#### LS POWER CORPORATION

Phill McMullen, LS Power Corporation Project Manager, and George Kerrick, 3M Company, appeared before the Board to request support for legislation revising taxation of a cogeneration facility in Washington County at the 3M Cottage Grove Plant.

Commissioner Peterson moved to adopt Resolution No. 94-015 as follows:

Support Legislation Revising Taxation of a Cogeneration Facility

WHEREAS, Northern States Power Company ("NSP") has a need for 232 megawatts of new electric generating capacity in the late 1990s; and

WHEREAS, NSP conducted a competitive procurement process for its 1997 power resource needs at the direction of the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission ("PUC"); and

WHEREAS, LS Power Corporation ("LS Power") was selected as a result of the NSP/PUC process to build a cogeneration facility at the ("3M") Cottage Grove plant; and

WHEREAS, the cogeneration facility will provide 3M with steam for heating and process needs for 3M's existing and future facilities; and

WHEREAS, the cogeneration facility will provide electric power to serve the growing needs of the south Washington County area and the rest of NSP's service territory; and WHEREAS, the cogeneration facility at the 3M Cottage Grove plan will have environmental benefits, replacing existing coal-fired boilers, will not require extension or construction of city utilities, will not require new major gas pipelines or electrical transmission lines, will require provision of minimal or no governmental services, will provide permanent employment for 25 people, and will provide employment for 250 people during the two year construction period; and

WHEREAS, in order to proceed with the development of the LS Power Corporation cogeneration facility, the annual taxation of the facility in Minnesota must be comparable to the taxation of the Wheaton, Wisconsin alternative; and

WHEREAS, under current Minnesota law, the LS Power facility would pay approximately \$12.1 million annually in taxes in Minnesota, as contrasted to taxes on the Wheaton facility estimated by NSP at approximately \$9,000 annually, due to the Minnesota real estate taxation of electrical generating equipment; and

WHEREAS, if the LS Power cogeneration facility were taxed in the same fashion as other commercial/industrial property, on its real estate value only, and close enough to NSP's tax cost in Wisconsin to allow the facility to be built in Minnesota:

NOW, THEREFORE, the County of Washington, acting by and through its County Board, RESOLVES:

- 1. That the construction of a 232 megawatt cogeneration facility at the 3M Cottage Grove facility will benefit the 3M Cottage Grove plant and the growing electrical needs of south Washington County, is environmentally desirable and will have no impact of county governmental services; and
- 2. That the County supports an amendment to the state property tax statutes for this proposed electrical generation facility. The amendment would provide a limited exception for this facility, taxing only its real property value. This allows taxation costs consistent with taxation of other manufacturing facilities in Minnesota, and close enough to NSP's tax cost in Wisconsin to allow the facility to be built in Minnesota.

Commissioner Engstrom seconded the motion and it was adopted unanimously.

# OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE COUNTY BOARD WASHINGTON COUNTY, MINNESOTA JANUARY 25, 1994

The Washington County Board of Commissioners met in regular session at 9:00 a.m. in the Washington County Board Room. Present were Commissioners Peterson, Abrahamson, Hauser, Hegberg, and Engstrom. Also present were Richard Arney, County Attorney; Jim Schug, Community Services Director; Judy Arends, Department of Health, Environment, and Land Management; Mary McGlothlin, Director of Health, Environment, and Land Management; Jim Trudeau, Sheriff; John Devine, Controller; Bob Turrentine, Assistant County Attorney; Jack Perkovich, Deputy Public Works Director; Richard Stafford, Auditor-Treasurer; Judy Honmyhr, Human Resources Director; Brendan McLaughlin, Budget Analyst; John Franzen, County Recorder; and Scott Hovet, County Assessor.

#### CONSENT CALENDAR

Commissioner Peterson moved, seconded by Commissioner Abrahamson, to adopt the following Consent Calendar:

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that Valley Paving, Inc., be paid in full for the said contract work in the amount due indicated on the final payment voucher which is attached herewith and is hereby a part of this resolution.

The foregoing Consent Calendar was adopted unanimously.

#### PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

Commissioner Peterson stated that she had received a letter from the City of Cottage Grove requesting the Board to delay action on Alternative No. 7 of the master plan draft for the Grey Cloud Island Park until such time as the City could discuss this matter with the County Board.

Commissioner Engstrom moved to authorize staff to proceed with the master plan draft for Grey Cloud Island Park based on Alternative No. 7. Commissioner Abrahamson seconded the motion and it was adopted with the vote as follows: Yes, Commissioners Abrahamson, Hauser, Hegberg, and Engstrom; No, Commissioner Peterson.

#### SIXTH CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT

Barbara Sykora, Aide to Representative Rod Grams, Sixth Congressional District, appeared before the Board to hear concerns the Board may have on current issues. Some of the issues the Board would like

#### **COMMUNITY SERVICES DEPARTMENT**

Commissioner Abrahamson moved to approve the 1994 contract with Human Services, Inc. to provide mental health, chemical health, aging and transportation services. Commissioner Engstrom seconded the motion and it was adopted unanimously.

# RESOURCE RECOVERY PROJECT

Jerry Turnquist, Resource Recovery Project Manager, appeared before the Board to discuss the Resource Recovery Facility tipping fee and the Waste Management Service Charge for Resource Recovery.

Commissioner Engstrom moved to adopt Resolution No. 94-017 as follows:

Ramsey/Washington County Resource Recovery Facility Tipping Fee

WHEREAS, Ramsey and Washington Counties are authorized by the Joint Powers Agreement, dated December 30, 1986, to establish by resolution, the tipping fee at the Ramsey/Washington County Resource Recovery Facility; and

WHEREAS, increases imposed by federal, state or local governmental units may be passed directly on to haulers without a ninety (90) day notice.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Washington County Board of Commissioners hereby establishes the tipping fee at the Ramsey/Washington County Resource Recovery Facility at \$50/ton, effective February 1, 1994.

Commissioner Hegberg seconded the motion and it was adopted unanimously.

Commissioner Engstrom moved to adopt Resolution No. 94-018 as follows:

Waste Management Service Charge for Resource Recovery

WHEREAS, on December 28, 1993, the Ramsey County Board of Commissioners and Washington County Board of Commissioners passed

resolutions lowering the tipping fee at the Resource Recovery Facility in Newport; and

WHEREAS, on December 28, 1993, the Ramsey County Board of Commissioners and Washington County Board of Commissioners passed resolutions to establish and implement collection of a Waste Management Service Charge (WMSC), to be used for the Resource Recovery Project, on all generators which is to be collected by licensed waste haulers; and

WHEREAS, the Ramsey/Washington County Resource Recovery Project Board adopted a resolution on January 20, 1994 which provided recommendations on the WMSC to be used for the Resource Recovery Project; and

WHEREAS, Ramsey and Washington Counties desire to handle solid waste in an environmentally responsible manner and to provide an economically sound basis for the operation of the Resource Recovery Facility.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Washington County Board of Commissioners determines that it will implement a WMSC (to be used for the Resource Recovery Project) that requires residential generators to pay a flat charge and non-residential generators to pay a charge based on the cubic yards of disposal capacity, and that the WMSC be collected by haulers.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the County Board designates the Resource Recovery Project as the designated agent of the Counties to collect the WMSC from the haulers.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the County Board determines that the Counties require that April 1, 1994 be the effective date for implementation of the WMSC.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the County Board approves that the shortfall created by the reduced tipping fee for the months of January, February and March, 1994 be appropriated from the Resource Recovery Project Board's undesignated fund balance.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the County Board determines that haulers will not be required to pay the WMSC if they do not collect it from their customers, as long as haulers submit a list of generators that do not pay the WMSC to the County when remitting the WMSC collected.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the County Board will consider in a timely manner ordinance changes necessary to implement the collection of the WMSC and that the Ordinances be as consistent as possible with Ramsey County and to be structured so that the ordinance changes can be effective April 1, 1994.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the County Board directs staff to prepare specific plans for implementing the WMSC for discussion and consideration by the Project Board at its February meeting.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the County Board supports the Project Board's efforts to prepare and implement a public education work plan.

#### **GENERAL ADMINISTRATION**

# Oakland Road

Commissioner Hegberg moved to adopt Resolution No. 94-019 as follows:

#### Oakland Road Findings

Pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 163.16, on December 28, 1993 the Washington County Board of Commissioners held a public hearing to determine if the complaint of Dean Tharp, et al that a portion of Oakland Road in the Town of May was impassable was well founded. At the hearing, the Board heard and received evidence for and against the complaint and at the completion of the hearing, deliberations were continued until January 11, 1994. Based on the evidence provided at the hearing and after due deliberation, the Board finds the following facts with regard to the complaint:

Oakland Road was dedicated in 1910 on the plat of Idlewylde and Jarchows Additions to Idlewylde as a 33 foot wide dead end road. It is marked in orange on Exhibit 4, which is incorporated herein by reference.

In 1991, the Town Board discovered that Oakland Road was dedicated to the public. In 1993, the Town Board posted the road as a minimum maintenance road for liability reasons. The Town of May never accepted, opened or maintained the road.

There is a gap between the public road now known as Oldfield Road and Oakland Road so that as dedicated, Oakland Road does not connect to another public road and dead ends in a marshy area to the east as shown on Exhibit 4.

