PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

COMMISSIONER MCMULLEN MOVED TO ADOPT **RESOLUTION NO. 91-017** AS FOLLOWS:

HAZARD ELIMINATION SAFETY PROGRAM

WHEREAS, UNDER THE FEDERAL HIGHWAY SAFETY ACT OF 1973, ONE OF THE OBJECTIVES SET FORTH BY THE

DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION IS THE CONFORMANCE OF ALL TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICES TO THE "MINNESOTA MANUAL ON UNIFORM TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICES FOR STREETS AND HIGHWAYS" (MMUTCD) AND,

WHEREAS, FUNDS ARE AVAILABLE THROUGH THE FEDERAL HIGHWAY ADMINISTRATION FOR THE CORRECTION OF REGULATORY AND WARNING SIGN DEFICIENCIES ON NON-FEDERAL AID LOCAL ROADS THROUGH THE HAZARD ELIMINATION SAFETY PROGRAM AND,

WHEREAS, WASHINGTON COUNTY IS DESIROUS OF BRINGING THE TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICES ON STREETS AND ROADS LOCATED WITHIN ITS GEOGRAPHICAL LIMITS INTO CONFORMANCE WITH MINNESOTA STANDARDS AND,

WHEREAS, REIMBURSEMENT (90% OF THE ELIGIBLE TOTAL COSTS) WILL BE BASED ON APPROVAL OF THE FIELD INSPECTION, MATERIALS CERTIFICATION AND REVIEW OF CLAIM DOCUMENTS AND,

WHEREAS, THE PARTICIPANT AGREES TO MAINTAIN ALL SUCH MATERIAL INSTALLATIONS IN SATISFACTORY CONDITION,

BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE WASHINGTON COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS DOES HEREBY AUTHORIZE THE COUNTY HIGHWAY ENGINEER TO ADMINISTER AND ACT AS PROJECT MANAGER ON BEHALF OF THE TOWNSHIPS AND SMALL CITIES.

COMMISSIONER EVERT SECONDED THE MOTION AND IT WAS ADOPTED UNANIMOUSLY.

HUMAN RESOURCES

THE HUMAN RESOURCES DIRECTOR PRESENTED A REVIEW OF PROPOSED CHANGES TO PERSONNEL RULES AND REGULATIONS, SECTIONS 2 AND 5, CONCERNING PART-TIME EMPLOYEES AND COUNTY SENIORITY AS IT RELATES TO COUNTY LAYOFFS. IT WAS BOARD CONSENSUS TO TABLE CONSIDERATION OF THE PROPOSED CHANGES TO THE JULY 16 BOARD MEETING.

THE HUMAN RESOURCES DIRECTOR UPDATED THE BOARD ON SECTION 18 (EMPLOYEE DEVELOPMENT) OF THE COUNTY PERSONNEL RULES AND REGULATIONS AND INDICATED THAT THIS ITEM WILL BE BACK FOR CONSIDERATION AT A FUTURE BOARD MEETING.

SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT

THE COUNTY SHERIFF PRESENTED AN ACTIVATION SCHEDULE FOR 1991 AND 1992 WHICH ESTABLISHES A TRANSITION TEAM COMPOSITION AND TIME SCHEDULE FOR HIRING STAFF FOR THE NEW LAW ENFORCEMENT CENTER. THE COUNTY CONTROLLER INDICATED THAT POSSIBLE FUNDING FOR THESE POSITIONS MAY BE AVAILABLE USING THE INVESTMENT PROCEEDS FROM THE BOND FUNDS.

COMMISSIONER MCMULLEN MOVED TO APPROVE THE ACTIVATION SCHEDULE FOR THE REMAINDER OF 1991 WHICH INCLUDES FOUR CORRECTIONAL/PATROL

OFFICERS, ONE CLERK SPECIALIST, ONE COMMUNICATIONS SUPERVISOR, AND ONE TRAINING OFFICER, WITH THE REMAINING FOUR HIRES FOR 1992 TO BE DISCUSSED DURING THE 1992 BUDGET HEARING PROCESS. COMMISSIONER HEGBERG SECONDED THE MOTION AND IT WAS ADOPTED UNANIMOUSLY.

THE BOARD REQUESTED THAT PUBLIC WORKS STAFF SCHEDULE A WORKSHOP TO DISCUSS THE POSSIBILITY OF HIRING AN OUTSIDE PROJECT SUPERVISOR DURING THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE LAW ENFORCEMENT CENTER. IT WAS ALSO SUGGESTED THAT THIS MAY BE AN ITEM FOR THE COST EFFECTIVE OPERATION COMMISSION TO DISCUSS AT THEIR NEXT MEETING.

THE FOREGOING CONSENT CALENDAR WAS UNANIMOUSLY ADOPTED.

PUBLIC HEARING - PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO ZONING ORDINANCE RELATING TO RAILROAD OPERATIONS

THE BOARD CHAIRMAN PRESENTED AN OVERVIEW OF TODAY'S PUBLIC HEARING TO CONSIDER AMENDMENTS TO THE ZONING ORDINANCE RELATING TO RAILROAD OPERATIONS. THE SECRETARY TO THE BOARD READ INTO THE RECORD THE NOTICE OF INTENT TO ADOPT SAID ORDINANCE. THE BOARD CHAIRMAN DECLARED THE PUBLIC HEARING OPEN AT 9:10 A.M.

THE ASSISTANT COUNTY ATTORNEY PRESENTED AN OVERVIEW OF EVENTS LEADING TO TODAY'S PUBLIC HEARING. HE ALSO STATED THAT THE MINNESOTA TRANSPORTATION MUSEUM HAS RECENTLY APPLIED FOR AN APPLICATION THROUGH THE INTERSTATE COMMERCE COMMISSION.

THE PUBLIC HEALTH DIVISION MANAGER READ INTO THE RECORD A LETTER RECEIVED FROM JOHN W. DIERS, MINNESOTA TRANSPORTATION MUSEUM, WHO WILL NOT BE APPEARING AT TODAY'S PUBLIC HEARING.

THE FOLLOWING INDIVIDUALS SPOKE: DAVID PARADEAU, MINNESOTA ZEPHYR, PRESENTED A HISTORY OF THE MINNESOTA ZEPHYR. HE FEELS IF HE IS RESTRICTED BY THE HOURS OF OPERATIONS AND NUMBER OF TRIPS ALLOWED BY THE ORDINANCE HE WILL BE FORCED TO RELOCATE WITH A LOSS OF BENEFITS TO THE COUNTY.

JIM KINDER, GRANT TOWNSHIP, READ INTO THE RECORD A LETTER FROM DAVID M. KONSCHNICK, DIRECTOR INTERSTATE COMMERCE COMMISSION. HE STATED THAT THE NUMBER OF TRIPS SHOULD BE LIMITED TO FIVE TRIPS PER WEEK, WITH NOT MORE THAN TWO IN ONE DAY AND WITH ONLY ONE TRAIN OUT ON THE TRACKS AT ANY ONE TIME.

RICHARD SCHUBERT, STILLWATER TOWNSHIP, PRESENTED AN AERIAL PHOTOGRAPH OF THE ENTIRE TRACK AND EXPLAINED THE ROUTE TO THE BOARD. HE STATED THE NUMBER OF TRIPS SHOULD BE LIMITED TO WHAT BURLINGTON NORTHERN WAS USING. HE SUGGESTED THAT ANOTHER SOLUTION WOULD BE FOR THE TRAIN TO USE THE TRACKS SOUTH OF STILLWATER INTO BAYPORT.

ANN THOMPSON, GRANT TOWNSHIP, REQUESTED THAT ROUND TRIPS BE REDUCED TO FIVE TRIPS A WEEK.

DIANE POLZIN, GRANT TOWNSHIP, FEELS THEY HAVE BEEN PUT ON VISUAL DISPLAY WHILE THEY TRY TO WORK AND RELAX IN THEIR BACKYARDS; THE TRAINS ARE PARKED FOR 15 TO 20 MINUTES IN THEIR BACKYARDS; CHILDREN'S NAPS AND BEDTIMES ARE INTERRUPTED BY TRAIN NOISE. SHE ALSO FEELS THAT THE SECTION ON STORAGE AND NON-EMERGENCY MAINTENANCE IS AN IMPORTANT ISSUE.

