SUBJECT: Preliminary Agenda for the July 2, 1991 Council Meeting

#### Consent Agenda:

Items 1, 2, & 3: I fully support granting the permits to St. Raphael's. It's the kind of festivals and things like this that they have that are great for any particular church and community in general; however, I don't think the City should subsidize it by waiving the sign permit fees. There are provisions in the ordinance for the Council to waive sign permits and other fees for civic and religious organizations if you think that's proper use of City funds.

#### Regular Agenda:

Item 1: Tim Erkkila, Westwood Engineering, will appear before the City Council to make a presentation on the Twin Lake Trailway and MAC Park Development Concept. Mr. Erkkila of Westwood Engineering & Planning was hired by the City of Brooklyn Center to do some park planning for them around the lakes and other areas in the city. He did some work on trying to tie that together in Crystal and Robbinsdale. He made a presentation to the Park Commissions of the three cities and to the City Managers. At that time we suggested that he should make the presentation to all of the City Councils. If they support the concept as the Park Commissions did, then possibly a committee of the three cities could be put together to try to formulate a program and begin implementing the program over a number of years in the three cities. The goal being to tie together a trail and park system around our lakes as exists around the Minneapolis lakes and other places in the metropolitan area.

Item 3: Consideration of one 3 day Temporary On-Sale Liquor License with waiver of the fee as requested by St. Raphael's Church. Again, I have no problem with the license being granted but I don't know why the City should subsidize an event that makes tens-of-thousands of dollars by waiving the license fee.

Item 4: Consideration of the First Reading of an Ordinance Amendment to Section 2005 (Misdemeanors) of the Crystal City Code relating to trespassing. The City Attorney's office and the police department will be at the Council meeting to discuss this with the Council as you requested at the last meeting when this was brought up.

Item 5: Reconsideration of preliminary plat of Twin Lake Shores Second Addition. We will be discussing this at the Economic Development Authority meeting. I again think that we would be better off to plat this into one lot and try to make some effort to limit the number of starter homes that appears will be in great abundance in the future. Maybe make room for a larger home here and there throughout the City.

Item 6: Reconsideration of a variance to the side street side yard setback at 4403 Zane Avenue North. We have made contact with the contractor on this and have asked them to try to get the owner or someone to the meeting.

Item 7: Consideration of award of contract for 36th Avenue State Aid Reconstruction Project. We received very favorable bids for this and as Bill recommends in his memo, we would recommend that you award the contract for the project.

Item 8: Consideration of acceptance of site improvements for Walgreens, 6918 - 56th Avenue North. I concur with Bill's recommendation.



# CRYSTAL PARK AND RECREATION ADVISORY COMMISSION Minutes May 1, 1991

The regular meeting of the Crystal Park and Recreation Advisory Commission was called to order at 7:04 p.m. by Chairperson Bill Gentry. Members present were:
Ms. Saunders, Mr. Jungroth, Ms. Howard, Ms. Pitts, Ms. Reid, Ms. Moucha, Mr. O'Reilly, Mr. Ertz and Mr. Theisen. Also present were: Mr. Moravec, council liaison, and Mr. Brandeen and Ms. Hackett from the department staff.

The minutes were approved as sent.

Ms. Hackett reviewed the monthly report and the Community Center activity report, highlighting major activities.

The Chairperson's Report will cover items further down the agenda.

The Commission discussed the Crystal Frolics Honored Seniors program. The Commission will assist with the publicity and the luncheon. Ms. Reid will set a meeting with Commission members interested in planning this event.

The Twin Lake Pathway/Trailway system was discussed by the Commission. A joint meeting was attended by representatives of Crystal, Brooklyn Center and Robbinsdale. Now each city will discuss the project further within their own city. A study committee made up of representatives from the cities could act in an advisory capacity until more formal arrangements are made. The possibility of establishing a joint powers agreement was discussed.

The Commission discussed the trailway concept plan. The plan did not define how the trails would be constructed or what existing roadways, sidewalks, etc. would be used. The Commission agreed that a trail system is needed to connect city facilities. The plan calls for the MAC park area to be a key feature in the development and the Commission felt that this ties in with the proposed study of the feasibility of the Nature Center.