The current access to Oakland road from Oldfield Road is across a private driveway located on a parcel of land owned in common by the owners of Lots 6-24 of Jarchows Addition. This access road is marked in green on Exhibit 4.

Because this access is private, even if Oakland road were improved, the public would have no access to it.

The portion of Oakland Road used by the landowners to access their properties and which is the subject of the complaint is located between Lots 6 and 24 of jarchows Addition to Idlewylde and is marked in red on Exhibit 4. This portion of the road is passable for emergency vehicles only in the summer months.

This road is approximately 2300 feet in length and provides access to four dwellings, two of which are located at the east end of the road and are either used or proposed to be used as full time residences, with the other two located on the westerly portion of the road and being used on a seasonal basis.

There is a fifth dwelling on Oakland road, but access is provided directly from the access road and not from Oakland Road.

Of the 2300 feet of travelled roadway, 1600 feet is on the platted right-of-way of Oakland Road and 700 feet is on private property.

In order to provide year-around access for emergency vehicles to the two properties at the end of the road, the entire road should be upgraded to a 20 foot horizontal surface, a 12 foot vertical surface and a 10-12 foot hard driving surface.

Minn. Stat. § 163.16 limits the County's jurisdiction to the platted portions and the cost to upgrade the entire road within the platted boundaries to these standards, would be between \$29,000 and \$36,000.

The two residents at the end of the road knew, or should have known, that the Town of May had not accepted or maintained the road as a town road when they purchased their property or converted the use from seasonal to full time residences.

The Town has not allocated funds to improve the road to a passable condition.

The Town determined not to open and maintain the road for the reasons set forth on Exhibit 10, which is incorporated herein by reference.

BASED ON THE FOREGOING and because the landowners knew, or should have known, that Oakland road was not an opened or maintained town road before they attempted to use their properties on a year-around basis; because the Town of May has not allocated the funds necessary to open and maintain the road; because, even if the road were improved, it would not be accessible to the public and would benefit only the abutting property owners; and because of the relatively high costs to provide access to only two year-around dwellings;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Washington County Board of Commissioners finds the complaint not to be well founded, that the relief requested by the landowners is denied and the decision by the Town is sustained.

Commissioner Peterson seconded the motion and it was adopted with the vote as follows: Yes, Commissioners Peterson, Hauser, and Hegberg; No, Commissioners, Abrahamson and Engstrom.

Commissioner Abrahamson stated he was opposed to this resolution. He feels there is a safety issue at stake here and that is why he voted against the resolution.

#### Update on Board Workshop to Discuss Personnel Issues

The Human Resources Director and First Assistant County Attorney asked for input from the Board on what types of personnel issues they would like discussed at a future workshop. Some of the areas suggested were: Americans with Disability Act and Reasonable Accommodation; Data Practices; Labor Relations Law; Comparable Worth; and, Civil Rights Liability Law.

Commissioner Peterson suggested inviting the local municipalities to attend also.

Chairman Hauser has two pieces of correspondence that she received and will make available to the other Board members: 1) Letter from the Metropolitan Light Rail Transit Joint Powers Board addressed to Representative Martin Sabo regarding federal funding for light rail transit; and 2) Department of Corrections regarding juvenile temporary holdover facility within the law enforcement center building.

Commissioner Peterson stated that there will be a AMC District X meeting on January 31, at 3:00 p.m.

Board Correspondence was received and placed on file.

# **ADJOURNMENT**

There being no further business to come before the Board, Commissioner Engstrom moved to adjourn, seconded by Commissioner Peterson, and it was adopted unanimously. The Board meeting adjourned at 10:15 a.m.

# Annual Boat and Water Safety Enforcement Agreement

WHEREAS, the County is eligible to receive \$36,277 to assist in the funding of the Sheriff's Duties during the period 1 January 1994 through 31 December 1994.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the County of Washington enter into an agreement with the State of Minnesota, Department of Natural Resources for the following purposes: to receive assistance in the funding of carrying out the Sheriff's Duties under the provisions of M.S. Section 361.01 to M.S. 361.29 during the period 1 January 1994 through 31 December 1994.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chairperson of the Washington County Board of Commissioners, the Washington County Auditor/Treasurer, and the Washington County Sheriff be and are hereby authorized to execute said agreement;

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be attached to the Annual County Boat and Water Safety Agreement covering the period from 1 January 1994 through 31 December 1994.

The foregoing Consent Calendar was adopted unanimously; Commissioner Peterson absent.

# PUBLIC HEARING - TRANSFER OF COUNTY STATE AID MUNICIPAL FUNDS TO COUNTY STATE AID REGULAR ACCOUNT

The Deputy Public Works Director gave a brief overview of the request to the Commissioner of Transportation to transfer County State Aid Municipal funds to County State Aid Regular Account in the amount of \$1,200,000.

The Chairman opened the public hearing for comments; none were heard. Commissioner Hegberg moved to close the public hearing. Commissioner Engstrom seconded the motion and it was adopted unanimously; Commissioner Peterson absent.

The Deputy Public Works Director stated that a letter was received from the City of Lake St. Croix Beach. He also stated that the County Board adopted Resolution No. 94-013 on January 18, 1994, requesting the Commissioner of Transportation to transfer County State Aid Municipal funds to County State Aid Regular Account. As part of that Resolution, it was stated that a public hearing will be held on this matter to receive comments. Since that has now been accomplished, the Deputy Public Works Director is requesting that the County Board submit Resolution No. 94-013 to the Commissioner of Transportation.

Artista Park

Commissioner Engstrom moved to submit Resolution No. 94-013, requesting the Commissioner of Transportation to transfer County State Aid Municipal funds to County State Aid Regular Account in the amount of \$1,200,000, to the Minnesota Department of Transportation. Commissioner Abrahamson seconded the motion and it was adopted unanimously; Commissioner Peterson absent.

#### COMMUNITY SERVICES DEPARTMENT

#### Appointments to the Ramsey Action Program, Inc. Board of Directors

Commissioner Abrahamson moved to reappoint James Schug, Community Services Director, and Charlotte Farnum, Economic Support Division Manager, as alternate, to the Ramsey Action Program, Inc. Board of Directors. Commissioner Hegberg seconded the motion and it was adopted unanimously; Commissioner Peterson absent.

#### **Economic Support Division Programs**

The Community Services Director presented a year end report on economic assistance, medical assistance, child support, and welfare fraud programs.

#### PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

The Public Works Director presented an overview on two requests to designate portions of CSAH 21 as Natural Preservation Routes (NPR), Type III.

Jon Kroschel, Mayor, City of Afton, encouraged the Board to designate portions of CSAH 21 as a Natural Preservation Route.

Kenneth Kopitzke, Afton, spoke against designating CSAH 21 as a Natural Preservation Route. He stated that he feels CSAH 21 does not meet the requirements outlined in state statues for NPR designation. He presented information on the function, accident history, scenic characteristics, and traffic volumes on CSAH 21.

Jon Kingstad, Afton, spoke in favor of the NPR designation on CSAH 21. He stated that perhaps there is one dangerous spot that may need to be reconstructed under any plan that goes forward and that would be Dodges Corner. He feels that the NPR designation will preserve the rural character of that area.

Al Gorgus, Chairman, Denmark Township, spoke on his own behalf and not necessarily that of the Denmark Township Board. He stated he is against having some portions of CSAH 21 designated as NPR and some not. He would rather have the entire CSAH 21 designated as NPR so it would be less of a safety hazard. He feels the design standards should remain high. He feels that the intersection of CSAH 20 and 21 needs immediate attention.

Commissioner Engstrom moved to designate CSAH 21 within the city limits of Afton, with the exception of the main street, as a Natural Preservation Route Type III, and that the County apply for the variance at the time of the reconstruction. Commissioner Abrahamson seconded the motion.

Darlene Moynagh, Afton, stated that the resurfacing that was done last summer has not made CSAH 21 any safer.

Tom Augustine, Denmark Township, presented statistics on traffic accidents occurring on CSAH 21. He feels that the resurfacing has not made CSAH 21 safer and that it should be reconstructed. He stated that designating CSAH 21 as a Type III NPR will not make that road any safer.

Barbara Kallusky, Afton, suggested that only the southern portion of CSAH 21 be designated NPR.

Howie Vetterick, Afton, stated that if CSAH 21 is designated as a NPR, the residents will have to live with a very substandard road for the next 10 years.

Nancy Bode, Afton, reminded the Board that there are two portions of CSAH 21 that have been requested as NPR Type III, one from the City of Afton and the other from Darlene Moynagh. She urged the Board to consider the southern portion of CSAH 21 be designated as NPR Type III.

Commissioner Hegberg moved to table the matter of designating the portion of CSAH 21 that is within the city limits of Afton as Natural Preservation Route Type III until Denmark Township requests that the southern portion of CSAH 21 be designated as a natural Preservation Route Type III. Commissioner Hauser seconded the motion. The motion failed.

The motion to designate CSAH 21 within the city limits of Afton, with the exception of the main street, as a Natural Preservation Route Type III, and that the County apply for the variance at the time of the reconstruction was adopted with the vote as follows: Yes, Commissioners Abrahamson, Hauser, and Engstrom; No, Commissioner Hegberg; Commissioner Peterson absent.

