REVISED COUNTY SMOKING POLICY

COMMISSIONER EVERT MOVED TO ADOPT THE REVISED COUNTY SMOKING POLICY AS FOLLOWS:

SMOKING IN COUNTY FACILITIES

POLICY

TO MEET THE INTENT OF THE COUNTY EMPLOYEE WELLNESS PROGRAM, AND IN AN ATTEMPT TO REDUCE SIDE-STREAM SMOKE, WASHINGTON COUNTY IS A SMOKE-FREE WORKPLACE EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 1990.

SCOPE: ALL COUNTY OWNED AND OPERATED FACILITIES ARE DESIGNATED SMOKE-FREE EXCEPT FOR THE FOLLOWING:

- 1. COUNTY VEHICLES SMOKING IS PERMITTED IN A COUNTY VEHICLE ONLY WHEN THE VEHICLE IS BEING OCCUPIED SOLELY BY A SMOKING DRIVER, OR WHEN ALL OCCUPANTS ARE SMOKERS. IF ANY OCCUPANT IS A NON-SMOKER, OR OBJECTS TO THE SMOKING, THE VEHICLE SHALL BE DESIGNATED AS NON-SMOKING.
- 2. SHERIFF'S OFFICE SMOKING SHALL BE PERMITTED IN THE JAIL PROPER FOR SMOKING INMATES. EMPLOYEES ASSIGNED TO THE JAIL PROPER WILL BE PERMITTED TO SMOKE IN A DESIGNATED AREA SO DEFINED BY THE COUNTY SHERIFF.

SMOKING IS PERMITTED IN A DESIGNATED AREA OF THE COMMUNICATIONS CENTER ONLY WHEN ALL OCCUPANTS ARE SMOKERS. IF ANY OCCUPANT IS A NON-SMOKER, OR OBJECTS TO THE SMOKING, THE CENTER SHALL BE DESIGNATED AS NON-SMOKING.

SMOKING WILL BE PERMITTED IN THE INTERVIEW/
INTERROGATION ROOMS ONLY WHEN CIRCUMSTANCES
DICTATE AND ONLY FOR THE INDIVIDUAL BEING
INTERROGATED. SUCH AN AREA WILL NOT BE A
SMOKING ROOM FOR EMPLOYEES.

3. JURY DELIBERATION ROOM - SMOKING WILL BE PERMITTED IN THE DESIGNATED AREA OF THE JURY DELIBERATION ROOM. SUCH AN AREA IS FOR JURORS ONLY AND WILL NOT BE A SMOKING ROOM FOR EMPLOYEES.

ALL COUNTY FACILITIES ARE SIGNED AS SMOKE-FREE. SUCH SIGNS SHALL INCLUDE A WARNING THAT ACTION WILL BE TAKEN IF SMOKING OCCURS IN THE FACILITIES.

EMPLOYEES FOUND SMOKING IN A COUNTY FACILITY WILL BE ADVISED THAT DISCIPLINARY ACTION MAY BE TAKEN AS A VIOLATION OF A WRITTEN COUNTY WORK RULE. IN ADDITION, WHERE APPROPRIATE FOR BOTH THE PUBLIC AND EMPLOYEES, SMOKING IN A DESIGNATED NON-SMOKING AREA MAY BE A VIOLATION OF THE MINNESOTA INDOOR CLEAN AIR ACT.

DEPARTMENT HEADS AND SUPERVISORS ARE ENCOURAGED TO PROVIDE FLEXIBLE BREAKS FOR EMPLOYEES WHO ARE SMOKERS. SUCH FLEXIBILITY, HOWEVER, MUST NOT PERMIT LONGER BREAK TIME FOR SMOKERS THAN THAT AFFORDED TO ALL EMPLOYEES AS PRESCRIBED IN COUNTY POLICY OR BARGAINING AGREEMENTS.

ALL EMPLOYMENT ADS SHALL DESIGNATE THE COUNTY AS A SMOKE-FREE EMPLOYER.

