

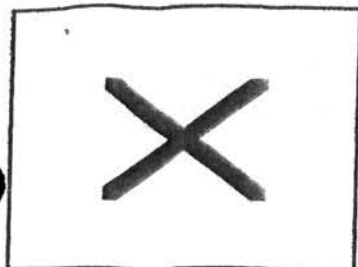

Honor Thy Mother and Thy father

My Name is Robert (Bob) Silker and I am the son of Betty Dorsey Silker and I am the 5th generation living on this farm and do own a small part of it today. Because of the complexity of the 158yr history I will be attaching an account of the ownership changes and a few comments about some of the historic things that happened along the way.

Because of the passing of my mother on august 4th 2015 now once again it will be handed down in the family. Per my mothers wishes the bulk of the farm will go to my Son Brandon Tyler Silker age 23. Reason for mentioning his age is he will be the youngest owner of the farm in the history of the farm. Currently the owner of record is Betty Dorsey Silker. Once Probate is completed Brandon Tyler Silker will be the next owner of record, 6th generation living here.

I am not sure as far as whom you would put on any paper work or plaque, But both Brandon and I are ok with honoring my mother Betty Dorsey Silker. Here is why, My mother Loved her father Merlin Dorsey and her grandfather Mike Dorsey very much and in fact so much she changed her name in the 80s to reflect that. Her name at birth was Betty Jean Dorsey. Her Marriage to Vern Silker changed her last name to Silker. So to Honor the memory of Father and Grandfather she changed it to Betty Dorsey Silker.

We have a rich history in Olmsted county and Kalmar Township and its something to be proud of. Dating all the way back to John Soble known as the first settler to come to Byron (Bear Grove) area. In 1853 he arrived to find no one here and returning in 1854 to make it his home. Several history books along with websites tell this story as well. After settling in 1854 his other brothers Jacob and David came as well. Last was his sister Phoebe and we are all there descendants.

Event timeline

Time line author Robert Silker

1853 John Soble (Great Great Great Uncle) comes to minnesota to find no one here yet in this area. He returns to back east.

1854 John Soble returns to find a very small settlement of people so he settles here as well, Soon to be known as Bear Grove. I believe there was only 3 other families living here then.

John Soble gets word back east of the settlement and Brother David H. Soble with Brother Jacob W Soble makes a settlement in 1856 Known as the West 80 (acres). This is our starting point on our land today. Land first deed was to David H Soble in June 8th 1858.

First shack or house was built with a room for the horses in 1856 later becoming a barn, then a chicken coop with storage for the model a ford.

Also Isaac Johnston settled here in 1856. You will see why this is important later as he had a Daughter in August 5th 1903 named Beatrice Johnston.

Some time in the spring 1859 sister Phoebe Soble (Great Great Great grandmother) arrives and meets John Parish and they are wed in November 6th 1859.

Sometime in 1858-60 a new house was built still one room but much nicer than the shack. No Running water or bathroom. Still stands today with upgrades. Made in the 1860s Kitchen, Extra bedroom and hand pumped water from a cistern. Still no bathroom. Not sure of the bathroom or when but grandma said it was a big

deal. I think the bathroom came in the 1930s My grandfather Merlin put it in.

John and Phoebe Parish have a daughter in June 6th 1862 named Ada (Soble) Parish.

1864-5 the Railroad comes though the north part of our farm. The township of Bear Grove is renamed by S.W. VanDusen and called Byron after his hometown in Byron, New York.

Ada Soble Parish (Great Great Grandmother) Marries Mike Dorsey in september 14th 1888 they have a son in April 7th 1898 Merlin Dorsey.

Oct. 5th 1891 David H Soble deeds the farm and other land to Phoebe Soble Parish, Now totaling 65 acres and other land. (I remember a story about a horse being traded for the 24 acres as I do not know how the farm got the 24 acres) Also that this was supposed to be a wedding gift David gave to her in 1959. Also that David had moved on to other things in 1860.

Oct 27th 1919 Ada Parish Dorsey is awarded the land through probate on her mother Phoebe's passing.

1920 landmark building that still stands today. In 1920 a new barn was erected measuring 45x35 standing 37ft tall. This was a big deal at the time and one of the biggest barns in the Byron area. The Cost of the barn was \$2200.00. In 1922 a loan was taken to pay off the cost of building it with the Byron Bank this became the most fearful time of the family history. To this day all successors and heirs must promise too never mortgage the property. Ada Dorsey was so scared they would loose the place it was unreal. As grandmother Dorsey put it she was hell to live with but you Kept Still and never spoke your mind. Based on records I understand,

plus the pending depression. Add the fact that the loan was paid off in Sept 29th 1925 but not recorded until 1928 I understand her fear. It was said that the bank held this over their head for 3 years trying to force them to barrow more money. They never barrowed any more money ever! The bank finally gave in and released the mortgage in 1928.

1922 Merlin Dorsey Meets Beatrice Johnston Daughter of Isaac Johnston and they are wed on October 24th 1924. Thus, My entry earlier about the Isaac Johnston family.

1929 Old #7 road turns into Hwy 14 coming through the south part of our land. Nabor, Melee Conway was so upset that they would cut down her apple trees that the engineers moved the road slightly to the north to save the trees. So happy she made the whole crew pies. Now known as Country Club Road West, Prior names were ol#7, Old 14, County 34

January 16th 1930 Merlin and Beatrice Dorsey have a daughter Betty Jean Dorsey

September 27th 1947 Mike Dorsey and son Merlin inherit the land from wife Ada Parish Dorsey.

In January 7th 1950 Betty Dorsey weds Vernon Silker and as a wedding gift from Merlin and Beatrice Dorsey they are gifted a 1 acre of land to build a house on. Recorded on Sept 22 1950.

1959 New Hwy 14 project is commenced and takes up a large part of our north part of the land. We lost our spring fed pond and several acres of the best land we had. It covered about 15 acres leaving us with about 71 acres tillable. Side note here. I spoke with a man that remembers drag racing on the new road before it was even open. He will go unmentioned.

April 15th 1960 Betty and Vernon Silker have a son named Robert William Silker named after uncle William Dorsey, known lovingly as uncle Bill. He had passed as a young man but Betty thought dearly of him and wanted to honor him.

1981 February 26th the land is deeded over to Daughter and husband Betty Dorsey Silker and husband Vernon Silker as a gift.

June 6th 1986 Merlin passes away

July 20th 1992 Robert Silker and Karen Olson have a son named Brandon Tyler Silker

May 1st 1996 Robert Silker buys 3 acres of land where the farm buildings stand for use of a shop to restore muscle cars. Purchase price was \$1 and was said to be a gift of his inheritance that his grandfather would have wanted him to have.

October 29th 1996 Beatrice Dorsey Passes away.

Vern Silker passes away on February 23rd 1998, Just shortly before the opening of his son's Robert Silker new industrial painting business, Largest of its kind in southern Minnesota.

On August 4th 2015 Betty Jean Dorsey Silker passes away and leaves the family farm to her grandson Brandon Tyler Silker. Brandon will be the youngest to inherit the farm and its rich history at age 23. Conditions are that his Father Robert Silker be allowed a life lease and allowed to run the farm as long as he is able. Total tillable acres today is 71.87 acres principle crops are beans and corn on a rotation basis. Total acres are 87.1
Only stipulation is that he can never borrow money against it!

We are celebrating our 158th year this year.
Everything here is based off 1858 records.