NORTON CROSS, STILLWATER TOWNSHIP, STATED THAT HE WOULD LIKE THE COUNTY TO ENFORCE HIS PROPERTY RIGHTS; HE FEELS THAT THE 6 1/2 MILES OF TRACK IS TOO SHORT AND THE SOUTHERN TRACK THROUGH BAYPORT WOULD PROVIDE A LONGER AND BETTER PRODUCT.

CATHERINE BUCK, STILLWATER TOWNSHIP BOARD, SUGGESTED A USE OF FIVE ROUND TRIPS PER WEEK, SEVEN IF THERE WAS A CONCESSION MADE FOR SUNDAYS; REQUESTED THAT THE TRAINS BE OUT OF STILLWATER TOWNSHIP BY 9:30 P.M.; REDUCTION OF ILLUMINATION ON TRAINS; ELIMINATE SWITCHING OR PASSING MANEUVERS.

GARY FUNKE, COUNCILMAN, CITY OF STILLWATER, IS CONCERNED THAT IF THE MINNESOTA ZEPHYR IS FORCED TO LEAVE THIS AREA, IT WOULD HAVE AN ADVERSE AFFECT ON THE ECONOMY OF DOWNTOWN STILLWATER.

GARY SWENSON, STILLWATER, STATED THAT FIVE OR SIX TRIPS WOULD BE ENOUGH FOR THE MINNESOTA ZEPHYR AND MINNESOTA TRANSPORTATION MUSEUM TO GET THEIR RUNS IN; HE STATED THAT THE MINNESOTA TRANSPORTATION MUSEUM COULD RUN SHORTER TRIPS IN THE DOWNTOWN AREA.

ROBERT WATSON, STILLWATER TOWNSHIP, FELT THE SOUTHERN CORRIDOR WOULD BE A GOOD ALTERNATIVE.

ROGER LINDBERG, GRANT TOWNSHIP, STATED HE LIVES ALONG THE TRACK AND ENJOYS HEARING THE TRAIN WHISTLES; HE THINKS IT WOULD BE A GREAT LOSS TO THE CHILDREN OF THE FUTURE IF TRAINS ARE NOT ALLOWED TO OPERATE.

TIM BAULSTAD, STILLWATER INN, STATED HE LIVES FOUR BLOCKS FROM THE TRACKS AND THE TRAINS DO NOT BOTHER HIM, HE FEELS THEY SHOULD NOT BE REGULATED.

BOB SLOGAR, STILLWATER, FOR BOTH SIDES TO LIVE TOGETHER THERE NEEDS TO BE SOME TYPE OF REGULATION.

MARK BAILEY, FEELS THE COUNTY SHOULD BE CAREFUL AND MAKE SURE THAT THE ORDINANCE IS GOVERNING THE PEOPLE IT IS SUPPOSE TO. THE BOARD SHOULD TAKE A CLOSER LOOK AT THIS FROM A LEGAL POINT OF VIEW. FEELS IF THIS GOES TO COURT, THAT THE COUNTY TAXPAYERS SHOULD NOT HAVE TO PAY FOR IT.

MARTHA HUBBS, REPRESENTING THE ST. CROIX VALLEY BED AND BREAKFASTS, STATED THEY ARE DEPENDENT ON THE MINNESOTA ZEPHYR FOR BUSINESS.

CATHY DANIELS, RIVERTOWN RESTORATION, SUPPORTS THE TRAIN OPERATIONS, AND FEELS THEY ARE VITAL TO THE ECONOMY OF STILLWATER AND AN IMPORTANT PART OF ITS HISTORY.

JOHN PETRISKO, STILLWATER TOWNSHIP, THINKS TRAINS ARE GREAT BUT THE NOISE ALONG THE TRACKS IS TERRIBLE; EXPLORE ALTERNATIVES; HAVE THE TRAINS GO SOUTH.

ROGER LINDBERG, GRANT TOWNSHIP, HAS LIVED THERE FOR 30 YEARS LESS THAN 300 FEET FROM THE TRACK AND HAS NOTING BUT GOOD TO SAY ABOUT THE TRAINS.

CINDY GUSTAFSON, STILLWATER, REPRESENTING THE CONSERVATION SIERRA CLUB ST. CROIX VALLEY AREA, STATED THAT THEY ARE OPPOSED TO THE EXPANSION OF THIS TRAIN; REASONS ARE THE NOISE, AIR POLLUTION, CHILDREN BREATHING SOOT AND LOSING SLEEP, AFFECTS ON WILDLIFE IN THE AREA.

TYRA THORENE, STILLWATER, HAS LIVED NEAR THE TRAIN ALL HER LIFE, STATED SHE ENJOYS THE TRAIN, MOST OF THE TIME THEY DO NOT EVEN HEAR THE TRAIN; DOES NOT SEE ANY SMOKE COMING FROM THE ENGINES.

MARGARET GRAHAM, GRANT TOWNSHIP, LIVES NEAR THE DULUTH JUNCTION; HAS ENJOYED THE TRAINS FOR ALMOST 80 YEARS; THEY DON'T MAKE ANY NOISE OR SOOT; SHE SAYS THE NOISE FROM THE HIGHWAYS IS WORSE THAN THE TRAINS.

JACK ANDERS, OAKDALE, STATED HE IS EMPLOYED BY THE MINNESOTA ZEPHYR AS AN ENGINEER AND WAS ALSO A MEMBER OF THE MINNESOTA TRANSPORTATION MUSEUM FOR SEVERAL YEARS; ASKED IF THE BOARD IS GOING TO REGULATE NOISE ON THE TRAIN TRACKS, IS THE BOARD GOING TO BE OPENING THEMSELVES TO REGULATING NOISE ON THE ROADS? HE ALSO STATED THAT IT TAKES ONLY FOUR MINUTES TO PASS A HOUSE AND NOT TWENTY MINUTES AS WAS PREVIOUSLY STATED.

JOYCE WELANDER, GRANT TOWNSHIP, STATED SHE IS IN FAVOR OF THE TRAINS; MANY OF THESE PEOPLE MOVED IN THIS AREA FROM THREE TO TEN YEARS AND KNEW THAT TRACK WAS THERE; ANY LESS THAN WHAT THEY NOW RUN WOULD PUT THEM OUT OF BUSINESS.

LUSCHA BORDAN, EMPLOYED BY THE MINNESOTA ZEPHYR, STATED SHE DOES THE HIRING FOR THE TRAIN AND WANTED TO SAY THAT HALF OF THE PEOPLE EMPLOYED BY THE ZEPHYR ARE WASHINGTON COUNTY RESIDENTS. IF REGULATIONS ARE ENFORCED, SHE DOESN'T SEE HOW THE TRAIN COULD RUN.

THE CHAIRMAN CALLED FOR FURTHER COMMENTS. NONE WERE HEARD. THE CHAIRMAN DECLARED THE PUBLIC HEARING CLOSED AT 11:25 A.M.

COMMISSION EVERT STATED SHE FELT THE BOARD SHOULD NOT ACT ON THIS MATTER TODAY. SHE SUGGESTED THAT THE ISSUE OF THE ICC APPLICATION BY THE MTM SHOULD BE RESOLVED, AND ALSO REQUESTED THE COUNTY ATTORNEY'S OFFICE TO LOOK INTO OTHER WAYS THIS MATTER COULD BE RESOLVED.

COMMISSIONER HAUSER MOVED TO ADOPT THE PROPOSED ORDINANCE WITH THE FOLLOWING AMENDMENTS: UNDER SECTION 749.05 NO. 2, REDUCE THE MAXIMUM NUMBER OF ROUND TRIPS FROM NINE TO SEVEN PER WEEK; AND UNDER SECTION 749.05 NO. 5, AMEND THAT LANGUAGE TO SAY "SIDINGS ON LAND WITH AN UNDERLYING ZONE THAT IS NOT COMMERCIAL OR INDUSTRIAL SHALL NOT BE ALLOWED." THE MOTION FAILED FOR LACK OF SECOND.