THE SHERIFF PRESENTED A REQUEST TO HIRE 2.5 FTE IN CLERICAL SUPPORT. COMMISSIONER MCMULLEN MOVED TO AUTHORIZE HIRE OF 2.5 FTE CLERICAL SUPPORT IN THE SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT WITH THE UNDERSTANDING THAT THESE POSITIONS BE IDENTIFIED AS SPECIAL PROJECTS WHICH WILL BE FUNDED BY AGREEMENTS WITH THE CITIES OF NEWPORT, ST. - 2) ONE OF THE MAJOR DANGERS FOR BOATERS USING THE RIVER DURING TIMES OF HIGH WATER IS THE INCREASED AMOUNT OF DEBRIS FLOATING IN THE RIVER AT SUCH TIMES; AND
- 3) MOST OF THE PROBLEMS ASSOCIATED WITH HIGH WATER LEVELS ON THE ST. CROIX RIVER OCCUR WHENEVER WATER LEVELS REACH 683.0 FEET MEAN SEA LEVEL AS MEASURED AT THE STILLWATER GAUGE; AND
- 4) A STUDY DONE BY THE LOWER ST. CROIX MANAGEMENT COMMISSION INDICATES THAT SOME OF THE AFOREMENTIONED PROBLEMS WOULD BE ALLEVIATED IF STATE RULE 6105.0330 WERE AMENDED TO PROVIDE A RIVER-WIDE NO WAKE PROVISION ANY TIME THE ST. CROIX RIVER REACHES OR EXCEEDS AN ELEVATION OF 683.0 FEET MEAN SEA LEVEL AS MEASURED AT THE STILLWATER GAUGE;

WHEREAS, THERE IS CONCERN ABOUT PROPERTY DAMAGE TO BOATS BEACHED AT CATFISH BAR CAUSED BY WAKE ACTION; AND SPECIFICALLY:

- 1) THERE IS A CONFLICT WITH TRAFFIC FROM THE MARINAS IN AFTON CROSSING THE NAVIGATIONAL CHANNEL TO CATFISH BAR WITH THE WATERCRAFT TRAVELING UP AND DOWN STREAM; AND
- 2) THERE IS A CONFLICT WITH FISHING BOATS ANCHORED IN THE AREA; AND
- BOAT PER 10 ACRES OF WATER SURFACE ON PEAK DAYS;

APRIL 2, 1991

- 4) 144 BOATERS REQUESTED BY PETITION, THAT A SLOW-NO WAKE ZONE BE ESTABLISHED IN THE AREA DUE TO CONCERN ABOUT BOATING SAFETY AND TRAFFIC AS A RESULT OF THE NATURE OF THE USERS AND THE CROSS-TRAFFIC; AND
- 5) THE NAVIGATIONAL CHANNEL CANNOT BE WIDENED TO ALLOW MORE ROOM FOR THE WATERCRAFT.

WHEREAS, A BILL HAS BEEN INTRODUCED IN THE MINNESOTA LEGISLATURE, SENATE FILE 256 AND HOUSE FILE 303, AMENDING MINNESOTA STATUTES, SECTION 473.803, SUBDIVISION 1.A.; AND

WHEREAS, THESE AMENDMENTS PROVIDE FOR EXCLUDING LAND FROM CONSIDERATION FOR A SITE FOR SOLID WASTE LANDFILLS IF ON-SITE INVESTIGATIONS INDICATE THAT THE TRAVEL TIME OF WATER FROM SURFACE TO GROUNDWATER RESOURCES IS TEN YEARS OR LESS AND THE LAND IS RECOGNIZED AS A SENSITIVE AREA; AND

WHEREAS, THE ORIGINAL LANDFILL SITING PROCESS MANDATED BY SECTION 473.803 DID NOT ALLOW FOR CONSIDERATION OF THE ABOVE MENTIONED ENVIRONMENTAL CHARACTERISTICS ON AN AREA AND WAS BASED ON GEOGRAPHICAL AREAS; AND

WHEREAS, MORE IS NOW KNOWN ABOUT THE ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACTS OF LANDFILLS ON AN AREA THAN WAS KNOWN WHEN THE ORIGINAL LANDFILL SITING PROCESS WAS INITIATED; AND

WHEREAS, THE PROPOSED AMENDMENTS BETTER ADDRESS THE ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT OF A LANDFILL UPON THE STATE'S LAND AND WATER RESOURCES; AND

