Dear Paideia Community,

Thank you to all of you who have voted for our grant proposal to support our Daily 5-aligned work! If you haven't yet voted, please go to http://education.state.mn.us/MDE/Welcome/News/BloggED/July-AugustPosts/056712 to learn more about the work we are doing and vote for Paideia to earn up to \$4,000 to support our teachers to create curriculum materials to be used here at Paideia and throughout the state of Minnesota.

This week our teachers and instructional assistants chose a Professional Learning Community to participate in to support their individual professional development. These sessions will meet every third week during our Wednesday collaboration times and will be led by our Lead Teachers. Staff will be participating in book studies, activities, and discussions to support their growth in one of the following four areas based on feedback from staff: 1) Meeting the Needs of All Students, 2) Inquiry-based/Constructivist Learning, 3) Content-Area Literacy Instruction, 4) Implementing IEPs. The other two Wednesdays of this 3-week cycle will be spent working together as an entire staff or in grade-level teams. We are excited about this new model of distributed leadership and professional development!

At this week's Board meeting, the Board approved our 2014-2015 Curriculum Guide, which you can find on our website. Included in our Curriculum Guide is information about our academic programs, the curricula we use for different content areas and grade levels, the units that will be taught each quarter for all grades, and a wealth of other information. If you have not already reviewed this document, I encourage you to do so.

Also, at our Board meeting, we heard from one of our long-time teachers, Susan Sailors, who will soon be moving on to a different school. She shared with the Board that her difficult decision was a financial one, and she suggested that, to support teacher retention, the Board reexamine the salary and benefits packages offered to teachers, consider allocating more funds to curriculum and instructional supplies, and provide teachers and students with more access to technology. Her love for Paideia was clearly apparent, and we thank her for publicly sharing her thoughts. We will continue our conversations on these issues during our next Human Resources Committee meeting (Tuesday, August 26th at 5:00pm).

Paideia Academy is a wonderful school of choice. As our authorizer noted in our charter renewal letter, we are a good school on our way to being a <u>great</u> school. We will continue our successes and progress by working together, communicating openly, and seeking to understand all perspectives. We have put in place multiple forums for conversation, and I encourage you to take advantage of any of them. If you have any questions or concerns, or you would just like to learn more about me, please feel free to join me at our first Coffee with the Director on September 8th at 9:00am.

Thank you for all of your support during our wonderful first few weeks of school! I look forward to seeing you at tonight's all-school dance!

News From The Board

The Governance and Long-Range Planning Committee met on Tuesday and discussed the Safe and Supportive Schools Policy, which recent Minnesota legislation requires all schools to implement. The committee did not complete its review and discussion of the draft policy, but hopes to complete that work at its next meeting.

The Board also met on Tuesday evening. Three new board members were elected, Peter Thorpe (parent), Susan Kelnberger (teacher), and Ashley Gillingham (community member and former Paideia teacher and interim director). The Board also approved the 2014-2015 Curriculum Guide. Paideia Academy will also be participating in the KIDSPO Kids & Family Expo on September 27, 2014 at the Eagan Community Center. We will be one of only two schools that will have an exhibition booth at the event and should get some fantastic exposure with families in the community. We are looking for staff and parent volunteers to take a shift at the booth. Please contact Board member Peter Thorpe if you are willing to spend an hour or two helping out!

This coming **Tuesday**, **August 26th**, the **HR committee** will meet at **5 p.m.** and will be reviewing the HR-related annual goals for the strategic plan, including issues related to teacher retention, as well as some HR-related policies. At **6 p.m.** on Tuesday, the **Finance committee** will be meeting to address the school's budget and finances, and may also begin discussions regarding finance-related teacher retention issues. Please attend!

Finally, Heidi Johnson, chair of the Academic Excellence Committee and I met with the Lead Teachers this past week to start the process of talking to the staff about teacher satisfaction. Our next steps will be to meet with the teaching teams and then small groups of teachers outside of their teaching teams.

From the Classrooms!