COMMISSIONER HAUSER MOVED TO ADOPT THE PROPOSED ORDINANCE WITH THE FOLLOWING AMENDMENT: UNDER SECTION 749.05 NO. 5, AMEND THAT LANGUAGE TO SAY "SIDINGS ON LAND WITH AN UNDERLYING ZONE THAT IS NOT COMMERCIAL OR INDUSTRIAL SHALL NOT BE ALLOWED." COMMISSIONER SCHEEL SECONDED THE MOTION.

COMMISSIONER SCHEEL MOVED TO MAKE AN ADDITIONAL AMENDMENT TO THE PROPOSED ORDINANCE, SECTION 749.05 NO. 1.A, INCREASE THE HOURS OF OPERATION FROM 10:00 P.M. TO 10:30 P.M. COMMISSIONER HAUSER ACCEPTED THE FRIENDLY AMENDMENT.

THE BOARD DISCUSSED THE PROPOSED ORDINANCE.

COMMISSIONER EVERT MOVED TO TABLE THE PROPOSED ORDINANCE FOR AN INDEFINITE PERIOD OF TIME TO ALLOW THE COUNTY ATTORNEY'S OFFICE TO INVESTIGATE THE ICC APPLICATION FROM THE MINNESOTA TRANSPORTATION MUSEUM AND TO LOOK FOR ALTERNATIVE WAYS TO HANDLE THIS SITUATION OTHER THAN THE LAND USE ORDINANCE. COMMISSIONER MCMULLEN SECONDED THE MOTION AND IT WAS ADOPTED WITH THE VOTE AS FOLLOWS: YES, COMMISSIONERS EVERT, MCMULLEN, SCHEEL, AND HEGBERG; NO, COMMISSIONER HAUSER.

WATER WELL SEALING ORDINANCE

THE PUBLIC HEALTH DIVISION MANAGER GAVE A BRIEF OVERVIEW OF CHANGES MADE TO THE PROPOSED WATER WELL SEALING ORDINANCE WHICH WAS REQUESTED BY THE COUNTY BOARD AT THEIR MEETING ON JUNE 11, 1991. WHEREAS, THE EXPENDITURES TO BE REIMBURSED MUST HAVE A REASONABLY EXPECTED ECONOMIC LIFE OF AT LEAST ONE YEAR, IN THAT THEY ARE, OR ARE TO BE INCORPORATED IN OR BECOME A PART OF, A FACILITY, ARE PROPERLY CHANGEABLE TO OR MAY BE CAPITALIZED AS PART OF THE BASIS OF THE FACILITY, AND IF THE COUNTY WERE SUBJECT TO FEDERAL INCOME TAXATION, WOULD BE DEPRECIABLE OVER THE FACILITIES ECONOMIC LIFE; AND

WHEREAS, IF AN EXPENDITURE TO BE REIMBURSED IS NOT MADE WITHIN TWO YEARS OF THE DATE OF THIS RESOLUTION, THIS RESOLUTION MAY BE UPDATED TO THE EXTENT SUCH EXPENDITURE IS STILL EXPECTED TO BE REIMBURSED WITH BOND PROCEEDS AT A LATER DATE; AND

WHEREAS, PROCEEDS OF THE BONDS ISSUED TO REIMBURSE THE EXPENDITURES DESCRIBED IN EXHIBIT A WILL BE DEEMED SPENT ONLY WHEN (1) AN ALLOCATION ENTRY IS MADE ON THE BOOKS OR RECORDS OF THE COUNTY WITH RESPECT TO THE BONDS; (2) THE ENTRY SPECIFICALLY IDENTIFIES AN ACTUAL EXPENDITURE TO BE REIMBURSED; AND (3) THE ALLOCATION IS EFFECTIVE TO RELIEVE THE BOND PROCEEDS FROM RESTRICTIONS ON UNSPENT PROCEEDS UNDER APPLICABLE DOCUMENTS AND STATE LAWS; AND

WHEREAS, NO ENTITY OR ENTITIES POSSESS DISCRETIONARY AND NONMINISTERIAL POWER TO (1) CONTROL ALL OR MOST OF THE SIGNIFICANT DECISIONS OR SIGNIFICANT ACTIONS; (2) SELECT, APPROVE OF, DISAPPROVE OF, OR REMOVE WITHOUT CAUSE A CONTROLLING PORTION OF THE GOVERNING BODY; (3) DETERMINE THE BUDGET OR OTHERWISE SIGNIFICANTLY CONTROL FINANCES; OR (4) APPROVE, DISAPPROVE OR PREVENT THE ISSUANCE OF DEBT OBLIGATIONS OF THE COUNTY; AND

WHEREAS, NONE OF THE PROCEEDS OF THE BONDS ISSUED TO REIMBURSE THE COUNTY FOR EXPENDITURES WILL BE USED (I) TO REFUND OTHER TAX-EXEMPT GOVERNMENTAL ISSUE OR (II) TO CREATE OR INCREASE THE BALANCE IN A SINKING FUND OR REPLACE FUNDS USED FOR SUCH PURPOSE, OR (III) TO CREATE OR INCREASE THE BALANCE IN A RESERVE OR REPLACEMENT FUND OR REPLACE FUNDS USED FOR SUCH PURPOSES, OR (IV) TO REIMBURSE AN EXPENDITURE ORIGINALLY PAID WITH THE PROCEEDS OF ANOTHER TAX-EXEMPT BOND OBLIGATION; UNLESS (I) SUCH AMOUNTS ARE DEPOSITED IN A BONA FIDE DEBT SERVICE FUND, OR (II) THE ORIGINAL TAX-EXEMPT ISSUE WAS NOT REASONABLY EXPECTED TO BE USED TO FINANCE THE EXPENDITURE;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF WASHINGTON COUNTY, MINNESOTA AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. THE COUNTY REASONABLY EXPECTS TO EXPEND MONEYS FROM THE SOURCES DESCRIBED IN EXHIBIT A ON THE TEMPORARY BASIS TO PAY THE EXPENDITURES DESCRIBED IN EXHIBIT A. THE COUNTY REASONABLY EXPECTS TO REIMBURSE ITSELF FOR SUCH EXPENDITURES FROM THE PROCEEDS OF TAXABLE OR TAX-EXEMPT BONDS, THE DEBT SERVICE FOR WHICH IS EXPECTED TO BE PAID FROM THE SOURCES DESCRIBED IN EXHIBIT A.
- 2. THE CONTROLLER OF THE COUNTY IS AUTHORIZED TO DESIGNATE APPROPRIATE ADDITIONS TO EXHIBIT A IN CIRCUMSTANCES WHERE TIME IS OF THE ESSENCE, AND ANY SUCH DESIGNATION SHALL BE REPORTED TO THE BOARD AT THE EARLIEST PRACTICABLE DATE AND SHALL BE FILED WITH THE OFFICIAL BOOK AND RECORDS OF THE COUNTY AT THE TIMES AND IN THE MANNER PROVIDED IN SECTION 3.
- 3. THIS RESOLUTION SHALL BE MAINTAINED AS PART OF THE BOOKS AND RECORDS OF THE COUNTY AT THE MAIN ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICE OF THE COUNTY, AND SHALL BE CONTINUOUSLY AVAILABLE DURING NORMAL BUSINESS HOURS OF THE COUNTY ON EVERY BUSINESS DAY OF THE PERIOD BEGINNING NOT MORE THAN 10 DAYS AFTER ADOPTION OF THIS RESOLUTION AND ENDING ON THE LAST DATE OF ISSUE OF ANY BONDS ISSUED TO REIMBURSE EXPENDITURES DESCRIBED IN EXHIBIT A.

- 4. THIS RESOLUTION IS AN EXPRESSION OF THE REASONABLE EXPECTATIONS OF THE COUNTY BASED ON THE FACTS AND CIRCUMSTANCES KNOWN TO THE COUNTY AS OF THE DATE HEREOF. PETITION FOR EXCLUSION TO THE SOLID WASTE DESIGNATION ORDINANCE

THE BOARD CHAIRMAN PRESENTED AN OVERVIEW OF TODAY'S PUBLIC HEARING FOR CONSIDERATION OF A PETITION FOR EXCLUSION TO THE SOLID WASTE DESIGNATION ORDINANCE BY RECOMP, INC., ROSEMOUNT FACILITY. THE BOARD CHAIRMAN ALSO INDICATED THAT A LETTER WAS RECEIVED FROM THE RAMSEY COUNTY ENVIRONMENT COMMITTEE REQUESTING A JOINT MEETING BETWEEN THE TWO COUNTIES.