WHEREAS, Washington County has a State approved comprehensive local water plans, which has been locally adopted pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Chapter 103B.311 or 103B.255, or has State approved comprehensive local water plans, covering 50% of land area in the county, which have been locally adopted pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Chapter 103B.231, 103D.401, or 103D.405; and

WHEREAS, the State of Minnesota, acting by and through its Board of Water and Soil Resources ("BWSR"), has authority to award Natural Resources Block Grants for purposes of implementing comprehensive local water plans, the wetland conservation act, and the DNR shoreland program to local government pursuant to Laws of Minnesota 1993, Chapter 172, sec. 6; and

WHEREAS, Washington County may assess a levy under its general levy authority to match such grants by BWSR pursuant to Minn. State § 103B.335; and

WHEREAS, the Minnesota Department of Revenue has determined the minimum amount necessary to be raised by Washington County for the base grant portion of the grant under the formula in repealed Minn. Stat. § 275.50, subd., 5; and

WHEREAS, BWSR has determined that Washington County is eligible for a Natural Resources Block Grant up to \$39,000 in 1994 upon BWSR acceptance of the LGU's application and the execution and delivery of a Grant Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Washington County Board of Commissioners approves of Washington County entering into a Grant Agreement with the State of Minnesota to receive state funds for the implementation of its comprehensive local water plans, the administration of the wetland conservation act, and the administration of the DNR shoreland program, under the terms of the Grant Agreement and all statutory requirements; and

#### GENERAL ADMINISTRATION

The Board discussed the Washington County Growth Management Act proposal by Representative Pam Neary.

Commissioner Hegberg moved to adopt Resolution No. 94-027 as follows:

# RESOLUTION CONCERNING THE WASHINGTON COUNTY GROWTH MANAGEMENT ACT

(as proposed by Representative Pam Neary)

WHEREAS, Representative Neary has floated a proposal entitled "the Washington County Growth Management Act" which would manage and guide growth into areas which are within the Metropolitan-Urban Service Area Boundary and exact an occupation tax on all development. The tax would be used to help offset additional and increased service delivery costs resulting from development, and

WHEREAS, Washington County government has, through both a survey conducted in the spring of 1993 and a Futures Visioning Workshop conducted in the fall of 1993, heard from our citizens a concern over the rapid expansion and development of both rural and urban lands in the County. Washington County experienced a 41% increase in households (about 14,000) from 1980 to 1990, and

WHEREAS, the County, using both state demographer and Metropolitan Council forecasts, anticipates that in the next 20 years (1995-2015) we will add at least 25,000 new households, or more than 50,000 new people to our existing development in Washington County, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Washington County government applauds Representative Neary for her timely response to a perceived need gathered through contact with her constituency and participation in the preliminary stages of Washington County's comprehensive plan update. Her proposal provides a forum in which to examine growth issues and shows some promise, especially in the areas of government collaboration and utilization of existing infrastructure. The Board will monitor closely the responses to this proposal in order to better focus County initiatives on guiding growth by listening to our constituency.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Washington County is in the middle of a detailed comprehensive planning update process. The County Board of Commissioners is of the opinion that we should let this thoughtful process, which has a large public involvement piece, work through the established 18-month program in order to take advantage of the wide amount of available input. It is only through extensive dialogue with our joint constituencies that we can realize the wants and needs of the public and the future residents of Washington County.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Representative Neary should delay any proposed legislation until the County has completed the comprehensive plan update. The Washington County Board of Commissioners opposes any legislative occupancy tax proposal.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that considering this extensive input and working with the appointed bodies, the County Board will forge a plan that addresses the many and complex issues of growth that face us today and in the future. This proposed plan will be available for review in January of 1995. It will contain background information, a program outlining how we can balance growth and development with land preservation in the County and implementation proposals to reflect our partnership with local governments.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that January of 1995 will be an appropriate time for proposals such as the Washington County Growth Management Act to be considered by Washington County government as well as all of the other taxing jurisdictions in Washington County. Working together, local, County and state officials can provide leadership today for a better tomorrow.

Commissioner Abrahamson seconded the motion and it was adopted unanimously.

Commissioner Abrahamson requested that this resolution be presented at the public meeting tonight at the Stillwater Junior High School to discuss Representatives Neary's Growth Management Act Proposal.

WHEREAS, this project is not programmed because of a funding shortfall.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, Washington County strongly supports MN/DOT's application for Federal ISTEA funding of the Trunk Highway 5 project.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, Washington County supports the proposed design and connection of Trunk Highway 5 to County State Aid Highway 5.

The Public Works Director gave a brief overview of the request from F.M. Frattalone Excavating & Grading, Inc. for access license across the Schroeder Pit. F.M. Tom Loucks, May Township Planner, feels the question of access across the Schroeder pit is only one issue. Some of the other issues the Township is concerned about are: 1) Inconsistent with May Township's Comprehensive Plan; 2) Incompatibility with surrounding neighborhood; 3) Concerns about impact on May Avenue if this access were to go through; and 4) An EAW has to be prepared for this project. The Town Board feels the County should not grant the access license before the mining permit is approved by the Town of May or the County.

Tom Oakes, May Township, stated that Frattalone Excavating plans on using approximately 300 trucks a day in the proposed pit. They would be hauling in bituminous road material and crushing it for recycling. He stated there is a water area that is described by the County atlas as a sensitive area in terms of groundwater contamination. He is concerned about hauling in bituminous road material

and recycling it on that site. Also this area is getting to be very residential and they don't need another gravel pit.

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Mike Coulon, May Township, stated his property boarders this proposed gravel pit. He feels the County should take a look at the environmental impact this pit would have on the area and its residents. He is totally against another pit in this area.

Commissioner Hegberg moved to table the request from F.M. Frattalone Excavating & Grading, Inc. for an access license across the Schroeder Pit until May Township forwards a request to the County. Commissioner Abrahamson seconded the motion and it was adopted unanimously.

WHEREAS, the County State Aid Highway 19 project has been identified in draft documents as a needed project; and

WHEREAS, the timing of this ISTEA project solicitation does not allow the County to revise its Comprehensive Plan or Capital Improvement Plan.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Washington County Board of Commissioners recognizes the proposed County State Aid Highway 19 project as implementing a solution to a County transportation problem; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this project will be supported by funding at the local level share if ISTEA funds are provided to Washington County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Washington County Board of Commissioners hereby proclaim the week beginning April 10, 1994 as Public Safety Telecommunications Week in Washington County and extends its appreciation and thanks to the dedicated Public Safety Telecommunications Personnel for the vital contribution they make to the safety and well being of our citizens and public safety providers.

The foregoing Consent Calendar was adopted unanimously.

# PUBLIC HEARING - HEALTH, ENVIRONMENT AND LAND MANAGEMENT Amendments to the Washington County Solid Waste Management Ordinance #105

The Board Chairman presented an overview of today's public hearing to consider amendments to the Washington County Solid Waste Management Ordinance, #105.

The Secretary to the Board read into the record the notice of intent to amend said ordinance. The Board Chairman opened the public hearing for comments at 9:05 a.m.

The Health, Environment, and Land Management Program Supervisor presented an overview of the proposed amendments to the Solid Waste Management Ordinance #105.

The Board Chairman asked for comments from the audience.

Tom Spence, Attorney representing certain waste haulers in Washington County, questioned Section 13.3.3 which states that the service charge can be adjusted by resolution. He stated that according to Minnesota Statute 400.08 that any adjustment rates have to be done by ordinance not by resolution. He also asked whether the service charge would be subject to sales tax.

The Assistant County Attorney stated that Section 13.3.3 says service charges may be revised by resolution. He indicated that it's just a minor point right now and feels that the Courts wouldn't strike the whole ordinance by that one provision. The County Board can still revise the rates through an ordinance, it never has to use this particular provision. It just gives the Board a little leeway down the road. As to the service charge being subject to sales tax, he indicated that the Department of Revenue is sending them mixed messages on whether it is or isn't.

The Resource Recovery Project Manager indicated that the last contact he had with the Department of Revenue was that the service charge would be subject to sales tax. He has asked for that ruling in writing but has not received anything as let.

Commissioner Hegberg gave a brief history on how the resource recovery facility was established and how this situation arose.

The Board Chairman asked for further comments; none were heard. The Board Secretary stated that all documentary evidence has been received and made a part of this record.

The Board Chairman closed the public hearing at 9:28 a.m.

Commissioner Hegberg moved to adopt Resolution No. 94-055 as follows:

#### Amendment to the Washington County Solid Waste Ordinance #105

WHEREAS, the Waste Management Act, which imposes various mandates upon counties, was created out of concern for the protection of water, air and land resources, as well as protection of public health; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to State law Washington County has adopted and received Metropolitan Council approval for its Solid Waste Master Plan, which acknowledges the State's preferential order for waste management, and which plans for the implementation of an integrated waste management system in order to protect public health and the environment; and

WHEREAS, in order to discharge the mandate imposed upon counties by the Minnesota Waste Management Act to manage mixed municipal solid waste in a more environmentally sound manner than land disposal, Ramsey and Washington Counties contracted with Northern States Power Company (NSP) to design, construct, own and operate the Resource Recovery Facility at Newport, Minnesota; and

WHEREAS, the Counties are required by the Service Agreement with NSP to pay for those services; and

WHEREAS, the Counties set the tipping fee for waste delivered to the Facility; and

WHEREAS, licensed Collectors of solid waste from both Counties requested the County Boards to reduce the tipping fee at the Facility; and

WHEREAS, both County Boards, in response to this request, reduced the tipping fee from \$66.79 per ton to \$50.00 per ton effective January 1, 1994, as a way to continue to discharge the Minnesota Waste Management Act mandate to manage mixed municipal solid waste in an environmentally sound manner; and

WHEREAS, this tipping fee reduction will result in a shortfall of revenue to the Counties which is a portion of the cost of solid waste management; and

WHEREAS, the Washington County Board of Commissioners has determined that a service charge collected by licensed waste collectors will be used to collect funds to pay for services related to the Resource Recovery Facility; and

WHEREAS, the Washington County Board of Commissioners adopted the Washington County Solid Waste Ordinance on November 24, 1992; and

WHEREAS, 1984 Minnesota Laws, Chapter 644, Section 80, Minnesota Statutes Sc400.08 and Sc473.811 Subd 3a, authorize Washington County to create a service charge for waste management services; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Washington County Board of Commissioners adopts the attached amendments to the Washington County Solid Waste Ordinance to be effective April 1, 1994, said amendments authorizing the Board to establish the rates, charges and amounts of the Waste Management Service Charge and the mechanism of collection and changing designation to apply only to waste deposited within the State.