Moved by Ms. Reid and seconded by Mr. Jungroth to recommend the acceptance of the first phase concept of the Twin Lake Pathway project (Phase 1 includes the Crystal trailways/pathways and MAC Park environmental interpretive center) and to consider a joint powers agreement with Brooklyn Center and Robbinsdale.

Motion carried-unanimous.

Mr. Moravec suggested that the Environmental Commission be included in the project.

Funding was discussed. Mr. Brandeen felt that LAWCON funding may be available if all three cities work together.

The Commission reviewed the citywide pathway/trailway concept. The Commission Long-Range Planning Committee discussed three phases:

Phase 1: Construct trails in all major parks.

Phase 2: Connect all major parks (community parks and playfields) and other points of interest with on-road trailway.

Phase 3: Utilize off-street trailways to tie parks/ facilities together.

The Long Range Planning Committee will meet and redefine the plan.

Ms. Reid reviewed the last Crystal Frolics Committee meeting.

The Commission discussed dog problems in the parks. Mr. Brandeen will develop an informational flyer to be delivered to homes by a local Boy Scout troop. Also, the ordinances are listed in the "Use Your Other Backyard" brochure. These P.R. items will be tried first and, if not successful, the stricter enforcement will be used.

The Waterslide Marketing Sub-comittee reviewed their last meeting. All promotional materials have been sent.

The Commission reviewed the final draft of proposed fees for recreation activities in the 1992 budget. Also reviewed were fees for Senior Center membership. The Commission discussed setting the Senior Center membership fee so that actual center costs were charged back to members.

Moved by Mr. O'Reilly and seconded by Mr. Ertz to recommend that the 1992 Senior Center membership fees be \$12 residents/\$18 non-residents.

Motion carried-unanimous.

The Commission Public Relations Committee reviewed their meeting. The "Use Your Other Backyard" brochure was discussed as was the June 8 pool opening.

Mr. O'Reilly informed the Commission of Crystal Day at the Crystal Center. More details available later.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:50 p.m.



#### Overview

Twin Lakes is a "jewel in the rough"; it is an underused resource. In the upcoming years the City of Brooklyn Center may have the opportunity to reclaim this valuable public resource. In a reclaimed state, more people will be able to utilize the chain of lakes and share its resources. This study was undertaken to determine what issues and opportunities are associated with increased utilization of the Lake as an active and passive resource.

The study occured over a 12-month period from midwinter 1987-88 to midwinter 1988-89. This afforded a 4 season review of the study area. The study area was broken into two areas of written summary: Twin Lakes (Upper, Middle, and Lower) and the Preserve Area. For mapping purposes they are displayed as part of the same geographic area and the graphics reference the Preserve as part of the study area. The graphics are presented on a corrected set of aerial photos from April 1985 and spliced together.

The study area falls largely within the City limits of Brooklyn Center. However, a study of Twin Lakes must recognize that Robbinsdale and Crystal also have part jurisdiction over the lakes and Brooklyn Park is a neighbor to the Preserve. This multi-jurisdictional aspect presents several problems caused by local views, but clearly can be viewed as an opportunity to provide a natural resource-based amenity which benefits a very broad area. This can be clearly seen when it is pointed out that all four communities are presently looking at ways to improve their pedestrian and bike trails. The possibility of a 4 city "link up" in the Twin Lakes area is feasible and opens up an immense opportunity for biking and hiking.


Twin Lakes and the Preserve Study

TRAIL & PARK SITE CONCEPT PLAN







Steve Tallen and I have discussed the trespassing ordinance at some length and basically agree on all the language. However, the period of time that the prohibition from entering the property is effective has been the subject matter of several discussions between Steve and myself. Our conclusion is that the determination of the length of time that the prohibition should be effective is a policy decision to be made by the City Council and not one to be made by either of us. Therefore, we submit the language to you and the Council for a decision regarding the period of time.

cc: Paul Rosenthal Peter MacMillan Subd. 1 On any premises privately owned but open to the use of the general public, no person shall remain on said premises after having been requested to leave by the owner of said premises, an authorized representative of the owner, or any other person or entity entitled to possession of the premises.