THE FOLLOWING INDIVIDUALS SPOKE: JUDY ARENDS, PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT STAFF, PRESENTED AN OVERVIEW OF ITEMS TO BE DETERMINED TODAY WHICH INCLUDE, THE APPOINTMENT OF AN ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE TO ADDRESS THE PETITION FOR EXCLUSION BY RECOMP, INC., ROSEMOUNT FACILITY; SECONDLY, CONTINUE THE PUBLIC HEARING ON THE EXCLUSION; AND THIRDLY, TO RESCHEDULE THIS PUBLIC HEARING AFTER RAMSEY COUNTY HAS ACTED.

GEORGE KUPRIAN, ASSISTANT COUNTY ATTORNEY, PRESENTED AN OVERVIEW ON THE PROCESS FOR APPOINTING AN ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE.

JOEL CARLSON, REPRESENTING RECOMP, INC., STATED RECOMP, INC. WAS CONCERNED ABOUT HAVING AN ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE HEAR THEIR PETITION FOR EXCLUSION. THEY FEEL THAT THE APPOINTMENT OF AN ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE WOULD LENGTHEN THE PROCESS AND FELT THE COUNTY BOARD COULD SIFT THROUGH ALL THE INFORMATION AND MAKE A DECISION.

THE BOARD CHAIRMAN CALLED FOR FURTHER COMMENTS; NONE WERE HEARD AND THE PUBLIC HEARING WAD DECLARED CLOSED AT 9:25.

COMMISSIONER HAUSER MOVED TO CONTINUE THE PUBLIC HEARING FOR CONSIDERATION OF A PETITION FOR EXCLUSION, AND IF THE INFORMATION RECEIVED AT THE PUBLIC HEARING IS INSUFFICIENT TO MAKE A DECISION, THE BOARD AT THAT TIME COULD APPOINT AN ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE. THE MOTION FAILED FOR LACK OF A SECOND.

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COMMISSIONER MCMULLEN MOVED TO ADOPT THE RESOLUTION APPOINTING AN ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE TO HEAR THE PETITION FOR EXCLUSION BY RECOMP, INC., ROSEMOUNT FACILITY. COMMISSIONER SCHEEL SECONDED THE MOTION.

THE BOARD DISCUSSED THE MOTION.

JOEL CARLSON, REPRESENTING RECOMP, INC., SUGGESTED THAT THE BOARD POSTPONE THEIR DECISION UNTIL AFTER A MEETING IS HELD WITH RAMSEY AND WASHINGTON COUNTY PUBLIC HEALTH STAFFS AND RECOMP, INC. WHICH IS SCHEDULED FOR LATER THIS MONTH TO DISCUSS THE AMENDED EXCLUSION.

COMMISSIONER HEGBERG MOVED TO TABLE THE MATTER OF APPOINTING AN ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE TO HEAR THE EXCLUSION PETITION BY RECOMP, INC. ROSEMOUNT FACILITY, UNTIL AUGUST 27, 1991. COMMISSIONER MCMULLEN SECONDED THE MOTION AND IT WAS ADOPTED UNANIMOUSLY; COMMISSIONER EVERT ABSENT.

IT WAS THE CONSENSUS OF THE COUNTY BOARD TO NOT MEET WITH RAMSEY COUNTY TO CONSIDER THESE ISSUES.

COMMISSIONER HEGBERG MOVED TO TABLE THE MATTER OF SPECIAL PROJECT STATUS OF THE LAW ENFORCEMENT/CORRECTIONAL OFFICER TRAINER POSITION UNTIL AFTER THE LAW ENFORCEMENT CENTER WORKSHOP SCHEDULED FOR AUGUST 13, 1991. COMMISSIONER HAUSER SECONDED THE MOTION AND IT WAS ADOPTED UNANIMOUSLY; COMMISSIONER EVERT ABSENT.

PURSUANT WHEREAS. TO THE CRANSTON-GONZALEZ NATIONAL AFFORDABLE HOUSING ACT OF 1990 "ACT"), GEOGRAPHICALLY CONTIGUOUS UNITS OF GENERAL MAY LOCAL GOVERNMENT FORM CONSORTIA FOR PURPOSE OF APPLYING FOR AND RECEIVING FUNDING TO ASSIST IN CARRYING OUT A COMPREHENSIVE HOUSING AND ASSISTANCE STRATEGY UNDER THE ACT; AND

WHEREAS, MINNESOTA STATUTES, SECTION 471.59 (THE "JOINT POWERS ACT") PROVIDES THAT "TWO OR MORE GOVERNMENTAL UNITS, BY AGREEMENT ENTERED INTO

THROUGH ACTION OF THEIR GOVERNING BODIES, MAY JOINTLY OR COOPERATIVELY EXERCISE ANY POWERS COMMON TO THE CONTRACTING POWERS OR ANY SIMILAR POWERS AND "THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ANY COUNTY MAY BY RESOLUTION ENTER INTO AGREEMENTS WITH ANY OTHER GOVERNMENTAL UNIT TO PERFORM ON BEHALF OF THAT UNIT ANY SERVICE OR FUNCTION WHICH THAT UNIT WOULD BE AUTHORIZED TO PROVIDE FOR ITSELF"; AND

WHEREAS, ANOKA COUNTY, DAKOTA COUNTY, RAMSEY COUNTY AND WASHINGTON COUNTY (THE "JOINT PARTIES") ARE GEOGRAPHICALLY CONTIGUOUS UNITS OF GENERAL LOCAL GOVERNMENT WITHIN THE MEANING OF THE ACT AND TOGETHER WITH THE HOUSING AND REDEVELOPMENT AUTHORITIES OR OTHER LOCAL ENTITIES IDENTIFIED IN THE ADDENDA TO THE AGREEMENT DESCRIBED BELOW, EACH HAVE THE POWER TO CARRY OUT THE PROGRAMS PROVIDED FOR BY THE ACT; AND

WHEREAS, THERE HAS BEEN PRESENTED TO THIS BOARD A FORM OF JOINT POWERS CONSORTIUM AGREEMENT AMONG THE JOINT PARTIES, PURSUANT TO WHICH THE JOINT PARTIES WILL, AMONG OTHER THINGS, DEVELOP AND CARRY OUT A HOUSING ASSISTANCE STRATEGY AND APPLY FOR AND EXPEND SUCH FEDERAL ASSISTANCE AS MAY BE AVAILABLE UNDER THE ACT TO CONSORTIA;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS (THE "BOARD") OF WASHINGTON COUNTY, MINNESOTA (THE "COUNTY") AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. THE BOARD HEREBY FINDS AND DETERMINES THAT IT IS IN THE BEST INTERESTS OF THE COUNTY THAT THE COUNTY ENTER INTO THE JOINT POWERS CONSORTIUM AGREEMENT.
- 2. THE BOARD HEREBY AGREES TO EXECUTE ON BEHALF OF THE WASHINGTON COUNTY HOUSING AND REDEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY (THE "AUTHORITY") THOSE POWERS NECESSARY TO THE OPERATION OF THE PROGRAM CONTEMPLATED BY THE JOINT POWERS CONSORTIUM AGREEMENT FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE COUNTY AND THE AUTHORITY.
- 3. THE BOARD HEREBY AUTHORIZES AND DIRECTS THE CHAIR OF THE BOARD AND THE COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR TO EXECUTE THE JOINT POWERS AGREEMENT IN SUBSTANTIALLY THE FORM ATTACHED HERETO, WITH ANY MODIFICATIONS WHICH MAY BE DETERMINED BY THE EXECUTING PARTIES NOT TO BE MATERIALLY ADVERSE TO THE INTERESTS OF THE COUNTY. EXECUTION OF THE JOINT POWERS CONSORTIUM AGREEMENT BY THE AUTHORIZED OFFICERS SHALL CONSTITUTE CONCLUSIVE EVIDENCE OF SUCH DETERMINATION.
- 4. THE COUNTY'S REPRESENTATIVE TO THE JOINT OPERATING COMMITTEE ESTABLISHED BY THE AGREEMENT SHALL BE THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE WASHINGTON COUNTY HOUSING AND REDEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY, AND/OR HIS/HER DESIGNEE, PROVIDED THAT SUCH REPRESENTATIVE MAY FROM TIME TO TIME REQUEST DIRECTION FORM THIS BOARD AND THIS BOARD MAY BY RESOLUTION REQUIRE APPROVAL OF ANY OFFICIAL ACTIONS TO BE TAKEN BY THE REPRESENTATIVE.

