

From the Director

Dear Paideia Community,

Congratulations Paideia - Our charter is being renewed!!! This is a very exciting development for us, as it demonstrates the strides we have made in our academic progress and performance, as well as the faith our authorizer has in Paideia Academy. While we are still waiting to find out the terms of our charter, including whether we will be authorized for three years or five years, it is still great news for us!

Our first full week in a while has kept us extremely busy. We began the week with our Monday Morning Meeting, led by the 4th grade team – our shortest one yet! We followed that up with our second Coffee with the Director, which was attended by eight parents, representing a wide variety of grade levels, interests, and questions. On Tuesday night, we held an Academic Excellence Committee meeting focused on how Paideia is meeting the requirements of the World's Best Workforce legislation passed last May as well as a Governance & Long-Range Planning Committee meeting dedicated to developing a plan to review and revise our school policies as well as streamlining our committee meeting calendar. Our Marketing Committee met on Monday night to continue the fabulous work they are doing to develop a more comprehensive strategy for publicizing our school and supporting enrollment.

Classroom observations have continued for the third quarter, and I have had the wonderful opportunity to observe our 6th graders learning how to participate in Literature Circles in Mr. Leckband's class, our 8th graders actively contributing to a Socratic Seminar in Ms. Kempf's class, and our 3rd graders analyzing the various aspects of <u>Tales of a Fourth Grade Nothing</u>. It was terrific to see our students being so inspired by their teachers and the work they are doing!

During the next few weeks, we will be working with teachers to revise their professional development plans based on their mid-year evaluations. Our focus is on supporting all of our staff members to provide appropriately challenging and well-rounded educational experiences for all students, meet the teaching standards outlined in the Danielson Framework for Teaching, and participate productively in a professional learning community. We thank you all in advance for sharing your responses with us later this spring when we will reach out to families to provide additional feedback.

I look forward to seeing many of you tonight at the PTO-sponsored Movie Night, then some more of you at the regional Science Olympiad competition in Minnetonka tomorrow. Go Paideia!

5th Grade

Math: This week we will finish our unit by comparing fractions, mixed fractions, improper fractions (along with decimals) and learning to order them from least to greatest. We move into Algebra mid-week; evaluating expression and solving algebraic equations involving variables. We will also be solving real-world problems using algebraic expression with unknown variables. I have a new classroom set of "Hands-On Equations" and students have loved working with these in the past.

5th Grade

Math: This week we will finish our unit by comparing fractions, mixed fractions, improper fractions (along with decimals) and learning to order them from least to greatest. We move into Algebra mid-week; evaluating expression and solving algebraic equations involving variables. We will also be solving real-world problems using algebraic expression with unknown variables. I have a new classroom set of "Hands-On Equations" and students have loved working with these in the past.

Language Arts: We have been reading our "just right books" along with working on improving our vocabularies and writing. Students have also had the opportunity to read to and with their teachers and some parent volunteers. Fifth graders are also working with Mr. Grover and Mrs. Ekrem on formatting documents in Microsoft Word. Next week we will be working on comparing and contrasting texts.

Social Studies: Students will present their Glogs (all work is due on Monday, February 10). They will continue learning about events that led to the American Revolution. They will have a quiz late in the week about the Colonies and events leading to the Revolution (watch for a study guide).

Inspirations: It was great to see students tackle a new software program (Glogster), learn to make it work, and create some great online posters!

Science: Students will continue to learn about natural environments in Minnesota.

Advisory: Students will learn about good homework habits.

Announcements: Look for information going home about a FREE 5th grade overnight field trip to the Science Museum of Minnesota in late February! Permission slips are due next Thursday, February 13th.

Midterm Progress Reports will be sent home on Wednesday, February 12. Reading logs are due March 3. Our next library visit will be Thursday, February 13 at 2:40 PM. Students should return their library books then.

Many students still need to bring Mr. Leckband a copy of their library cards for him to have on file.

Volunteer Opportunities: Mr. Leckband needs three parent volunteers for the February 13 library visit.

