MINUTES OF MEETING

Inter-Agency Coordinating Committee

December 15, 1961

A meeting was held in the Neighborhood House on December 15, 1961, for the purpose of discussing relocation, rentals and the time schedule for the acquisition and demolition of buildings in Riverview Industrial Park.

Fresent were:

Lyle E. Kinvig, General Manager, Fort Authority of Saint Paul James Peterson, Ramsey County Welfare Board Clem Bowe, Housing and Redevelopment Authority, Relocation Office Frank Hijikata, Neighborhood House Marjorie McFeeters, Neighborhood House

This group voted to call themselves the Inter-Agency Coordinating Committee.

Mr. Kinvig presented the demolition time schedule for Riverview Industrial Park, as follows. No objections were voiced.

"It is the intention of the Pert Authority to own or to have an option on properties in Riverview Industrial Park by June 1, 1962."

Mr. Kinvig led the discussion on rents to be charged to tenants of properties purchased by the Port Authority, and to home owners who have not yet found housing elsewhere. Four methods of determining the rentals were mentioned.

1. Comparative units in the area.

2. 3/4 of 1% of the purchase price per month.

3. 1/2 of 1% of the purchase price per month.
4. 10% of the purchase price divided by 12 per month.

It was generally agreed, however, that each case will be considered on its own merits.

Responsibility for maintainence of these properties was touched on briefly, but this will be discussed more fully at a later meeting.

SUBJECT: ACTIVITY REPORT JANUARY 1, 1962 to APRIL 1, 1962.

This report will strive to present in narrative form a realistic picture of relocation activity plus statistical information. You will note from attachments, the relocation office has received various lists from the Port Authority i. e., properties to be vacated, demolition schedules, properties optioned to the Port Authority. The occupants were contacted immediately upon receipt of each list.

As the work progressed, many people who were in areas not immediately involved became alarmed and it was necessary to deviate from a fixed schedule and plan. Although we have the number of families and individual householders at the time of survey, this figure changed constantly, as people moved in and out of the area. Because of this situation it was necessary to make as many as three calls to keep up to date as to the occupants of certain housing units.

The Relocation Office has made every effort to work in close harmony with the Port Authority and furnish it with information and procedures used in relocating of people from the Eastern, Western, Mt. Airy and Upper Levee projects. Rumors, misunderstanding of dates and the length of time occupants could remain after acquisition by the Port Authority caused considerable confusion until the opening of the Port Authority Information office. When emergencies occurred (and they did), it was necessary for the family visitor and myself to stay with a building until it was vacated. Two such emergencies were, 100 South Robert from which four families were relocated and $106\frac{1}{2}$ South Robert from which six families were relocated. A couple of these cases could be dramatized. Suffice to say, considerably more time was spent due to social factors. The above buildings were condemned as unsafe by City Authorities.

The Port Authority opened an Information Office in the Neighborhood House at 229 East Indiana, January 24, 1962. It was then possible to spend more time on actual relocation problems. Previously it had been necessary to refer problems other than relocation to the Port Authority main office.

BOWE SUBJECT: ACTIVITY REPORT FOR PERIOD 9-1-61 to 12-31-61 FOR THE MAYOR'S OFFICE The Central Relocation and Information Service Office completed survey reports of survey areas #4 and #5 and the "Final Report of Statistical Information for the Entire Riverview Survey" were completed and submitted during this period. The family visitor spent ten days interviewing and reinterviewing people to be displaced by the Rondo-St. Anthony Freeway (Interstate Freeway #94). Property in this area is being acquired by the Minnesota State Highway Department. Beginning September 15, 1961 the family visitor was assigned to work full time with the people to be displaced in the "Industrial Park Area" that is being developed by the Port Authority of the City of Saint Paul. I am sure it is recognized the position of the staff of the Central Relocation and Information Service Office was handicapped to a certain extent in providing their services until the Port Authority was designated the property acquisition agency by the City Council early in November, 1961. Until that time, the people of the area were confused by the various rumors concerning which agency, dates, and timing of the whole program. During this time, I attended meetings with the Port Authority and Neighborhood House personnel and joint meetings of the Port Authority, Neighborhood House, and Ramsey County Welfare Board in an effort to resolve difficult situations. I also interviewed families with special problems referred to me by the other agencies. Responsibility for payment of moving costs was discussed next.