CROIX RIVER VALLEY. MR. BRUER ALSO SHOWED A VIDEO OF THE ST. CROIX RIVER.

WHEREAS, THE WASHINGTON COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS HAS REVIEWED THE PETITION TO PREPARE AN EAW FOR THE EXPANSION OF CURRENT GRAVEL MINING OPERATIONS IN NEW SCANDIA TOWNSHIP, COUNTY OF WASHINGTON, STATE OF MINNESOTA TO INCLUDE A WASHING AND CRUSHING FACILITY; AND

WHEREAS, THE PETITION ALLEGES THAT THERE MAY BE POTENTIAL ENVIRONMENTAL EFFECTS RESULTING FROM THE PROJECT IN THE FORM OF: (1) THE QUANTITY AND QUALITY OF THE WATER SUPPLY IN NEARBY RESIDENTIAL WELLS; (2) NOISE POLLUTION FROM THE WASHING AND CRUSHING OPERATION; (3) AIR QUALITY DUE TO CRUSHING OPERATION; (4) THREAT TO LONG TERM RECLAMATION OF PROPERTY AND RETURN TO OTHER USES; (5) THREAT TO ADJOINING OLD OAK FORESTS AND NATURAL WILDLIFE HABITATS; (6) THE ENVIRONMENTALLY IRRESPONSIBLE PRACTICES OF THE PROPOSER OF THE PROJECT; AND

- 5. IT IS KNOWN THAT BRACHT BROTHERS ARE CURRENTLY IN VIOLATION OF MANY TOWNSHIP ORDINANCES BUT THAT THE TOWNSHIP AND COUNTY HAVE NOT IN THE PAST AND DO NOT CURRENTLY HAVE THE STAFF TO EITHER INSPECT OR ENFORCE THESE ORDINANCES

AND

WHEREAS, THE WASHINGTON COUNTY PLANNING ADVISORY COMMISSION HAS CONDITIONALLY APPROVED A PERMIT TO ALLOW BRACHT BROS., INC. TO EXPAND THEIR MINING OPERATION BY ADDING WASHING AND CRUSHING EQUIPMENT; AND

WHEREAS, THE WASHINGTON COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS HAS DETERMINED THAT IT IS NECESSARY FOR THE PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY AND WELFARE OF THE RESIDENTS OF WASHINGTON COUNTY TO REGULATE THE OPERATION OF EXCURSION TRAINS IN THE UNINCORPORATED AREAS OF THE COUNTY; AND

WHEREAS, THE WASHINGTON COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS HAS DETERMINED THAT THE EXISTING ZONING ORDINANCE IS INADEQUATE TO MEET THIS NEED; AND

WHEREAS, THE WASHINGTON COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS HAS RECEIVED THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE WASHINGTON COUNTY PLANNING ADVISORY COMMISSION IN THE FORM OF A DRAFT ORDINANCE; AND

THIS ORDINANCE CREATES A RAILROAD OVERLAY DISTRICT WITHIN SECTION 6 OF THE WASHINGTON COUNTY ZONING ORDINANCE, ADDS CERTAIN DEFINITIONAL SECTIONS TO SECTION 3 OF THE WASHINGTON COUNTY ZONING ORDINANCE AND SPECIFIES CERTAIN DESIGN AND PERFORMANCE STANDARDS IN SECTION 7 OF THE WASHINGTON COUNTY ZONING ORDINANCE. IT APPLIES TO THE UNINCORPORATED AREAS OF THE COUNTY AND DEFINES RAILROAD OPERATIONS AS THOSE WHICH ARE NOT PREEMPTED FROM LOCAL LAND USE CONTROL BY OPERATION OF STATE OR FEDERAL LAW. AMONG OTHER THINGS, THE ORDINANCE SETS A MAXIMUM OF NINE ROUND TRIPS PER WEEK, EXPANDED TO THIRTEEN ROUND TRIPS PER WEEK, EXPANDED TO THIRTEEN ROUND TRIPS PER WEEK DURING THE MONTHS OF SEPTEMBER AND OCTOBER THAT MAY BE CONDUCTED ON THE SAME SECTION OF TRACK, LIMITS THE HOURS OF OPERATION FROM 10:00 A.M. TO 10:00 P.M., REGULATES SIDING, RAILROAD STATIONS FOR PASSENGER BOARDING, HERBICIDE SPRAYING, LIGHTING, NOISE, DIESELING OR IDLING, AND REQUIRES THE ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT. THE ORDINANCE SHALL BE EFFECTIVE ON NOVEMBER 1, 1991 FOLLOWING PUBLICATION, AS REQUIRED BY LAW AND PROVIDES THAT A VIOLATION OF THE ORDINANCE IS GROUNDS FOR REVOCATION OF THE CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT AND WOULD SUBJECT THE VIOLATOR TO CRIMINAL OR OTHER CIVIL PENALTIES.

WHEREAS, THIS PROPERTY HAS FOR MANY YEARS BEEN USED FOR RAILROAD PURPOSES AND IS PRESENTLY BEING USED FOR THE OPERATION OF AN EXCURSION AND DINNER TRAIN; AND

WHEREAS, WASHINGTON COUNTY HAS ADOPTED AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE OPERATION OF SUCH TRAINS IN THE UNINCORPORATED AREA OF THE COUNTY; AND

THE COUNTY AGREES TO PAY THE REASONABLE AND CUSTOMARY CHARGES OF THE REGISTRAR FOR THE SERVICES PERFORMED. THE COUNTY RESERVES THE RIGHT TO REMOVE THE REGISTRAR UPON 30 DAYS' NOTICE AND UPON THE APPOINTMENT OF A SUCCESSOR REGISTRAR, IN WHICH EVENT THE PREDECESSOR REGISTRAR MUST DELIVER ALL CASH AND BONDS IN ITS POSSESSION TO THE SUCCESSOR REGISTRAR AND MUST DELIVER THE BOND REGISTER TO THE SUCCESSOR REGISTRAR. - DIRECTED TO PREPARE AND FURNISH TO THE PURCHASER AND TO THE ATTORNEYS APPROVING THE BONDS, CERTIFIED COPIES OF PROCEEDINGS AND RECORDS OF THE COUNTY RELATING TO THE BONDS AND TO THE FINANCIAL CONDITION AND AFFAIRS OF THE COUNTY, AND SUCH OTHER CERTIFICATES, AFFIDAVITS AND TRANSCRIPTS AS MAY BE REQUIRED TO SHOW THE FACTS WITHIN THEIR KNOWLEDGE OR AS SHOWN BY THE BOOKS AND RECORDS IN THEIR CUSTODY AND UNDER THEIR CONTROL, RELATING TO THE VALIDITY AND MARKETABILITY OF THE BONDS AND SUCH INSTRUMENTS, INCLUDING ANY HERETOFORE FURNISHED, SHALL BE DEEMED REPRESENTATIONS OF THE COUNTY AS TO THE FACTS STATED THEREIN.
- 5.02. THE CHAIRMAN AND COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR ARE HEREBY AUTHORIZED AND DIRECTED TO CERTIFY THAT THEY HAVE EXAMINED THE OFFICIAL STATEMENT PREPARED AND CIRCULATED IN CONNECTION

WITH THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF THE BONDS AND THAT TO THE BEST OF THEIR KNOWLEDGE AND BELIEF THE OFFICIAL STATEMENT IS A COMPLETE AND ACCURATE REPRESENTATION OF THE FACTS AND REPRESENTATIONS MADE THEREIN AS OF THE DATE OF THE OFFICIAL STATEMENT.

