

AGREEMENT FOR LEGAL SERVICES

This Agreement, entered into between the City of Crystal, a Minnesota municipal corporation (City) and the law firm of Holmes & Graven, Chartered (City Attorney) as of this 1st day of January, 1990, provides as follows:

Section 1. Background: Findings.

- 1.01. The City desires to retain the firm of Holmes & Graven, Chartered as City Attorney and the firm desires to serve the City as City Attorney.
- 1.02. Pursuant to Section 6.02 of the City Charter the appointment and removal of the City Attorney are made at the discretion of the City Council.
- 1.03. At a duly called regular meeting of the City Council held on Tuesday, December 5, 1989, the City Council determined that the firm of Holmes & Graven, Chartered be engaged as City Attorney, with David J. Kennedy of that firm serving as primary legal counsel for the City and instructed the City Manager to prepare an agreement between the firm and the City setting forth the terms and conditions of the engagement.

Section 2. Terms and Conditions.

- 2.01. In consideration of the mutual promises and conditions contained in the Agreement the City and the City Attorney agree to the terms and conditions set forth in this section.
- 2.02. a) The City appoints the firm of Holmes & Graven, Chartered as City Attorney, with David J. Kennedy acting as primary legal counsel for the City.
- b) The City Attorney agrees to perform all usual and customary legal services for the City in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.
 - c) The City agrees to compensate the City Attorney for services as follows:
 - An annual retainer fee of \$13,200 payable in monthly installments of \$1,100 per month commencing as of January 1, 1990, or such other date as may be mutually agreed upon by the parties. Services to be covered by the retainer fee are as follows:
 - 1) Attendance at all Council meetings, regular and special;
 - Meetings with staff; public groups as requested by the Council; and public hearings;
 - Review and preparation of contracts, bonds, insurance and other routine legal documents;

- 4) Routine ordinance code amendments and preparation of resolutions;
- 5) Formal and informal legal advice to Council and staff, commissions and committees;
- 6) Public inquiries on non-police matters, i.e., matters not directly related to criminal prosecution activities.
- 2.03. For all other legal services, except as provided in Section 2.05, the City agrees to compensate the City Attorney at the following hourly rates for services indicated in the year at the hourly rates indicated below:

- 2.04. Billings by the City Attorney to the City for services will be on a monthly basis, except as may otherwise be agreed upon by the parties as to the retainer fee as set forth in Section 2.02.
- 2.05. The City Attorney will act as approving bond counsel for the City if so requested by the City. These services are not part of this Agreement, but may be made such by mutual agreement of the parties. In the event such services are desired by the City, fees for these services shall be those usual and customarily charged by the firm of Holmes & Graven, Chartered.
- 2.06. It is the intention of the parties and it is hereby agreed by the City Attorney, that the term "primary legal counsel" as used herein means and refers to David J. Kennedy who will, except in the case of extraordinary circumstances involving disability, unavoidable conflict or other good and substantial reasons, perform, supervise and be responsible to the City for the legal services to be provided.
- 2.07. This Agreement may be amended by the parties at any time by mutual consent.
- 2.08. This Agreement may be terminated by the City at any time and by the City Attorney upon 60 days written notice to the City.



SUBJECT: Request to Amend Street Nuisance Ordinance

The Environmental Quality Commission considered a citizen request to amend the street nuisance code, regarding leaves, at our December meeting. The request was referred to the Environmental Quality Commission by Councilmember Carlson. A resident in Mr. Carlson's district recently requested that the street nuisance code, Section 800.11, subd. 2, be amended to include the following wording:

Yard leaves should be raked periodically. All yards must be cleaned of leaves before the first snow fall to prevent them from blowing into the streets and onto yards that have been cleaned.

After discussing the implications of the ordinance change suggested above, the Environmental Quality Commission agreed that attempts to enforce such an ordinance would be extremely difficult, if not impossible. Many of the members agreed that it would also be ecologically unsound since it is often best to condition lawns with unraked leaves. Also, state law prohibits the landfilling of yard waste and brush as of January 1, 1990.

Therefore, the Environmental Quality Commission does not feel that further action is necessary on this ordinance amendment request.

Thank you for taking the time to contact me recently regarding your concern for the funding of the Human Services Councils in Hennepin County. I very much appreciated hearing from you on this issue and I want you to know I think the many letters and telephone calls I received on this issue contributed greatly to the reinstatement of Human Services Council funds into the 1990 budget.

As you know the state levy limits and other budget constraints forced our staff to make a recommendation that the Human Services Council funds for both planning and citizen participation be eliminated. The rationale for this recommendation was that it would be difficult for us to justify providing funds for planning and citizen participation when there was insufficient money for direct service programming. However, I was very pleased to have successfully advocated restoration of most direct services that had been eliminated from the 1990 budget. As a result I believe we built a strong case for reinstating the Human Services Council funding to our 1990 budget at the 1989 level of funding.

