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OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE COUNTY BOARD WASHINGTON COUNTY, MINNESOTA JANUARY 7, 1992

THE WASHINGTON COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS MET IN REGULAR SESSION AT 9:00 A.M. IN THE GOVERNMENT CENTER BOARD ROOM. PRESENT WERE COMMISSIONERS MCMULLEN, EVERT, SCHEEL, HEGBERG, AND HAUSER. ABSENT NONE. CHAIRMAN SCHEEL PRESIDED. ALSO PRESENT WERE CHARLES SWANSON, COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR; RICHARD ARNEY, COUNTY ATTORNEY; JIM TRUDEAU, SHERIFF; RICHARD STAFFORD, AUDITOR-TREASURER; JUDY HONMYHR, DIRECTOR HUMAN RESOURCES; RUSS REETZ, DIRECTOR COURT SERVICES; JIM SCHUG, DIRECTOR COMMUNITY SERVICES; LYLE DOERR, FACILITIES MANAGER; JOHN DEVINE, CONTROLLER; AND MARY MCGLOTHLIN, PUBLIC HEALTH DIRECTOR.

CHAIRMAN SCHEEL CALLED FOR UNFINISHED BUSINESS FROM 1991. THERE WAS NONE. COMMISSIONER HEGBERG MOVED TO ADJOURN SINE DIE. COMMISSIONER MCMULLEN SECONDED THE MOTION AND IT WAS ADOPTED UNANIMOUSLY.

A NEW ROLL CALL WAS TAKEN. PRESENT WERE COMMISSIONERS MCMULLEN, EVERT, SCHEEL, HAUSER, AND HEGBERG. ABSENT NONE.

TO AMEND AND MODIFY AGREEMENT NO. 66330 DATED AUGUST 2, 1990, SO THAT THE STATE MAY PAY TO THE COUNTY, AT THIS TIME, THE STATE'S SHARE OF THE COSTS OF BITUMINOUS SURFACING AND AGGREGATE SHOULDERING WHICH HAVE BEEN PERFORMED UPON, ALONG AND ADJACENT TO COUNTY STATE AID HIGHWAY NO. 7 FROM COUNTY ROAD NO. 59 IN MAY TOWNSHIP TO 0.5 OF A MILE EAST OF PAUL AVENUE IN THE CITY OF MARINE ON THE ST. CROIX IN ACCORDANCE WITH PLANS DESIGNATED BY THE COUNTY AS COUNTY PROJECT NO. 89-0704 AND BY THE STATE AS STATE PROJECT NO. 8210-85

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, THAT THE CHAIRMAN OF THE WASHINGTON COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS AND THE WASHINGTON COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR EXECUTE THE MODIFIED AGREEMENT THROUGH THEIR SIGNATURES.

SECTION 361.01 TO M.S. 361.29 DURING THE PERIOD 1 JANUARY 1992 THROUGH 31 DECEMBER 1992.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, THAT THE CHAIRPERSON OF THE WASHINGTON COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS, THE WASHINGTON COUNTY AUDITOR/TREASURER, AND THE WASHINGTON COUNTY SHERIFF BE AND ARE HEREBY AUTHORIZED TO EXECUTE SAID AGREEMENT.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, THAT A COPY OF THIS RESOLUTION BE ATTACHED TO THE ANNUAL COUNTY BOAT AND WATER SAFETY AGREEMENT COVERING THE PERIOD FROM JANUARY 1 1992 THROUGH 31 DECEMBER 1992.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE WASHINGTON COUNTY 201 SEWER USE ORDINANCE.

THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF WASHINGTON COUNTY ORDAINS:

SECTION 1: THE WASHINGTON COUNTY 201 SEWER USE ORDINANCE IS HEREBY AMENDED AS FOLLOWS:

DELETE SECTION 401.02 IN ITS ENTIRETY AND REPLACE WITH THE FOLLOWING LANGUAGE:

401.02. UNLAWFUL CONNECTION TO PUBLIC SEWAGE TREATMENT SYSTEMS. IT SHALL BE UNLAWFUL FOR ANY PERSON TO CONNECT A BUILDING SEWER TO ANY PUBLIC SEWER WITHOUT FIRST OBTAINING A PERMIT FROM THE SEWER AUTHORITY.

