These guidelines are a resource supported and enlivened by reflective supervision, ongoing training, and service resources and funding on behalf of families who are experiencing the co-occurrence of child maltreatment and domestic violence.

These guidelines were developed in collaboration with a multi-disciplinary work group, who were committed to keeping children safe and enhancing family well-being.