## WASHINGTON COUNTY ORDINANCE #110

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE WASHINGTON COUNTY SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT ORDINANCE #105.

The Board of Commissioners of Washington County ordains:

#### SECTION 1:

The Washington County Solid Waste Management Ordinance #105 is hereby amended as follows:

Delete Section 10.1 in its entirety and replace with the following language:

10.1 Designation. All acceptable waste generated within the County and deposited within the State of Minnesota must be delivered to the designated facility, and may not be delivered to any other solid waste management facility except as provided in subsection 10.4 and 10.7 herein. The County may from time to

time designate additional solid waste management facilities. This provision is binding on all persons in the County, including without limitation, political subdivisions, solid waste management operations, solid waste generators, and solid waste haulers.

Delete Section 10.3 in its entirety.

10.3 Diversion. If the designated facility is declared by the Director of the Department or the Director's designee to be inoperative, the County may institute diversion. Diversion is the procedure wherein all acceptable waste must be delivered to the designated facility, pass over the scale, and then be diverted to another licensed solid waste management site or facility. Diversion does not mean interruption of designation as set forth in Section 10.4.

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Delete Section 13 in its entirety and replace with new Section 13.

#### 13.0 SERVICE CHARGE

- 13.1 Purpose and Authority: Pursuant to Laws 1984, Chapter 644, Section 80, and Minn. Stat. Sections 400.03, 473.811, Subd. 3A, the County hereby imposes on all owners, lessees or occupants of property, including properties owned, leased or used by the State or a political subdivision of the State a service charge for solid waste management services provided to their properties by the County or by those under contract with the County.
- 13.2 Definitions: For the purpose of this section, the terms used herein shall have the following meaning unless the context clearly indicates otherwise.
- 13.2.1 Licensed Collector; A person or other legal entity licensed by the County pursuant to Minn. Stat. Section 115A.93 to collect mixed municipal solid waste.

#### 13.2.2 Residential Generator:

- a. a person who resides in a single residence; or
- b. a person residing in a building or at a site containing multiple residences, including a townhome or mobile home park, where each resident either has separate trash pickup, or is separately assessed for such service. Each dwelling unit will be considered a residential generator if there is a separate waste collection for each resident, even if the resident pays the owner or association a monthly maintenance fee which includes the expense of waste collection, and the owner or association pays the waste collector for waste collection in one lump sum.

#### 13.2.3 Non-residential Generator:

- An industry, business, including a home-operated business, church, nursing home, nonprofit organization, schools and other commercial accounts; or
- b. An owner of a building or site containing multiple residences, including a townhome or mobile home park, where one or more waste containers with a capacity of at least one (1) cubic yard is used, and no resident is separately assessed for such service.

- Rates and Charges: Rates and charges imposed may take into account the character, kind and quality of the service and of the solid waste; the method of disposition including but not limited to activities such as recycling, composting, co-composting, resource recovery, the number of people served at each place of collection, and all other factors that enter into the cost of service, including but not limited to depreciation and payment of principal and interest on money borrowed by the County for the acquisition or betterment of solid waste facilities, the establishment of a reserve fund for payments of a fee to the Facility vendor for services to be provided at the Facility, and administrative costs associated with providing waste management services to County residents; and specifically may take into account as an additional cost of service, the amount of waste estimated to be generated by different classifications of solid waste generators, as determined by the County.
- 13.3.1 The rate of the solid waste management service charge for Residential Generators shall be \$1.60 per month.
- 13.3.2 The rate of the solid waste management service charge for Non-residential Generators shall be volume based and be charged in the following manner:
  - a. If the Non-residential Waste Generator purchases disposal capacity from a Licensed Hauler, the Generator shall be charged for disposal capacity purchased at the rate of \$0.80 per cubic yard of purchased capacity if the purchased disposal capacity is of the type that is not able to compact waste and \$2.40 per cubic yard of purchased capacity if the purchased disposal capacity is of the type that is able to compact waste.
  - b. If the Non-residential Waste Generator does not purchase disposal capacity from a Licensed Collector, the Generator shall be charged an equivalent of \$0.80 per cubic yard of waste generated.
- 13.3.3 Revision and Collection: When deemed advisable, the County Board may by resolution revise the rates and charges of the solid waste management service charge promulgated herein.
- 13.4 Collection.
- As a condition of license issued under Minn. Stat. Section 115A.93, a Licensed Collector shall collect from the solid waste generators within the County and serviced by the Licensed Collector the service charges established under this section.
- 13.4.1.1 The collection shall be made at the time of billing and remitted to the County in the following manner:
- 13.4.1.2 The waste management service charge collected shall be remitted no later than the twentieth (20th) day of each month following collection, on a form and in a manner to be determined by the Ramsey/Washington County Resource Recovery Project Manager to:

The Ramsey Washington County Resource Recovery Project Suite C 6989 N. 55th Street Oakdale, MN 55128

13.4.1.3 If a generator does not pay the waste management service charge to the Licensed Collector, the Licensed Collector shall not be obliged to remit

the waste management service charge to the County. It shall be presumed that the Licensed Collector has collected the fee from the generator unless the Licensed Collector states in writing the generator's name, address, the time period and amount of waste management service charge billed by January 20, 1995.

- In the event that a generator pays a Licensed Collector only part of the generator's bill for waste management services, the waste management service charge shall be deemed to be paid to the extent that it is equal to the proportion of the bill paid by the generator. That amount shall be remitted to the County as partial payment of the waste management service charge by January 20, 1995 at which time the Licensed Collector shall state in writing that the generator did not fully pay the waste management service charge and provide in writing the generator's name, address, the time period and amount of waste management service charge billed and the amount of waste management service charge paid by the generator.
- No later than July 20, 1994 all Licensed Collectors shall report to the Resource Recovery Project Manager, on a form and in a manner to be determined by the Project, summary information regarding generators that have not paid the waste management service charge, or have made partial payment of the waste management service charge. The information shall include the number of generators that have been billed the waste management service charge, the number of generators that have made partial payment of the waste management service charge, and the number of generators that have not paid the waste management service charge.
- 13.4.1.6 The Licensed Collector's records may be audited to the extent allowed by Minn. Stat. Sections 400.08 and 115A.93.
- 13.4.1.7 A failure of a Licensed Collector to make a good faith attempt to collect the service charge shall be in violation of a condition of licensing and subject to the sanctions found in the Washington County Administrative Ordinance.
- 13.4.2 Service charges may be billed directly to every owner of real property through the County property tax statements as a separate item and shall be due, payable and collected in the same manner as real property taxes subject to the same penalties and interest as overdue real property taxes. In such instances, no charge shall become payable in any year unless first certified by the County Board to the County Auditor in the year prior to its being payable.
- 13.4.3 Solid waste generators not using Licensed Collectors to dispose of their waste may be billed directly by the County.
- 13.4.4 An owner occupant or lessee of property may be billed directly by the County.
- In cities with organized collection, the Licensed Collector is responsible for remitting the waste management service charge if the Licensed Collector bills the generators for service. If the City bills the generators for service, the County and the Ramsey/Washington County Resource Recovery Project will develop specific procedures for collecting the waste management service charge in collaboration with the City.

- 13.4.6 The County may use any other manner of billing or collection allowed by law.
- 13.5 Unpaid Charges.
- 13.5.1 Taxable Properties: On or before October 15 in each year, the County Board shall certify to the County Auditor all unpaid outstanding charges for services hereunder, and a statement of the description of the lands which were serviced and against the charges arose. It shall be the duty of the County Auditor, upon order of the County Board, to extend the assessments with interest of six percent upon the tax rolls of the County of the taxes of the year in which the assessment is filed.

For each year ending October 15 the assessment with interest shall be carried into the tax becoming due and payable in January of the following year, and shall be enforced and collected in the manner provided for the enforcement and collection of real property taxes in accordance with the provisions of the laws of the state. The charges, if not paid, shall become delinquent and be subject to the same penalties and the same rate of interest as the taxes under the general laws of the state.