DELETE SECTION 401.03 IN ITS ENTIRETY AND REPLACE WITH THE FOLLOWING LANGUAGE:

401.03. UNLAWFU SEWAGE TREATMENT UNLAWFUL INCREASE IN DISCHARGE TO PUBLIC SYSTEM. NO NEW CONSTRUCTION OR EXISTING STRUCTURE RESULTING IN EXPANSION OF AN HABITABLE SPACE BEING CREATED SHALL ALLOWED UNLESS THERE IS ADDITIONAL AVAILABLE CAPACITY IN THE PARTICULAR SYSTEM CONSIDERED, AND THE MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS CONTAINED IN SECTION 405 OF THE WASHINGTON COUNTY SHORELAND ORDINANCE ARE MET.

EXISTING HOMES NOT PRESENTLY SERVED BY THIS SYSTEM MAY BE ALLOWED TO CONNECT TO A 201 COLLECTOR SYSTEM IF IT CAN BE SHOWN THAT THE EXISTING ON-SITE SEWAGE TREATMENT SYSTEM IS INADEQUATE. SUCH ADDITIONS AS GARAGES, DECKS, NEW FOUNDATIONS, AND BATHROOM ADDITIONS ARE CONSIDERED NONHABITABLE SPACE, THEREFORE, NOT AFFECTING THE FLOW RATE. NONHABITABLE SPACES ARE SUBJECT TO ALL OTHER ZONING AND SHORELAND RESTRICTIONS.

DELETE SECTION 401.04 (2) B. IN ITS ENTIRETY AND REPLACE WITH THE FOLLOWING LANGUAGE:

B. APPLICATIONS SHALL BE SUPPLEMENTED BY ANY PLANS, SPECIFICATIONS, OR ANY OTHER INFORMATION CONSIDERED PERTINENT IN THE JUDGMENT OF THE SEWER AUTHORITY. THE INDUSTRY, AS A CONDITION OF PERMIT AUTHORIZATION, MUST PROVIDE INFORMATION DESCRIBING ITS WASTEWATER CONSTITUENTS, CHARACTERISTICS AND TYPE OF ACTIVITY.

SECTION 601.03 (1) B DELETE THE WORD "BIENNIAL".

SECTION 601.03 (2), 2ND SENTENCE. DELETE THE FOLLOWING LANGUAGE: "BIENNIALLY (ONCE EVERY TWO YEARS)"; AND REPLACE IT WITH THE FOLLOWING LANGUAGE: "EVERY THREE YEARS".

DELETE SECTION 601.03 (3) EXCEPTION IN ITS ENTIRETY AND REPLACE IT WITH THE FOLLOWING LANGUAGE.

EXCEPTION: WHERE A CONFORMING SEPTIC TANK SERVING A DWELLING IS REGULARLY PUMPED AT LEAST ONCE EVERY THREE YEARS, THE PROFESSIONAL INSPECTION OF SLUDGE AND SCUM ACCUMULATION IS WAIVED.

SECTION 2: THE ZONING ADMINISTRATOR IS HEREBY DIRECTED TO CHANGE THE WASHINGTON COUNTY 201 SEWER USE ORDINANCE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE FOREGOING INSTRUMENT.

SECTION 3: EFFECTIVE DATE. THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE AND IS HEREBY DECLARED TO BE IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT FROM AND AFTER ITS PASSAGE AND PUBLICATION ACCORDING TO LAW.

COMMISSIONER HEGBERG SECONDED THE MOTION AND IT WAS ADOPTED UNANIMOUSLY.

PUBLIC HEARING - PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT REZONING REQUEST BY WEST LAKELAND FREEWAY PROPERTIES

THE BOARD CHAIRMAN PRESENTED AN OVERVIEW OF TODAY'S PUBLIC HEARING TO CONSIDER AMENDMENTS TO THE ZONING ORDINANCE RELATED TO A REZONING REQUEST BY WEST LAKELAND FREEWAY PROPERTIES TO REZONE APPROXIMATELY 1.6 ACRES FROM R-1 RESIDENTIAL TO INDUSTRIAL. THE SECRETARY TO THE BOARD READ INTO THE RECORD THE NOTICE OF INTENT TO ADOPT SAID ORDINANCE. THE BOARD CHAIRMAN DECLARED THE PUBLIC HEARING OPEN AT 9:25 A.M.

