WHEREAS, THE 1976 METROPOLITAN LAND PLANNING ACT (MINN. STAT. 473.869) PROVIDES A PROCEDURE FOR GRANTING EXTENSIONS UPON A FINDING OF "EXCEPTIONAL CIRCUMSTANCES OR UNDUE HARDSHIP"; AND

WHEREAS, THE METROPOLITAN COUNCIL IS STILL REVISING ITS GUIDELINES FOR REVIEW OF LOCAL COMPREHENSIVE PLANS; AND

WHEREAS, WASHINGTON COUNTY WILL BEGIN A PROCESS TO UPDATE ITS ENTIRE COMPREHENSIVE PLAN DURING THE 1990 CALENDAR YEAR FOLLOWING COMPLETION OF ITS 1990-94 STRATEGIC PLAN;

WHEREAS, COUNTY GOVERNMENT IS THE GOVERNMENTAL UNIT MOST DIRECTLY RESPONSIBLE FOR PROVIDING HUMAN SERVICES SUCH AS CHILD CARE, SERVICES TO THE MENTALLY ILL, RETARDED, CHEMICALLY DEPENDENT AND THE ELDERLY, AND SERVICES TO PROTECT VULNERABLE ADULTS AND CHILDREN;

WHEREAS, COUNTY GOVERNMENT WILL BE FORCED TO CUT SPENDING FOR SERVICES IN ORDER TO BALANCE BUDGETS IN 1990 AND BEYOND;

WHEREAS, COUNTY GOVERNMENT MUST RETAIN LOCAL CASH OPERATING BALANCES AND EMERGENCY RESERVES AT FISCALLY PRUDENT LEVELS;

WHEREAS, CUTS PROPOSED BY THE GOVERNOR AND THE MINNESOTA SENATE WOULD RESULT IN REDUCTIONS IN NECESSARY COUNTY "RAINY DAY FUNDS" AND IN BASIC AND NECESSARY SERVICES TO COUNTY CITIZENS;

WHEREAS, CUTS PROPOSED BY THE GOVERNOR AND THE MINNESOTA SENATE WOULD REQUIRE A SERIES OF DIFFICULT AND CONTROVERSIAL BUDGET DECISIONS RELATING TO BOTH 1990 AND 1991 BUDGETS THROUGHOUT THIS SUMMER AND EARLY FALL, WITH SERIOUS NEGATIVE CONSEQUENCES FOR THE ONGOING OPERATING OF COUNTY GOVERNMENTS;

THE EAST 660 FEET OF THE NORTH 495 FEET (30 RODS) OF GOVERNMENT LOT 4, AND THAT PART OF THE EAST 660 FEET OF GOVERNMENT LOT 3, ALL IN SECTION 3, T32N, R21W, LYING SOUTHERLY OF THE FOLLOWING DESCRIBED LINE: BEGINNING AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SAID GOVERNMENT LOT 3; THENCE WESTERLY, ALONG THE SOUTH LINE OF GOVERNMENT LOT 3, A DISTANCE OF 320 FEET; THENCE NORTHWESTERLY, DEFLECTING TO THE RIGHT 46 DEGREES 00 MINUTES 00 SECONDS, A DISTANCE OF 480 FEET, MORE OR LESS, TO THE WEST LINE OF SAID EAST 660 FEET AND THERE TERMINATING.

- SECTION 2: THE ZONING ADMINISTRATOR IS HEREBY DIRECTED TO CHANGE THE WASHINGTON COUNTY ZONING ORDINANCE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE FOREGOING INSTRUMENT.

