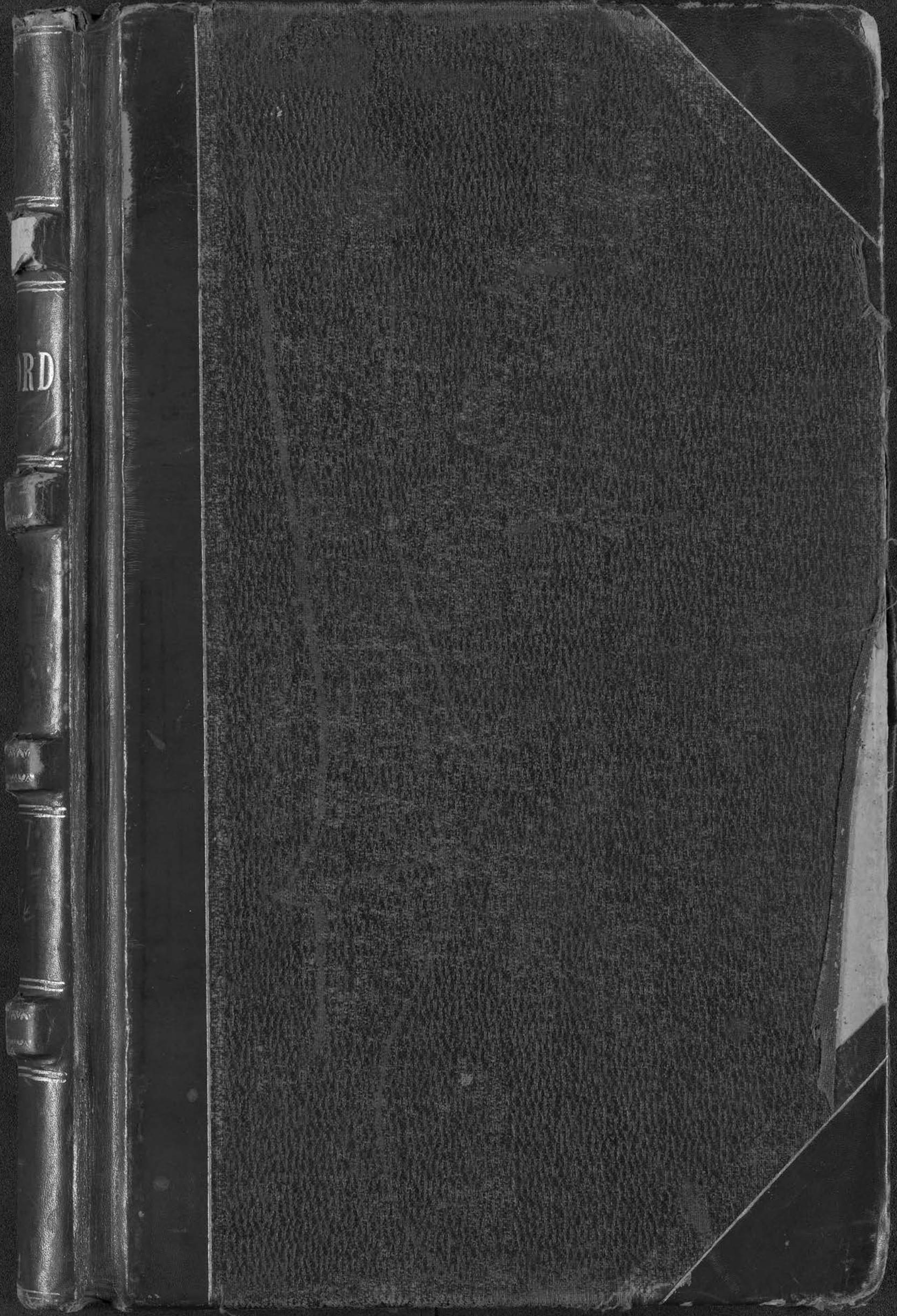

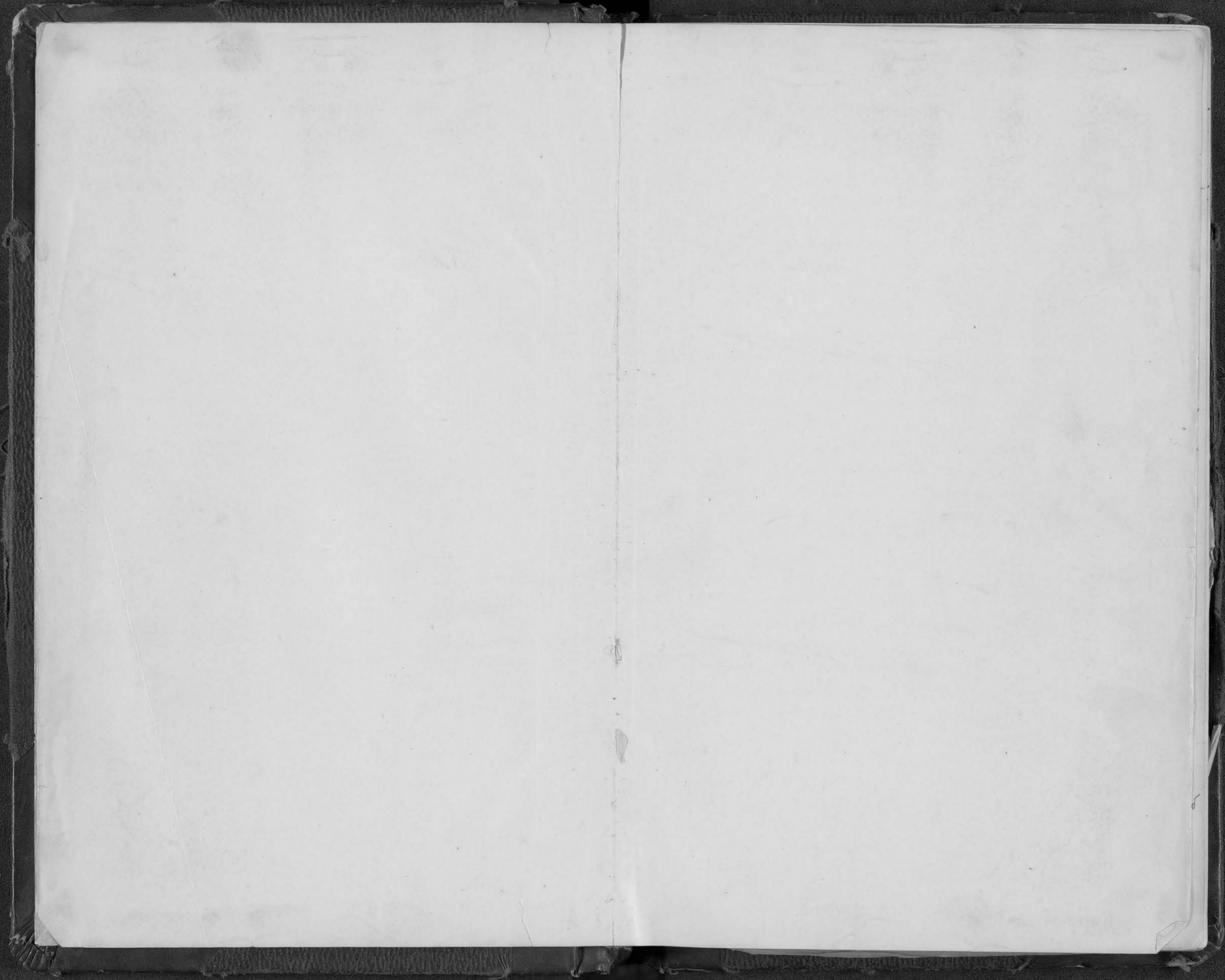

Annual Meeting, Aug 7, 1905. 1

Annual meeting of Moorhead Board of Education held at office of George E. Perley August 7, 1905, at 5pm.

Present - Perley, Lamb, Wentzell, Shapleigh, Torson
On motion Torson was elected clerk pro tem.

The following officers were elected by ballot for the ensuing year:-

President - George E. Perley,

Clerk - Wm D. Titus

Treasurer - Thomas Torson.

On motion the salary of the clerk and Treasurer was fixed at \$100 each for ensuing year. The bond of the treasurer was fixed at \$10,000, to be furnished by a surety company, and the premium to be paid by the district.

The president announced the following standing committees:-

Supplies - Shapleigh, Titus, Torson.

Buildings & Repairs - Titus, Wentzell, Lamb.

Insurance - Wentzell, Lamb, Shapleigh.

Library & Museum - Lamb, Wentzell, Perley.

Text Books - Torson, Shapleigh, Perley.

Teachers - Perley, Torson, Titus.

Auditing - Wentzell, Titus, Torson.

On motion it was decided to extend the system of free text books, now in operation in the grades, to the High School the change to be made gradually; and the superintendent was authorized to expend not to exceed \$125 this year for that purpose.