Subd. 2 On any property privately owned but open to the use of the general public, no person shall return to said property after receipt of a written notice of trespass from the owner, an authorized representative of the owner, any other person or entity entitled to possession of the premises, or law enforcement official, which notice prohibits them from returning to said premises. Such prohibition shall be effective for two years from the date the written notice was served.

The written notice under this Subd. 2 shall be personally served upon the party prohibited from entering the property and an affidavit of service shall be executed at the time of service. No prosecution shall be maintained under Subd. 2 of this section unless the property owner or other complaining party can produce a copy of the notice of trespass and a signed affidavit of service.

After having reviewed the information submitted to us by you in your February 8, 1991, letter, we have drafted a proposed City Ordinance and have some suggested language to include in the trespass letter.

In the trespass letter we suggest that rather than prohibiting persons from returning to Shopping Center property who have been arrested for any reason, it would be more useful to limit that language to "prohibiting persons who have been arrested for suspicion of criminal activity occurring at the Shopping Center". This language accomplishes the purpose of the letter which is to prohibit shoplifters and other undesirables from returning to the Shopping Center and allows you to pursue suspects off the premises of the Shopping Center for an arrest and still be able to serve them with the letter. In addition, we would also suggest that the person being served with the letter either sign an acknowledgment of receipt of the letter or, if they refuse to sign the acknowledgment, have an affidavit of service showing that the letter was served on the person so that there will be no doubt that they did receive written notice prohibiting them from returning to the Shopping Center property. Another addition to the letter is a time limitation of five years.

Finally, we would suggest that you change the letter to read that the persons will be subject to arrest for trespassing under Crystal City Code Section 2005 which makes it a misdemeanor crime for any person receiving this written notice to return to the Shopping Center property. Attached you will find a copy of the letter incorporating these suggested changes.

In addition to the letter, we have also drafted a proposed Ordinance which could be included under Section 2005 of the

Crystal City Code for specific provisions regarding misdemeanors. The heading would be "Trespass" and incorporates the provisions of the letter. A draft of the proposed City Ordinance is attached along with the trespass letter for your information.

### \$2005 - Misdemeanors - Specific Provisions

TRESPASS - It is unlawful for any person to return to a business establishment who has received written notice from any merchant or group of merchants or from a law enforcement agency prohibiting them from returning to the premises of that buisness establishment after arrest on suspicion of criminal activity occurring at that business or on its premises. Such prohibition will be enforced for five years from the date of conviction for the activity for which such person was arrested. Lake Shores Second Addition

#### BACKGROUND:

Earlier this year, the EDA requested staff to pursue replatting the two lots at 5105 and 5109 - 50th Avenue North into one, large lot (proposed plat of Twin Lake Shores Second Addition). Each lot is 50' x 126' (6,300 square feet); these are non-conforming lots as minimum lot width is now 60' and minimum lot size is 7,500 square feet. The majority of lots in this area have similar dimensions to 5105 and 5109 - 50th Avenue North.

The EDA's decision to combine these lots was based on concerns that the lots do not meet current size requirements, and recent Metropolitan Council information encourages inner-ring suburbs to create larger lots for single family homes.

At its June 10 meeting, the Planning Commission recommended denial of the proposed replatting of the two lots (Twin Lake Shores Second Addition). The Commission felt leaving the lots as they are is consistent with other lots in the neighborhood.

For your information, attached are memos from Bill Barber dated June 12 and Julie Jones dated June 21 and 13 regarding this matter.

As there is disagreement between the EDA, Planning Commission and staff on this matter, the Crystal Council continued consideration of the plat of Twin Lake Shores Second Addition and referred the matter back to the EDA for further discussion. The EDA will discuss this issue on July 2, 1991.

At the June 18, 1991, Council meeting, the Crystal City Council deferred action on consideration of a preliminary plat for the property located at 5105/09 50th Ave. N. The EDA's request to combine the property into one lot was recommended for denial by the Planning Commission at their June 10 meeting.

The Crystal EDA is now requested to re-evaluate it's earlier decision to combine the two lots into one single family lot. Background information regarding the EDA's earlier decision, which was included in the June 17 City Council packet, is attached.

As Jerry Dulgar, Executive Director, noted at the June 18 City Council meeting, the Crystal EDA needs to make a policy decision regarding the redevelopment of Scattered Site Acquisition properties in this and similar situations.