Mr. Kinvig stated that the Fort Authority has agreed to pay for the moving costs of hardship cases. Mr. Peterson of the Welfare Board said it has been their policy to pay for moving costs for relief, ADC and Old Age Assistance Cases.

Mr. Kinvig said he would ask the Authority's legal coursel.

Mr. Kinvig said he would ask the Authority's legal counsel, Mr. J. E. Dillon, to draft a suggested form of lease for study by this Committee.

During the discussion, it was suggested that the Port Authority might establish an office in one of its vacant buildings to assist individuals affected by the Authority's redevelopment project and who need relocation and, also, to provide a place for them to pay their rents. It was noted that it is very difficult for some of these people to come into the downtown area for this purpose. The Housing Authority had indicated that they would have one man available for relocation assistance and guidance for a short period of time and that this individual would be available for part time assistance thereafter. Mr. Peterson of the Welfare Board said he might be able to recommend a girl who was familiar with the area and who could speak Spanish to assist in the operation of such an office. However, it was brought out that the Port Authority would have to assume the costs of running such an office inasmuch as the budgets of the other agencies would not allow them to participate financially. This suggestion met with full approval, and Mr. Kinvig stated that he would submit the recommendation to the Fort Authority.

Mr. Kinvig read a letter called "Information to Tenants" issued by the Housing Authority in 1954, which advised tenants of Housing Authority owned properties of the rental requirements, etc. Mr. Kinvig suggested that a similar letter be sent to all tenants (not home owners) in the Riverview Industrial Park area, from a list provided by Mr. Clem Bowe of the Housing Authority. The Committee approved of this suggestion and Mr. Kinvig said he would draft such a letter and aubmit it at the next Committee meeting for their additional suggestions and approval.

Discussion followed regarding the criteria to be used in determining the eligibility of hardship cases. Mr. Peterson suggested that his office might be able to provide a couple of individuals who would be able to do this work. This suggestion was well received and at a future meeting the Committee will set up the criteria to be used for the determination of hardship cases.

Mr. Kinvig said meetings of this Committee will be held on a regular basis in the future and he will attempt to establish a regular schedule.

Mr. Kinvig said he would pass on to the Fort Authority the recommendations made by this Committee and will advise the Committee of the actions taken by the Fort Authority at their meeting to be held December 19, 1961.



HOUSING AND REDEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY OF THE CITY OF SAINT PAUL, MINNESOTA REPORT OF THE ACTIVITY of the CENTRAL RELOCATION AND INFORMATION SERVICE January 16, 1961 BACKGROUND The Housing and Redevelopment Authority has maintained a staff to provide relocation assistance to persons displaced by urban renewal action since

January 1954. Such assistance has been a requisite of the urban renewal programs established by the Authority in cooperation with the Federal Urban Renewal Administration.

Since the service began the relocation staff has given assistance primarily to families and individuals displaced as a result of renewal action in the Eastern and Western Redevelopment Projects and the Upper Levee Renewal Project. In addition, the relocation staff has, in cooperation with the Minnesota State Highway Department, given assistance to persons displaced as a result of the acquisition of right-of-way for the Interstate Highway.

