## **Over the Counter and Prescription Medication:**

Parents/guardians of students taking prescription medications and/or over-the-counter medications must bring the medications to the school office in the original, unopened container. All medication must be hand delivered to the office by the parent/guardian. Parent/guardians will need to have their physician complete a form that will record the time, dosage and frequency/duration of prescription and/or over-the-counter medications. Students needing to keep medications on their person (inhalers, epi-pens, etc.) must have a similar form on file in the office and with the teacher. Under no circumstance may a child have a prescription and/or over-the-counter medication in their possession on campus of which the school has not been made aware. Violation of this policy may result in immediate suspension or expulsion from the Academy. With the proper paperwork completed, medication can be administered to your child by the Health Clerk or any member of the office staff.

## Kindergarten:

#### Welcome!

**Math:** We will learn new counting songs and how to use our math manipulatives.

**Language Arts:** We will learn how to listen to read-alouds, how to handle books correctly and how to use our classroom library.

## **Eighth Grade:**

#### PARENT/GUARDIAN VOLUNTEERS

Volunteers are a valuable asset to the Academy and its students. The Academy seeks to promote an atmosphere welcoming to all its volunteers. All volunteers are required to submit to a background check and shall operate under the direction of the administration or office staff. If there are any concerns regarding the results of a background check, Paideia will contact the individual directly. Families are asked to make their best efforts to provide 50 hours of community service time to the Academy each year. We ask that parents/guardians log their hours. All children who do not currently attend Paideia should be placed with outside care while parents/guardians are doing volunteer work at the Academy.

All volunteer opportunities will be communicated by Paideia Academy staff or the PTO. All volunteer activities must be pre-arranged with Paideia Academy staff. Volunteers must sign-in at the front desk and wait for authorization from office staff to proceed to classrooms.

All volunteers are required to act in accordance with all school policies and rules. Volunteers shall maintain the same confidentiality standards expected of certified personnel and exhibit the ethical behaviors of a professional. Each volunteer must sign a Confidentiality Agreement. The Director shall be responsible for resolving complaints regarding volunteers and may ask a volunteer to leave the school if he/she violates any school rule or policy.