THE PUBLIC HEALTH LAND USE SPECIALIST PRESENTED AN OVERVIEW OF THE REZONING REQUEST BY WEST LAKELAND FREEWAY PROPERTIES. HE REQUESTED THAT ALL MATERIALS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD BE INCORPORATED INTO THE RECORD.

THE FOLLOWING INDIVIDUALS SPOKE: STEVE NELSON, WEST LAKELAND FREEWAY PROPERTIES, STATED THAT REZONING THIS PROPERTY FROM RESIDENTIAL TO INDUSTRIAL WOULD BE THE BEST USE OF THIS PROPERTY; AND RAY SWANSON, WEST LAKELAND TOWNSHIP PLANNING COMMISSION, PRESENTED A LETTER FROM JOHN PRITCHARD, CHAIRMAN, WEST LAKELAND TOWNSHIP, WHICH SUPPORTS THE REZONING REQUEST. WEST LAKELAND TOWNSHIP FEELS THAT THE TOWN'S HISTORICAL ZONING AS WELL AS ITS RIGHT TO ZONE AND PLAN SHOULD BE AFFIRMED BY THE COUNTY BOARD.

THE BOARD CHAIRMAN CALLED FOR FURTHER COMMENTS. NONE WERE HEARD. THE CHAIRMAN DECLARED THE PUBLIC HEARING CLOSED AT 9:55 A.M.

THE BOARD DISCUSSED THE REZONING REQUEST.

COMMISSIONER HAUSER MOVED TO DENY THE REZONING REQUEST BY WEST LAKELAND FREEWAY PROPERTIES TO REZONE APPROXIMATELY 1.6 ACRES FROM R-1 RESIDENTIAL TO INDUSTRIAL. COMMISSIONER MCMULLEN SECONDED THE MOTION AND IT WAS ADOPTED UNANIMOUSLY.

COMMISSIONER HAUSER MOVED TO DIRECT THE COUNTY ATTORNEY'S OFFICE TO PREPARE A RESOLUTION DENYING THE REZONING REQUEST BY WEST LAKELAND FREEWAY PROPERTIES. COMMISSIONER EVERT SECONDED THE MOTION AND IT WAS ADOPTED UNANIMOUSLY.

REQUEST BY CHARLES MARX TO GRANT ACCESS TO C.A.S.H. 3

THE PUBLIC WORKS DIRECTOR PRESENTED A REQUEST BY MR. CHARLES MARX, FOREST LAKE, WHO DESIRES DIRECT ACCESS TO C.S.A.H. 3 VIA AN EXISTING FIELD ENTRANCE. THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT RECOMMENDS THAT MR. MARXS' REQUEST BE DENIED.

CHARLES MARX PRESENTED HIS REQUEST. HE STATED THAT IF HE WERE TO ACCESS ON TO 202ND STREET NORTH RATHER THAN C.S.A.H. 3 HIS DRIVEWAY WOULD BE CONSIDERABLY LONGER, SNOW REMOVAL WOULD BE MORE DIFFICULT AND EMERGENCY VEHICLES SUCH AS FIRE ENGINES AND AMBULANCES WOULD HAVE A HARD TIME GETTING THROUGH.

THE BOARD DISCUSSED MR. MARXS' REQUEST.

COMMISSIONER HEGBERG MOVED TO APPROVE THE REQUEST BY MR. MARX TO ALLOW HIS DRIVEWAY TO ACCESS C.A.S.H. 3 PROVIDING THAT MR. MARX REMOVE THE FIELD ACCESS THAT IS CURRENTLY THERE AND REMOVE THE CULVERT WHICH IS JUST SOUTH OF WHERE HE WOULD LIKE TO PLACE THE DRIVEWAY. COMMISSIONER HAUSER SECONDED THE MOTION AND IT WAS ADOPTED WITH THE VOTE AS FOLLOWS: YES, COMMISSIONERS HEGBERG, HAUSER, AND SCHEEL; NO, COMMISSIONERS EVERT AND MCMULLEN.

THE BOARD APPOINTED COMMISSIONERS HAUSER AND EVERT TO THE MINNESOTA MUNICIPAL BOARD TO SERVE ON THE PROCEEDINGS INVOLVING THE ANNEXATION OF CERTAIN LAND TO THE CITY OF FOREST LAKE.

