From the Director

Dear Families,

It is hard to believe how quickly this quarter has gone by. We are wrapping up week 6 now and DDI (Data Driven Instruction) assessments begin next week on Friday with 6th grade language arts and 8th grade social studies. Assessments will continue the following week during the morning hours with the exception of Spanish 7/8 in the afternoons. We should be finished with the assessments by Thursday. Grades 2-8 will take the assessments online at quia.com. K and 1st will take paper based assessments which will then be loaded onto quia.com for results analysis. During our collaboration time on September 28, teachers will be meeting in teams to analyze the results and develop plans to re-teach standards that were not mastered and provide enrichment opportunities as needed.

Families who are new to Paideia, DDI assessments are administered primarily during the 8th week of the quarter and are summative/cumulative. This year, we are focusing on math in grades K-8 along with the core subjects (science, language arts, social studies, Spanish) for grades 6-8. All of the assessments were written by Paidiea teachers and are closely aligned with the MN standards which are mapped out in the respective scope and sequence by content area for each quarter. We are seeking the same level of rigor as the MCA state tests so that these assessments offer accurate data in relation to student mastery of content. During DDI testing, please ensure that your child has plenty of rest, a nutritious breakfast, and is present and on time to school.

SchoolView

Paideia Academy offers families access to SchoolView, an online service that is easy to access and will enhance teacher/family communication. In SchoolView you can:

- Find information about your child's schedule, attendance, discipline, demographic information and academic performance.
- Subscribe to an email alert system that will automatically send an email when your child is absent.
- Pay for and check your student's lunch balances.
- Update your phone numbers and e-mail addresses as well as update student health information.



- Math- I've used interactive manipulatives for math and I also put the warm-up and workbook pages up there for children to follow along with.
- Dismissal- We use it during dismissal time to announce student numbers.
