Ennert H. Emerson was born in Telemarken, Norway, October 7, 1849. His parents were Halvor and Ingebor (Aase) Emerson. He was the eldest of a family of twelve children.

In 1853 the family émigrated to the United States and settled at Janesville, Wisconsin, where his father followed his trade as a cabinet maker until the sping of 1855, when the family moved to Goodhue county, Minnesota, settling in Holden township, which at that time was a wilderness, with very few white settlers and numberous Indians. Here Mr. Emerson grew to manhood, receiving a very meager education and assisting his father in developing his farm lands.

In early manhood, Mr. Emerson, in partnership with Nels Kvernodden engaged in the mercantile business at Cannon Falls, Minnesota, remaining in business there for a number of years.

He was united in marriage to Aase J. Buene at his father's home in holden township on May 27, 1876. The marriage was performed by Rev. A Weenaas, first president of Augsburg Seminary. The same year the newly wedded couple moved onto a 200-acres farm in Ellington township in Dodge County, Minnesota. Mr. Emerson was absent from the farm from August 1882 until October 1883, when he resided on a claim near Columbia, South Dakota, and he also resided at Mantorville, Minnesota for a time while serving as register of deeds of Dodge County.

Mr. Emerson was keenly interested in public affairs and during his life held the following offices of trust and honor: Register of Deeds, Dodge County, from January 1, 1887, until December 31, 1890. Representative in the state legislature from Dodge County during the legislative sessions of 1899 and 1907.

He was one of the organizers of the Kenyon Farmers' Elevator Company, and served as its first president, resigning this position to assist in organizing a Farmers' Elevator at West Concord, of which he likewise became president. He also helped organize the Skyberg and Ellington co-operative creameries.

His interests in life were many and varied. One of his enterprises was the purchase of a tract of land in Wisconsin, from which he cut logs and operated a saw mill for a number of years. Part of this lumber was shipped to his home and used in improvements on some of his farms. His love of nature was clearly expressed by his ambition to beautify every property which he acquired.

He passed away Fæbruary 19, 1931. He was the father of nine children: John, Henry, Isaac, Rudolph, Emma Marie, Mrs. A. B. (Hannah) Kyllo, James Victor, Mrs. Clarence (Mabel) Cain, the first born who passed away in infancy, and a son Joseph, who died at the age of fifteen years.

His father's name was Halvor Ennerson Wraalstad. Wraalstad was the name of the place, ranch or farm where his father was born. Some norwegians use this name and some do not. He used it four times, Baptism, Confirmation, Wedding, and funeral.

His brother was named Torbjorn Ennerson Wraalstad. Torbjorn had one son named Ennert. He of course was a cousin. The mail for the two Ennert's came to the same post office. No way of telling which was which. That was when he changed his name to Emerson.

Another brother of his was named John Ennerson Wraalstad. He was the father of Andrew Volstead. Peter who is a son of John and a brother of Andrew Volstead writes his name Vrolstad. So the last name Volstad, Volstead and Vrolstad are all twists of Wraalstad.

James Victor Emerson married Charlotte Audrey McAlister
August 17, 1922 at Redeemer Lutheran Church, St. Paul, Minnesota.
The farming enterprise was deversified. The Emerson's made a decision in 1956 to change the pin-money flock to a 450-layer unit which Me Emerson enabled them to get as much as 16 cents per dozen above the market price. When Minnesota Farm Management service went over the records it was determined that they were averaging 222 eggs per hen and getting a return of \$3.74 above feed cost on each hen. Charlotte was the instigator in getting this enterprise change. A large Fallow Iowa hatchery contacted her about providing them with hatching eggs if they would provide her with the hybrid checks without cost. They made use of the buildings they had and updated to fit their needs.

Victor sold seed that was certified for a number of years. He was active in the Farm Bureau (head for two years), Sunday School Superintendent, Church Council, and genuinely interested in the community.

Treasurer of District 14 for a number of years,

son-in-law until 4971. Working on the farm assisting his board,

Victor continued to help on the farm after his son-in-law had purchased it. He also helped his son on an ajoining farm. In 1971 he got started working with a man who was tearing down building. The next year he went into business for himself.

