farm in 1968 and continue to operate it at the present time. They have 4 daughters fei living in munich - Deri in political drugon Dara & Lisa living in upls.

John C. Spencer was born in Beaver Dam, Wisconsin on December 20, 1850. As a small child, he moved to Rochester, Minnesota with his parents. He came to Fairmont in 1878 and filed a tree claim which is now part of the present farm. In 1883 he married Catherine Agnes Henneway McCann who at the age of 15 had come to the United States from Newry, Ireland. With a brother, she came to Madison, Wisconsin and then to Winona, Minnesota. She later accompanied a cousin to Fairmont where she married John C. Spencer. It was the first marriage in the Catholic Church in the City of Fairmont - April 2, 1883. In 1884 they purchased more land in Section 1 of Rolling Green Township where Mr. Spencer had filed the tree claim. The land was passed on to their children who lived on the farm. These children were John T., Margaret Anne & Michael Joseph. Michael lived the longest and in 1955 upon his death it was passed on to a nephew & his wife, James Bernard Spencer & Blossom. They farmed and lived there from 1948 to November, 1982. They still own the land except for the building site which is now owned by their son & his wife, Charles & Jackie Spencer, and their three sons, Kevin, James and Joseph. Charles now farms the land. This farm is west of the City of Fairmont on the west side of the Martin County Fairgrounds. The young boys make the 5th generation of Spencers to live on this land.



Three brothers, William, Carl and August emigrated from Pomerania Germany to New York State. Earning some money there they were able to continue to Algona Iowa as far as the railroad went in 1869.

Ey ox team they came to this farm on the north shore of what was called Lake Fremont. Carl Ziemer lived in a sod house on a side hill with the lake down below. Mrs. Ziemer often saw smoke by the lake from campfires of Indians she thought and she would go and hide in the barn as Indians always went to the house for food. Mrs. Ziemer was often left all alone on the prairie while her husband tried to earn some cash in Winnebago or Algona. All the fuel was hauled from Spirit Lake by oxen and often times Mrs. Ziemer driving saying Gee and Haw to make the oxen stop and go. The grasshopper menace was a horrible time. Mrs. Ziemer relates it got very dark outside and she suspected a storm coming so hurried to get a pail of water in, she had to cover the pail with her apron to keep the grasshoppers out of the water, the grasshoppers ate everything, crops, garden and even wood from the windowsills. As in all other pioneer families they made ropes out of slough grass for fuel.

#### THE HARVEY DOUGHERTY'S

Mr. and Mrs. Thomas O'Doughertay and their family of seven children, five sons and two daughters and his brother John, a widower with six children, four boys and two girls constituted an overwhelming majority of the population of Harvey township in the year 1856 when they staked their claims to lands in sections 22 and 15.

The heads of these families, Thomas and John, were born in Dunneghall, Ireland. They came to America in 1840. They were at Jolliet, Illinois when hearing of the fertile woodland and prairie bordering the Crow River in Minnesota they took to

the somewhat vaguely blazed trail to seek a new home in the unbroken wilderness. Their caravan in addition to the members of the families consisted of one team of horses, seven yoke of oxen, twenty-two cows and a small flock of poultry. They were six weeks in making their journey, when fording the C.ow River at or near Kingston, they reached the land of their dreams and proceeded to Forest City where they found surveyors engaged in platting the townsite. They arrived July 14, 1856 and halted for a brief period to b'd welcome to the arrival of Sarah Jane Dougherty, who was born in one of the covered wagons. The group of settlers at Forest City joined with the Doughertys in congratulating the proud parents on her arrival and the owners of the townsite deeded a lot in the embryo city to the little maiden. Soon after this im-

portant episode in Meeker County history the Doughertys staked their claims to what became the future and permanent home of Thomas and John O'Doughertay (brothers) and their families of children.

#### THOMAS O'DOUGHERTAY

O'DOUGHERTAY, THOMAS, was born in Dunneghall, Ireland in 1816. He emigrated to America in 1840. Catherine Ward a native of the same country was a passenger on the same vessel and a friendship was formed that resulted in their marriage one year later. Mr. O'Doughertay was a tailor by trade and soon found employment in New York City and later in Syracuse, New York. In 1856 he was residing in Joliet, Illinois at which time he was the father of seven children. They staked their claim to the N½ of the NE¼ of section 22, Harvey town in the summer of 1856 and building a shelter house of prairie sod began the labor of developing their wilderness home. Their two boys, aged 12 and 14 and the mother were very helpful in the hard labor that followed but they made rapid progress and in 1862 they were quartered in a log house and had constructed crude but comfortable shelter buildings for their stock and poultry. They had seemingly overcome their greatest difficulties and were on the

highway leading to a greater degree of competency. Hopes of a better future were destroyed when in August 1862 the Indian outbreak occurred and they were forced to abandon their home and seek safety in the Stockade at Forest City. They had succeeded in driving two cows to Forest City the day following the housing of the wife and children in the stockade. While engaged in the effort they were making to drive their stock to a point of refuge they were closely pursued by a band of Indians, the herd of cattle was scattered and Mr. Dougherty and his son John had a narrow escape from capture and probable death by the savages.