I would further recommend that the EDA also discuss the redevelopment opportunities for this Scattered Site property at their July 2 meeting, giving direction to staff. Verbal information received from the Minnesota Housing Finance Agency staff indicates that rebuilding a new home(s) on this property will not qualify in the new Minnesota Communities Program, which is very restrictive regarding new construction projects. A new HUD requirement would also require the EDA to repay a substantial amount of CDBG funds used for redevelopment of the site to Hennepin County. the EDA does not contract for construction of a new home on the property but rather sells the vacant lot, the HUD repayment requirement does not apply. Therefore, I would recommend that the Crystal EDA consider selling the vacant property at 5105/09 50th Ave. N. once title is clearly recorded and the replatting issue is resolved.

There is no immediate need to resolve the replatting issue immediately, however, it would be in the City's best interest to encourage new construction on the property prior to January 1, 1992. The property will remain tax exempt in 1992 since it will be sold after July 1, 1991. However, 1993 tax levels will be based on the value of the property as of January 2, 1992.



SUBJECT: Replatting of 5109 50th Ave. N.

At their June 10 meeting, the Crystal Planning Commission recommended denial of the Crystal Economic Development Authority's request to approve a preliminary plat of 5105/09 50th Ave. N. from two lots into one lot. The EDA had directed staff on April 2, 1991 to proceed in the replatting of this Scattered Site Acquisition Program property.

It is my understanding that the following factors resulted in the EDA's decision to replat the property into one lot:

- If the property were to remain as two 50'x126' lots, their size would not meet the minimum 7,500 square foot lot size requirement nor would they meet the minimum 60' wide lot requirement.
- 2. Recent Metropolitan Council housing demographic reports encourage inner-ring suburbs to create more larger lots for expanding families. They also forewarn about building more first-time homebuyer type housing since the first-time homebuyer market is expected to sharply decline over the next five years.
- Residents in the area have spoken to staff relaying their desire to see only one home built on the property.
- 4. There are other homes in the neighborhood which are built on two lots.
- 5. Building one larger home on the two lots will likely have a more positive affect on home values in the neighborhood than building two small homes would have.

The Planning Commission denied the EDA's replatting request, giving three reasons:

- They felt it would not be suitable to build a home that does not fit within the neighborhood on the property.
- There are several contractors interested in building two homes on the property.

 No variances would be necessary to build homes on the 50' wide lots.

I find many contradictions in the Planning Commission's decision. Mainly, I am surprised that the Planning Commission is not concerned about the non-conformance of the two 50' lots. Even though most lots in the area are only 50' wide, I see no reason to perpetuate a zoning code violation when the City has the opportunity to eliminate the violation.

The Planning Commission members were very concerned that if only one home were built on the property, it would not fit into the neighborhood. However, it is more likely that if two homes are built on the property, they will not fit with the style of homes in the neighborhood, because it will be necessary to design a home with an attached garage projecting out to the street in order to meet the setback requirements. This design of home will not blend well into the neighborhood.

The Planning Commission also cited the fact that there are contractors interested in purchasing the two lots for home construction as a reason for denial. However, there also may be many contractors interested in purchasing the property to build a single home since larger lots are a rarity in inner-ring suburbs. Many people who are searching for building lots also take into consideration the tax rate in that municipality. Crystal's low tax rate makes it a very desirable community in which to own a home.

It is true that there will be no variances necessary to build a home on two 50' wide lots in this location, provided the necessary setbacks are met. However, the Planning Commission and the City Council have often been required to consider variances for additions and decks on properties such as these when the homeowners decide that they need more space. The Economic Development Authority is attempting to eliminate the chance of this situation occurring on any properties it would resell.

The City Council should also be aware that the Economic Development Authority has spent \$800 to date for completion of the preliminary plat survey. It will cost approximately an additional \$200 - \$400 to complete the replatting process. Therefore, I see little reason for the City Council to reverse the EDA's decision to plat this as one parcel, especially since funds have already been expended to accomplish this task.

Preliminary Plat

I have received a request to replat Lots 8 and 9, Block 2 of Twin Lake Shores from 2 lots into one large lot. The existing lots are approximately 50'x126' or approximately 6,552 square feet per lot. Minimum lot size is 7,500 square The lots in this area are all approximately the same feet. size. The homes in the area are single family, one story or one story with a 2nd floor expansion for sleeping area. The homes were built in the late 1940's or early 1950's.

