A Message from your Counselors: What should Career Exploration Look Like?

Career Exploration begins with the awareness that different occupations exist. It continues with research and "trying out" several occupations. There are two ways to explore careers; one is to investigate and the other is to experience. Your child should engage in both.

Helpful Hints: Activities That Can Help Nurture Your Child's Interests

If your child has an interest in animals, he or she might like to:

- · Join a 4-H club.
- · Volunteer at a local veterinary clinic or zoo.
- · Walk or care for a neighbor's dog.

If your child has an interest in art, he or she might like to:

- · Design a personal website.
- · Make birthday or holiday cards for relatives and friends.
- · Create graphics for the school newsletter.

If your child likes to help people, he or she might like to:

- · Be a summer camp counselor.
- · Assist at a day care center.
- · Teach a younger child to read.

If your child likes to build or repair things, he or she might like to:

- · Build a radio or computer from a kit.
- · Take apart an old appliance and put it back together.
- · Design and build a bird house.

If your child likes sports, he or she might like to:

- · Play on a sports team.
- · Assist a coach.
- · Umpire or referee community games.

Technology

Kindergarten: Students continued to explore with Paint tools and used IXL Math on the computers.

1st Grade: Students resized, rotated and moved, clip art pictures in a document and created a mini book with a partner using a template created in Word. This will be printed and sent home next week!

2nd Grade: Students will begin Insect PowerPoints soon!

3rd Grade: Students have almost completed their astronomy research presentation using www.glogster.edu. This program allowed them to resize, rotate, and layer objects. They also had to save it on the internet site, (no need for a folder this time.) The Presidential PowerPoints for advisory are almost done as well. Students also did a few activities from www.netsmartz.org on Friday and had a discussion about internet safety.

4th Grade: Students used computers to learn about the cardiovascular system and continue to work on their keyboarding skills. Students get their name on a giant keyboard posted in their room when they can type over 20 words per minute.

<u>Upper Academy Careers Exploration Update:</u> All students used Word or the internet in their exploration. Some completed a questionnaire that they will use in interviewing an adult about their career. Others completed an online interest inventory to explore careers that they might be interested in. This information will be displayed in an Excel Graph and a PowerPoint Portfolio over the next few weeks.

Next week the MCA Science Test for the 5th and 8th graders will be taken on a computer. No more bubbles to fill in....(for awhile anyway!!!)

5th Grade

Math: We spent the week learning about probability and combinations, especially in the area of "Theoretical" verses "Experimental" probabilities. Ask your student if they can tell you what the differences are! The students worked in stations calculating probabilities while flipping coins, drawing colored Skittles from bags, rolling dice, and having a "Horse Race" in the classroom! We should be ready to test out of Chapter 11 early next week. Next week we will be multiplying and dividing decimals, and finding out how we use these skills in real world situations.

Language Arts: Students continue to work on improving their vocabularies, writing, and reading. We are doing more focus on fluency by reading poems aloud with partners, groups, and parents. Students will eventually be presenting a poem for multiple voices for the entire class.

Social Studies: Students will work on the Bill of Rights and other major Constitutional amendments.

Science: Science update coming soon! (Ms. Creighton is out on maternity!)

Advisory: Students continue to use Advisory time to work on character education, organizational/study skills, and Olweus Anti-Bullying.

Announcements: 5th Grade will be taking their Science MCA test first thing on Monday morning. Inspirations: It was inspiring to see students showing off their skills of visualizing text they read, and reading poetry aloud with expression. Students have done a great job learning about our federal government. Every day we learn something new. Students are really thinking about these ideas and have a lot of great questions.

6th Grade

Math: We transitioned from our Hands-On-Equation kits (concrete learning) to working more abstractly with numbers and variables in our Algebra unit. The students did well with one and two-step equations, and even had a glimpse into 7th grade math with a day of multi-step equations (combining like terms and using the Distributive property.) We will move into inequalities next week, and review our Divisibility rules.

Language Arts: Students are now writing epic poetry or narratives and listening to the Odyssey. We have revisited the literary genre of myths. Ask your student her or his definitions of myths and epic poetry. Some students are using the Ojibwe myths as a model for writing their epic poem or narrative.

- **Social Studies:** Students will complete their immigration study and take a test. We will concentrate on push-pull factors (ask your student what that means). In addition, we will do a short activity to explore where our families are from.
- Science: Science update coming soon! (Ms. Creighton is out on maternity leave!)
- **Advisory:** Students continue to use Advisory time to work on character education, organizational/study skills, and Olweus Anti-Bullying.

Mr. Leckband says that t was inspiring to hear all the students' previous knowledge of myths and epics. Students did a great job researching different immigrant groups who are "new" to Minnesota.

7th Grade

- **Math:** The seventh graders will continue to work on equations within story problems. The main focus of the week will be on slope. Some of the concepts will be: what is slope and calculating slope from ordered pairs or a graph. The standards for next year are primarily Algebra, so I want to expose the 7th graders to the concepts early!
- **Language Arts:**Students will continue reading persuasive articles in the Daybook. Students will practice writing constructed responses, using evidence from the text, to support their claim on a specific topic.
- **Social Studies:** We enjoyed our week with student teacher, Mr. Campbell! Students studied WW2, completing reading, writing, cut/sort/paste/label, online, and readers' theater activities. Next week we will continue to study wars in U.S. history from the Civil War to the present.
- **Science:** In science next week, students will learn about sickle cell anemia (a genetic disease) and how genetic variation can influence survival. They will be doing a lab to show how variation can help or hurt survival.
- **Advisory:** Mr. Grover, Mr. Roll, and Mrs. Ekrem have been working with students on college and career readiness activities in Advisory. 7th graders are discussing character traits such as hope and self-control, and working on getting organized and caught up for midterm, and continuing with Olweus Anti-Bullying topics. 8th Grade

Math: 8A: The students have completed their work with quadratic equations. They will be starting their study on radical functions and equations. During this next week, the students will work on: adding/subtracting/multiplying/dividing radical expressions, solving radical equations and preparing for an assessment. The date of the assessment has not been set because it will vary based on how comfortable the students are with the content. 8B: The students will be completing a variety of 8th grade standards review activities. I want to ensure they have a VERY solid foundation of the most important skills before they leave for high school (slope, systems of equations, etc.) 9 quiz!

- **Language Arts:** Students will be researching and writing their argument essay about a self-selected topic. This is a group project, so it is important for students to meet the classroom deadlines.
- **Social Studies:** We enjoyed our time with student teacher Mr. Campbell this week! Students learned about the Cold War, including the leadership of Lenin and Stalin in the Soviet Union; students watched documentaries, completed film guides, worked with websites, and completed a simulation about communism. Next week we will begin reading the novel *Animal Farm*.
- **Science:** In science next week, students will be prepping for and taking the MCAs on Monday or Tuesday. The rest of the week we will begin looking at water and land use across the planet and how humans impact the Earth and environment.