THE BOARD APPOINTED COMMISSIONERS SCHEEL AND HAUSER TO THE CANVASS BOARD FOR THE PRIMARY ELECTIONS.

PARCEL #97034-2900. THE PROPERTY IS SOUTH OF TRUNK HIGHWAY NO. 12, NORTH OF THE FRONTAGE ROAD AND WEST OF COUNTY STATE AID HIGHWAY NO. 21.

WHICH REQUEST WAS REFERRED TO THE WASHINGTON COUNTY PLANNING ADVISORY COMMISSION, WHO AFTER HOLDING A PUBLIC HEARING, RECOMMENDED DENIAL OF THE REQUEST AS INDICATED IN THEIR FEBRUARY 25, 1992 MINUTES; AND

WHEREAS, ON MARCH 3, 1992, THE WASHINGTON COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS, PURSUANT TO NOTICE OF INTENT TO ADOPT ORDINANCE IN RESPONSE TO THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE PLANNING COMMISSION THAT THE REQUEST BE DENIED, CONDUCTED A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE REQUEST AND BASED ON THE MINUTES OF THE WASHINGTON COUNTY PLANNING ADVISORY COMMISSION HEARING AND THE EVIDENCE PRESENTED AT THE MARCH 3, 1992 HEARING MAKES THE FOLLOWING FINDINGS WITH REGARD TO THE REQUEST:

- 1. THE SUBJECT PARCEL IS A REMANENT PIECE OF LAND, LEFT OVER AFTER A TAKING BY THE MINNESOTA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FOR THE HIGHWAY 12 RECONSTRUCTION. THE SUBJECT PARCEL WAS PART OF A LARGER PARCEL AND COMPENSATION WAS PAID TO THE PRIOR OWNER AS IF THE SUBJECT PARCEL WAS ACQUIRED, THOUGH IN FACT THE SUBJECT PARCEL WAS NOT. APPLICANT PURCHASED THE PROPERTY AFTER THE HIGHWAY 12 RECONSTRUCTION WAS COMPLETED.
- 2. ACCORDING TO THE WASHINGTON COUNTY COMPREHENSIVE PLAN AND THE WASHINGTON COUNTY ZONING ORDINANCE, BOTH OF WHICH PREDATE APPLICANT'S PURCHASE OF THE PARCEL, THE SUBJECT PARCEL IS ZONED R-1.
- 3. ACCORDING TO THE WASHINGTON COUNTY COMPREHENSIVE PLAN AND ZONING ORDINANCE, THE SURROUNDING PROPERTIES ARE ZONED R-1 ALSO.
- 4. THE FOLLOWING FACTS OR CONDITIONS EXIST ALONG THE HIGHWAY 12 CORRIDOR IN WEST LAKELAND TOWNSHIP, INCLUDING THE SUBJECT PARCEL:
 - (A) THERE IS NO PUBLIC SEWER SERVING THE AREA AND NONE IS PLANNED. THIS CONDITION AFFECTS THE TYPES OF DEVELOPMENT WHICH ARE APPROPRIATE. IN GENERAL, COMMERCIAL/INDUSTRIAL USES ARE MORE APPROPRIATE AND DESIRABLE IN SEWERED AREAS, ESPECIALLY WHEN CONSIDERING THE PROTECTION OF GROUNDWATER.
 - (B) THERE IS NO PUBLIC WATER SUPPLY. THIS CONDITION MEANS THAT ALL WATER USERS WILL HAVE TO RELY ON HIGH QUALITY GROUNDWATER. ANY CONTAMINATION WILL AFFECT THE FUTURE USE OF THIS AND ADJACENT PROPERTY. FIRE FIGHTING IS ALSO A CONCERN DUE TO A LACK OF A STEADY FLOW OF WATER TO FIGHT AND CONTROL A FIRE. ANY COMMERCIAL/INDUSTRIAL