On October 21, 1959, an agreement was made between the Housing and Redevelopment Authority and the City of Saint Paul whereby the Authority would provide informational service and relocation assistance to families displaced or to be displaced by any public action. The agreement requires that the Authority shall provide among other things services as follows:

- (a) Interview the inhabitants of the area being acquired for public improvement to obtain necessary information of family size and composition, income and economic status, housing needs and desires, and such problems that may exist, such as health, accessibility to employment or schools, etc.
- (b) Inform such inhabitants of the Municipality of the services available to them through the Authority, and urge such persons to seek appropriate dwellings and housing accommodations outside of the area being acquired for public improvements.
- (c) Seek dwelling accommodations in the private market for such displaced inhabitants of the Municipality in other areas of the Municipality through advertisement, contacts with real estate and property management firms and by all other means available and necessary to accomplish the rendering of informational service and relocation assistance to such persons.
- (d) Make reference to such displaced families and individuals to available dwelling accommodations meeting their needs and ability to pay for the same.
- (e) Assist eligible families in making application for low-rent housing projects of the Authority.

(f) Make further contact with such families and individuals as may be necessary to assist them in being properly relocated within the corporate limits of the City of Saint Paul, Minnesota. (g) Refer families and individuals having special problems requiring the assistance of other public agencies to the appropriate agency; emlist the assistance of other agencies, including the Welfare Agency, in connection with families and individuals receiving assistance from such agencies. (h) Maintain accurate records of the families and individuals and the nature of the dwelling accommodations to which they move. (i) From time to time, as required, furnish to the public body or agency carrying out the public program or project and to the Municipality, report or reports of the informational service and relocation assistance rendered by the Authority to such displaced persons or individuals. This report is the initial one made by the Authority to the City of Saint Paul as part of its agreement. The report deals with the performance of the Central Relocation and Information Service for the year 1960. ACTIVITIES DURING THE YEAR 1960 First Quarter Preparations were begun for assisting persons to be displaced by the State's purchase and clearance of the new armory site bounded by Columbus Street, East Twelfth Street, Cedar Street and Minnesota Street. Preparations were begun for assisting persons to be displaced by the State Highway Department's acquisition of right-of-way for the Interstate Highway in the vicinity of Seventh Street and Broadway. Relocation payments to Upper Levee Relocatees processed. Second Quarter

An informational brochure was prepared for distribution to organisations and to persons to be displaced by public action.

A survey was made of the Eustis Street Expressway area where acquisition of right-of-way by the Minnesota State Highway Department was commencing.

Listings were prepared of private housing accommodations available for persons to be displaced. The listings were secured from newspaper advertisements, real estate firms and other sources.

Between April 1 and May 15 one hundred and twenty families and individual householders were contacted and eighty-one family records completed.

An average of ten (10) calls a day was received from persons seeking information on relocation assistance.

Third Quarter

Relocation of persons and families from the new armory site completed.

Interviewers visited tenants of residential structures in areas subject to public action to determine their need for assistance. Early resistance to offers of assistance dissolved after the tenants realized that a sincere effort was being made to assist them.

Neighborhoods which appeared to be productive of the type of accommodation needed were thoroughly investigated. Tenants who had no transportation were transported by staff of the relocation office to inspect available dwelling units.

Fourth Quarter

Beginning September 1, 1960 there was a lull in relocation activity in the field. However, telephone inquiries relating to relocation problems continued to come in. The State Highway Department had set a deadline for vacating several large buildings in the route of the Freeway. It was necessary to interview and reinterview people in the area from East Seventh Street and Broadway to Rice and Rondo as the State Highway Department had given some of the owners or lessors the option of continuing to operate their properties to June 1, 1961.

Most of need for assistance in the East Seventh Street and Broadway area was requested by older single citizens on Old Age Assistance or a combination of Old Age Assistance and Social Security. They lived in one-room apartments or light housekeeping rooms. Because of their low incomes these people presented many problems.

On December 1, 1960 the Relocation Office staff began a relocation survey of the housing needs of families and persons living in the area from Concord Street north to the Mississippi River and from Holman Airport west to the High Bridge. (Attached is a preliminary report to December 31, 1960 of the housing survey.)

