To the Town Clerk

This Clerk's Account Book has been designed with the assistance of the State Public Examiner's Division, to provide a complete, simple, and comprehensive record of all township finances, by funds, over a five-year period. With it have been combined the necessary forms for town records.

The forms in Part I are:

- A. Register of receipts
1 double page for each year
- B. Yearly summary of receipts and disbursements
1 double page for each year
- C. Register of orders issued
60 double pages

INSTRUCTIONS FOR USE—PART I

1. If you will carefully follow the headings, you will experience no difficulty in using the register of receipts, or the register of orders issued. Of the latter you will use as many pages as you find necessary each year. As an aid in making up the summary at the end of the year, a specimen page has been filled out showing how to make up of this form. (See page following title page 3). The figures used are fictitious amounts, intended simply for guidance in use of the form.

2. Paragraph 6 of Section 1069 G. S. 1923, makes it the duty of the Town Treasurer to file with you, within five days preceding the annual town meeting, a statement in writing showing all moneys received by him, as well as all moneys paid out, from whom received and to whom paid. (Booth form 3 G).

When this report has been filed with you, turn to your register of orders issued, and check off in the column provided for that purpose, all orders shown as paid on said report. When this has been done, then make a list, by funds, of all orders unpaid. (Booth form 3 K). If the Treasurer has paid any interest on any of the orders paid, as shown by his report, you should enter the amount at the bottom of your last page of orders issued for that year, each amount in its proper fund, first making a sub-total of the orders issued on that fund and then adding the total of the interest. You will require these figures in making up your summary. Now check the receipts as shown on the Treasurer's report with your record of receipts and see that these items agree.

3. The example shown on the specimen page will assist you in making up the summary; also in preparing the reconciliation with the Treasurer's account.

4. The law makes it the duty of the board of audit to examine, audit and approve all disbursements of the town. This should be done annually before the annual town meeting. You will find a certificate for the board of audit to sign after they have performed this duty, at the bottom of the summary page.

5. The law makes it your duty to display this report at the place of holding the town meeting, at least one-half hour before the time for opening the polls. You are also required to read this report publicly at the meeting.

6. Be sure to fill in dates—year, month and day—wherever called for. This is very important.