- ACTIVITIES THAT USE OR STORE FLAMMABLE OR HAZARDOUS CHEMICALS WOULD POSE SERIOUS PROBLEMS BECAUSE OF THE LACK OF URBAN SERVICES.
- (C) THERE ARE GROUNDWATER AND SOIL CONTAMINATION PROBLEMS IN THE AREA. SPECIFICALLY, THERE IS A WELL ADVISORY COVERING THE PROPERTY SOUTH OF HIGHWAY 94 IN THE TOWNSHIP.
- (D) ACCESS ALONG THE HIGHWAY HAS BEEN CHANGED AS A RESULT OF THE HIGHWAY BEING UPGRADED. ACCESS HAS A DIRECT RELATIONSHIP TO THE APPROPRIATENESS AND SUCCESS OF COMMERCIAL USES. PROPERTY OWNERS WERE PAID DAMAGES TO THEIR PROPERTY AS A RESULT OF ACCESS BEING CHANGED.
- (E) GEOLOGIC CONDITIONS ARE SUCH THAT THERE IS A "VERY HIGH" TO "HIGH" SUSCEPTIBILITY OF CONTAMINATING THE WATER TABLE SYSTEM AND THE PRAIRIE DU CHIEN AND JORDAN AQUIFERS AS INDICATED IN THE WASHINGTON COUNTY GEOLOGIC ATLAS.
- (F) BOTH TOWNSHIP AND COUNTY ZONING ORDINANCE DEFINE COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL USE BROADLY. IF LAND IS ZONED IN THESE CLASSIFICATIONS, ANY USE MEETING THAT CONDITION IS A USE-BY-RIGHT.
- (G) NEITHER THE TOWN NOR COUNTY HAVE DESIGN CRITERIA FOR NEW COMMERCIAL DEVELOPMENT.
- (H) THE STATE PURCHASED NUMEROUS SIGN LOCATIONS ALONG THE HIGHWAY AND PAID DAMAGES AND FIVE YEARS' REVENUE TO TAKE THOSE SIGNS. THE COUNTY OR TOWNSHIP RECEIVE NO ADDITIONAL PROPERTY TAXES AS A RESULT OF A SIGN BEING PLACED ON PROPERTY BECAUSE SIGNS ARE NOT ASSESSED AS IMPROVEMENTS.
- (I) THE SOILS IN THE AREA ARE PRIMARILY SAND, GRAVELLY SAND, AND GRAVEL. THESE TYPES OF SOILS INCREASE SUSCEPTIBILITY TO GROUNDWATER CONTAMINATION.
- (J) COMMERCIAL/INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT CAN POSE A THREAT TO THE GROUNDWATER BECAUSE OF THE POTENTIAL FOR SOLVENTS AND CHEMICALS TO BE WASHED DOWN THE DRAIN AND INTO THE SEPTIC SYSTEMS OR ACCIDENTALLY OR DELIBERATELY SPILLED ONTO THE GROUND SURFACE.
- (K) GROUNDWATER MOVES IN BASICALLY AN EASTERLY TO SOUTHEASTERLY DIRECTION ACCORDING TO THE GEOLOGIC ATLAS.
- (L) GROUNDWATER CONTAMINATION HAS BEEN PROVEN TO EXIST IN THE AREA OF THE SUBJECT PROPERTY AND THE SUBJECT PROPERTY LIES ENTIRELY WITHIN A WELL ADVISORY.
- (M) THERE IS NO INTERCHANGE AT COUNTY STATE AID HIGHWAY NO. 21 (STAGECOACH TRAIL).
- 5. GRANTING THIS ZONING REQUEST WOULD ESTABLISH A LAND USE CLASSIFICATION FOR THE SUBJECT PARCEL INCONSISTENT WITH THE SURROUNDING USES AS PLANNED FOR IN THE WASHINGTON COUNTY COMPREHENSIVE PLAN AND REGULATED BY THE WASHINGTON COUNTY ZONING ORDINANCE.

6. GRANTING THIS ZONING REQUEST WOULD ESTABLISH A LAND USE CLASSIFICATION FOR THE SUBJECT PARCEL INCONSISTENT WITH THE USES AS PLANNED FOR IN THE WASHINGTON COUNTY COMPREHENSIVE PLAN AND REGULATED BY THE WASHINGTON COUNTY ZONING ORDINANCE.

THE LAND USE SPECIALIST PRESENTED AN OVERVIEW OF THE PROPOSED ORDINANCE.