WHEREAS, THE METROPOLITAN COUNCIL IN THEIR POSITION PAPER FOR LEGISLATION ON LANDFILL SITING, DATED MARCH 1991, SUPPORTS LEGISLATION TO EXCLUDE CERTAIN LAND USE CLASSIFICATIONS INCLUDING REGIONAL PARKS AND THE MISSISSIPPI RIVER CRITICAL AREA FROM THE INVENTORY PROCESS FOR SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL FACILITIES; AND

WHEREAS, THE PROTECTION OF GROUNDWATER QUALITY IS VITAL TO THE LONG TERM HEALTH AND WELFARE OF THE PUBLIC; AND

WHEREAS, THE PRINCIPLES OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AND LAND USE SUITABILITY MUST BE KEY CONSIDERATIONS TO ANY LANDFILL SITING PROCESS; AND

WHEREAS, THE WASHINGTON COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS IS DEEPLY CONCERNED ABOUT OUR DETERIORATING ENVIRONMENT AND SUPPORTS LEGISLATION WHICH WOULD AFFORD BETTER PROTECTION OF THE ENVIRONMENT.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE WASHINGTON COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS DECLARE ITS SUPPORT OF SENATE FILE 256 AND HOUSE FILE 303 AND STRONGLY URGES ENACTMENT.

COMMISSIONER HAUSER SECONDED THE MOTION AND IT WAS ADOPTED UNANIMOUSLY; COMMISSIONER SCHEEL ABSENT.

WHEREAS, THE METROPOLITAN COUNCIL IN THEIR POSITION PAPER FOR LEGISLATION ON LANDFILL SITING, DATED MARCH 1991, SUPPORTS LEGISLATION TO EXCLUDE CERTAIN LAND USE CLASSIFICATIONS INCLUDING AND THE MISSISSIPPI RIVER CRITICAL REGIONAL PARKS AREA FROM THE INVENTORY PROCESS FOR SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL FACILITIES; AND

WHEREAS, THE WASHINGTON COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS SUPPORTS DECISIONS WHICH PROTECT THE ENVIRONMENT.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE WASHINGTON COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS SUPPORTS SENATE FILE 825 AND HOUSE FILE 1047.

CHAIRMAN SCHEEL CALLED FOR FURTHER COMMENTS. NONE WERE HEARD. COMMISSIONER EVERT MOVED, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER HAUSER TO CLOSE THE PUBLIC HEARING AND IT WAS ADOPTED UNANIMOUSLY.

EXHIBIT A CONDITIONS TO EXCLUSION FROM DESIGNATION RECOMP, INC. - ST. CLOUD FACILITY

IN THE MATTER OF ITS PETITION FOR EXCLUSION OF CERTAIN WASTE FROM DESIGNATION UNDER WASHINGTON COUNTY SOLID WASTE ORDINANCE SECTION XI, AND ITS MANAGEMENT OF THE EXCLUDED WASTE AT RECOMP, INC.'S FACILITY IN ST. CLOUD, MINNESOTA ("THE FACILITY"), RECOMP OF MINNESOTA, INC., A MINNESOTA CORPORATION, A SUBSIDIARY OF RECOMP, INC., A DELAWARE CORPORATION, A SUBSIDIARY OF BONNEVILLE PACIFIC CORPORATION,

A DELAWARE CORPORATION (THE "PETITIONER"), AGREES TO THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS TO THE EXCLUSION:

1. THE PETITIONER SHALL SUBMIT REPORTS TO WASHINGTON COUNTY ON FORMS PROVIDED BY RAMSEY AND WASHINGTON COUNTIES (THE COUNTIES) WITHIN THIRTY DAYS FOLLOWING THE END OF THE MONTH OR QUARTER.

ON A MONTHLY BASIS THESE REPORTS SHALL STATE:

- A. VOLUMES AND TYPES OF EXCLUDED WASTE DELIVERED FROM EACH OF THE COUNTIES TO THE FACILITY;
- B. NAMES(S) OF LICENSED HAULERS(S) COLLECTING EXCLUDED WASTE;
- C. THE DATES ON WHICH EXCLUDED WASTE WAS COLLECTED BY EACH HAULER;
- D. THE GENERATOR FROM WHOM EXCLUDED WASTE WAS COLLECTED BY EACH HAULER;
- E. TONS OF EXCLUDED WASTE COLLECTED FROM THE TWO COUNTIES EACH DAY;
- F. TOTAL TONS OF EXCLUDED WASTE DELIVERED TO THE FACILITY PER MONTH PER COUNTY.