They spent the winter of 1862 in a rented shack in Stearns County and returned to their home farm in the spring to find their home partially wrecked, their shelters for stock destroyed by fire and their herd of cattle killed or stolen.

With undaunted spirit and courage Thomas O'Doughertay and family faced and overcame these disasters and in the years that followed increased their land holdings by homesteading 160 acres of land in section 22. The log house had given place to a comfortable frame dwelling and the family enjoyed many of the luxuries of life.

Mr. O'Doughertay was recognized as a kindly hearted and generous man and was fam liarly known in his circle of acquaintance as "Uncle Tommy" and his kindly advice and words of cheer gave wholesome aid to many a desponding neighbor and friends. His good wife was equally beloved and she was one of those kind motherly women who rejoiced with the success and sympathized with the sorrows of all her neighbo s and the memory of her many acts of kindness continue to dwell in the minds of those whose parents she befriended. Their union was blessed with nine children all of whom lived to maturity except Edward who died at eleven years of age. The children in order of birth are John, James B., Mary Ann, Thomas W. Domnick, Catherine, Patrick Henry, and Sarah Jane.

Thomas O'Doughertay died February 8, 1890. Mrs. Catherine Ward-O'Doughertay died December 14, 1900 and was born August 29, 1820.

There are seventeen living descendants of the territorial pioneers, Mr. and Mrs. Thomas O'Doughertay.

DOUGHERTY, SARAH JANE (daughter of Thomas and Catherine Ward-O'Doughertay) was born in a covered wagon in the townsite of Forest City, July 15, 1856. She married, October 7, 1896, John Joseph Dougherty (no relation). This union proved one

of true happiness giving the lie to the old adage,—"Change your name and not your letter you change for worse instead of better."

John Joseph Dougherty was born in Ireland February 6, 1858. He came to America in 1888 and for forty-three years was engaged in railroad work, serving as a section foreman and later as a caretaker of the Great Northern Station in Minneapolis. He retired on a pension February 6, 1929 and died February 6, 1938.

Mr. and Mrs. Dougherty became the parents of Thomas W. Dougherty, born in Litchfield, Minnesota, November 25, 1877. He graduated from the law department of the University of Minnesota and became a practicing attorney in Wisconsin and later in Dakota. In 1936, he located in Montevideo, Minnesota where he is connected with the Ford Automobile Agency and gives loving and tender care to his aged mother with whom he shares an attractive bungalow home.



Sarah Jane Dougherty

Mrs. Sarah Jane Dougherty is a frail and somewhat delicate lady of refinement. She retains all her faculties and enjoys recounting the experiences of her long and useful life. The writer will long remember his visit to her attractive home and the courtesies extended by mother and son.

John Dougherty (the eldest son of Thomas and Catherine Ward-O'Doughertay) was a lad of 19 years at the time of the Indian outbreak at which time he left St. Paul and found employment on a Mississippi River steam boat (The War Eagle). He later went to Little Rock, Arkansas where he married Ellen McKenzie. He died leaving an infant son, who died in childhood.

James B. married Elizabeth Dowdell. Mary Ann Married Thomas Wheeler and became the mother of ten children, five boys and five girls. Thomas W. married Mary Dowling and became the father of ten children. Domnick married Hannah Finnegan and had two children. Patrick Henry married Catherine Dowling and had two children. Catherine married Hugh Dowling, no children. Sarah Jane.

The John Dougherty (brother of the Thomas family) gradually disposed of their land holdings in Meeker County and the family became somewhat scattered in their places of residence. Of the four sons and two daughters who should be numbered among the earliest residents of Meeker County and the township of Harvey, there are said to be one hundred and fifty living descendants. There are seventeen who reside in Meeker County as follows: Mrs. Mary McAloon and her three children: Rose, John and Mary C.; John Dougherty and his four children: Margaret, Frances, John and Robert; Dennis Dougherty and his seven children:

Dorothy and Marie (twins), Joseph, Frances, Thomas, James and Donald. The pioneer ancestors bore the name O'Doughertay but the present generation has modernized the name and spell it Dougherty.

DOUGHERTY, THOMAS W., son of Thomas and Catherine Ward-Dougherty, was born in Illinois and was only four years of age when his father located in Meeker County. He spent the remaining years of his life in the township of Harvey and became one of its most prosperous citizens, owning at the time of his death nearly a section of Land.

He married, June 1874 Mary Dowling. They were the parents of the following children in order of birth: Edward F .. born August 4, 1875, married, resides in Hollywood California. Thomas I., born no children. December 1, 1877, unmarried. Sarah, born March 30, 1880; died, October 2, 1925. John R., unmarried, born July 1, 1882, and with his brother Thomas successfuly operates the home farm. Catherine, born September 28, 1884; died August 30, 1902. Hugh F. born February 26 .1887; died September 2, 1887