On motion the treasurer was instructed to file with the clerk a monthly statement of receipts and disbursements, showing the disposition of the funds on hand.

On motion the meeting adjourned.

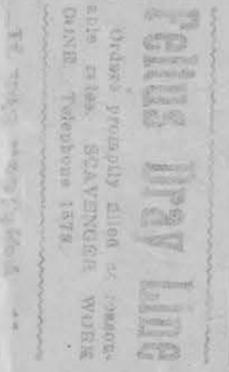

Minutes of the Regular Monthly Meeting of the Board of Education, held at the High School Building on Dec. 5th, 1911, at 8 o'clock P. M.; Present- Messrs. Torson, Titus, Davy, Perley, and Supt. Edwards.

The following business was transacted:-

The minutes for the meetings of Oct. 27th and Nov 7th were read and no errors or corrections being noted, were approved as read. Treasurer's monthly report was read, and ordered filed. It showed on hand at date of said report, Dec. 5th, 1911, the sum of \$6778.88.

On motion special committee consisting of Davy and Perley and Miss Mae McClure, teacher of music, were authorized to purchase a piano for use of the school, at an expense not exceeding \$300, it being understood and agreed that there will be applied in payment of the same special funds now on hand in the sum of about \$80, and that the students would give an opera under the direction of Miss McClure, the proceeds to be applied to the payment of said piano, the balance to be paid from the general fund.

The report of Supt. Edwards was received and ordered filed, showing on Dec. 5th, a total enrollment of 712, against a total enrollment of 690 one year ago, and 145 in the High School against 119 a year ago. The report also stated that the superintendent had instituted a more rigid system covering the matter of purchasing books and supplies, that the Normal gymnasium has been engaged during the basket ball season for 3 nights weekly, and that the expense will be paid so far as possible from the income of the games, and that notice has been given us that it will be difficult to make a similar arrangement hereafter.

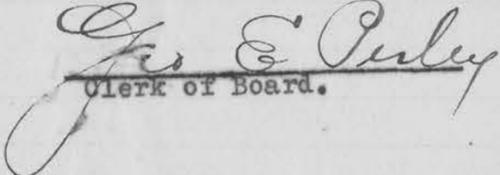

Gentlemen:-

Inclosed herewith we hand you reports and estimates on the several school buildings in the city of Moorhead as per your request. In the matter of a new high school building we believe that a suitable building can be erected, with new boiler house and connecting tunnels suitable to meet the requirements of your city for the sum of \$66,000.00 and we submit herewith a block plan suggesting the arrangement of the buildings.

It will be understood that the cost could be extended indefinitely but we consider the above sum sufficient to cover all costs for such a building as you need.

In case a new high school building is erected in the near future, it would seem to be more economical for the present to expend as little money as possible on the repairs of the central building, for the reasons that the present high school room will be amply large for grade purposes and the rooms in the attic should be abandoned as being unfit for school purposes and such repairs and changes as suggested to be made now, would be of little or no value, when the time comes for making the general repairs that will make a good serviceable building that will last for the next ten or fifteen years. We would therefore advise that the general remodeling and repairs be deferred till the new high school is erected when the whole work can be done at the same time and with greater economy and efficiency.

The Report in substance stated, that a new High School building with concrete floors, fire proof partitions, and power ventilation, thoroughly built and of attractive architecture, could be erected for \$58,500.00. said building to be 70 feet or its equivalent; that the present Central Building could be repaired or remodeled, equipped with power ventilation, and made adequate and suitable for the needs of the District for graded school purposes for many years to come, and until a larger building should be needed for \$9,100.00, that a suitable boiler house and connecting tunnels for heating both buildings would cost \$7,500.00; that temporary repairs could be made in the Central Building, for supplying ventilation, as specified in said report, for \$1170.00, and that a room for Domestic Sewage and other purposes in the attic, could be finished for \$555.00; The report also included the valuation of the present buildings, made at the request of the Insurance Committee, as follows:- Central School Building, \$2098.00- Manual Training Building \$1050.00- Second Ward Building \$9472.00- First Ward Building, \$5309.00- Third Ward Building \$13381.00. The report strongly recommended the retention of the present Central Building for grade purposes, and the erection of the new high school building on the NE 1/4 of the block, near the Central Building, with Boiler House in the rear connecting with both buildings. After a general discussion of questions raised by this report, and the advisability of erecting a new school building, the Board on motion adopted unanimously the following resolution:-Whereas at a meeting of the electors of Moorhead, Independent School District # 2, Clay County, Minnesota, held at the Moorhead School Building, City of Moorhead in said district on Saturday, July 15th, 1911, a majority of the electors present, voted to erect a new school building in said district to cost not less than \$75,000; Therefore be it resolved that a meeting of the said district be and the same hereby is called for Friday, May 10th 1912, at the Sharp School Building in said district at 7 o'clock P. M. for the purpose of voting on the proposition of issuing \$75,000 in bonds, to be used for the erection and furnishing of the school building, as authorized by the said vote of the district, on July 15th, 1911; And be it further resolved, that the polls be kept open for two hours for the purpose of voting on said proposition. On motion the purchase of the following described text books and supplies as requested by the Supt. was authorized. "Easy German Reader"- 48 copies; tools and utensils for working upon the play ground, and the purchase of certain flowers desired for the use of the Drawing Department.