ON A QUARTERLY BASIS THESE REPORTS SHALL STATE:

- A. THE TYPES AND VOLUMES OF PRODUCTS, INCLUDING RESIDUE, DERIVED FROM EXCLUDED WASTE DELIVERED FROM THE COUNTIES;
- B. THE MARKETS OR SOLID WASTE FACILITIES TO WHICH THE PRODUCTS WERE DELIVERED, INCLUDING WHERE RESIDUE WAS DELIVERED;
- C. THE AMOUNT OF FINISHED COMPOST PRODUCT FROM THE COUNTIES' EXCLUDED WASTE; AND
- D. A CALCULATION OF THE MASS BALANCE OF THE PROCESSING SYSTEM FOR THE MONTH FOR WASTE FROM THE COUNTIES, WHICH DETERMINES THE PERCENTAGE OF PRODUCT MARKETED AND THE PERCENTAGE OF RESIDUE MANAGED FROM THE COUNTIES' WASTE.
- 2. THE PETITIONER SHALL PROVIDE ACCESS TO RECORDS TO WASHINGTON COUNTY OR ITS AGENTS UPON REASONABLE NOTICE TO ALLOW THE COUNTY TO VERIFY COMPLIANCE WITH THE CONDITIONS OF THIS EXCLUSION.
- 3. THE PETITIONER SHALL GRANT ACCESS TO WASHINGTON COUNTY TO INSPECT THE FACILITY AT ANY REASONABLE TIME TO VERIFY COMPLIANCE WITH THE CONDITIONS OF THIS EXCLUSION.
- 4. THE PETITIONER SHALL MAINTAIN THE FACILITY IN ACCORDANCE WITH ALL PERMITS AND LICENSES, AND SHALL COMPLY WITH ALL APPLICABLE RULES, REGULATIONS AND LAWS RELATED TO OPERATION OF THE FACILITY.
- 5. THE PETITIONER SHALL PROCESS THE EXCLUDED WASTE PURSUANT TO THE PETITION FOR EXCLUSION, WHICH IS INCORPORATED INTO THESE CONDITIONS, AND SHALL RECOVER THE MARKET AT LEAST 30% OF THE WASTE DELIVERED FROM WASHINGTON COUNTY GENERATORS LEAVING NO MORE THAN 45% OF RESIDUE AND UNPROCESSED MATERIAL. ALL NONCOMPOSTABLE MATERIALS, RESIDUE AND UNPROCESSED MATERIALS THAT ARE ACCEPTABLE AT THE ELK RIVER RESOURCE RECOVERY FACILITY SHALL BE DELIVERED TO THE ELK RIVER

RESOURCE RECOVERY FACILITY FOR FURTHER PROCESSING.

- THE PETITIONER SHALL DEMONSTRATE THAT THE EXCLUDED TONNAGE IS ACTUALLY DELIVERED TO THE FACILITY IN THE FOLLOWING MANNER: AT THE END OF EACH CALENDAR YEAR THE TONS OF EXCLUDED WASTE DELIVERED TO THE FACILITY OVER THE PREVIOUS YEAR, AS REPORTED BY THE PETITIONER IN THE MONTHLY REPORTS, SHALL BE COMPARED BY RAMSEY AND WASHINGTON COUNTIES WITH THE QUANTITY EXCLUDED. IF THE ACTUAL QUANTITY OF WASTE DELIVERED OVER THIS PERIOD IS LESS THAN 80% OF THE EXCLUDED AMOUNT, THE EXCLUSION MAY BE MODIFIED BY WASHINGTON COUNTY. THE MODIFICATIONS MAY INCLUDE REDUCING THE QUANTITY OF WASTE EXCLUDED TO THE LEVEL DELIVERED DURING THE PREVIOUS CALENDAR YEAR.
- 7. THE PETITIONER AGREES THAT ACTUAL DELIVERIES OF WASTE FROM RAMSEY COUNTY TO THE FACILITY SHALL NOT EXCEED THE EXCLUDED TONNAGE, 1,387 TONS, AND THAT ACTUAL DELIVERIES OF WASTE FROM WASHINGTON COUNTY TO THE FACILITY SHALL NOT EXCEED THE EXCLUDED TONNAGE, 438 TONS, AS CALCULATED FOR ANY CONSECUTIVE TWELVE MONTH PERIOD.
- 8. THE TERM OF THIS EXCLUSION SHALL BE 20 YEARS.
- 9. THE PETITIONER AGREES THAT RAMSEY COUNTY AND WASHINGTON COUNTY MAY SUSPEND THE EXCLUSION FOR DESIGNATION FOR A QUANTITY OF WASTE NOT TO EXCEED 60 TONS PER CALENDAR YEAR. SUCH SUSPENSION SHALL OCCUR AFTER TWO WEEKS OF RECEIPT OF WRITTEN NOTICE BY RAMSEY COUNTY OR WASHINGTON COUNTY THAT SUCH A SUSPENSION IS NECESSARY.
- 10. THE EXCLUSION SHALL APPLY TO 1,825 TONS PER YEAR OF WASTE, OR FIVE TONS PER DAY, CALCULATED ON A 365 DAY BASIS FOR BOTH RAMSEY AND WASHINGTON COUNTIES, OR 1.2 TONS PER DAY FOR WASHINGTON CALCULATED ON A 365 DAY BASIS. YARD WASTE IS NOT EXCLUDED WASTE. THE TYPES OF WASTE TO BE EXCLUDED IS DESCRIBED AS FOLLOWS:

WASTE FROM BURGER KING RESTAURANTS INCLUDING FOOD WASTE, PAPER, AND PLASTIC. THE NONCOMPENSABLE PORTION COMPRISES ABOUT 15% OF THE TOTAL.

- 11. THE PETITIONER AGREES THAT IT SHALL MARKET ALL COMPOST AND RECYCLABLE PRODUCTS DERIVED FROM WASTE EXCLUDED FROM DESIGNATION PURSUANT TO THIS EXCLUSION.
- 12. THE PETITIONER AGREES THAT THE EXCLUDED WASTE SHALL BE RESTRICTED TO WASTE FROM BURGER KING RESTAURANTS. THE PETITIONER FURTHER AGREES THAT IT SHALL CONTRACT DIRECTLY WITH BURGER KING TO OBTAIN THE EXCLUDED WASTE IN ORDER TO MAINTAIN CONTROL OVER THE COLLECTION OF EXCLUDED WASTE. IN THE EVENT BURGER KING'S HAULER DELIVERS AN UNACCEPTABLE LOAD TO THE FACILITY, THE PETITIONER SHALL NOTIFY WASHINGTON COUNTY WITHIN 24 HOURS OF THE DELIVERY WITH DETAILED INFORMATION ABOUT THE REJECTED LOAD.
- 13. THE PETITIONER AGREES THAT PRODUCTS DERIVED FROM WASTE EXCLUDED FROM DESIGNATION PURSUANT TO THIS EXCLUSION SHALL NOT BE STORED FOR A PERIOD IN EXCESS OF ONE YEAR BEFORE MARKETING. IN THE EVENT THE PETITIONER IS UNABLE TO MARKET THE PRODUCTS IN THIS TIME, THE PETITIONER MUST NOTIFY THE WASHINGTON COUNTY PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT. THE DEPARTMENT MAY GRANT AN EXTENSION TO THIS PROVISION OR MAY DIRECT THE PETITIONER TO DELIVER THE MATERIAL TO THE RAMSEY/WASHINGTON COUNTY RESOURCE RECOVERY FACILITY AND PAY THE TIPPING FEE IN EFFECT AT THAT TIME. IN NO EVENT SHALL UNMARKETABLE PRODUCT BE DELIVERED TO A LANDFILL OR RESOURCE RECOVERY FACILITY.

- 14. THE PETITIONER AGREES THAT THE CONDITIONS OF THE EXCLUSION MAY ONLY BE AMENDED UPON WRITTEN REQUEST TO THE WASHINGTON COUNTY PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT, AND FURTHER AGREES THAT THE AMENDMENT PROCESS SHALL BE THE SAME AS THE PROCESS USED TO CONSIDER PETITIONS FOR EXCLUSION FROM DESIGNATION.