In reviewing this with the City Assessor, I would like to compare the benefit to the City if left as 2 lots versus replatting into 1 large one. On a 50'x126' lot, a 26'x40' home could be built with a garage with a market value of \$66,000 plus. This would provide two 3 bedroom homes. If you replat to one lot, you could have a single family home built with a market value of \$80,000 plus or minus. In this case, the neighborhood dictates the market value that any house will bear. The taxes on a \$66,000 home with homestead designation, will be approximately \$750 per year per lot. On the \$80,000 home with homestead designation, the taxes would be approximately \$1,050 per year.

If the two lots are sold separately, each lot could bring approximately \$16,000 per lot compared with combining the two into one large lot with a possible sale price of \$22,000.

I understand what the Metro Council is trying to do by suggesting that larger lots be created to allow for larger homes but I think they are looking at doing this in an area, not one lot here and one lot there. I have had a couple of contractors who have asked about these lots and are interested in either purchasing or building for the City. They think that the lots should be left as is and would be a better benefit to the City rather than combining them.

I would recommend that this proposal be continued and refer it back to the Economic Development Authority for them to take a look at the whole situation.

#### PLANNING COMMISSION UPDATE

The Planning Commission considered the request to replat Lots 8 & 9, Block 2 Twin Lake Shores into one large lot. After Block 2 reviewing both staff reports they recommend to Council to deny the request. The vote was 6-2. Their findings of fact were:

- It is not suitable for a larger lot such as this in this neighborhood when the majority are 50 foot lots.
- Contractors have already expressed a desire to purchase the lots as they are and build homes on them.
- 3. Better to put two lots with homes back on the tax rolls.
- 4. A home could be built on these lots without requiring any variances.

I will be prepared to answer any questions you have on Tuesday night.

Request of an 8' Variance to the Required 20' Side

Yard Side Street Setback

This property is located on the corner of 44th Ave. and Zane Ave. N. The property is 70' across the front which requires a 20' side street side yard setback. The applicant is requesting to build a 10' x 20' porch. This proposed addition will sit 8' into the required side yard. The back of the addition as you can see by the site plan would be even with the back of the house. The existing house is approximately 32' deep.

There is approximately 59'+ from the back of the house to the back property line. The screen porch could be built behind the house without needing a variance.

If you choose to recommend approval of this request, it would not affect the visibility on the corner, nor will it have any adverse effect on neighborhing property since it will be on the side yard adjacent to the side street.

This is one of the requests that would be affected by the proposed setback change that I have proposed to have all side street side yard setbacks in an R-1 and R-2 district to be 10' regardless of the width of the lot.

Update from Planning Commission meeting on May 20, 1991

The Planning Commission considered the variance request of Judy Rice to build a 10'x20' porch to the south side of the house. The Planning Commission suggested building the porch out to the rear of the house with a wood walk along the south side back to the porch.

The Planning Commission recommended denial of the request based on the finding of facts that the applicant has not shown undue hardship as defined by State Statute and City Ordinance. They felt that there were alternatives. Passed on a 6-1 vote. Neither Judy Rice nor her contractor have been in contact with me regarding any alternative solutions.


#### UPDATE

#### EXHIBIT "A"

#### AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made by and between the City of Crystal, a municipal corporation in the State of Minnesota, hereinafter called the City, the first party, and hereinafter called the second party,

WHEREAS, second party has requested that the City Council approve the issuance of a building permit.

WHEREAS, as a prerequisite to the approval of said permit, the City Council requires the construction of certain improvements for the orderly development of property known as Walgreen's, 6918 -56th Avenue North consistent with the site plan dated 6/28/90.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the granting of said permit, said second party agrees and covenants as follows:

- Remove bituminous areas, concrete curb and sidewalk.
- Construct concrete driveway apron across boulevard.
- Construct three curb openings at driveway and repair street adjacent.
- Close three driveway openings in curb and repair street adjacent.
- Construct V6 (minimum section) cast-in-place concrete barrier curb around parking lot.
- Construct parking area, access aisles and drives with a minimum of 6" Class 5 base and 2" bituminous surface.
- Stripe parking stalls with white paint.
- Erect two handicap parking stall signs.
- Construct storm sewer and appurtenances to collect and dispose of all surface water on the site.
- Erect stop signs at exits from parking area.
   Disconnect two abandoned water services at the main and restore disturbed area.
- Prepare and submit "as built" utility plans.
- Designate and sign fire lanes.
- Note how area lighting if proposed will conform to Section 515.07, Subd. 10, of the Crystal City Code.
- Landscape all open and disturbed areas.
- Provide all lot irons in place and to grade at the time of final acceptance.