THE BOARD CHAIRMAN ASKED FOR FURTHER COMMENTS. NONE WERE HEARD. THE CHAIRMAN DECLARED THE PUBLIC HEARING CLOSED AT 9:20 A.M.

WASHINGTON COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. 92

AN ORDINANCE IMPOSING A MORATORIUM ON THE ISSUANCE OF BUILDING PERMITS FOR LATERAL ADDITIONS TO SUBSTANDARD STRUCTURES IN THE ST. CROIX RIVER DISTRICT.

THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF WASHINGTON COUNTY ORDAINS:

- SECTION 1: IN ORDER TO PROTECT AND PRESERVE EXISTING NATURAL, SCENIC, AND RECREATIONAL VALUES OF THE ST. CROIX RIVER, A MORATORIUM ON THE ISSUANCE OF BUILDING PERMITS FOR ALL LATERAL ADDITIONS (PARALLEL TO THE RIVER OR BLUFF) TO SUBSTANDARD STRUCTURES WITHIN THE ST. CROIX RIVER DISTRICT IS HEREBY ADOPTED.
- SECTION 2: THIS MORATORIUM SHALL ONLY APPLY TO SITUATIONS WHERE AN APPLICANT WISHES TO EXPAND A SUBSTANDARD STRUCTURE BY CONSTRUCTING A LATERAL ADDITION TO A STRUCTURE NOT MEETING THE RIVER OR BLUFF SETBACK REQUIREMENT, AND HAS NOT HAD A BUILDING PERMIT ISSUED PRIOR TO THE DATE THIS MORATORIUM COMES INTO EFFECT.
- SECTION 3: THIS MORATORIUM SHALL BE AND IS HEREBY DECLARED TO BE IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT FROM AND AFTER ITS PASSAGE AND PUBLICATION ACCORDING TO LAW, AND SHALL BE LIMITED TO TWO (2) MONTHS FROM THE DATE IT BECOMES EFFECTIVE, UNLESS EARLIER REPEALED OR EXTENDED.

PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT

Commissioner Hegberg moved, seconded by Commissioner Evert to adopt the following Consent Calendar:

- 2. Adoption of Resolution No. 92-058 as follows:

Adopting Washington County Ordinance No. 93 Relating to the Washington County Park System Repealing Washington County Ordinances Nos. 44 & 55

WHEREAS, the Washington County Board of Commissioners has determined that it is necessary for the public health, safety and welfare of the residents of Washington County to prescribe regulations not inconsistent with law for the protection and use of county parks; and

WHEREAS, Washington County adopted Washington County Ordinances Nos. 44 and 55 prescribing such regulations; and

WHEREAS, the Washington County Board of Commissioners has determined that these existing ordinances are inadequate; and

WHEREAS, the Washington County Board of Commissioners has received the recommendations of the Washington County Park and Open Space Commission in the form of a draft ordinance; and

WHEREAS, on May 5, 1992, the Washington County Board of Commissioners conducted a public hearing on the draft ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the draft ordinance as amended by County Board action taken at their May 5, 1992 hearing be and hereby is adopted.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chairman of the Washington County Board of Commissioners is authorized to execute this ordinance on behalf of the Board, with the ordinance being in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication, according to law.

This ordinance specifies rules and regulations for the safe and peaceful use of park lands; for the education and recreation of the public; for the protection and preservation of the property, facilities and natural resources; for the safety and general welfare of the public and provide penalties for violations of the regulations. This ordinance applies to all parks within the Washington County park system.

The foregoing is only a summary of the ordinance and the full text is available for public inspection at the Office of the Washington County Auditor/Treasurer and the Washington County Department of Public Works.

3. Adoption of Resolution No. 92-059 as follows:

Amending the Lower St. Croix River Bluffland and Shoreland Management Ordinance

WHEREAS, on March 24, 1992, the Washington County Board of Commissioners passed a two month moratorium that prohibited the issuance of any new building permits for lateral additions to substandard structures that lie within the St. Croix River District to provide the Washington County Planning Advisory Commission the opportunity to hold a public hearing on an amendment to Section 601.03 of the Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, on March 24, 1992, the Washington County Planning Advisory Commission held a public hearing on the proposed ordinance and recommended its approval; and

WHEREAS, on May 5, 1992, the Washington County Board of Commissioners conducted a public hearing on the Planning Advisory Commissions recommendations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Washington County Board of Commissioners adopt the Planning Advisory Commission's recommendations deleting Section 601.03(2) of the ordinance and replacing it with the following language:

601.03(2) a lateral improvement to an existing substandard structure or facility is allowed so long as the improvement does not encroach any closer to any bluffline or the ordinary high water mark of the river than the closest point of the existing structure to any bluffline or the ordinary high water mark of the river and all of the following conditions are met. For the purpose of this section, the term structure shall not include

decks, porches, garages or other non year around living spaces.