Hall, of Lake City, Mich., graduate of 1912 class of Mount Pleasant Normal School, Mich., salary of \$765 per year. It is understood that Mr. Hall has had 2 years experience as teacher. Miss Katie Jobben, who declined a re-election, Miss Olga Olson of Osla, Minnesota, at salary of \$55 per month. To succeed Miss Martha Hansche, who declined a re-election, Miss Emma Meillicke, now teaching in N. Dak., 3 years experience- graduate of Moorhead Normal School, at salary of \$57.50. per month.

In Place of Miss Jones, who declined election, Miss Mabel Amundson, Graduate of 1912 class, Moorhead Normal School, at \$55 per month.

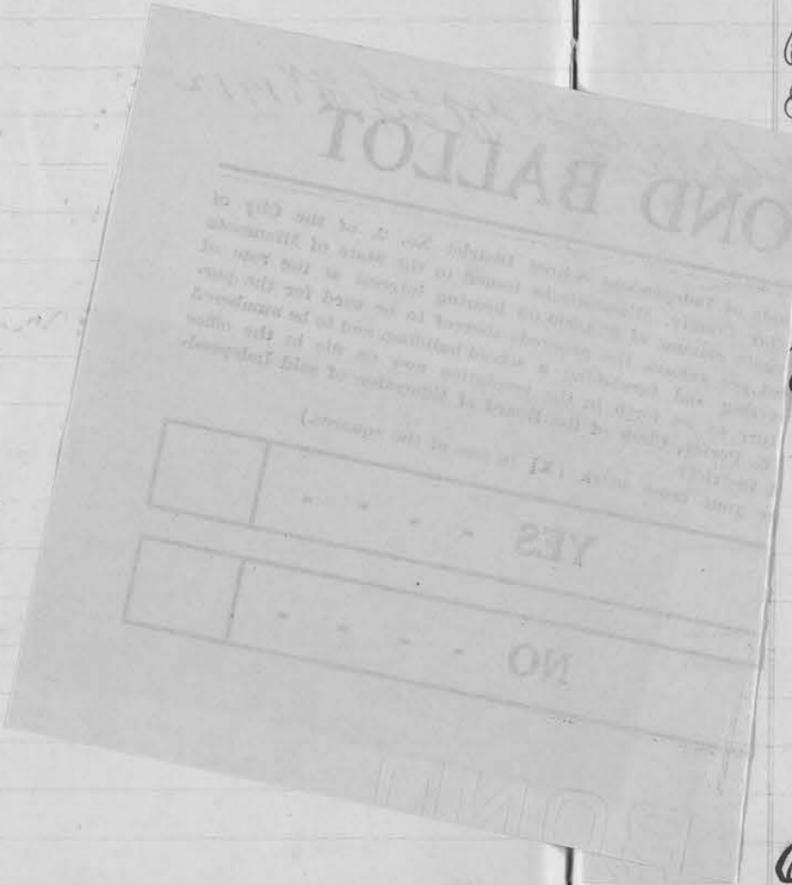

After a careful investigation, including two examinations of the premises, your building committee respectfully recommends the following alterations at the Central building in order to provide accommodations for the High School:

That the partition wall on the east side of the High School room be removed and the text book library, girls' cloak room and the west portion of the small recitation room thrown into the assembly room, thus adding a space 12 1/2 feet wide and the entire length of the room to the present room and providing accommodation for 39 or 40 additional desks.

That the reference library and museum cases be removed from the large north recitation room and the reference library placed in the alcove which will be left in the south-east corner of the enlarged assembly room.

That a room be finished on the third floor for the museum cases and the text book library.

That a partition be built down the middle of the room now used as recitation room and reference library, making two recitation rooms 13 X 30 feet each.