That the second party warrants and guarantees all work done under the agreement against any defect in workmanship, materials, or otherwise that may occur within one year from the date of final acceptance by the City of all said work and other requirements.

That construction work be completed prior to issuance of the occupancy permit but not later than one year from issuance of building permit.

To hold the City harmless from any and all claims which may arise from third parties for any loss or damage sustained resulting from pursuance of the above-described work.

That all just claims incurred in the completion of aforementioned work requirements shall be paid in full by said second party to all persons doing work or furnishing skill, tools, machinery, services, materials, equipment, supplies or insurance.

All work pursuant hereto shall be in compliance with existing laws, ordinances, pertinent regulations, standards, specifications of the City of Crystal, and subject to approval of the City Engineer.

In the event that said second party has not completed any or all of the aforementioned work and requirements on the completion date as set forth herein, then in that event said second party shall be considered in default. Should said second party be in default, then said second party authorizes said City, its officers, its employees or its authorized agents to enter upon said second party's property and to complete any or all such uncompleted or improperly performed work or other requirements in conformity with this agreement.

That surety be deposited with the City in the amount of \$60,000 to insure the faithful performance of the above construction work and requirements, said surety to be in the form and manner as prescribed by law.



- The lessor of the premises, his or her immediate family, and any agents or employees of the lessee may not participate as players in the conduct of lawful gambling on the leased premises.
- The lessor and the lessee do not have a direct or indirect financial interest in the distribution or manufacture
  of gambling equipment.
- The lessor of the premises will allow the Board or agents of the Board, the Commissioner of Public Safety or agents of the commissioner, or the Commissioner of Revenue or agents of the commissioner, and law enforcement personnel to inspect the premises at any reasonable time, and permit the organization to conduct lawful gambling at the premises according to the terms of this lease. The lessor may not impose any conditions on the organization regarding distributors of gambling equipment, services, or the use of profits.
- The organization must obtain a license and a premise permit from the Gambling Control Board. The
  organization will be responsible for complying with the laws and rules of lawful gambling.
- The organization must have, at the gambling premises, a current inventory of gambling equipment, a sketch with dimensions of the premises available for review, and a clear physical separation or divider between the lessee's gambling equipment and the lessor's business equipment.
- The organization will be responsible for ensuring that the lessor's business activities are not conducted on the leased premises.
- If the lease is cancelled prior to the termination date of this lease, each party agrees to notify the Gambling
  Control Board explaining the reasons for the cancellation. The lease shall be terminated immediately for any
  gambling, liquor, prostitution or tax evasion violations occurring on the premises.
- The lessor of the premises shall provide the lessee access to the licensed premises during any time reasonable and necessary to conduct lawful gambling on the premises and as agreed upon in this lease.





Dear Mr. Northfield:

As we discussed when we met to review your drainage situation, Crystal has limited authority in dealing with backyard drainage where only runoff from private property is involved. I am convinced much of your basement problem is directly related to the flat grade of your lawn and the moisture absorbing heavy clay soil. Because of the excessive amount of rainfall we have experienced this year, I have recently reviewed numerous similar situations.

There is no question the construction and grading on the adjacent property is not helping the situation, but the degree of its impact is questionable. Since some of the lot grading on that property is related to construction activities for which Crystal has issued permits, the City's Building Inspector, Bill Barber, will be contacting the owner next door about redirecting drainage to the street. Please note that the City's actions are related to the recent construction activities and not pre-existing drainage patterns from one lot to the next.

A copy of this letter will be forwarded to the City Council with their next meeting packet. A follow-up memo will be sent as corrective actions initiated by the Building Inspector are completed.