STAFFING OF RELOCATION OFFICE

An acting relocation officer, Mr. Clement Bowe, was appointed on January 6, 1960. The staff consisted of one until Mr. Soll Gould and Mrs. Kathleen Langeland were appointed to the staff on April 1, 1960. Mr. Gould was employed part time in relocation activity until April 15 after which he was employed full time.

Mrs. Lorraine Bauers was appointed Clerk-Stenographer on April 18, at which point Mrs. Langeland was appointed Family Visitor. Mrs. Langeland left the Relocation Office staff to assume another position within the Authority on October 1, 1960. Two temporary employees were hired as enumerators on December 1, 1960 to begin a survey of the housing needs of persons to be displaced by public action.

On January 3, 1961 the Commissioners of the Authority appointed Mr. Bowe Assistant Relocation Officer and Mr. Norton Kent, Director of Planning, was given the added responsibility of supervising the Central Relocation and Information Office. IDA C. is 85 years of age. She lived on the 3rd floor of a dilapidated house-keeping unit. She had resided there for several years. During the period we worked with the 16 occupants of this building, the "Caretaker" was intoxicated at the time of each visit. He informed the tenants he was going to rent another building and take them with him. Ida would not accept the fact that she had to move until a crane moved in and demolished a house on the next corner. She had been transported to two different satisfactory housing units previously. On the last day before the utilities were to be shut off she accepted a unit on Marshall Avenue.

It should be noted that some of these senior citizens take more time to relocate for many reasons: health, inability to look for themselves, low income, in many cases a degree of senility and a desire to remain in or near their present locality. The following shows the results of our interviews and work with the 103 individuals householders and 17 families:

SUBJECT: ACTIVITY REPORT JANUARY 1, 1962 to APRIL 1, 1962.

This report will strive to present in narrative form a realistic picture of relocation activity plus statistical information. You will note from attachments, the relocation office has received various lists from the Port Authority i. e., properties to be vacated, demolition schedules, properties optioned to the Port Authority. The occupants were contacted immediately upon receipt of each list.

As the work progressed, many people who were in areas not immediately involved became alarmed and it was necessary to deviate from a fixed schedule and plan. Although we have the number of families and individual householders at the time of survey, this figure changed constantly, as people moved in and out of the area. Because of this situation it was necessary to make as many as three calls to keep up to date as to the occupants of certain housing units.

The Relocation Office has made every effort to work in close harmony with the Port Authority and furnish it with information and procedures used in relocating of people from the Eastern, Western, Mt. Airy and Upper Levee projects. Rumors, misunderstanding of dates and the length of time occupants could remain after acquisition by the Port Authority caused considerable confusion until the opening of the Port Authority Information office. When emergencies occurred (and they did), it was necessary for the family visitor and myself to stay with a building until it was vacated. Two such emergencies were, 100 South Robert from which four families were relocated and $106\frac{1}{2}$ South Robert from which six families were relocated. A couple of these cases could be dramatized. Suffice to say, considerably more time was spent due to social factors. The above buildings were condemned as unsafe by City Authorities.

The Port Authority opened an Information Office in the Neighborhood House at 229 East Indiana, January 24, 1962. It was then possible to spend more time on actual relocation problems. Previously it had been necessary to refer problems other than relocation to the Port Authority main office.

The following is a statistical resume of activities for the period January 1, 1962 to April 1, 1962.

SUBJECT: ACTIVITY REPORT FOR PERIOD 9-1-61 to 12-31-61 FOR THE MAYOR'S OFFICE

The Central Relocation and Information Service Office completed survey reports of survey areas #4 and #5 and the "Final Report of Statistical Information for the Entire Riverview Survey" were completed and submitted during this period.

The family visitor spent ten days interviewing and reinterviewing people to be displaced by the Rondo-St. Anthony Freeway (Interstate Freeway #94). Property in this area is being acquired by the Minnesota State Highway Department.