COUNTY-WIDE GROUND WATER PLAN (AMENDS RESOLUTION NO. 89-66)

WHEREAS, APPROXIMATELY 3 OF EVERY 4 MINNESOTANS, INCLUDING WASHINGTON COUNTY RESIDENTS, DEPEND ON GROUNDWATER FOR THEIR DRINKING WATER SUPPLY AND AN ESTIMATED 36.3% OF THE POPULATION IS SERVED BY PRIVATE WATER WELL SYSTEMS, AND

WHEREAS, THERE IS A GROWING CONCERN OVER THE IMPACT OF HUMAN ACTIVITIES ON GROUNDWATER QUALITY, AND

WHEREAS, WASHINGTON COUNTY HAS IDENTIFIED AN INCREASING NUMBER OF CASES OF SIGNIFICANT CONTAMINATION OR DEGRADATION OF GROUNDWATER IN THE PAST DECADE, AND

WHEREAS, THE 1988-89 WASHINGTON COUNTY COMMUNITY HEALTH SERVICES PLAN IDENTIFIED GROUNDWATER QUALITY AS A SIGNIFICANT PUBLIC HEALTH PROBLEM WARRANTING PRIORITY ATTENTION IN 1988-89, AND

WHEREAS, THE GOAL OF WASHINGTON COUNTY IS TO INSURE THAT RESIDENTS WILL HAVE ACCESS TO POTABLE WATER AND PREVENT FURTHER CONTAMINATION OF GROUNDWATER WITHIN THE COUNTY, AND

WHEREAS, THE 1987 MINNESOTA LEGISLATURE AUTHORIZED METROPOLITAN COUNTIES TO PREPARE AND ADOPT GROUNDWATER MANAGEMENT PLANS FOR THE PROTECTION, PRESERVATION, AND PROPER MANAGEMENT OF GROUNDWATER RESOURCES, AND

WHEREAS, THE STATE OF MINNESOTA, THROUGH ITS BOARD OF WATER AND SOIL RESOURCES, HAS MADE A \$15,600 GRANT AVAILABLE TO WASHINGTON COUNTY TO ASSIST THE COUNTY IN DEVELOPING A COUNTY GROUNDWATER PLAN; AND

WHEREAS, THE TERMS OF THE STATE GRANT REQUIRE WASHINGTON COUNTY TO CONTRIBUTE MATCHING FUNDS AND IN-KIND GOODS AND SERVICE EQUAL TO \$15,600.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF WASHINGTON COUNTY DIRECTS THE WASHINGTON COUNTY PLANNING DEPARTMENT TO DEVELOP A GROUNDWATER MANAGEMENT PLAN CONSISTENT WITH THE PROVISIONS OF M.S. 473.8785, AND

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, WASHINGTON COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS APPROVES OF WASHINGTON COUNTY ACCEPTING THE STATE GRANT, THE EXPENDITURE OF \$15,600 OF COUNTY FUNDS AND IN-KIND CONTRIBUTIONS FOR THE PURPOSE OF MATCHING THE STATE GRANT, AND AUTHORIZES THE EXECUTION OF THE GRANT AGREEMENT BY THE CHAIRPERSON OF THE BOARD AND THE COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR.

THE COUNTY OF WASHINGTON HEREBY ACKNOWLEDGES CONTINUED PARTICIPATION AS A MEMBER OF THE MINNESOTA COUNTIES INSURANCE TRUST BY THE ACCEPTANCE AND EXECUTION OF THE THREE PAGE REVISED JOINT POWERS AGREEMENT DENOTED AS "MINNESOTA COUNTIES INSURANCE TRUST, JOINT POWERS AGREEMENT, REVISED: MARCH 16, 1990," WHICH IS ATTACHED HERETO AND INCORPORATED HEREIN.

MINNESOTA COUNTIES INSURANCE TRUST JOINT POWERS AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made by and between the political subdivisions organized and existing under the Constitution and laws of the State of Minnesota, hereafter collectively referred to as "Members", and individually as "Member" which are parties signatory to this Agreement and listed in Appendix "A", which is attached hereto and made a part hereof. Members are sometimes referred to herein as "parties."