I agree that the Human Services Councils play an important role in helping us establish our priorities for funding and I am most pleased that this budget item was restored to our 1990 budget. Thanks again for your kind attention and involvement in this important Hennepin County issue.

MINUTES OF THE ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY COMMISSION OF CRYSTAL, MINNESOTA OCTOBER 19, 1989 7:30 P.M. SOUTH CONFERENCE ROOM

The Chair called the meeting to order at 7:37 p.m., recognizing a quorum. Those members present were: Beth Jarvis, Jerry Farrell, Mary Pat Hanauska, Phyllis Isaacson, Larry Lemanski, Lerry Teslow, Gerald Schoultz, Diane Christopher, Julie Jones (Staff Liaison), and Pauline Langsdorf (Council Liaison; arrived 8:10 p.m.).

Those members absent were: Ryan Schroeder and Gail Gove.

The Chair noted that the first item on the agenda was the approval of the September 21, 1989 meeting minutes. Mary Pat Hanauska moved to approve the minutes as written and Gerald Schultz seconded the motion.

Motion Carried.

The second item on the agenda was the review of the revised draft of the Housing Maintenance Code. The Commission reviewed both the point of sale and the rental licensing sections of the code. Julie Jones explained the changes which had been made to the previous drafts. The Commission members then discussed and recommended further changes where necessary.

The Commission members then discussed how the presentation of the housing code should be addressed at the Council/EQC work session on November 16. Many members felt that it would be wise to forward statistics on housing conditions to enforce the need for a housing code. It was also suggested to open the meeting by showing video footage of sample housing inspections. Jerry Farrell volunteered his home for a sample housing inspection.

Under other business Julie Jones explained the current compost/yardwaste problem. She also explained the results of the last HRG meeting.

Pauline Langsdorf mentioned that the Environmental Quality Commission may want to get involved in Earth Day 1990, which is scheduled to take place next spring. One suggested event was a tree planting project in City Parks.

Since there was no other business, Lerry Teslow moved to adjourn the meeting. Gerald Schoultz seconded the motion. The meeting adjourned at 9:43 p.m.

MINUTES OF THE CITY COUNCIL AND ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY COMMISSION WORK SESSION NOVEMBER 16, 1989 7:00 P.M. COMMUNITY ROOM

The Chair of the Environmental Quality Commission, Beth Jarvis, called the meeting to order at 7:07 p.m., with roll call and introductions. Environmental Quality Commission members present were: Gail Gove, Mary Pat Hanauska, Phyllis Isaacson, Beth Jarvis, Larry Lemanski, Gerald Schultz, Lerry Teslow, Jerry Farrell (arrived 7:09 p.m.), Diane Christopher (arrived 7:11 p.m.), and Ryan Schroeder (arrived 8:00 p.m.). City Council members present were: Betty Herbes, Adrian Rygg, Elmer Carlson, Pauline Langsdorf, Garry Grimes, John Moravec (arrived 7:40 p.m.), and John T. Irving (Council member elect). Staff members present were: Tom Heenan, Health Sanitarian; Bill Barber, Building Inspector; and Julie Jones, Community Development Coordinator.

The Chair then asked Tom Heenan, Health Sanitarian, to show a video tape to the group of a rental property that was recently condemned. Mr Heenan explained the problems with the particular examples shown and answered questions.

The Chair then explained the Environmental Quality Commission's reasoning for suggesting Point of Sale Inspections and explained why the Commission held a sample housing inspection as part of their study process. Diane Christopher had videotaped a second sample housing inspection at the residence of Jerry Farrell and played the tape for the group which was narrated by Bill Barber, Building Inspector. The Chair asked for Jerry Farrell's and Diane Christopher's opinion of the housing inspections done on their homes. They responded that they found the inspections helpful and were pleased that the inspections focused on health and safety problems only.

The Chair continued the meeting by explaining the Commission's reasoning for including certain segments into the housing code such as a paragraph addressing the sale of fixer-uppers.

At 7:53 p.m. the Chair called for a break in the meeting.

The meeting reconvened at 8:10 p.m.

The Chair called on Julie Jones to explain recent demographics released from the Metropolitan Council. Ms. Jones explained that current statistics released in a Metropolitan Council housing study emphasized the need for a stronger focus in inner ring suburbs on housing maintenance. The Chair then opened the floor for discussion and questions. Various issues were discussed, including: right of entry, compliance by seller, problem rental properties, and staffing requirements.

The Chair suggested that the City Council forward the draft Housing Maintenance Code to the Planning Commission and possibly the EDA Advisory Commission for further review, allowing the Environmental Quality Commission to study other issues such as recycling and pesticides.

Pauline Langsdorf commended the Environmental Quality Commission members and the staff for their efforts in compiling the draft Housing Maintenance Code.

After a briefing of future agenda items by the Chair, Lerry Teslow moved to adjourn the meeting. Mary Pat Hanauska seconded the motion. The meeting adjourned at 9:23 p.m.