- 16. PETITIONER AGREES THAT THE VIOLATION OF ANY OF THESE CONDITIONS SHALL BE GROUNDS FOR REVOCATION OF THE EXCLUSION. SHOULD A VIOLATION OCCUR THE WASHINGTON COUNTY PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT HAS THE AUTHORITY TO PROVIDE WRITTEN NOTICE TO THE PETITIONER REQUIRING CORRECTION OF THE VIOLATION. SHOULD THE VIOLATION NOT CORRECTED IN A REASONABLE TIME, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL BRING FORWARD A REQUEST TO THE WASHINGTON COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS TO REVOKE THE EXCLUSION. SAID TAX LEVIES ARE SUCH THAT IF COLLECTED IN FULL THEY WILL PRODUCE AT LEAST FIVE PERCENT (5%) IN EXCESS OF THE ESTIMATED AMOUNT NEEDED TO MEET WHEN DUE THE RENTAL PAYMENTS ON THE LEASE. SAID TAX LEVIES SHALL BE IRREVOCABLE UNTIL EXPIRATION OF THE TERM OF THE LEASE; PROVIDED THAT SUCH LEVIES MAY BE CANCELLED OR REDUCED PROVIDED THE COUNTY HAS SUFFICIENT MONIES ON HAND WITH WHICH TO PAY RENTAL PAYMENTS DUE PURSUANT TO THE LEASE, OR PROVIDED THAT THE RENTAL PAYMENTS AS FINALLY DETERMINED ARE LESS THEN ESTIMATED.

THE TAXING POWERS OF THE COUNTY SHALL BE AND ARE HEREBY IRREVOCABLY PLEDGED FOR THE PROMPT AND FULL PAYMENT OF THE RENTAL PAYMENTS ON THE LEASE, AS THE SAME RESPECTIVELY BECOME DUE AND PAYABLE.

SECTION 6. THAT THE APPROVAL HEREBY GIVEN TO THE VARIOUS DOCUMENTS REFERRED TO ABOVE INCLUDES AN APPROVAL OF SUCH ADDITIONAL DETAILS THEREIN, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO THOSE DETAILS SET FORTH BELOW, AS MAY BE NECESSARY AND APPROPRIATE AND SUCH MODIFICATIONS THERETO, DELETIONS THEREFROM AND ADDITIONS THERETO AS MAY BE NECESSARY AND APPROPRIATE AND APPROVED BY THE COUNTY ATTORNEY PRIOR TO THE EXECUTION OF THE DOCUMENTS. THE EXECUTION OF ANY INSTRUMENT BY THE APPROPRIATE OFFICER OR OFFICERS OF THE COUNTY HEREIN AUTHORIZED SHALL BE CONCLUSIVE EVIDENCE OF THE APPROVAL OF SUCH DOCUMENTS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE TERMS THEREOF. IN THE

ABSENCE OF THE CHAIRMAN OR THE COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR, ANY OF THE DOCUMENTS AUTHORIZED BY THIS RESOLUTION TO BE EXECUTED MAY BE EXECUTED BY SUCH OFFICERS AS, IN THE OPINION OF THE COUNTY ATTORNEY, MAY EXECUTE DOCUMENTS IN THEIR STEAD.

SECTION 7. THAT THE COUNTY SHALL CREATE ON ITS BOOKS A SPECIAL FUND TO BE DESIGNED THE "JAIL FACILITY FUND" TO BE HELD AND ADMINISTERED BY THE TREASURER OF THE COUNTY SEPARATE AND APART FROM ALL OTHER FUNDS OF THE COUNTY. THE FUND SHALL BE MAINTAINED IN THE MANNER SPECIFIED UNTIL ALL OF THE RENTAL PAYMENTS DUE PURSUANT TO THE LEASE HAVE BEEN FULLY PAID. IN THE FUND THERE SHALL BE MAINTAINED TWO SEPARATE ACCOUNTS, TO BE DESIGNATED AS THE "CAPITAL ACCOUNT" AND THE "DEBT SERVICE ACCOUNT," RESPECTIVELY.