- 13.5.2 Tax-Exempt Properties: Unpaid charges may be collected as otherwise provided in Section 13 of this ordinance.
- 13.5.3 Civil Action: In addition to each and every other remedy available to the County, unpaid solid waste management charges, penalties and interest may be recovered in a civil action against a property owner, lessee or occupant and/or licensed collector.
- 13.5.4 Licensed Collector: In addition to any other civil action available to the County, any Licensed Collector failing to remit to the County service charges collected shall be in violation of a condition of licensing and subject to the sanctions found in the Washington County Administrative Ordinance.
- 13.6 Administrative Appeal
- A person assessed or a Licensed Collector required to collect a service charge may appeal the amount of the charge billed or required to be collected to the Department by requesting in writing an adjustment to the charge. If the Department denies the request for adjustment, the person or Licensed Collector may appeal the decision to the County Board.
- 13.7 Effective Date: The rates and manner of collection established herein shall be effective on April 1, 1994.

#### **SECTION 2:**

The Director of Health, Environment and Land Management Department is hereby directed to change the Washington County Solid Waste Management Ordinance #105 in accordance with the foregoing instrument.

#### **SECTION 3:**

Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be and is hereby declared to be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication according to law.

Passed by the Board of Commissioners of Washington County, Minnesota this 22nd day of March, 1994.

for the sum of \$744,000.00; in total, upon the following terms and conditions:

- 1. Conveyance should be by warranty deed or quit claim deed pursuant to the terms and conditions of a standard Miller-Davis Purchase Agreement free and clear of all liens, charges and encumbrances;
- 2. Seller to pay all levied or pending special assessments (if any);
- 3. Seller to pay abstract expenses;
- Real Estate taxes shall be pro rated as of the date of closing;
- 5. Buyer to pay recording fee(s), state deed tax and conservation fee.
- 6. Closing is to be on or before May 1, 1994, or as soon as possible after that date. The closing shall be handled through the Washington County Attorney's Office.
- 7. John and Harriet Edstrom may retain possession of the main house, rent free, through October 31, 1994, or six months after date of closing, whichever is later. After that six month period, John and Harriet Edstrom have the first option to rent the main house and immediate yard, and outbuildings for their personal use. By September 15, 1994 sellers must notify County's Property Acquisition Specialist whether they plan to vacate the main house by October 31, 1994, or whether they will enter into a lease agreement with the County to rent the main house, the immediate yard around the main house, and outbuildings. Should John and Harriet Edstrom enter into a lease agreement with the County, the rental rate shall be set at \$700 per month for a period of one (1) year. After 1 year, the rental rate shall be reviewed and set according to the rental market of houses in the area.
- 8. Sellers shall be obligated to perform all maintenance in order to keep the rental property in a reasonable repair, normal wear and tear excepted. If at such time during John and Harriet Edstrom's rental period that main house requires major repair (new roof, new furnace, new septic system or new well), it is understood that John and Harriet Edstrom will share in 40% of the expense of that repair. If John and Harriet Edstrom fail to meet this obligation the County reserves the right, after 60 days notice to the Edstroms, to terminate rental of the main home. If John and Harriet Edstrom decide to share in 40% of that expense, they may continue renting the main house.
- 9. The outbuildings will remain on property for use of John and Harriet Edstrom as long as outbuildings are safe, useful, and not a liability (to be determined by County). However, at time when outbuildings require large expenditure for maintenance or repair, the County may decide that outbuilding(s) should be removed or razed. Should John and Harriet

- 10. John and Harriet Edstrom shall be obligated to pay all utilities, including fuel oil, propane gas, natural gas, electricity, water, telephone, sewer, and garbage hauling, in a timely manner, while they are in possession of the property.
- 11. Relocation benefits are available to qualified sellers and renters as per state law.
- 12. Acquisition is subject to a satisfactory environmental audit by the County.
- 13. The acquisition is subject to the existing lease (if any) of the second house and upon acquisition the County will terminate the existing lease. Upon acquisition the County will inspect second house and after review, will decide whether to rent, remove, or raze the second house. Should County decide to rent existing second house, existing renters shall be given first option to rent by entering into a lease agreement with the County.
- 14. John Edstrom will have the option of entering into the County's standard farmland lease with Washington County for the existing cropland on the property at the rate of \$37 per acre per year. Said lease will be effective for the 1994 growing season and will give him an option to rent cropland for an additional three (3) years.

Commissioner Peterson moved, seconded by Commissioners Engstrom, to adopt the following Consent Calendar:

- Adoption of Resolution No. 94-078 as follows:

Mission Directed Budgeting - 1995 Guidance (Replaces Resolution No. 93-043)

WHEREAS, the County Board adopted the concept of Mission Directed Budgeting on April 20, 1993; and

WHEREAS, the County Board continues to support MDB and its desire to more definitively set the mission for Washington County and link it to the resources they are willing to provide; and

WHEREAS, the County Board wishes to continue empowering departments to manage their budget allocations to best accomplish this mission and the duties assigned to them;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the following guidelines are to be used by departments in Mission Directed Budgeting for 1995.

Departments will be given an operating budget based on the monetary equivalent to their 1994 budget minus capital expenditures and adjusted for 1995 employee wage and benefit increases and changes in facilities rent charges.

Departments will budget for their operating expenses and submit requests to Administration for additional funds for capital and/or other expenses.

Departments will be able to transfer dollars between line items within their operating budget, provided there is no net increase in expenditures. Transfers to wage and benefit and capital objects are limited to \$10,000 per position, item or project. Transfers to road and building projects require County Board approval.

The County Administrator, or his designee, has authority to transfer dollars within the budget provided it does not reduce the fund balance (i.e., monies must come from increased current revenues, decreased current expenditures, or contingency), except for authorized use of MDB Savings Allocation. Transfers to wage and benefit and capital objects are limited to \$10,000 per position, item or project.

The County Board may make any budget adjustments necessary to reflect changes in financial conditions.

#### 4. Adoption of Resolution No. 94-079 as follows:

#### Mission Directed Budgeting - Savings Plan

WHEREAS, the County Board adopted the concept of Mission Directed Budgeting on April 20, 1993; and

WHEREAS, the County Board continues to support MDB and its desire to offer an incentive plan for departments to decrease expenditures;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Savings Plan portion of Mission Directed Budgeting be refined and implemented beginning with the 1994 fiscal year.

Departments with any savings at year-end will have 25% allocated to that department and will have 25% allocated to a countywide pool.

Savings will be measured at the year-end accounting system close prior to audit adjustments (approximately the second week of February).

Savings will be based on the excess revenues over expenditures line of the operating statement. Departments which receive revenues to support countywide operations will not have those revenues considered as part of the savings plan.

Departments and services with legal restrictions (dedicated use of funds) are not included in the savings plan.

The savings will be measured at the appropriate departmental level. Departments with more complicated budgets will review their services separately to determine savings and prepare a memo to the administrator explaining where they believe it occurred and how much was saved.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the following procedures will be used to govern the use of funds under the savings plan.

Departments wishing to use any of their savings allocation should write a memo to the administrator explaining what the savings will be spent on and detailing which services and objects to increase by what amounts. The administrator has final discretion to authorize the expenditures and budget increases.

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The use of the countywide MDB Savings Pool will be available for departments to submit proposals to their peers to determine projects deserving of this funding. A two-thirds majority of those present at the department head meeting is needed for approval. Final approval must be authorized by the County Board.

Expenditure of MDB Savings should be for one-time expenses (i.e.) equipment, additional training, or a pilot project). Savings should not be used for additional staffing, supporting operating costs, new programs or items that will cause increased ongoing operating costs.

5. Adoption of Resolution No. 94-080 as follows:

Authorize City of Oakdale to Enter Tax-Forfeited Property Withheld by DNR for Grading Work

WHEREAS, parcel 57575-2000 being Outlot A, Hadley Meadows Addition in the City of Oakdale is forfeited property withheld by DNR per M.S. 282.018.

WHEREAS, the City of Oakdale is desirous of conducting grading work for drainage improvement purposes.

WHEREAS, such work shall be performed by the city and the city shall be responsible for any expenses incurred in the entire project.

WHEREAS, M.S. 282.04 Subdivision 2, the county auditor may, with the approval of the county board provide for the grading thereof such that reasonable grading is necessary for the protection and preservation of the property.

#### **HUMAN RESOURCES DEPARTMENT**

Commissioner Engstrom moved to ratify the 1994-95 bargaining agreement with AFSCME Clerical/Technical and Professional Employees as follows:

- 1. <u>Duration</u>: January 3, 1994 through December 31, 1995.
- Wages: Effective for 1994, a 1.0% general wage increase and effective for 1995, a 2.0% general wage increase. In addition, effective January 1, 1995, adjust the salary ranges for six classifications in accordance with the County's pay equity plan.
- 3. <u>Holidays</u>: Increase Christmas Eve day from a one-half day holiday to a full day holiday.
- 4. <u>Health Insurance</u>: Amend Article 17.1 to provide the following monthly contributions for dependent health insurance:

1994 - \$260.00 (\$15.00 increase).

1995 - \$290.00 (\$15.00 increase).

- Flexible Spending Accounts: Effective for 1995, amend Article 17.3 to \$310.00 (\$15.00 increase).
- 6. <u>Compensatory Time</u>: For employees in the Professional unit, increase maximum accrual of compensatory time from 40 to 50 hours and allow for up to a 50 hour carry over from one year to the next in 1994 and effective in 1995 increase accrual of compensatory time up to 60 hours with a 60 hour carry over.
- Other Items: In addition to the above, revise various language provisions including an update of the non-discrimination clause, increase of the number of Union stewards, increase leave without pay for Union business, include language regarding the Family and Medical Leave Act.