WHEREAS, Minnesota Statutes, Section 471.59 provides that two or more governmental units may by agreement jointly exercise any power common to the contracting parties; and

WHEREAS, Minnesota Statutes, Section 471.981 provides that two or more political subdivisions may by agreement establish a self-insurance pool; and

WHEREAS, political subdivisions may self-insure, purchase insurance through an authorized carrier, or any combination thereof; and

WHEREAS, the creation and operation of a joint self-insurance pool for political subdivisions is economically feasible and practical;

NOW THEREFORE in consideration of the mutual promises and agreements contained herein and subject to the provisions of Minnesota Statutes, Sections 471.59 and 471.981 and all other applicable statutes, rules and regulations, the parties hereto agree as follows:

Article I Purpose

The members desire to establish a mechanism whereby the members may jointly exercise powers common to each participating member to:

- A. Develop and administer a risk management service program;
- B. Prevent or lessen the frequency and severity of losses occurring in the operation of member functions;
- C. Defend and protect, in accordance with this agreement, bylaws and coverage documents, any member against stated liability or loss;
- D. Provide a mechanism for the delivery of employee benefits including, but not limited to group health insurance, and
- E. Provide other similar or related services and programs as determined by the Board.

The powers and duties created herein and the activities and services jointly provided to each member shall not constitute the procurement of insurance or operating an insurance business, unless specifically stated by resolution of the Board.

It is further the intent of the members to establish procedures whereby additional qualifying members may be added to this Agreement and to establish a mechanism whereby additional and/or alternative programs and services may be developed for the benefit of the members.

Article II Name

The name of this joint powers entity shall be the MINNESOTA COUNTIES INSURANCE TRUST, hereinafter sometimes referred to as the "Trust".

Article III Membership

Membership in the Trust shall be open to any governmental unit or other political subdivision as set forth in M.S. 471.59 Subdivision 1, and M.S. 471.981 including but not limited to joint powers agencies, of the State of Minnesota that are deemed by the Board of Directors of the Trust to qualify for membership. The Board may impose such conditions on membership as it deems appropriate to protect the interests of the Trust and to provide for the benefit of its members; and such conditions as are required by the Agreement, the Bylaws or by applicable statutes, rules or regulations. The Board, at its discretion, may create classes, levels or types of membership within the Trust with differing member rights, privileges or obligations.

Article IV Board Of Directors

There is hereby created a Board of Directors of the Trust, herein referred to as the "Board", which shall be empowered to oversee and administer the Trust. The Board shall be empowered to manage all the affairs of the Trust and to do all things necessary or convenient for the furtherance of the purposes of the Trust, including but not limited to: expending and receiving funds; entering into contracts, leases, and other agreements; renting, leasing, purchasing and otherwise procuring or receiving property real or personal; employing personnel either as employees or by contract; and employing consultants such as attorneys, auditors, accountants, risk managers, actuaries and others.

Article V Divisions

The Board shall be empowered to create divisions within the Trust as needed for the separation of Trust programs. The Board shall preside over and supervise the management, business and affairs of each division.

Article VI Bylaws & Operating Policies And Procedures

The Board shall adopt Bylaws which shall provide for the operation and administration of the Trust. The Board may adopt Operating Policies and Procedures to direct and document the specific activities of the Trust.

Article VII Term Of Agreement/Termination

This Agreement shall remain in effect until:

- A. Terminated by the mutual consent of the members:
- B. Suspended or superseded by a subsequent agreement between the members, or
- C. Terminated by operation of law.

Article VIII Withdrawal

No member may withdraw from this Agreement, or any division of the Trust created pursuant to Article V, for a period of three (3) years after its initial entry into the Trust or division whichever is later. A member may, after the initial three years, withdraw from this Agreement, or any division of the Trust created pursuant to Article V, upon giving sixty (60) days written notice to the Board, prior to the last day of the plan year. The withdrawal of a member shall not affect the continuance of the Trust or any division of the Trust by the remaining members. A member that withdraws shall remain jointly and severally liable for all debts, obligations and liabilities which were incurred on its behalf or by the Trust during the term of its membership. The liability of a member upon withdrawal shall be determined in accordance with the Bylaws and other applicable requirements. A member that ceases to qualify for participation in the Trust or terminates participation, shall have no right or claim to the reserves or other holdings of the Trust. The withdrawing member may be entitled to a share of the assets of the Trust only if deemed appropriate by the Board. The Board at its sole discretion may determine the nature and timing of any distribution of assets to a withdrawing member.

