NCVHS meetings 2/24 and 2/26</p>	<p>Dave Haugen provided a brief update at the Exec Committee regarding recent hearings of the National Committee VHS full committee and its Standards Subcommittee. Discussion focused on the Standards Committee meeting February 26, 2015, regarding "Overview of Proposed Operating Rules Health Care Claims, Prior Authorization, Enrollment/Disenrollment & Premium Payment." During the NCVHS session it was pointed out that several key minority positions exist regarding the proposed operating rules, especially in areas of: requirements for acknowledgments; requirements for higher levels of digital security; and setting expectations if real time claim processing were to become available. Findings from the hearing, and any possible recommendations, will be forwarded by NCVHS to the Secretary of the US Department of Health and Human Services (HHS).</p>

4. Tentative -- Updates/Old business

a. Companion Guides Update

i. Repeat proposed update process for claims guides – for discussion

Back in Dec. 15, 2014 we published proposed revisions to the MN companion guides for the claims (837) transactions as “version 9.0,” and announced a 30 day public comment period. Following the conclusion of the 30 day public comment period, we began finalizing the revised guides to be published as adopted rules (“version 10”). At that time we became aware of some errors in the guides (for repeat lab services, and the public health nursing tables). We also recently passed the Autism SBAR.

Given these additional changes, we are considering republishing our proposed revisions, with the 30 day public comment period, and then finalizing them as adopted rules. (Essentially we would be publishing a “version 9.1” as the new proposed revised revision, that when finalized would still be adopted into rule as “version 10.0.”)

Given the number of steps that would need to be completed, it would likely be approximately July 1 before version 10.0 was adopted into rule.

a) TAG and SBAR update

The TAG updates are summarized in the latest issue of the [AUC newsletter](#). In addition, we would like to discuss/brainstorm experimenting with some new meeting formats and content.

b) ICD-10 outreach opportunities

WEDI conducted a webinar last week regarding the findings of its latest national ICD-10 readiness survey. The survey results indicated that many parties, especially providers, seem unprepared or lagging in their ICD-10 preparedness.

Judy has been meeting with and organizing additional potential resources for the ICD-10 sessions at the rural health conference June 29-30. We have been including a steady stream of reminders and ICD-10 articles in the AUC monthly newsletter.

5. Tentative -- New business

a) Future challenges – meeting business needs for new payment mechanisms

One of the AUC’s interests has been to prepare for a changing health care delivery/financing environment. WEDI recently announced the formation of a project team as part of its Payment Models Workgroup to focus on Bundled Payments. This “Bundled Payments Taskforce” will “assess the attributes, information, and technology needs and requirements of

this model, and develop solutions, in the form of an industry action plan, to foster their adoption and implementation while increasing sustainability.” As a possible step toward learning more about the issues and contributing to solutions, what if the AUC recruited members (a new TAG?) to actively participate on the AUC’s behalf on the WEDI Task Force, and to periodically report back findings, lay out issues and options being explored, and help lead the AUC in a new area of inquiry and technical assistance? This new “TAG” then would essentially meet by participating on the WEDI Task Force, as well as any additional meetings they might need to synthesize and react to findings and recommendations of the Task Force and to engage with the AUC.

- b) Future challenges – Convergence of clinical and administrative data exchange
i. Meaningful use phase III rules review and response?

Several sources have cited the needs and possible emerging opportunities for a convergence in the exchanges of clinical and administrative data. CMS recently released its [proposed rule for Phase III of EHR meaningful use incentives](#), and is seeking comments through May. Is this a possible opportunity for recommending changes to foster the convergence of clinical and administrative data?