Beginning September 15, 1961 the family visitor was assigned to work full time with the people to be displaced in the "Industrial Park Area" that is being developed by the Port Authority of the City of Saint Paul. I am sure it is recognized the position of the staff of the Central Relocation and Information Service Office was handicapped to a certain extent in providing their services until the Port Authority was designated the property acquisition agency by the City Council early in November, 1961. Until that time, the people of the area were confused by the various rumors concerning which agency, dates, and timing of the whole program. During this time, I attended meetings with the Port Authority and Neighborhood House personnel and joint meetings of the Port Authority, Neighborhood House, and Ramsey County Welfare Board in an effort to resolve difficult situations. I also interviewed families with special problems referred to me by the other agencies.

SUBJECT: CENTRAL RELOCATION AND INFORMATION SERVICE OFFICE

RELOCATION INFORMATION

The Central Relocation and Information Service serves as a clearing house for information on all displacement activities in Saint Paul. This includes up-to-date time schedules, boundary information and reuse plans. This information is available to interested individuals, agencies and groups.

Relocation is not a numbers game as many people believe it to be. (See attached). This article is as true today as when written in 1954. It should again be recognized that the Central Relocation and Information Service office as of today is operating under an agreement between the Housing and Redevelopment Authority of the City of Saint Paul and the City of Saint Paul as per Minnesota Laws 1959, Chapter 545. M.S.A., Section 462.445, Subdivision 4, and Subdivision 6, as amended. These services are available to any inhabitants of the City of Saint Paul displaced by Public Action i.e.; highways, streets, schools or other public building, etc. A copy of the above agreement is attached. If and when an Urban Renewal or Conservation program under a G.N.R.P. is approved we would be obligated to operate under the "Policies and Requirements for Local Public Agencies Urban Renewal Manual", Chaper 1. Objectives and Submission Requirements, Chapter 2. Planning and Relocation and Chapter 3. Carrying out the Relocation Program.

RELOCATION PERSONNEL

The Central Relocation and Information Service subject to revision from time to time should be staffed as follows:

Relocation Supervisor Family Visitor Housing Locator Clerk Stenographer

In establishing these needs, it should be recognized that this is tentative, subject to a work load which cannot be accurately determined. This is true because the Central Relocation and Information Service is performing a service for various agencies whose timing of property acquisition varies. It should also be recognized that staff for this operation should have flexibility so that duties of each position may be interchangeable.

It is my recommendation that Lorraine Bauers be assigned to the position of Family Visitor and Mr. Soll Gould to the position of Housing Locator on a full time basis. A clerk-stenographer to be hired to replace Lorraine Bauers.

REPORTS AND FORMS

The attached reporting form can be used, but again we must not lose sight of the fact that the Central Relocation and Information Service is dealing primarily with human beings. In my opinion, a narrative report with enough statistics to verify should be used. To be specific, in using the attached reporting form, one would be used for each area in which relocation was being carried out, such as at the present time, one for the Lower West Side Area, and for the Minnesota State Highway Department.

Reporting under an Urban Renewal program is provided for on form H-666, Housing and Home Finance Agency, Urban Renewal Administration, "Report of Progress".

PEOPLE CONTACTED

Contacts and an amicable relationship with other agencies is a necessity. These include: Greater St. Paul Case Work Council, Capitol Community Center, Neighborhood House, Hallie Q. Brown Center, Ramsey County Welfare Board, American Red Cross, Salvation Army, Urban League, Catholic Charities, Family Service and others. The Rehousing Office, as it was known during the Eastern and Western Redevelopment programs, the Mt. Airy and Upper Levee programs or the Central Relocation and Information Service as it is described in our contracted agreement with the City of Saint Paul, has at all times worked in harmonious agreement with the above agencies.

I am attaching copies of reports made at various intervals since January 3, 1960, when I was named Acting Relocation Officer. These reports reveal the activities of the Central Relocation and Information Service Office. Included are letters to other agencies informing them of our services and to the people of the Riverview Area notifying them of the housing survey to be conducted in that area. In addition a brochure prepared by me and distributed to people being displaced by any Public Action in the City of Saint Paul. Also attached are copies of letters of appreciation from the Commissioner of Administration and the State Highway Department.