CAPITAL ACCOUNT. THE PROCEEDS FROM THE SALE OF THE SERIES 1991 BONDS PAID TO THE COUNTY BY THE ISSUER, LESS ANY ACCRUED INTEREST RECEIVED THEREON AND RETAINED BY THE ISSUER, PLUS INVESTMENT EARNINGS ON AMOUNTS ON DEPOSIT IN THE CAPITAL ACCOUNT, SHALL BE CREDITED TO THE CAPITAL ACCOUNT, FROM WHICH THERE SHALL BE PAID ALL COSTS AND EXPENSES RELATING TO THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE JAIL FACILITY AND RELATED IMPROVEMENTS, INCLUDING WITHOUT LIMITATION, ACQUISITION COSTS, DEVELOPMENT COSTS, FINANCING COSTS AND THE COST OF ANY CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTS HERETOFORE LET AND ALL OTHER COSTS INCURRED AND TO BE INCURRED, OF THE KIND AUTHORIZED IN MINNESOTA STATUTES, SECTION 473.65. UPON COMPLETION OF, AND PAYMENT OF THE COSTS RELATING TO, THE JAIL FACILITY, FUNDS REMAINING IN THE CAPITAL ACCOUNT SHALL BE TRANSFERRED TO THE DEBT SERVICE ACCOUNT. THE TREASURER MAY FROM TIME TO TIME WITHDRAW OR SET ASIDE AMOUNTS ON DEPOSIT IN THE CAPITAL ACCOUNT WHICH ARE ATTRIBUTABLE TO INVESTMENT EARNINGS IN EXCESS OF THE ARBITRAGE YIELD ON THE BONDS FOR THE PURPOSE OF RESERVING FOR THE COUNTY'S OBLIGATION TO MAKE REBATE PAYMENTS TO THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA.

DEBT SERVICE ACCOUNT. THERE IS HEREBY PLEDGED AND THERE SHALL BE CREDITED TO THE DEBT SERVICE ACCOUNT (A) ALL TAXES LEVIED FOR THE PAYMENT OF THE RENTAL PAYMENTS, AS SET FORTH HEREIN OR HERETOFORE PROVIDED, (B) INVESTMENT EARNINGS ON AMOUNTS ON DEPOSIT IN THE DEBT SERVICE ACCOUNT, AND (C) ALL FUNDS REMAINING IN THE CAPITAL ACCOUNT AFTER COMPLETION OF THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE JAIL FACILITY AND PAYMENT OF THE COSTS THEREOF. THE DEBT SERVICE ACCOUNT HEREIN CREATED SHALL BE USED SOLELY (X) TO PAY THE RENTAL PAYMENTS PURSUANT TO THE LEASE AND (Y) TO PAY ANY AMOUNTS REQUIRED TO BE REBATED WITH RESPECT TO THE SERIES 1991 BONDS TO THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA PURSUANT TO SECTION 148 OF THE INTERNAL REVENUE CODE OF 1986, AS AMENDED.

SECTION 8. THAT THE COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR IS HEREBY AUTHORIZED AND DIRECTED TO FILE A CERTIFIED COPY OF THIS RESOLUTION WITH THE COUNTY AUDITOR, TOGETHER WITH SUCH OTHER INFORMATION AS EACH SHALL REQUIRE, AND TO OBTAIN FROM THE COUNTY AUDITOR A CERTIFICATE THAT THE LEASE HAS BEEN ENTERED IN SUCH AUDITOR'S BOND REGISTER.

SECTION 9. THAT THE COUNTY SHALL ANNUALLY, IN EACH OF THE YEARS 1992 THROUGH 2010, CONFIRM THE AMOUNT OF THE LEVY SET FORTH IN SECTION 5 HEREOF TO BE SPREAD UPON THE TAX ROLLS FOR THAT YEAR.

SECTION 10. THAT CHARLES SWANSON, WASHINGTON COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR, OR HIS SUCCESSOR IN OFFICE, IS HEREBY DESIGNATED AND AUTHORIZED TO ACT ON BEHALF OF THE COUNTY AS THE COUNTY REPRESENTATIVE, AS DEFINED IN THE LEASE.

SECTION 11. THAT THIS RESOLUTION SHALL BE IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT FROM AND AFTER ITS PASSAGE.

COMMISSIONER EVERT SECONDED THE MOTION AND IT WAS ADOPTED UNANIMOUSLY; COMMISSIONERS HEGBERG AND HAUSER ABSENT.

ADJOURNMENT

THERE BEING NO FURTHER BUSINESS TO COME BEFORE THE BOARD COMMISSIONER EVERT MOVED TO ADJOURN SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER MCMULLEN AND IT WAS ADOPTED UNANIMOUSLY; COMMISSIONERS HEGBERG AND HAUSER ABSENT. THE MEETING ADJOURNED AT 3:55 P.M.