SECTION 6. TAX COVENANT.

- 6.01. THE COUNTY COVENANTS AND AGREES WITH THE HOLDERS FROM TIME TO TIME OF THE BONDS THAT IT WILL NOT TAKE OR PERMIT TO BE TAKEN BY ANY OF ITS OFFICERS, EMPLOYEES OR AGENTS ANY ACTION WHICH WOULD CAUSE THE INTEREST ON THE BONDS TO BECOME SUBJECT TO TAXATION UNDER THE INTERNAL REVENUE CODE OF 1986, AS AMENDED (THE CODE), AND THE TREASURER REGULATIONS PROMULGATED THEREUNDER, IN EFFECT AT THE TIME OF SUCH ACTIONS, AND THAT IT WILL TAKE OR CAUSE ITS OFFICERS, EMPLOYEES OR AGENTS TO TAKE, ALL AFFIRMATIVE ACTION WITHIN ITS POWER THAT MAY BE NECESSARY TO ENSURE THAT SUCH INTEREST WILL NOT BECOME SUBJECT TO TAXATION UNDER THE CODE AND APPLICABLE TREASURY REGULATIONS, AS PRESENTLY EXISTING OR AS HEREAFTER AMENDED AND MADE APPLICABLE TO THE BONDS.
- 6.02. THE COUNTY WILL COMPLY WITH REQUIREMENTS NECESSARY UNDER THE CODE TO ESTABLISH AND MAINTAIN THE EXCLUSION FROM GROSS INCOME OF THE INTEREST ON THE BONDS UNDER SECTION 103 OF THE CODE, INCLUDING WITHOUT LIMITATION REQUIREMENTS RELATING TO TEMPORARY PERIODS FOR INVESTMENTS, LIMITATIONS ON AMOUNTS INVESTED AT A YIELD GREATER THAN THE YIELD ON THE BONDS, AND THE REBATE OF EXCESS INVESTMENT EARNINGS TO THE UNITED STATES.
- 6.03. THE COUNTY FURTHER COVENANTS NOT TO USE THE PROCEEDS OF THE BONDS OR TO CAUSE OR PERMIT THEM OR ANY OF THEM TO BE USED, IN SUCH A MANNER AS TO CAUSE THE BONDS TO BE "PRIVATE ACTIVITY BONDS" WITHIN THE MEANING OF SECTIONS 103 AND 141 THROUGH 150 OF THE CODE.

THE AMENDMENTS TO THE WASTE WHEREAS, 1991 MANAGEMENT ACT CHARGED THE SEVEN METROPOLITAN COUNTIES IN CONSULTATION WITH THE METROPOLITAN COUNCIL AND THE OFFICE OF WASTE MANAGEMENT, WITH DEVELOPING A SPECIFIC, WORKABLE PROCESS FOR SITING AND DEVELOPING AN ASH DISPOSAL FACILITY AND A MIXED MUNICIPAL SOLID WASTE (MSW) DISPOSAL MIXED MUNICIPAL SOLID WASTE (MSW) DISPOSAL FACILITY UNLESS EACH COUNTY AND THE COUNCIL AGREE THAT THE MSW FACILITY WILL NOT BE NEEDED WITHIN NEXT 15 YEARS TO ADEQUATELY THE METROPOLITAN WASTE; AND

WHEREAS, A PRELIMINARY NEEDS ANALYSIS INDICATES THAT IT CANNOT BE CONCLUDED THAT A MSW LANDFILL WILL NOT BE NEEDED WITHIN THE NEXT 15 YEARS; AND

WHEREAS, THE AMENDMENTS STATE THAT THE COUNTIES SHALL REPORT THE PROPOSED PROCESS TO THE LEGISLATIVE COMMISSION ON WASTE MANAGEMENT BY DECEMBER 1, 1991, INCLUDING ANY NECESSARY RECOMMENDATIONS FOR LEGISLATION TO IMPLEMENT THE PROCESS; AND

NOVEMBER 5, 1991

WHEREAS, ON MAY 22, 1991, THE SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT COORDINATING BOARD UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED A MOTION THAT IT ACT AS THE ENTITY TO WORK WITH THE COUNCIL AND THE OFFICE OF WASTE MANAGEMENT TO FULFILL THE OBLIGATIONS OF THE COUNTIES UNDER THE 1991 REPLACEMENT SITING PROCESS AMENDMENTS TO THE WASTE MANAGEMENT ACT; AND

WHEREAS, A REPLACEMENT SITING PROCESS REPORT WHICH ADDRESSES THE LEGISLATIVE DIRECTIVES IN THE 1991 AMENDMENTS TO THE WASTE MANAGEMENT ACT HAS BEEN PREPARED; AND

WHEREAS, THE SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT COORDINATING BOARD APPROVED THE REPLACEMENT SITING PROCESS REPORT ON SEPTEMBER 25, 1991.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE WASHINGTON COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS APPROVE THE REPLACEMENT SITING PROCESS REPORT AND LEGISLATIVE DIRECTIVES.

COMMISSIONER EVERT SECONDED THE MOTION AND IT WAS ADOPTED UNANIMOUSLY.

REVISED RESOLUTION TO ACQUIRE WINTER PROPERTY BIG MARINE PARK RESERVE

WHEREAS, ON MAY 7, 1991 BY RESOLUTION NO. 91-071, THE WASHINGTON COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS AUTHORIZED ITS CHAIRMAN AND ADMINISTRATOR TO EXECUTE A PURCHASE AGREEMENT ON BEHALF OF THE COUNTY TO PURCHASE LOT 1 OF PAULSON'S FIRST DIVISION OF LOT 7, WASHINGTON COUNTY, MINNESOTA, LOCATED ON BIG MARINE LAKE; AND

WHEREAS, THE RESOLUTION ACKNOWLEDGED THAT THE SELLER'S DID NOT HAVE LEGAL TITLE TO THE LAKE FRONTAGE, BUT AGREED THAT PRIOR TO CLOSING THEY WOULD ATTEMPT TO OBTAIN TITLE TO THE LAKE FRONTAGE BETWEEN THEIR LOT AND BIG MARINE LAKE. THE RESOLUTION ALSO PROVIDED THAT IF THEY COULD NOT OBTAIN SUCH TITLE, EITHER THE PURCHASE PRICE FOR THEIR PROPERTY WOULD BE REDUCED FROM \$37,700 TO \$24,700 OR THEY COULD DECIDE NOT TO SELL THE PROPERTY; AND

WHEREAS, RESOLUTION 91-071 STATED THAT THE CLOSING WAS TO BE ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 21, 1991; AND

WHEREAS, SELLERS WERE NOT ABLE TO OBTAIN LEGAL TITLE TO THE LAKE FRONTAGE PRIOR TO OCTOBER 21, 1991, BUT WILL BE ABLE TO OBTAIN TITLE TO THE LAKE FRONTAGE BY JANUARY 31, 1992 AND WOULD THEN LIKE TO SELL THE PROPERTY TO THE COUNTY.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, THAT THE WASHINGTON COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS HEREBY AUTHORIZES THE COUNTY TO EITHER PURCHASE THE WINTER PROPERTY WITHOUT LAKE FRONTAGE DESCRIBED AS "LOT 1 OF PAULSON'S FIRST DIVISION OF LOT 7" OR THE WINTER PROPERTY WITH LAKE FRONTAGE DESCRIBED IN EXHIBIT A; AND THAT THE CLOSING DATE ON THIS ACQUISITION BE EXTENDED TO NO LATER THAN JANUARY 31, 1992.