Article IX Assessments/Distributions

The amount of any liabilities in excess of assets, in any division of MCIT, shall be assessed to the appropriate members of the Trust in a form, manner and amount as determined by the Board.

The Board may, at its discretion, determine that an assessment is necessary to insure the financial integrity of the Trust, to operate and maintain the Trust or to carry out other purposes of the Trust pursuant to this Agreement. Such assessments shall be in a form, manner and amount as determined by the Board.

In the event that the assets, in any division of the Trust, are determined to be more than sufficient to meet liabilities and maintain prudent reserves, such surplus assets may be returned to members; credited toward future annual payments or otherwise utilized as determined by the Board

Article X Disposition Of Trust Property

In the event that the Trust is terminated, any property or other assets acquired by the Board shall be distributed to the members in a manner to be determined by the Board. However, sufficient reserves shall be retained and maintained consistent with the Trust's obligations and known or foreseeable risks, under this Agreement, the Bylaws, and applicable laws or regulations.

Article XI Other Agreements

This agreement replaces earlier joint powers agreements concerning the establishment and operation of the Trust. To the extent that previous agreements are inconsistent with the provisions of this agreement such earlier agreements are void. Entering into this agreement does not alter a members's initial entry date into the Trust or a division of the Trust for the purposes of calculating the minimum time necessary for withdrawal from the Trust or a division of the Trust. Failure to adopt this agreement does not constitute withdrawal from the Trust or alter a member's obligations for participation under the terms of earlier agreements.

PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT

COMMISSIONER MCMULLEN MOVED TO ADOPT RESOLUTION NO. 90-69 AS FOLLOWS:

NEGATIVE DECLARATION FOR AN EIS TILLER CORPORATION MINING OPERATION, DENMARK TOWNSHIP

WHEREAS, TILLER CORPORATION HAS APPLIED FOR A CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT FOR A MINING OPERATION; WHICH INDICATES THE OPERATION WILL EXCAVATE 40 ACRES OR MORE OF LAND TO A MEAN DEPTH OF 10 FEET OR MORE DURING ITS EXISTENCE AND MINNESOTA RULE 4410.4300, SUBP. 12 AND SUBP. 1 REQUIRES AN EAW BE PREPARED IN THIS SITUATION; AND

WHEREAS, WASHINGTON COUNTY AS THE RESPONSIBLE GOVERNMENT UNIT (RGU) HAS PREPARED AN EAW WHICH MEETS THE REQUIREMENTS OF MINNESOTA RULE 4410.1200 IN TERMS OF CONTENT AND HAS BEEN PUBLISHED AND DISTRIBUTED AS REQUIRED BY MINNESOTA RULE 4410.1500; AND

WHEREAS, THE COMMENT PERIOD FOR REVIEW HAS ELAPSED PURSUANT TO MINNESOTA RULE 4410.1600 AND A DECISION ON THE NEED FOR AN EIS IS REQUIRED PURSUANT TO MINNESOTA RULE 4410.1700; AND

WHEREAS, THE MAJOR ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUES OF CONCERN AS IDENTIFIED IN THE EAW ARE:

- (1) IMPACT OF AGRICULTURAL RUNOFF WHICH FLOWS INTO THE PIT. RUNOFF CONTAINING PESTICIDES OR NUTRIENTS FROM FERTILIZER COULD ADVERSELY AFFECT GROUNDWATER QUALITY. THE EAW IDENTIFIES MITIGATIVE MEASURES, SUCH AS STORMWATER MANAGEMENT SETTLING PONDS OR DIVERSION DITCHES, AS WELL AS GROUNDWATER MONITORING TECHNIQUES FOR CONTROLLING THESE IMPACTS.
- (2) IMPACT OF THE MINING OPERATION ON ERODIBLE SOILS. THE PROJECT CONTAINS ERODIBLE SOILS AND SHALLOW LIMESTONE FORMATIONS. THE EAW NOTES THAT RECLAMATION WILL BE IMPORTANT IN PREVENTING EROSION OF THE END LAND FORM. IT IDENTIFIES SEEDING OF SOIL STOCKPILES AS A METHOD OF PRESERVING SOILS TO BE USED IN RECLAMATION.