Commissioner Peterson seconded the motion and it was adopted unanimously.

#### PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

The Deputy Public Works Director presented an overview of the Big Marine Park Reserve Acquisition Guidelines adopted by the County Board in 1988. The Board discussed improvements to property within the Big Marine Park Reserve. Commissioner Hauser suggested that a percentage of the total value of the house could be used as a guideline for improvements. Commissioner Abrahamson stated that if a property owner wishes to improve his property he should be allowed to do so. Commissioner Engstrom suggested surveying other metropolitan Counties to see what their policies are, and how we compare to them.

Ray Richardson, property owner in the Big Marine Park Reserve, stated he has been trying to put up an accessory building since last October. He stated that this would be a temporary building and that he would remove the building, when it became necessary, at his own expense. He got approval from May Township, but he was turned down by the County.

Commissioner Hegberg moved to reaffirm Phase I, Phase II, and Phase III, items 1, 2, and 3, of the Big Marine Park Reserve Acquisition Guidelines; and, that Phase III items 4 and 5 be removed and discussed further at a workshop to be held at a later date. Commissioner Peterson seconded the motion.

Commissioner Abrahamson asked that this workshop be held in the evening, and that the May Township Board and residents of the Big Marine Park Reserve be invited to attend this workshop. Chair Hauser stated that this workshop would not be revisiting whether or not there would be a park reserve, or where the boundaries will be. She stated this will be a workshop dealing with the Big Marine Park Reserve Acquisition Guidelines.

The County Attorney asked for time to analyze the possible repercussions of removing items 4 and 5 from Phase III of the Big Marine Park Reserve Acquisition Guidelines

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Commissioner Engstrom moved to table the matter of reaffirming the Big Marine Park Reserve Acquisition Guidelines until after the Board has held its workshop on this matter. Commissioner Peterson seconded the motion and it was adopted with the vote as follows: Yes, Commissioners Peterson, Hauser, and Engstrom; No, Commissioners Abrahamson and Hegberg.

Sue Soderman, May Township Board Chairman, asked whether the Board is going to delay a decision on the two building permits until after the Board workshop is held. Commissioner Engstrom asked that the matter of the two building permits be brought back for discussion at next week's Board meeting. He requested that the Public Works staff provide information on when the property was acquired, the current owners, what is the current assessed value, and the percentage increase of the improvement.

#### **GENERAL ADMINISTRATION**

#### Recognition of Community Response to the Tornado of April 26, 1994

Commissioner Hegberg moved to adopt **Resolution No. 94-087** as follows:

Community Response to the Tornado April 26, 1994

WHEREAS, on April 26, 1994, a tornado touched down without warning in Grant and Stillwater Townships of Washington County, causing significant property damage, but thankfully no serious injury to persons; and

WHEREAS, the Washington County Disaster Response Team, including employees of the County, and representatives of the American Red Cross, the National Guard, and numerous other community agencies, responded to the disaster in a way that demonstrated the highest level of preparedness, professionalism, and concern for citizens; and,

WHEREAS, this response resulted in a well coordinated effort of numerous individuals and community agencies.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Washington County Board of Commissioners hereby commends the members of the Washington County Disaster Response Team for their effective response to this tornado disaster, and for the commitment and concern they demonstrated in providing services to the affected County residents.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Board extends its appreciation to the many local and state government agencies, as well as businesses and volunteers for their efforts and compassion during and after the tornado disaster of April 26, 1994.

Commissioner Engstrom seconded the motion and it was adopted unanimously.

Ken Smith, Stillwater Township, stated he intends to rebuild after the tornado totally destroyed his property. He appreciates the Board considering waiving building permits for property that was destroyed.

#### Waive Building Permit Fees for Homes Damaged by the April 26 Tornado

The Board discussed a request received from a citizen by the Health, Environment, and Land Management Department to waive, in total or in part, building permit fees required for rebuilding of storm damaged homes in Stillwater and Grant Townships. This matter will be discussed further at the next Board meeting.

The County Administrator stated that the County Assessor and Auditor-Treasurer are looking at two possible options for property tax relief for those homes that were affected by the tornado. Commissioner Hegberg asked that homes located in the Sunnybrook area be included for property tax relief. They have suffered water problems, and septic systems no longer function due to the storm.

Commissioner Hegberg suggested that the Sentence-to-Service crew might be used to pick up debris from the storm.

Kathy Mullaney, Woodbury, stated they have experienced trouble with their well since last spring. When neighbors drill new wells, their water turns muddy. She stated she is concerned about what might happen to her water when they start construction on this interchange.

The Board Chair thanked Ms. Grenfell and Ms. Mullaney for appearing at the Board meeting. She noted that the City of Woodbury has been asked to come in and make a presentation and give the Board more information about the Environmental Assessment Worksheet. The County Public Works Department will also be present to update the Board on how the County has been involved in this matter thus far. This item will be placed on next week's agenda at 9:00 a.m.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Jon Larson, Veterans Service Officer, has the legal authority to apply for financial assistance, and the institutional, managerial, and financial capability to ensure adequate construction, operation, maintenance and replacement of the proposed project.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Washington County has not violated any Federal, State, or local laws pertaining to fraud, bribery, graft, kickbacks, collusion, conflict of interest or other unlawful or corrupt practices.

- Approval of one F.T.E. Special Project Probation Officer I position in Court Services through June 30, 1995.
- Approval of .5 Special Project Secretary in Community Services through June 30, 1995 to assist in fraud prevention.
- Approval of positions required for managed care in Community Services: 1 F.T.E. Managed Care Advocate, .5 F.T.E. Eligibility Technician, .5 Special Project Eligibility Technician, and .5 F.T.E. Secretary.
- Approval for conversion of student back-up operator to Special Project in I.S. through December

#### SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT

#### **Amendment to 1994 Budget**

Commissioner Abrahamson moved to amend the 1994 budget for the Sheriff's Office as follows: Cut \$232,200 in expenses and bring in an additional \$60,000 in revenues due to rate increases; authorize use of fund balance in the amount of \$500,000. Commissioner Engstrom seconded the motion and it was adopted unanimously.

#### Contract with U.S. Marshal for Rental of Beds at the L.E.C.

Commissioner Engstrom moved to approve the contract with the U.S. Marshal for bed rental at the Law Enforcement Center in the amount of \$75 a day per bed. Commissioner Abrahamson seconded the motion and it was adopted unanimously.

#### PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

The Board continued discussion from last week regarding the Lake Road/I-494 interchange in Woodbury. Dave Jessup, City of Woodbury Public Works Director, presented background information on this project. Mr. Jessup stated that some citizens were concerned about their well water and septic systems because of the construction. He stated that the City of Woodbury was committed to working with its residents in ensuring the continuity of their water supply. Possible options for this may be redoing their existing well, drilling a new well, or providing municipal water service. The same would apply to the septic system if the property owner can show that the system failed as a result of the construction, then the City will work with the property owner in developing an alternative system. These options may include a new on-site system or municipal service.

The Public Works Director stated that no action was needed by the County Board if they wished the plans to go ahead as proposed by the City of Woodbury and as approved by him. The Board Chair thanked Mr. Jessup for appearing, and also thanked the citizens group for coming back. No further action was taken on this matter.

#### HUMAN RESOURCES DEPARTMENT

The Human Resources Director presented the agreements which have been reached through the meet and confer process for 1994 with the Confidential Employees, Confidential Supervisors and Essential Supervisors.

#### COURT SERVICES AND SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENTS

Captain McGlothlin presented an overview of a request to fill five F.T.E. Correctional Officer II positions for juvenile detention. The State of Minnesota has given permission to Washington County to open up the Juvenile Detention section in the Law Enforcement Center.

Commissioner Abrahamson moved to approve five F.T.E. Correctional Officer II positions for juvenile detention and approve the necessary funding in the amount of \$80,000 out of the contingency fund. Commissioner Peterson seconded the motion and it was adopted unanimously.

Captain McGlothlin stated that the juvenile detention center should be opened on or as close to August 1 as possible.

#### GENERAL ADMINISTRATION

#### Federal Legislation on Local Flow Control

Commissioner Engstrom moved to adopt Resolution No. 94-106 as follows:

Federal Legislation on Local Flow Control

WHEREAS, a recent U.S. Supreme Court decision, C & A Carbone v. the Town of Clarkstown (N.Y.) held that local government flow control ordinances are unconstitutional because they violate the Interstate Commerce Clause; and,

WHEREAS, solid waste flow control is an extremely sensitive and important issue, because to the extent that counties can no longer regulate the flow of trash and recyclables generated within their borders, it opens the door to exportation of waste to other states; and,

WHEREAS, this is not environmentally sound, nor economically appropriate for our constituencies; and,

WHEREAS, considering the large financial investments we have made, and must continue to make in environmentally sound disposal and recycling facilities, and the need to fund these costs from within our solid waste system, we need to be assured of relatively predictable, stable tonnage at our facilities; and,

WHEREAS, Washington County has, since 1987, operated a resource recovery facility jointly with another county, and is committed to future funding of this resource recovery facility. In 1994 alone, were we not able to meet our flow control commitments, it would cost Washington County over Four Million Dollars (\$4,000,000.00); and,

WHEREAS, this Four Million Dollar (\$4,000,000.00) figure would increase yearly to the end of the contract; and,

WHEREAS, flow control legislation, such as Senate Bill S1634, and flow control amendments to any interstate solid waste bill in the House of Representatives, is the only way of securing appropriate fiduciary responsibility for our investment.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Washington County Board of Commissioners endorses waste flow control legislation at the federal level, which will allow local units of government to achieve comprehensive and environmentally sound solid waste management within their own borders.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that copies of this resolution be sent to each member of the congressional delegation from Minnesota and to the Association of Minnesota Counties to be shared with all Minnesota counties.