I directed and was responsible for all the activities referred to above. In conclusion, I wish to state I have performed the duties of all positions in the Central Relocation and Information Office and I firmly believe I can carry out the duties and responsibilities of Relocation Officer.

BOWE SUBJECT: ACTIVITY REPORT OF THE CENTRAL RELOCATION OFFICE 1-1-61 to 3-31-61 Requests for information continue to come in from residents of the Rondo-St. Anthony Freeway Route. I have handled all the personal contacts in the East Seventh and Broadway area and the area west of Aldine Street during this period. One building in the East Seventh and Broadway area was condemned by the St. Paul Fire Department. Therefore, the State Highway Department cancelled the lease of the lessor. It was necessary to spend a considerable amount of time advising and counseling the people affected by the advance termination of the lease at 487-97 Broadway. Twelve families or individual householders were involved in one building. Two families purchased homes, three rented in the private rental market, one was referred to and was accepted in Mt. Airy Homes. The Ramsey County Welfare Board placed one in the mission at 445 Wacouta Street and five senior citizens were relocated in the adjacent area which will necessitate their moving again by July 1, 1961, when the State Highway Department will terminate all housing leases in this immediate area. Mr. Gould made 125 contacts to secure rental listings and certified 35 units. He also was assigned duties of photographing public housing sites, proposed public housing sites and dilapidated housing units in various areas of the city. Mrs. Bauers has prepared and sent out 832 notices to families in the Riverview district pertaining to the housing survey being carried on in that area. Prepared and helped to prepare statistical reports of the area already covered by the survey. Three such reports have been submitted to date. She also answers telephone inquiries concerning the housing survey and other pertinent questions. The January 30th and March 23rd, 1961 preliminary reports will provide information pertaining to the housing survey in the Riverview area.

Report on Activities of the Relocation Office from September 1, 1960 to December 31, 1960.

Beginning September 1, 1960 there was a bull in relocation activity in the field. However, telephone inquiries relating to relocation problems continued to come in. The State Highway Department had set a deadline of June 30, 1960 and August 15, 1960 for vacating several large buildings in the route of the freeway. It was necessary to interview and reinterview people in the area from E. Seventh Street and Broadway to Rice and Rondo as the State Highway Department had given some of the owners or lessors the option of continuing to operate their properties to June 1, 1961.

The State Highway Department had started negotiation and acquisition of property west of Aldine on St. Anthony Avenue during this period. The areas described above are a part of the Intercity Freeway Route 94.

In the first area (Broadway and E. 7th St.) it was older citizens, primarily single and in the lowest income bracket i.e., on Old Age Assistance or a combination of low Social Security and Old Age Assistance who were most in need of relocation assistance. Most of these people lived in one room apartments or what is known as light housekeeping rooms. Because of their low income limits, these people presented many problems. During this period a total of three hundred and fifty telephone inquiries were received pertaining to housing. One hundred and fifteen letters and brochures were mailed to people on the route of the Intercity Freeway on St. Anthony Avenue, west of Aldine Street.

On October 1, 1960, Mrs. Kay Langeland who had been working as a family visitor in the Relocation Office, was transferred to Mt. Airy Homes as Tenant Selection Supervisor. Her position in the Relocation Office was not replaced. From October 1, 1960 to December 1, 1960, I attempted to combine the work of Family Assistant and Acting Relocation Officer to the best of my ability. On December 1, 1960, two people were added to the Relocation Office staff to begin a survey of the housing needs in the area from Concord Street to the river and from Holman Airport to the high bridge, and related areas. To date six hundred and sixty-five letters have been mailed to people in the survey area. (Attached is a copy of letter).

During this period I attended two meetings with the staff of the Neighborhood House on E. Indiana Street, four monthly meetings of St. Paul Area Health Council, and the annual meeting of the St. Paul Urban League.

