

Dear Paideia Community,

Happy Friday! It's been another exciting week here at Paideia. Wednesday Dismissal Update

Kindergarten

- Math: Beginning of the year assessments; number sense

- Language Arts: Lowercase Cursive Letters d, e, f
- Science: Review day on animal classification, Test on animal classification, Students create their own Mr. Fab
- Social Studies: Goods & Services, Consumers & Producers, Market Day

- Science: Students will study microorganisms and viruses.
- Social Studies: Students will learn how decisions are made at the local, state, and national level.
- Advisory: Students will continue the Olweus curriculum by talking about anti-bullying rules.

- **Inspirations**: The kids are really getting to know the routine and becoming productive fourth graders!

Fifth Grade

- Math: Review, Quiz Tuesday, Pretest, Using a Calculator, Multiplying by 10's, 100's, 1,000's.
- Language Arts: Students will be presenting a multi-media project to the class. Students are allowed (with parent permission) to bring digital photos from home to add to their presentation. Students will be reading a passage from "The Young Man and the Sea" to work on their reading comprehension skills. Reading calendars are due Sept. 5.
- **Science:** Students will continue to learn about the scientific method. Students will also begin their unit on simple machines.
- **Social Studies:** Next week students will present their Lakes of the World posters. We will complete geography work, review and have a geography and lakes post test. Current events presentations will be Friday for students were assigned that date.
- Advisory: Character trait- Love of Learning, study skills, organization, first Olweus class meeting
- **Announcements:** At Curriculum Night, information was available about an online Learning Management System called Schoology. 5th and 6th Graders will use this tool this year. Sixth Grade

- Math: Quiz on Monday, Prime Factorization, Greatest Common Factor, Least Common Multiple, Review, Quiz Friday.
- Language Arts: Students will be presenting a multi-media project to the class. Students are allowed (with parent permission) to bring digital photos from home to add to their presentation. Students are also working on making text connections with the nonfiction text, "Before We Were Free." Students' reading calendars are due Sept. 4 (6B) or Sept. 5 (6A).
- **Science:** Students will continue learning about the scientific method. Students will also begin learning about how engineering design is the process of designing products and processes that solve a specific problem.
- **Social Studies:** Next week students will begin learning about the Deserts of the World. They will research deserts and work on a poster project. Current events presentations will be Friday for students were assigned that date.

- **Announcements:** At Curriculum Night, information was available about an online Learning Management System called Schoology. 5th and 6th Graders will use this tool this year. - **Inspirations:** It was inspiring to see students working diligently in class, staying on task, and completing their work in the time allotted to them. Students then created a small poster based on their research, which we hung up in a timeline around the classroom.

Seventh Grade

- Math: Working with integers (adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing), solving equations and inequalities with integers.
- Language Arts: Writing a descriptive paragraph using the writing process, focusing on the "Ideas" trait in writing with a paired convention skill, continue with critical strategies for reading and writing in the Daybook, collaborating in partner and small group activities by following group roles.
- **Science** next week, 7th and 8th graders will be learning about the metric system. They will practice using metric units and conversions and will put their knowledge to the test during the metric Olympics! Students will use recorded data to create graphs for each metric Olympics event per grade.
- Social Studies: This week in 7th grade Social Studies we began our study of People in U.S. History, which will be our focus during Q1. Students put their textbook skills to work by skimming and scanning a text of their choosing and using the Table of Contents and Index to locate information on a historical figure of interest. We used Venn Diagrams to compare and contrast the experiences and characteristics of people in U.S.
 - History. We ended the week by examining a video of "Adventurers" in U.S. History, focusing on which character traits helped make these people "successful". Next week we will continue to study various groups of people throughout U.S. History.
- Advisory: Character trait- Love of Learning, study skills, organization, first Olweus class meeting.
- Announcements: Reminder to practice IXL (every student was given a username and password).
- Volunteer Opportunities: Putting up bulletin boards.