Commissioner Peterson seconded the motion and it was adopted unanimously.

#### Per Diem for Advisory Boards, Committees, Commissions

The County Administrator stated that the current policy on per diem for County advisory boards, committees, and commissions was a little vague on who was not entitled to collect per diems on County advisory committees. An amendment to the current policy would add the words "and Commissioners" to the third paragraph which already has staff excluded from receiving per diems.

Guntary Gundalis

Commissioner Engstrom moved to adopt Resolution No. 94-107 as follows:

Per Diem for Advisory Boards, Committees, Commissions

WHEREAS, Washington County recognizes the important contributions made by members of its advisory boards, committees and commissions; and

WHEREAS, Washington County desires to support the members of its committees for volunteering their time and efforts on the County's behalf; and

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Washington County Board of Commissioners hereby sets a per diem rate of \$35.00 per meeting, payable to individuals (excluding staff and Commissioners) for the performance of service in any of the following boards, committees and commissions:

Commissioner Hegberg asked for a map showing where the proposed "no wake zone" is located on the St. Croix River.

#### **BOARD CORRESPONDENCE**

Board correspondence was received and placed on file.

The County Administrator informed the Board that the Metropolitan Council has notified the County of a public hearing on the revised aviation chapter of the Metropolitan Development Guidelines. Copies will be made available if any of the Commissioners are interested.

#### **ADJOURNMENT**

There being no further business to come before the Board, Commissioner Engstrom moved to adjourn, seconded by Commissioner Peterson and it was adopted unanimously. The Board meeting adjourned at 10:25 a.m.

WHEREAS, the Minnesota Board of Aging in its designation of MAAA, Inc., made a determination that the seven metropolitan counties acting through a Joint Powers Agreement was not a general purpose local government unit and therefore not entitled to the federal right of first refusal; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to 42 U.S.C. sections 3012 (a) (6) and 3012 (b) (3), the Administration of the United States Department of Health and Human Services shall provide technical assistance, consultation, review, and comment to state political subdivisions with respect to regulations and policies for the aged and aging;

# OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD OF EQUALIZATION OF

# WASHINGTON COUNTY, MINNESOTA JUNE 21, 1994

The 1994 Washington County Board of Equalization composed of Mary Hauser, Chairperson, and Commissioners, Wally Abrahamson, Myra Peterson, Dave Engstrom and Dennis Hegberg opened the meeting on Tuesday, June 21, 1994 at 11:30 a.m.

Board officers were sworn in by Washington County Assessor, Scott Hovet with staff assessor Ed Hervin, Auditor-Treasurer, R.H. Stafford and recorder, Dawn Aerts.

CASE 27, RON CARR, 93031-2260 Hugo

Mr. Carr appealed his property valuation on the grounds that two previous independent fee appraisals had reflected lower values and that the Assessor's Office had increased the value \$7,000 over these two appraisals. He also disputes a 3% across the board increase on Hugo property values. Based on Carr's two appraisals (May 1992 for \$121,000, and October 1992 for \$125,000), Assessor Frank Langer responded that when using a time adjustment of 4% per year, the lower value adjusts to \$128,700 and the higher to \$130,800.

Note: The Local Board of Review in Hugo recommended no value decrease.

CASE 5, MARY LESLIE, 37024-2700 Lake Elmo

Mary Leslie appealed the value of her home based on the addition of a 3-season porch constructed in 1992-1993. Mrs. Leslie said that the porch, once completed, was found to have significant structural problems and that the addition did not meet required building codes. Leslie presented estimates that show it will cost her (or a potential buyer) roughly \$33,000 to demolish the current porch and rebuild a new one. Frank Langer said that a partial value of \$3,000 established in 1993 and \$1,400 in 1994 reflects 50% of the completed value of the structure. He noted that if the Leslies obtained a statement verifying the need for demolition, the Assessor's Office will ("red tag") or subtract the value (\$4,400) from the assessed value. However, if the porch is completed, the rest of the value will be added on. Scott Hovet noted that the current physical condition of the porch is reflected in the present value. Leslie responded that the 3-season porch is a deterrent to the property and should be considered a value liability.

CASE 15, ROD CAMERON, 83670-2250 Grant Township

Rod Cameron requested that his property assessment be based on an average of two appraisals (one at \$212,000) that he previously submitted to the Local Board of Review. Cameron explained that his

home was unique (Prairie style - 1 bedroom, 3/4 bath) with limited value in terms of fair market sales price. Appraiser Pat Poshek responded that there are two factors considered in property value reductions: 1) functionality (i.e. 1 bedroom, 1 bath) and 2) lack of comparison with a similar home. He pointed out that Grant Township property is valued at \$5,000 per acre minimum.

Note: The Local Board of Review recommended a reduction of value on the new construction from \$273,500 to \$221,500.

# CASE 3, DEAN THARP, 89370-2550 May Township

Dean Tharp requested that the Board consider special circumstances relevant to his property. He noted that Dennis Montague agreed to review the situation after discussing the property value with appraiser, Pat Poshek. Tharp explained that the purchase price and valuation does not reflect "the true value" and that his secondary lot was unbuildable due to local zoning restrictions. He explained that one lot (75 ft) should be treated as unbuildable and substandard. Appraiser Pat Poshek responded that values on other cabins/lots on similar properties on Square Lake were in line with the Tharp property and that the premium and aesthetic "quality" of the lake itself overrides adverse factors such as access or seasonal nature of area.

Note: The current value is significantly below the purchase price (\$145,000) and the other parcel is valued at \$500.00.

# CASE 11, HELEN MAHONEY, 39026-0400, 39026-0471, Lakeland

Helen Mahoney brought photos before the County Board to illustrate the ongoing and significant problem with flooding on her property. Appraiser Steve Daggett responded that the flood plain factor had been taken into account when establishing values for the Mahoney property and he noted that neighborhood sales data indicate that the property is not overvalued.

Note: The taxpayer purchased the vacant lot in 1992 for \$25,000 - the Assessor's Office has the lot currently assessed at \$10,400.

# CASE 30, ALAN SANDKAMP, (Multiple Parcels) 9962 S. Grey Cloud Tr.,

Alan Sandkamp questioned Board Members on the reason behind a \$900.00 increase in taxes and requested specific reasons for the value increase. According to the Assessor's Office staff, the taxable value has remained the same since 1987 and the Local Board reduced the value of the building by \$10,000. R.H. Stafford, Auditor-Treasurer, explained that the State of Minnesota uses 110 different

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calculations when taxing properties in Washington County and that a tax-value comparison may be needed to analyze the reasons for Sandkamp's increase. A rate sheet and thorough explanation of tax calculations will be provided to Mr. Sandkamp.

Note: It was noted that an Independent School District #833 referendum, approved in 1992, may account for some of the increase in taxes reflected in 1993.

CASE 28, JOEL GRIESHABER, 73631-3375 Woodbury

Mr. Greishaber testified that he purchased his property in December '92 for \$117,000. Greishaber disagreed with the current assessed value on the home of \$122,600 and presented comparable sales figures for similar properties in the immediate area with comparable amenities. Greishaber said he was misinformed about an across the board increase of 12% in the Woodbury area and said that the increase was closer to 3.2% Greishaber said that based on the comps he has analyzed, the value should be further decreased to below \$117,000.

Note: The Local Board of Review recommended a value reduction from \$122,600 to \$117,000.

CASE 13, M. SHANK (NO APPEARANCE) 25441-2000

#### CASE 21, DEAN AND BRENDA PETERSON, 55450-4710 Newport

According to Brenda Peterson, the land portion of assessed value has remained the same since 1991. The Peterson's originally purchased the land for \$32,000 and feel that the land value was appropriate, but disagree with the assessed value of the home. Peterson asked the Board to consider factors such as ground water contamination and odors emitted from a nearby industrial plant when assessing the "real value" of the home. Peterson said she averaged tax amounts with four of the highest valued properties in the immediate area and she found that they were paying considerably more property taxes than the others. The Peterson's believe their home is over-valued by as much as \$20,000.00 based on the narrowness of the lot, location and environmental concerns.

Scott Hovet and Ed Hervin said that they were sympathetic to the identified pollution problems in the area, but explained that for lack of sale figures from similar properties in the area, there currently is no data on how contamination and potential clean-up may affect overall property marketability. Board

Members requested that the Assessor's Office initiate some research and investigation into the legal and policy implications of contamination as they relate to property values in the future.

CASE 17, SHERYL PALMER, 83012-2060 10130 Manning Av. N., Grant

Maureen Flaherty appeared, on behalf of Sheryl Palmer, to dispute the perceived "arbitrary assignment" of values (without input from all Grant Township property owners). Flaherty said the concerns are with the disparity of values and tax amounts between similar property types (i.e. age, style, size, in Grant Township) and the seemingly arbitrary means of establishing property values.

