TO ALL WHO SHALL SEE THESE PRESENTS, GREETING:

KNOW YE, That reposing special trust and confidence in the patriotism, valor, fidelity and abilities of Francis Scott Fitzgerald, I have nominated and by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, do appoint him provisionally, a Second Lieutenant of Infantry in the service of the UNITED STATES: to rank as such from the twenty-sixty day of October nineteen hundred and seventeen. He is therefore carefully and diligently to discharge the duty of the office to which he is appointed by doing and performing all manner of things thereunto belonging.

AND I DO strictly charge and require all Officers and Soldiers under his Command to be obedient to his orders as an officer of his grade and position. And he is to observe and follow such orders and directions, from time to time, as he shall receive from me, or the future President of the United States of America, or the General or other superior Officers set over him, according to the rules and discipline of War.

THIS COMMISSION to continue in force during the pleasure of the President of the United States, for the time being.

GIVEN under my hand at the City of Washington this nineteenth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and eighteen and in the one hundred and forty-second year of the Independence of the United States.

SUBJECT: Establishment of residence in St. Paul.

1. I lived with my parents, Mr. and Mrs. Edward Fitzgerald of #599 Summit Avenue, and while living with them, I took examinations for a commission at Fort Snelling, in the month of July, 1917.
2. At the time I took the examinations, I was 20 years and 10 months old, and had been a student at Princeton University. I left for Princeton in October to begin my senior year and to await my commission there. It arrived when I had been at Princeton a month.