Attached is a preliminary report to December 31, 1960 of the housing survey being conducted on the west side.





REPORT ON RELOCATION OF PERSONS DISPLACED BY PUBLIC ACTION IN THE CITY OF SAINT PAUL SUBMITTED BY: CLEMENT H. BOWE, ACTING RELOCATION OFFICER OF THE CENTRAL RELOCATION AND INFORMATION SERVICE, SEPTEMBER 1, 1960. Location of Projects New Armory Site, area bounded by E. 12th Street, Columbus Street, Cedar Street, and Minnesota Street - completed. Route of Expressway through the lower loop from E. 7th and Broadway to connection with Rondo-St. Anthony Freeway at Rice and Rondo. Route of Eustis Street Expressway from Pearl Street and Eustis Street to University Avenue. Route of Rondo-St. Anthony Freeway from St. Anthony Avenue and Aldine Street to City limits. Attached is an example list of properties acquired by the Minnesota State Highway Department, and property acquisition dates on freeway route through lower loop between Neil and E. 7th on the east, and Rice and Rondo on the west. #1 Attachment #2 is a copy of statistical Report of Relocation Progress for the period from June 17th to July 29th, 1960. Site Occupancy Surveys Preliminary information was obtained from building managers, owners and a physical check of the premises. Letters were sent to each tenant in occupancy, advising of Central Information Service. A copy of the letter is attached. #3 Information and Interviewing Site Occupants Interviewers visited tenants to ascertain their need for assistance and explain to them that assistance which was needed was available from the Central Relocation and Information Service office. Householders were interviewed and sufficient information was obtained to determine situations peculiar to certain tenants which were complicating their ability to move. A considerable amount of resistance was encountered. The tenants, for the most part, felt the offer of assistance was too late. Many tenants complained about the type of housing available that they had to rent. This was especially true of the Armory Site and the "Portland Block" (453-483 Broadway). Approximately seventy persons over sixty years of age, in the very low income group, Old Age Assistance or Social Security resided in this area. After a few days tenants became more cooperative and realized a sincere effort was being made to assist them.

Page two: Locating Housing and Referring Site Occupants Neighborhood areas which appeared to be productive of the type of accommodation needed were canvassed. Property managers were solicited for current listings. Older tenants who had no transportation were taken personally by the relocation office interviewers to inspect available units. Reports of Persons 60 and Over A report of persons aged 60 and over displaced by the Eastern Redevelopment Area U R Minn. 1-1, Western Redevelopment Area U R Minn. 1-2, and Upper Levee Area, Minn. R-3 prepared for Housing and Home Finance Agency, Urban Renewal Administration. This report involved 343 persons. A copy is attached. #4 Meeting with Other Agencies Monthly meetings of the Greater St. Paul Case Work Council and St. Paul Area Public Health Council of the Greater St. Paul Community Chest and Council Inc. Meetings at least once a week were necessary with various people of the State Highway Department to work out extensions in hardship cases and other problems that arise. Also the Department of Administration for the Armory Site. In some areas almost daily contact with the Ramsey County Welfare Board due to the large number of people receiving Old Age Assistance. Illustration of Problems The following are five cases which illustrate kinds of problems encountered: Case No. 1 Mrs. G. was an elderly widow of 84 and becoming senile. However, she was able with the help of neighbors, to care for herself and rent three sleeping rooms of the apartment she occupied. Interviews disclosed she had one relative, a niece who lived in White Bear Lake. The niece, who has a family of her own, was also employed in the Midway district. She did take time off from work to try and help her aunt. Mrs. G. was escorted to several rental units, all of which she rejected. She was also taken to the tenant selection office at Mt. Airy Homes. She agreed to accept an apartment that was available at McDonough Homes. Case No. 2 Mary H., a lady apparently in her fifties (she refused to divulge her age) was one of Mrs. G's roomers. She refused to give the interviewer any information and advised she was perfectly able to locate housing for herself. A few days after Mrs. G. moved to McDonough Homes, Mr. Bowe of the Relocation Office, noticed a person in Mrs. G's. apartment as he was driving past. Investigation revealed Mary was still occupying her room although the gas and electricity had been turned off and the furniture moved out. She was sleeping on an improvised bed on the floor.