Local Grant Township appraiser, Pat Poshek explained that the Township had an across-the-board increase in land value of \$5,000.00 and that all properties located in the northern half of Grant Township experienced a value increase based on market activity and subsequent sales data. Scott Hovet noted that properties with varying land classifications (i.e. Green Acres, agricultural, homestead, etc.) are calculated differently and that the confusion may be with the 110 varying tax formulas dealing with value, classification and Local Base Tax Rates. Auditor-Treasurer Dick Stafford offered to share the tax formula rate sheets with the property owner and provide an analysis of how the property tax was determined.

CASE 18, BRUCE FEATHERSTONE, 79004-2134 12157 St. Croix Tr. So., Denmark

Bruce Featherstone disputes the method of valuing property and the assessed value of his property based on the move of his home to a new location with less acreage and loss of aesthetic view. Featherstone believes that the home is currently in a less desirable location (without a view), on less acreage (15 acres to 7 acres) which should justify a decrease in property value and subsequent tax in the new location. Featherstone said the neighborhood would not command the price currently assessed on the property of \$178,000.

Note: The Local Board of Review of Denmark Township previously decreased the value from \$187,600 to \$178,000.

CASE 20, DAVID BEAUDET, 60140-2350 6400 Lookout Tr. No., Oak Park Heights

Mr. Beaudet disputes the land value portion of the assessment based on several factors: a utility and sewer easement on property, building restrictions and encumbrances. Beaudet explained that the Assessor's Office lowered the overall property value in 1992, but said that the property has more encumbrances than previously identified. According to staff assessor, Ed Hervin, the subject property has a river view (even with encumbrances) and comparables in the area show that similar properties are commanding well over \$50,000.

Note: The Local Board of Review recommended no change.

# CASE 22, THOMAND O'BRIEN 52018-2300 Multiple Parcels - Marine

Farm land or steeply wooded - asking for reduction in evaluation. Part of lands have never been built on - swamp land or have springs, or highway comes through. Believes there are unbuildable sites because of slope of hills, etc. Per Frank Langer, this is valued like all other property in the City - AGR \$3,500/acre (not on Green Acres). Of total acres there are some in AGR and some in Vacant Residential. Eight parcels residential non-homesteaded, seasonal or farm non-homestead. Lot 12 valued at \$43,000 but has highway around it and heavily swamped area. To the right there also is an island between highways. South and West of parcel 52007-2100 (?) the land is next to highway and has a steep slope. Another two parcels (both marked #1) are difficult to get to. Parcel 3 is heavily wooded, parcel 7 agricultural use. Far west parcel very heavily ravined. South of that is next to a nature center and has hard access. Assessed as #151, seasonal residential and #250 vacant land non-homestead.

Three parcels Mr. O'Brien identified as farm land and #7 is farm land. Possibly some of them could be combined. They are residential homestead but could have a house built on them. #6 is the O'Brien Observatory (they are very proud to have had the U of M come to them for land). The Assessor needs more topographic information on this property. There may be some other things they could do to get the taxes lowered! Staff will look into this and get back to them.

# CASE 23, BARBARA PROETZ 95420-2000 Stillwater Township

He (Mr. Proetz?) is disabled since 1985 and is a licensed real estate broker. The assessed value in '93

was \$182,800, in '94, \$183,000 and \$243,500 this year '95). Local Board of Review lowered it to \$210,000. Their new roof leaks more now than before. They have a suit now against the roofer. The pool is shot. Does not have the money to repair the house. Have had one oral offer of \$175,000 but no written offers. He would be satisfied if the \$243,500 would be reduced to the \$175,000 level. Even though the Local Board reduced it to \$210,000 we do not support the \$210,000. Recommend leaving value at \$210,000.

# CASE 24, RICHARD and CHERIE TIMMING 72390-2250 Woodbury

Contacted the Assessor a year ago. Three others in the neighborhood valued at \$300,000. In '95 increased the value from \$326,000 to \$339,800. Assessor came to house and checked the unfinished area (don't know why). Showed her two other homes that were not comparable. - not all things were on the assessment sheet. A comparable property (Blatchley) at 7702 Somerset the contractor built with more square footage - everything is not the same. Borders Tamarack reserve. Were told by the Assessor, Blatchley's was too low. They thought they got a good deal from the former owner in 1991, but they should have paid \$323,000 instead of \$355,000. Comparable to a house in '88? The Assessor did not come up with anything.

Mrs. Timming doesn't think the ones they showed her were comparable to theirs. All the taxes are lower than theirs by about \$2,000. Now valuation \$339,800 - she wants it lowered to \$323,000 or \$326,000. Most of Bjorklund Development houses have gone down in price. Valley Creek Mall almost in their back yard. Group home also in neighborhood. Two other homes on the market have been on the market for two years. They are trying to sell their home and asking \$379,000 - on the market for two years. No reduction recommended by the Assessor's Office.

# CASE 25, DONALD and CAROLYN VANCE 85740-2200 & 2250 Grey Cloud

Our staff recommending a reduction to \$97,000 from \$100,500 total for both parcels. We are a 100% market value state. The measurement in St. Paul Park is 93% The \$97,000 assessment for both parcels is good.

# CASE 29, HEIDI HARVIEUX 93025-0090 Hugo

There was an increase across the board for the City. Eight acres with house are on farm classification, homesteaded and on green acres.

# CASE 31, NANCY KNAAK 42065-2950 Lakeland Shores

Ms. Knaak thought the value increased by \$42,000 in one year, but it actually changed \$14,400 from \$194,900 to \$209,000. Equalized all lots in the area in 1992/1993. The land value increased by \$10,300 and the building by \$3,600 for a total of \$13,900. There has been a slight reduction the last two years in the evaluation. Recommend no change.

CASE 14, NEIL and CAROL HICKEY 37444-2400 (No "Property Narrative") in file

In the landfill area of Lake Elmo on Jamaca. They received city water. They've owned property four years - were told no problems by city, county and real estate agent when they bought. First evaluation \$132,000 - \$135,000, then \$127,000 then \$105,500. After water installed (by city) it went up to \$132,000. The Local Board did not do anything. The Assessor's Office is always watching the situation, as well as others in the County. Appraisal by a real estate agent is \$140,000. This did not reflect the contamination situation. Recommended no change.

The County should have a workshop on landfill contamination portions of the County.

Motion by Dave Engstrom, seconded by Wally Abrahamson to continue and reconvene the Board of Review next Tuesday, June 28, 1994. Time to be established at a later date. There are three more cases to consider.

June 28, 1994

The Washington County Board of Equalization reconvened at 11:00 a.m., Tuesday, June 28, 1994. Members composed of Mary Hauser, Acting Chair, Wally Abrahamson, Myra Peterson, Dennis Hegberg and Dave Engstrom were present in addition to Auditor-Treasurer, R.H. Stafford, County Assessor, Scott Hovet; Assessor Ed Hervin and Recorder, Dawn Aerts.

Scott Hovet outlined three motions for consideration before the Board: Motion 1, 1994 Assessor's Recommendations to the County Board of Equalization; Motion 2, the 1994 Property Valuation Change Report and Motion 3, an independent appeal for property valuation adjustment requested by board member, Myra Peterson.

CASE 7, WALTER MOE, 79004-2130 12125 St. Croix Tr. S., Denmark Township

Mr. Moe requested that his property value be adjusted based on reduced acreage and deterioration of his home. Mr. Moe explained that his property had been on the market on at least two previous occasions over a one-year period when the property consisted of 22 acres and the property failed to sell at \$200,000 or later, at a reduced price of \$196,000. According to Mr. Moe, his current property consists of 5 acres, his home may be over-built for the area and he feels the home has deteriorated since it was previously on the market. Assessor Ed Hervin noted that according to comparable properties (equal or slightly better) than the Moe property, the value is appropriate.

Note: The Local Board of Review recommended no change.

# CASE 32, TOM SWENO, 37445-6310 8076 Hill Trail, Lake Elmo

Mr. Tom Sweno requested that the Board review the value on his parcel and noted that he felt there were major disparities in the values established on similar and larger parcels in the immediate area. Sweno identified several larger multi-parcel properties which reflected lower values than his and said that his property was less valuable due to noise and activity from an adjacent business property.

Assessor Ed Hervin, said that the property was inspected that morning, but due to lack of specific data on the properties identified by Mr. Sweno, the Assessor's Office could not respond to the disparity issue. Scott Hovet explained that assessed value is not proportional to the size of vacant or multi-parcel properties and that other factors such as open-improved lot vs non-developed, land use, wetlands, or other potential differences will likely produce different values.

Without sufficient or concrete data to review, Board Members suggested that the Assessor's Office further investigate the disparity issue and offered several options for Mr. Sweno: 1) to pursue an abatement of value (informal) or 2) request further consideration at the Minnesota State Tax Court.

# CASE 33, LLOYD and ANN BODLOVICK, 10425-5500 1511 Olive St., Stillwater

Ann Bodlovick requested that the Board reduce the value of her property based on heavy traffic flow (16,000 per day estimate along Olive St.), and to keep her value in line with the current "on market" asking price of \$100,000. Bodlovick said that current traffic and projected increases in flow due to major commercial expansion along County Rd. 5 continues to negatively impact the value of her home. Board member Wally Abrahamson agreed with the traffic issue and recommended in concurrence with Dave Engstrom that the value be reduced to \$100,000. The Board agreed.