WHEREAS, MINNESOTA STATUTES CHAPTER 394 AUTHORIZES COUNTIES TO REGULATE PLANNING, DEVELOPMENT AND ZONING WITHIN THE UNINCORPORATED AREAS OF THE COUNTY THROUGH THE ADOPTION OF OFFICIAL CONTROLS WHICH MAY INCLUDE REGULATING THE SUBDIVISION OF LAND AND THE APPROVAL OF LAND PLATS AND THE PRESERVATION AND DEDICATION OF STREETS AND LAND FOR OTHER PUBLIC PURPOSES AND THE GENERAL DESIGN OF PHYSICAL IMPROVEMENTS; AND

WHEREAS, MINNESOTA STATUTES CHAPTER 394 AUTHORIZES TOWNSHIPS TO CONTINUE TO EXERCISE AUTHORITY TO PLAN AND ZONE THROUGH THE USE OF OFFICIAL CONTROLS, PROVIDED THAT NO TOWN SHALL ENACT OR ENFORCE OFFICIAL CONTROLS INCONSISTENT WITH OR LESS RESTRICTIVE THAN THE STANDARDS PRESCRIBED IN THE OFFICIAL CONTROLS ADOPTED BY THE COUNTY; AND

WHEREAS, WASHINGTON COUNTY HAS ADOPTED ORDINANCE NO. 48 AS A DEVELOPMENT CODE FOR WASHINGTON COUNTY WHICH CONSISTS OF THE OFFICIAL CONTROLS, WITH CHAPTER 5 OF THE DEVELOPMENT CODE REGULATING THE SUBDIVISION AND PLATTING OF LAND LOCATED IN THE UNINCORPORATED AREAS OF THE COUNTY; AND

WHEREAS, AS THE POPULATION OF WASHINGTON COUNTY INCREASES, THERE WILL CONTINUE TO BE INCREASED PRESSURE IN THE UNINCORPORATED AREAS OF THE COUNTY TO SUBDIVIDE AND PLAT UNDEVELOPED LAND. THESE SUBDIVISIONS HAVE THE POTENTIAL TO AFFECT THE PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY AND WELFARE OF THE ENTIRE RESIDENTS OF THE COUNTY AND IT IS IN THE INTERESTS

OF ALL RESIDENTS OF WASHINGTON COUNTY TO ENSURE THAT THE PROVISIONS OF THE WASHINGTON COUNTY DEVELOPMENT CODE ARE APPLIED UNIFORMLY THROUGHOUT THE COUNTY; AND

WHEREAS, ON JUNE 7, 1977 BY RESOLUTION, THE WASHINGTON COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS CREATED A WASHINGTON COUNTY PLAT COMMISSION TO PROTECT THE GENERAL WELFARE OF THE CITIZENS OF WASHINGTON COUNTY BY REGULATING PLATTING IN THE TOWNSHIPS THROUGH THE EXPERTISE AND ADVISE OF THE MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION; AND

WHEREAS, IN VIEW OF THIS INCREASED DEVELOPMENT PRESSURE, THE WASHINGTON COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS FINDS IT IS NECESSARY AND PROPER TO REDEFINE THE ROLL OF THE WASHINGTON COUNTY PLAT COMMISSION TO MEET THE INCREASED DEMANDS FOR DEVELOPMENT IN THE UNINCORPORATED AREAS OF THE COUNTY AND REVIEW THE WASHINGTON COUNTY DEVELOPMENT CODE TO ENSURE THAT IT WILL CONTINUE TO PROTECT THE PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY AND WELFARE OF THE CITIZENS OF WASHINGTON COUNTY IN THE AREA OF REGULATING THE SUBDIVISION AND PLATTING OF LANDS.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT THE ROLE OF THE WASHINGTON COUNTY PLAT COMMISSION BE ESTABLISHED AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. <u>MEMBERSHIP</u> THE WASHINGTON COUNTY PLAT COMMISSION SHALL CONSIST OF:
 - A. A COMMISSIONER APPOINTED BY THE WASHINGTON COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS.
 - B. THE WASHINGTON COUNTY ATTORNEY OR HIS DESIGNEE.
 - C. THE WASHINGTON COUNTY ENGINEER OR HIS DESIGNEE.
 - D. THE WASHINGTON COUNTY SURVEYOR OR HIS DESIGNEE.
 - E. WASHINGTON COUNTY RECORDER OR DESIGNEE.
 - F. ZONING ADMINISTRATOR OR DESIGNEE.
 - G. A REPRESENTATIVE FROM THE WASHINGTON COUNTY SOIL AND WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT.
- 2. POWERS AND PURPOSES THE PLAT COMMISSION SHALL BE AN ADVISORY COMMISSION, WHO SHALL MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS AND GIVE ADVICE TO DEVELOPERS, AFFECTED TOWNSHIPS AND THE WASHINGTON COUNTY BOARD IN CONNECTION WITH THE PLATTING AND SUBDIVISION OF LAND LOCATED WITHIN THE UNINCORPORATED AREAS OF THE COUNTY. EACH MEMBER OF THE PLAT COMMISSION SHALL REVIEW THE PLAT OR SUBDIVISION AND MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE PLAT COMMISSION TO ENSURE THAT THE SUBDIVISION IS CONSISTENT WITH THE WASHINGTON COUNTY COMPREHENSIVE PLAN, AND THE PROVISIONS OF THE WASHINGTON COUNTY DEVELOPMENT CODE. NO PLAT SHALL BE CONSIDERED BY THE BOARD FOR FINAL ACTION WITHOUT FIRST BEING REVIEWED BY THE PLAT COMMISSION AND RECEIVING THE PLAT COMMISSION AND RECEIVING THE PLAT COMMISSION SON'S RECOMMENDATIONS.

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, THAT THE REVIEW OF CHAPTER 5 OF THE WASHINGTON COUNTY DEVELOPMENT CODE BE REFERRED TO THE WASHINGTON COUNTY PLANNING ADVISORY COMMISSION FOR STUDY AND RECOMMENDATIONS CONSISTENT WITH THIS RESOLUTION.

10. APPROVAL TO MAKE FINAL PAYMENT OF \$11,030.34 TO MARKHURD UPON SUCCESSFUL COMPLETION OF AERIAL PHOTOGRAPHS FOR WASHINGTON COUNTY.

WHEREAS, THE WASHINGTON COUNTY PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT IS AUTHORIZED OR REQUIRED TO PERFORM VARIOUS REGULATORY FUNCTIONS; AND

WHEREAS, MINNESOTA STATUTES AND ADOPTED WASHINGTON COUNTY ORDINANCES ALLOW FOR THE COLLECTION OF FEES FOR LICENSING AND PERMITTING ACTIVITIES; AND

WHEREAS, THE WASHINGTON COUNTY SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT ORDINANCE PROVIDES THAT THE BOARD SHALL SET REQUIREMENTS FOR INSURANCE AND BONDING REQUIREMENTS RELATED TO SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT ACTIVITIES; AND

WHEREAS, THE PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT HAS PREPARED FEE SCHEDULES FOR THE YEAR 1992.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT THE WASHINGTON COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS HEREBY ADOPTS THE 1992 FEE SCHEDULE CONTAINED IN THE NOVEMBER 4, 1991, MEMO FROM THE PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT.

COMMISSIONER HAUSER SECONDED THE MOTION AND IT WAS ADOPTED UNANIMOUSLY.

COMMUNITY SOCIAL SERVICES

COMMISSIONER EVERT MOVED TO APPROVE REVISIONS TO THE 1992-1993 COMMUNITY SOCIAL SERVICES ACT AND MENTAL HEALTH PLAN FOR WASHINGTON COUNTY AND AUTHORIZED ITS SUBMITTAL TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES. COMMISSIONER MCMULLEN SECONDED THE MOTION AND IT WAS ADOPTED UNANIMOUSLY.

SHERIFF'S OFFICE

THE COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE PRESENTED PROPOSED CONTRACT COSTS FOR POLICE SERVICES TO CITIES FOR 1992. SPEAKING FROM THE AUDIENCE WERE MAYOR JOHN JANSEN, CITY OF LAKE ST. CROIX BEACH, WHO SUGGESTED BETTER COMMUNICATION WAS NEEDED BETWEEN THE COUNTY AND CITIES; AND MAYOR HENRY DEWUSKE, CITY OF MAHTOMEDI, WHO STATED HE SUPPORTS THE FIGURES FOR THE COMING YEAR, BUT IS CONCERNED WITH FUTURE INDIRECT COSTS.