. Page three: She continued to claim she had permission to remain in the building. After consultation with Mr. Stevenson, Assistant Commissioner of Administration for the State of Minnesota and Mr. William B. Callahan of the Department of Public Property, it was decided to bring in a uniformed police officer to talk to her. This brought results. Mr. Bowe knew of rooms at 71 E. 11th Street. He personally drove her to the building and waited until she had rented a room. He then, along with Mr. Callahan, saw to it that her belongings were transported to her new quarters at 71 E. 11th Street. Case No. 3. The Paul S. family occupied one half of a duplex, the other half of which was occupied by Mrs. S's sister and family. Paul had arrived in Saint Paul from Texas approximately one year ago and had brought his family here later. They were having trouble establishing Minnesota residence with the Ramsey County Welfare Board. Conference was held with interviewers from this office and Ramsey County Welfare Board. All difficulties were resolved and referral was made to the tenant selection office at Mt. Airy Homes and they were accepted. Food order was also provided by the Ramsey County Welfare Board. Case No. 4. After several visits to the building, I was finally able to gain access to the apartment of Mrs. S. She appeared to be in a stupor and was very incoherent. She was attempting to bail out a plugged sink in her kitchen and was carrying the water to the bathroom. The other room was a combination living room and bedroom. The bedding and room were filthy. After considerable effort, she gave a name of a person whom she said was her daughter and the part of the city where she supposedly lived. On checking with the City Directory, a person by that name was listed. A call was made to the daughter who stated her mother was on probation. Contact was made with the Ramsey County Probation office who verified the daughter's information. Mrs. S. was picked up by the probation officer. Mrs. S. was 66 years of age and receiving \$70.00 Social Security. Case No. 5. Mr. Him., living in an old residence on Eustis Avenue converted into housekeeping units, is 62 years of age and a cardiac patient. He is also handicapped by his inability to read or write. His total income was \$55.90 received from the Welfare Department. He was paying \$25.00 a month rent and could scarcely pay more on this allotment. He had looked and inquired everywhere in this area for housekeeping rooms to no avail. His own efforts were limited to looking in this immediate area because of lack of a telephone or transportation. Even the outlay of fifty cents for bus fare would make serious inroads on his daily food allotment. The family visitor found a suitable apartment for him at 4xx Ashland but the rental was \$35.00 a month - an increase of \$10.00 over the amount he had been paying. We obtained the name of the Ramsey County Welfare Board worker and convinced her that this appeared to be as economical a housekeeping unit as could be found and still provide decent shelter. The Ramsey County Welfare Board worker agreed to increase his budget to \$65.90 and arrangements were made by our office for Mr. H. to rent and move to the new location.

Public Housing

In addition to being mailed an "Information Notice to People", each tenant, at the time of their interview was informed of their priority for public housing.

The Family Visitor and Acting Relocation Officer personally escorted older citizens without transportation to the Tenant Selection office at Mt. Airy Homes to submit their applications for public housing. In many instances it was the only possible means of transportation.

Thirty-eight applications from these areas have been submitted and fourteen applicants to date have been accepted as vacancies occurred.

Future Plans

Approximately 150 families remain on various Freeway sites, Eustis Street.

E. 7th and Broadway Area, and Rice and Summit Avenues. These figures do not remain constant. Both the State Highway Department and Department of Public Works of the City of Saint Paul, in hardship cases, purchase the property immediately when hardship is proven.

Lafayette Street Bridge approaches and right-of-way through lower West Side, and the flood control program will also displace a large number of families in that area.

The Arch-Pennsylvania Highway and the Short Line Route will displace people. The exact figures will be known after a survey is completed.