- (3) IMPACT OF THE MINING OPERATION ON O'CONNOR LAKE. THE LAKE IS LOCATED UP-GRADIENT FROM THE EXISTING AND PROPOSED MINING OPERATION. OVERFLOW RUNOFF FROM THE LAKE INTO THE LOWER ELEVATION OF THE PIT COULD CAUSE EROSION OF THE ACTUAL OVERFLOW PATH. THE EAW IDENTIFIES A SPILLWAY AND OVERFLOW ENERGY DISSIPATION STRUCTURE, AND DETERMINATION OF THE NEED FOR A DAM SAFETY PERMIT AS POSSIBLE MITIGATIVE MEASURES.
- (4) GENERAL CONCERNS ABOUT NOISE, DUST AND TRAFFIC. THE EAW IDENTIFIES THE CRUSHER, SCREENING OPERATIONS AND LOADING TO STOCKPILES AND TRUCKS AS THE MAJOR SOURCES OF DUST EMISSIONS. BECAUSE OF THE ESTIMATED QUALITY OF MATERIALS TO BE HANDLED AT THE FACILITY, AN AIR EMISSION FACILITY PERMIT IS REQUIRED BY THE MINNESOTA POLLUTION CONTROL AGENCY. THIS PERMIT WILL DETAIL REQUIRED AIR POLLUTION CONTROL EQUIPMENT.

NOISE GENERATED BY THE PROCESSING, SCREENING, AND TRANSFER EQUIPMENT, AS WELL AS BY THE EXCAVATING AND HAULING OPERATIONS. THE EAW STATES THAT NOISE CALCULATIONS CONCLUDE THAT APPLICABLE NOISE STANDARDS CAN BE COMPLIED WITH. THE MITIGATION TECHNIQUES IDENTIFIED INCLUDE LOCATING CRUSHING AND SCREENING EQUIPMENT TO TAKE ADVANTAGE OF THE ATTENUATING EFFECTS OF DISTANCE AND TOPOGRAPHY. STOCKPILE PLACEMENT CAN AID IN FURTHER NOISE REDUCTION.

TRAFFIC TO AND FROM THE MINE WILL USE 87TH STREET SOUTH AND COUNTY HIGHWAY 21. THE EAW CONCLUDES THAT THESE ROADS HAVE ADEQUATE CAPACITY TO HANDLE THE TRAFFIC EXPECTED FROM THE OPERATION.

AND

WHEREAS, THE WASHINGTON COUNTY MINING ORDINANCE AND CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT PROVISIONS IN THE WASHINGTON COUNTY ZONING ORDINANCE PROVIDE A MECHANISM FOR REQUIRING AN APPLICANT TO EVALUATE AND DEMONSTRATE POTENTIAL IMPACTS AND MITIGATE SIGNIFICANT IMPACTS; AND

WHEREAS, THE RGU HAS COMPARED THE IMPACTS THAT MAY REASONABLY BE EXPECTED TO OCCUR FROM THIS PROJECT WITH THE TYPE, EXTENT AND REVERSIBILITY OF ENVIRONMENTAL EFFECTS, CUMULATIVE POTENTIAL EFFECTS ON RELATED OR ANTICIPATED FUTURE PROJECTS, EXTENT TO WHICH THE ENVIRONMENTAL EFFECTS ARE SUBJECT TO MITIGATION BY ONGOING PUBLIC REGULATORY AUTHORITY, AND THE EXTENT TO WHICH THE ENVIRONMENTAL EFFECTS CAN BE ANTICIPATED AND CONTROLLED AS A RESULT OF OTHER ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES UNDERTAKEN BY PUBLIC AGENCIES OR THE PROJECT PROPOSER AND HAS CONCLUDED THAT THE IDENTIFIABLE MAJOR ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUES CAN BE ADEQUATELY ADDRESSED THROUGH THE CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT PROCESS.

