From the Director

Dear Families.

Paideia has been participating in the Minnesota Department of Education program called Quality Compensation (Q Comp) for the past few years. This is a program that grants schools, who apply and are accepted to participate, up to \$240 (for charter schools) per student per year. These funds are specifically allocated for and may only be used in alignment with the five components under Q Comp: Career ladder/Advancement Options, Job-embedded Professional Development, Teacher Evaluation, Performance Pay, and an Alternative Salary Schedule. Only licensed teachers are eligible to participate.

With these some of these funds, Paideia is able to create what are called Career Ladder Positions. In essence, this is a leadership structure for teachers to earn a small stipend for taking on an additional leadership role. This is a great opportunity for teachers to utilize and develop their skills and share in the leadership of the school. For the 2011-12 school year, Paideia has 15 lead teachers in Career Ladder Positions. Near the end of the 2010-11 school year, teachers who were interested in a leadership position submitted an application and participated in an interview process. I would like to introduce the lead teachers for this year:

Teachers Corner

Dan Armstrong, UA Special Education Teacher

I decided to go into teaching in the mid 1990's. I originally wanted to teach theology at the college level, and so I went to seminary in 1999 and graduated in 2002. From 2001 to 2005, I taught theology as an adjunct in Minneapolis. In 2006, I began the languages portion for a doctorate in theology, but I needed five languages (Greek, Hebrew, Aramaic, Latin and German), and after doing a year of Greek, I began to some serious soul-searching. I was managing a Dunn Brothers at this time, and one of my regular customers, a Special Education Teacher, was finishing a doctorate in education at the U of M. I told her I was at a crossroad, and she invited me to volunteer where she worked. I did, and the rest is history: In the summer of 2007, I enrolled at Mankato State University for their graduate license program in Special Education.

As an adjunct professor at North Central University, I taught theology and ethics (I did this on a full-time basis). From 2007-2010, I worked as a paraprofessional for the Carver-Scott Educational Cooperative in Chaska. Given my background in theology, I frequently taught the subject of world religions to students with Emotional and Behavioral Disorders. During the 2010-2011 school year, I was a Special Education Teacher for an Autism program in Chaska, and taught social skills, math, and reading.