Inspirations: It was inspiring to have so many parent volunteers take us to the library and to see the students on their best behavior in the library. It was also inspiring seeing students reading to their partners, giving each other compliments, and telling the class what they learned from their readings.

6th Grade

Math: I was really impressed with students who were able to solve my "Amazing T Puzzle" in the classroom this week! Next week we will be finishing up our chapter on Area of Two-Dimensional figures and have our Chapter 9 quiz. We then begin learning about volume and surface area of Three-Dimensional figures.

Language Arts: We have been reading our literature circle novels and participating in literature circle discussions. Students have been doing a great job sharing what they've learned from their novels and how their own experiences relate to the characters and settings in their novels. Next week we will be working on point of view, plot, and themes from readings in our "Daybooks of Critical Reading and Writing." We will then use what we learned to apply to our literature circle novels.

Social Studies: Final Draft of RAFT writing project is due on Monday, February 10. Next week students will learn about the Civil War using an iPad app. Toward the end of the week they will have a test on the Dakota-US War and Civil War (there will be a study guide to complete). Following our Civil War chapter, we will begin reading Soldier's Heart by Gary Paulsen. It's the story of Charley Goddard, a young Minnesotan who fought in the Civil War.

Science: Students will continue to learn about sound and light waves.

Advisory: Students will learn about good homework habits.

Announcements: Midterm Progress Reports will be sent home on Wednesday, February 12. Reading logs are due March 3.

- **Volunteer Opportunities:** Mr. Leckband has opportunities for chaperoning students to the library on Friday, January 31st. He also has opportunities for reading to and with 5th grade students on Tuesday mornings and Thursday afternoons. Please contact him at: nleckband@paideiaacademy.org for details.
- **Inspirations:** Students did a fantastic job writing their RAFT papers. Just reading their drafts showed M. Sailors their understanding of the Dakota-US War and it was interesting to read the writing from the viewpoint of the historical figure they selected. Ms. Hood was impressed with 6th graders during their literature circle discussions during her visit to 6th grade Language Arts this week! Mr. Leckband was inspired to see students having productive conversations centered around literature circle novels.

7th Grade

- **Math:** 7A & 7B: Next week students will be learning about translations and reflections, direct variation, inverse variation and proportional vs. non-proportional relationships. The following IXL skills can be practiced at home: Q.1, Q.2, Q.3, Q.4, Q.5, X.1, Eighth Grade I.4
- Language Arts: We will continue studying poetry in the Daybook lessons and practicing writing poetry as well. Students will take Spelling #4 and WOTW #4 quizzes at the beginning of the week, and they will be given Spelling #5 and WOTW #5. Students will analyze two poems and write paragraphs how they are similar and different. They will be assessed on comparing/contrasting text as well. Reminders: All students should be reading a book, either nonfiction or fiction. They will be documenting their reading minutes and page numbers on their January reading calendar. An extra copy can be downloaded and printed on the 7th grade Language Arts website. The February reading calendar is due 03/04/14.

8th Grade

- Math: 8A: Students will be learning to add, subtract, multiply polynomials and special products of binomials. - **Social Studies:** Students are really enjoying listening to the novel *The House On Mango Street*, by Sandra Cisneros! This short novel (while read widely across the country in middle school and high school classrooms) does reference some mature, serious topics, so please be ready to discuss as needed with your child at home, and please contact Ms. Hood with any questions or concerns you may have. We have been focusing on a word-listing and categorizing activity aimed at helping students identify and discuss themes within the novel. This novel is a good tie-in/bridge between our study of North American culture and geography last quarter, and this quarter's focus on the cultures and geography of Latin America. Students also completed activities about South America using our National Geographic online textbook and resources.
- **Science:** In science next week, students will have a test on Tuesday about rocks and minerals. They will need to know characteristics of rocks and minerals, how the three rock types form, rock vocab, and techniques to use to identify rocks and minerals. Once finished with rocks and minerals, students will begin learning about what causes seasons and how the Sun affects life on Earth.