By 1981, according to an article in the Village Press, Dodge Center Weekly paper, he had torn down about 40 buildings using, for the most part, just a crow bar and a wrecking bar. He said he starts on the inside of the house ripping out partitions, closets and laths.

"A lot of people take the roof off first, but the reason I do it this way is if there is bad weather, I have a roof over my head."
"I don't have to lay up and wait for good weather." He found silver dollars, one dated 1901, and even a Mayo High School class ring which he returned.

They both were enthusiastic fan of the children while in sport activities and the Minnesota teams, regardless of the sport, found them watching the TV to keep current with the wins and losses. His grandson took him to a Viking practice in Mankato and he had his picture taken with Bud Grant as a birthday present.

Mrs. Emerson was also active in community organizations. She was a member of the West Concord Study Club, the Minnesota Club, taught Sunday School, served several offices in the Church ladies group, the County Extension Board, was selected to WHO'S WHO IN MINNESOTA from Dodge County, along with a concern and love of visitors to the home. The grandchildren held a special place for both of them.

There were five children, Victor Jr. the oldest, deceased, who farmed just around the corner on a farm that was owned previously by a brother of Mr. Emerson. Edgar went to Austin to work in the Hormel plant after a time in farming. Myron chose to work in the Twin Cities. Evonne and husband moved to the farm in 1961 to assist and later to purchase the farm. Mary Jo, deceased, assisted her husband in a machine repair business in West Concord.

Mr. and Mrs. Emerson celebrated their 60th Anniversay with a book of memories that had been written by people of the community that in some way they had touched. Mr. Emerson was having health problems at that time and it was felt this would be easier for him to handle. As you read through the letters, notes, and card you begin to see a picture of the real Mr. & Mrs. Emerson, and the leaders that they were in the community.

May 7 1985. Victor was 88 years old, and Charlotte was 81 years old.

Victor passed away January 11, 1983 at age 88 years, 4 months, ans 12 days. Charlotte passed away May 7, 1985 at age 81 years, 5 months, and 10 days.

ALF MONROE LARSON

Alf Monroe Larson is a retired farmer and landowner in Section 5 of Delafield Township. The Larsons raised Brown Swiss Cattle for showing.

Alf was born May 24, 1907, a son of John S. and Hellen (Grinager) Larson. In addition to the children named in Volume 1 of the Jackson County History Book, John and Hellen were the parents of two more children: Joseph H. born January 11, 1913, died September 29, 1967; and viola J. born July 6, 1916. John died on July 22, 1916, and Hellen in 1934.

Alf was nine years old when his father died, therefore it was necessary for him to assist his older brother and sister with the farming operation. In addition to farming the home place, they rented land from the neighbors while they were still very young. Alf had his own team of horses, some plugs that wouldn't run away, and wagon for picking corn.

On August 13, 1930, Alf was married at Windom to Harriet Lavina Johnston, born July 13, 1910. They purchased the home place and continued to make it their home. They worked hard and didn't buy anything they didn't need. They got along without a car for a couple of years, borrowing one when they needed transportation for special occasions.

Alf worked on the W.P.A. project during the winter of 1933, shoveling gravel by hand into a wagon pulled by horses, using dump planks to unload. The wages were \$6.75 per day for man, wagon, and team. When the "New Deal" came along conditions started to get better.

Alf was a member of the Farm Bureau, Brown Swiss Association and the Dairy Shrine Club, and served as a school board member. Alf and Harriet were 4-H advisors for many years. They were active in church work at the Delafield Lutheran Church where they were members.

Mr. and Mrs. Larson are the parents of the following named children: Gerald, born March 20, 1931, died June 13, 1954; Willis, born September 4, 1932, married to Luetta Inmen; Max, born September 18, 1933, married to Barbara Schmidt; M. Joanne (Mrs. Roland Roesner), born December 7, 1934; Shirley (Mrs. Bryce Ewing), born December 25, 1935; Margaret (Mrs. Arlin Mattison), born March 21, 1937; Reverend Donald, born April 20, 1938, married to Virginia White; and John Richard and Leon, who died in infancy.

Harriet died June 20, 1977. Alf remarried Jane Holmen Stevens on May 21, 1988. They still reside on the home place.