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- (a) A minimum undisturbed setback of 30 feet from all blufflines and 50 feet from the ordinary high water mark of the river shall be maintained.
- (b) The maximum width of the improvement shall not exceed 50% of the lateral width of the river facing profile of the existing structure. For the purpose of this section, the lateral profile width shall exclude decks, porches, garages or other non year around living spaces, and shall be based on the date the structure became a substandard structure.
- (c) The improvement to the structure must be visually inconspicuous as viewed from the river during summer months.
- (d) An inspection by the Zoning Administrator and Soil and Water Conservation District must include a finding that tree survival/growth and integrity and inherent stability of the existing landscape will be maintained if the improvement is built.
- (e) The improvement shall meet all other standards contained in the ordinance, including those contained in Sections 402 and 602.
- (f) The height of the improvement shall not exceed the height of the roof line of the existing structure.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chairman of the Washington County Board of Commissioners is authorized to execute the ordinance on behalf of the Washington County Board and the ordinance shall thereafter be effective on the date of publication as required by law.

That part of the N 1/2 of Section 19 and the SW 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of Section 18, all in Township 30 North, Range 20 West, Washington County, Minnesota, described as follows: commencing at the northwest corner of the NE 1/4 of section 19; thence north 89 degrees 44 minutes 35 seconds east, assumed bearing, along the north line of said NE 1/4 a distance of 75.00 feet to the point of beginning; thence south 03 degrees 00 minutes 00 seconds west 245 feet; thence south 13 degrees 00 minutes 00 seconds west 500.00 feet; thence south 06 degrees 30 minutes 00 seconds east 692.00 feet, thence south 37 degrees 00 minutes 00 seconds east 623.00 feet, more or less, to a point on the north line of Outlot A of Random Creek Ranchettes No. according to the plat on file in the office of the County Recorder, Washington County Minnesota; thence easterly along said north line to the northeast corner of said Outlot A, being a point on the north line of the S 1/2 of the SW 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of said Section 19; thence easterly along said north line of the S 1/2 of the SW 1/4 of the NE 1/4 to the northeast corner thereof; thence easterly along the south line of the NW 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of said Section 19 to the southeast corner of said NW 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of the NE 1/4; thence northerly along the easterly line of said NW 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of the NE 1/4 and along the easterly line of the W 1/2 of the NE 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of said Section 19 to the northeast corner of said W 1/2 of the NE 1/4 of the NE 1/4; thence westerly along the north line of said W 1/2 of the NE 1/4 of the NE 1/4 to the east line of said SW 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of Section 18; thence northerly along said east line to the centerline of Trunk Highway 96; thence southwesterly along said centerline to a line that bears north 03 degrees 00 minutes 00 seconds east from the point beginning; thence southerly along said line to the point of beginning.

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WHEREAS, on May 5, 1992, the Washington County Board of Commissioners, pursuant to a Notice of Intent to Amend Ordinance in response to the recommendations of the Planning Commission, conducted a public hearing on the request and based on the minutes of the Washington County Planning Advisory Commission hearing and the evidence presented at the March 24, 1992 hearing, makes the following findings with regard to the request:

- 1. South Twin Lake is classified as an LS-1 lake, within the meaning of the Washington County Shoreland Management Ordinance.
- 2. The Washington County Shoreland Management Ordinance establishes lakeshore districts as overlay districts in lieu of the regulations contained in the Washington County Zoning Ordinance.
- 3. The boundaries of the Lakeshore District are designated on the Washington County Zoning Map 1,000 feet from the ordinary high water mark of any public body of water.
- 4. The current south and west boundaries of the Lakeshore District as shown on the zoning district map are erroneous and measuring 1,000 feet from the