Eighth Grade

- **Math:** Solving one-step equations by adding/subtracting/multiplying/dividing, solving 2-step and multistep equations, solving equations with variables on both sides (8B has their chapter 1 test on Monday).
- Language Arts: Reading Heart of a Chief or Touching Spirit Bear, focusing on the "Ideas" trait in writing with a paired convention skill, continuing with critical strategies for reading and writing in the Daybook, collaborating in partner and small group activities by following group roles.
- Social Studies: This week in 8th grade Social Studies we completed an iPad activity that introduced us to the capabilities of Google Earth, which we will use throughout the year for various learning purposes. We also worked in Ch. 1 of our National Geographic textbooks, which introduced us to vocabulary and concepts such as "Absolute Location" and "Relative Location"; students created maps that included Map/Globe Elements, such as Title, Legend/Key, Scale, and Compass Rose. We completed some Freeze Frame and Listen-and-Draw activities to reinforce our learning of geography vocabulary. Next week we will begin our study of the regional and cultural geography of North America.
- **Science** next week, 7th and 8th graders will be learning about the metric system. They will practice using metric units and conversions and will put their knowledge to the test during the metric Olympics! Stu dents will use recorded data to create graphs for each metric Olympics event per grade.
- Advisory: Character trait- Love of Learning, study skills, organization, first Olweus class meeting.
- Announcements: Reminder to practice IXL (every student was given a username and password).
- Volunteer Opportunities: Putting up bulletin boards.

Music 4

- Standards/unit: Artistic Foundations; Understanding Compound vs. Simple Meter
- Activities: Moving to compound meter, reading compound meter, hearing 3/4 vs. 9/8, hearing 2/4 vs. 6/8
- Inspirations: Every fourth grade student knows proper marching posture and marking time in place!

Music 5

- Standards/unit: Artistic Foundations; Music Theory Foundations
- Activities: Building the keyboard, living piano, recognizing keyboard notes, reading notes on Orff Instruments
- **Inspirations:** Band and Orchestra clubs have begun after school. We will be playing our instruments next week for the first time!

- Standards/unit: Artistic Process: Perform or Present; African Drumming Techniques
- Activities: Exploring cultures of Africa, learning traditional instrument names, continuing ensemble work

Counselor's Corner

- A Message from your Counselors: We have really enjoyed getting into each and every classroom and meeting many of the students! We have been able to participate in advisory meetings and teambuilding activities. Mr. Roll has met with several of the students individually, and has enjoyed hearing about all the fun things that kids did over the summer, as well as many great ideas about lessons Upper Academy students would like to see delivered.
- Counseling Highlights: What does a School Counselor do?
 - School Counselors work with teachers, students, administrators and parents to help make school a successful experience for all children. School Counselors help students develop academically, personally, and socially. We do this by offering many different services to fit the needs of the students. Some of these services include:
 - **Classroom Advisory Support**: Counselors work with classroom teachers to support student's social skill and character development.
 - **Individual Counseling**: Students have the opportunity to work one-on-one with counselors on specific issues or concerns.
 - **Crisis Intervention:** Counselors work with students and familys to help them deal with stressful events that may occur such as family problems, loss of a loved one, or conflicts with friends.
 - **Group Counseling:** Groups Consist of 4-8 students and a counselor. The main purpose for groups is to let students know that they are not alone with their thoughts and feelings.
 - **Parent Education:** Parent Involvement in school activities helps to make students more successful. School Counselors can provide you with information regarding family relationships and ways to help your child.
- Helpful Hints: Top 10 Homework Tips! (Part 1)
 - **Know the teachers and what they are looking for!** Attend school events, such as parent-teacher conferences, to meet your child's teachers. Ask about their homework policies and how you should be involved.
 - **Set up a homework-friendly area.** Make sure kids have a well-lit place to complete homework. Keep supplies paper, pencils, glue and scissors within reach! Cont.

Counselor's Corner continued.

• **Schedule a regular study time.** Some kids work best in the afternoon, following a snack and play period; other may prefer to wait until after dinner.

Help them make a plan. On heavy homework nights or when there's an especially hefty assignment to tackle, encourage your child to break up the work into manageable chunks. Create a work schedule for the night if necessary – and take time for a 15 minute break every hour, if possible.

Keep distractions to a minimum. This means no TV, loud music, or phone calls. (Occasionally, though, a phone call to a classmate about an assignment can be helpful!)