BASED ON THE FOREGOING

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT THE WASHINGTON COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS AS THE RGU, MAKES A NEGATIVE DECLARATION OF THE NEED FOR AN EIS IN CONNECTION WITH THE APPLICATION OF TILLER CORPORATION FOR A CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT FOR THEIR MINING OPERATION IN DENMARK TOWNSHIP.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT THE MAJOR AREAS OF ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUES BE SATISFIED BEFORE THE ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT BY THE WASHINGTON COUNTY PLANNING COMMISSION.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE WASHINGTON COUNTY ZONING ORDINANCE REGULATING LAND USE IN WASHINGTON COUNTY.

PAUL, MINNEAPOLIS AND OMAHA RAILROAD AS LOCATED AND CONSTRUCTED ACROSS SAID SECTION. B) THAT PART OF THE SW 1/4 LOCATED SOUTHERLY AND EASTERLY THEREOF OF THE SAID RAILROAD RIGHT-OF-WAY. C) A PARCEL CONTAINING 80 ACRES, MORE OR LESS, BOUNDED AND DESCRIBED AS FOLLOWS; COMMENCING AT THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF SAID SECTION AND RUNNING THENCE EAST 575 FEET ALONG THE SOUTH LINE THEREOF; THENCE NORTH AT RIGHT ANGLES TO SAID SOUTH LINE 108.9 FEET TO AN IRON PIPE MONUMENT SET ON THE NORTHERLY RIGHT-OF-WAY LINE OF CHICAGO, ST. PAUL, MINNEAPOLIS AND OMAHA RAILROAD, SAID IRON PIPE MONUMENT BEING THE POINT OF BEGINNING; THENCE CONTINUING NORTH ALONG SAID RIGHT ANGLE LINE 860.1 FEET TO AN IRON PIPE MONUMENT; THENCE EAST AT RIGHT ANGLES 641.45 FEET TO AN IRON PIPE MONUMENT; THENCE EAST AT RIGHT ANGLES 1672 FEET, MORE OR LESS, TO THE EAST AND WEST QUARTER-SECTION LINE OF SAID SECTION; THENCE EAST 1378 FEET, MORE OR LESS, TO THE CENTER OF SAID SECTION; THENCE SOUTH ALONG THE NORTH AND SOUTH QUARTER-SECTION LINE OF SAID SECTION TO ITS INTERSECTION WITH THE NORTHERLY RIGHT-OF-WAY OF THE CHICAGO, ST. PAUL, MINNEAPOLIS AND OMAHA RAILROAD, THENCE SOUTHWESTERLY ALONG SAID NORTHERLY RIGHT-OF-WAY OF THE CHICAGO, ST. PAUL, MINNEAPOLIS AND OMAHA RAILROAD, THENCE SOUTHWESTERLY ALONG SAID NORTHERLY LINE OF SAID RAILROAD TO THE POINT OF BEGINNING. D) THE SOUTH 876.57 FEET OF THE SW 1/4 OF SECTION 8, T29N, R20W, BAYTOWN TOWNSHIP, WASHINGTON COUNTY,

MINNESOTA, EXCEPTING THEREFROM THE WEST 90 FEET THEREOF, ALSO EXCEPTING ALL THAT PART THEREOF WHICH LIES SOUTH OF THE RIGHT-OF-WAY OF THE C., ST. P., M. AND O. SECTION 2: THE ZONING ADMINISTRATOR IS HEREBY DIRECTED TO CHANGE THE WASHINGTON COUNTY ZONING ORDINANCE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE FOREGOING INSTRUMENT.

SECTION 3: EFFECTIVE DATE. THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE AND IS HEREBY DECLARED TO BE IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT FROM AND AFTER ITS PASSAGE AND PUBLICATION ACCORDING TO LAW.