VIRGINIA ERDAHL, DEPUTY ADMINISTRATOR, PRESENTED AN OVERVIEW OF THE PROPOSED 1992 BUDGET.

RICHARD STAFFORD, AUDITOR-TREASURER, PRESENTED AN OVERVIEW OF PROPERTY TAXES.

CHAIRMAN SCHEEL DECLARED THE PUBLIC HEARING OPEN FOR COMMENTS AT 7:40 P.M.

COMMENTING FROM THE AUDIENCE WERE THE FOLLOWING INDIVIDUALS:

CHUCK BEYER, STILLWATER -- QUESTIONED WHY CUTS WERE BEING MADE TO THE HOME HEALTH CARE AIDES, WHY NOT CUT FROM THE TOP STARTING WITH COMMISSIONERS WAGES.

DAN MACDONALD, DENMARK TOWNSHIP -- SUGGESTED THAT USERS OF SERVICES SHOULD PAY FOR THEM IN HIGHER FINES, SUCH AS CRIMINALS SERVING TIME. HE ALSO SUGGESTED THAT PEOPLE USING THE COUNTY HIGHWAYS PAY FOR THEM THROUGH LICENSE TABS. HE QUESTIONED WHY WASHINGTON COUNTY TAXES WERE 21% HIGHER THAN DAKOTA COUNTY.

JOHN MORTINSON, WOODBURY -- QUESTIONED WHY PROPERTY EVALUATIONS CONTINUE TO INCREASE. STATED IT WAS HARD TO SELL PROPERTY AT THE PRICE IT'S VALUED AT. TAXES KEEP GOING UP.

COLLETTE HALEY -- STATED WITHOUT THE SERVICE THAT WASHINGTON COUNTY PROVIDES, IT WOULD BE DIFFICULT TO KEEP HER SON AT HOME.

JACK DIELENTHEIS, STILLWATER -- COMMENTED ON SEVERAL NEWSPAPER ARTICLES: ST. PAUL PIONEER PRESS--RE: GRACE COMMISSION, HAD IT EVER BEEN FORMED; COURIER--RE: 10% REDUCTION TO ALL COUNTY DEPARTMENTS, DID THIS REFLECT IN THE BUDGET; ST. PAUL PIONEER PRESS--RE: BUILDING OF LAKE ELMO PARK RESERVE MAINTENANCE BUILDING; ST. PAUL PIONEER PRESS--RE: JAIL EXPECTED TO COST MORE TO OPERATE THAN FIRST EXPECTED.

JOANN ADCOCK, STILLWATER -- STATED SHE WAS NEW TO MINNESOTA AND WONDERED HOW THE COUNTY COULD JUSTIFY A 7.4% INCREASE WHEN THE ECONOMY IS IN RECESSION, UNEMPLOYMENT IS HIGH. CUT THINGS OUT. DO NOT LIVE BEYOND MEANS. SUGGESTED THAT TAXES COLLECTED IN WASHINGTON COUNTY SHOULD STAY IN THE COUNTY. ALSO SUGGESTED TAX ON PERSONAL ITEMS SUCH AS CARS, BOATS, SNOWMOBILES, ETC.

CALVIN BANCSLON, GRANT TOWNSHIP -- MOVED TO WASHINGTON COUNTY IN 1981 BECAUSE GRANT TOWNSHIP HAD LOWEST TAX BASE. SINCE THAT TIME IT'S INCREASED 250%. POOR MANAGEMENT. SAY NO TO PROGRAMS AND PROJECTS.

DONALD WALDILLIG, ST. PAUL PARK -- QUESTIONED WHETHER COMMISSIONER SALARIES HAVE BEEN FROZEN FOR THE COUNTY BOARD. WHAT WAS RESULT OF COURT CASE FOR HEALTH INSURANCE FOR RETIREES? HOW DOES THE COUNTY PER CAPITAL TAXES COMPARE WITH STATE OR OTHER METROPOLITAN COUNTIES? HE STATED THAT ALL C.E.O. COMMITTEE MEMBERS WERE BUSINESS MEN, WHY DIDN'T THEY HAVE ORDINARY WORKERS INVOLVED.

DUANE NELSON, STILLWATER -- THE COUNTY NEEDS TO STRIKE A BALANCE, SAY NO. IF STARTING NEW PROGRAMS, CUT OLD PROGRAMS. CUT CULTURE AND RECREATION.

RON TETU, BIG MARINE LAKE -- QUESTIONED WHY TAXES ARE RISING MORE THAN INFLATION. WHY ARE WASHINGTON COUNTY'S TAXES HIGHER THAN DAKOTA COUNTY? DECREASE WATERSHED FUNDING, HE HAS PROBLEMS WITH CARNELIAN-MARINE WATERSHED DISTRICT.

DUANE MILLER, STILLWATER TOWNSHIP -- STATED IT WAS HARD FOR SENIOR CITIZENS ON A 3.5% INCREASE ON SOCIAL SECURITY TO KEEP UP WITH RISING TAXES. ALSO STATED THAT THE BOARD OF EQUALIZATION PROCESS DOES NOT WORK.

JAMES MCCLOUD, LAKE ELMO -- QUESTIONED THE FORMAT OF THE TRUTH IN TAXATION STATEMENT THAT CAME OUT, DIDN'T PROVIDE ANY INFORMATION. WHY COULD CERTAIN COUNTIES PROVIDE MORE INFORMATION THAN OTHERS.

WAYNE BERBERICH, DENMARK TOWNSHIP -- QUESTIONED WHY IT COST SO MUCH TO OPERATE THE LAW ENFORCEMENT CENTER AND GENERAL GOVERNMENT. ASKED WHAT GOOD IT DOES TO COMPLAIN. WHAT IS THE AVERAGE SALARIES FOR COUNTY EMPLOYEES.

BILL BEYERS -- RUN COUNTY MORE LIKE A BUSINESS, LAYOFF MORE EMPLOYEES.

BOB FRITZ, STILLWATER -- STATED HE HAS SPENT THE PAST YEAR ATTENDING COUNTY BOARD MEETINGS. NOTED THAT SPENDING IS UP 5%, DOESN'T SEE ANY CHANGE IN COUNTY SPENDING. STATED 85% OF PROGRAMS ARE MANDATED, OTHER 15% ARE DISCRETIONARY. ARE THE COMMISSIONERS ABLE TO TELL WHETHER A CERTAIN DEPARTMENT IS OVER BUDGET ON A WEEK-TO-WEEK BASIS. CONTROL SPENDING.

JIM DUNCAN, STILLWATER TOWNSHIP -- IS WILLING TO START A TAX PAYER GROUP TO GET TAXES REDUCED.

UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER -- MINIMIZE CHANGE ORDERS TO THE LAW ENFORCEMENT CENTER TO REDUCE COSTS.

THE BOARD CHAIRMAN CALLED FOR FURTHER COMMENTS. THERE WERE NONE.

THE BOARD CHAIRMAN CLOSED THE PUBLIC HEARING AT 9:08 P.M.

WHEREAS, THE OUTCOME OF THE PRESIDENTIAL PRIMARY BALLOTING WILL NOT DETERMINE THE ELECTION OF CANDIDATES TO PUBLIC OFFICE IN MINNESOTA OR AT THE NATIONAL LEVEL; AND

WHEREAS, THE MINNESOTA LEGISLATURE HAS NOT APPROPRIATED SUFFICIENT FUNDS TO REIMBURSE LOCAL GOVERNMENTS FOR THE ENTIRE COST OF THIS ELECTION, AND

WHEREAS, THE LEAGUE OF MINNESOTA CITIES HAS RECOMMENDED THAT CITIES SUPPORT THE REPEAL OF THE PRIMARY IF NO STATE FUNDS ARE PROVIDED TO COVER THE COST OF CONDUCTING BALLOTING AT THE POLLS; AND

WHEREAS, THE DYRSTAD COMMISSION ON STATE AND LOCAL RELATIONS AND COMMON CAUSE HAVE BOTH CALLED FOR THE REPEAL OF THE LAW ESTABLISHING THE PRIMARY; AND

DECEMBER 10, 1991