Kindergarten:

Math: We will practice writing numbers one through five, as well as the number word and filling in a ten-frame.

Language Arts: Sight Word: see Sight Word Reader: I See We will learn the color blue.

Science: We will learn about the five senses. We will do coconut science.

Social Studies: We will continue our unit on citizenship. We will continue to focus on learning school routines, as well as what it means to be a good citizen.

Advisory: We will continue to learn about kindergarten classroom routines. Last week, we read the story <u>Howard B. Wigglebottom Learns About Bullies.</u> In this story, it talks about the phrase "be brave! Be bold! A teacher must be told." Please review this phrase at home with your student to remind them the importance of telling a teacher if something is happening that they don't like. This week, we will talk about Rule #2: "We will try to help students that are bullied."

Announcements: You will notice that most of our newsletter is the same as last week. We were in the process of finishing up new growth assessments for the year and did not anticipate the amount of time it would take.

Inspirations: Happy Birthday James H! (8/26) We did some fine-motor stations this week and it was fun to watch the kindergartners explore the different activities and build up their finger-muscles.

First Grade:

Math: We will finish number bond centers. We will take the chapter 2 test. We will begin chapter 3, addition facts to 10.

Language Arts: We will work in Daily 5 centers. We will write about what we like to do at recess. We will begin working on spelling with Words Their Way.

Science: We will learn about what different animals eat and the food chain.

Social Studies: We will begin learning about the 7 continents. We will make books about our city, state, country and continent.

Advisory: We will do the third lesson in the Olweus program. We will learn about organization skills, for example keeping our desks organized and clean.

Announcements: The first homework packet of the school year went home on Friday, August 22nd. Homework is due the following Thursday (August 28th). Every part of the packet must be completed and turned in on time to earn full points.

Inspirations: Annika, Christopher, Addison, Sophia B., Gabriella and Johnny all retired clips this week! Way to go!!!

Second Grade:

Math: We will practice reading, writing, and representing whole numbers to 1,000, including using base ten blocks and writing numbers in words (five hundred sixty-two), standard form (562), and expanded form (500+60+2). We will also count by 1s, 10s, and 100s.

Language Arts: We will continue to practice building stamina for read to self, listen to reading, and word work. We will also do poem of the week and learn about parts of speech (proper nouns and nouns, adjectives, and verbs). On Thursday we will have our first spelling test, and on Friday we will get out new words in our Words their Way curriculum.

Science: We will learn about the seasonal cycle (Core Knowledge).

Social Studies: We will finish our maps units and learn about timelines and make our own personal timeline.

Advisory: We will do our third Olweus meeting and discuss the rule "We will try to help students who are being bullied."

Math: We will be working on rounding/estimation, factors and multiples, and prime and composite numbers.

Language Arts: We will work on characters and setting in reading group. In writing we are learning about the 6 traits, first is big ideas.

Science: We will start research on a virus poster project.

Social Studies: We will study how humans affect the geography.

Inspirations: Our first library trip was fun, the children's librarian welcomed us when we got there!

Fifth Grade:

Math: Next week in fifth grade we will be moving on from multi-digit division into exponents and order of operations. The 5th graders have been doing a great job with both the interactive notebook and the stations, so we will be using both of these activities to learn about these topics. Fifth graders will also begin to receive homework more regularly.

Language Arts: Students continue to work toward improving their writing, reading, and vocabulary skills. We have also completed several lessons in our "Daybooks of Critical Reading and Writing" to help us become more critical readers and more thoughtful writers. Please have your students bring their library cards next week so I can make copies to have at school. We will be visiting the library soon. Reading calendars are due September 2nd.

Science: Students are learning how experiments are conducted using the scientific method.

Social Studies: Students will learn about Meso-American civilizations next week. This is the Aztec, Inca, and Mayan cultures.

Advisory: Students will participate in Olweus lesson 3. We will also start looking at organization and missing work.

Announcements: Mr. Noah Stommel will be joining Paideia on Monday, August 25 as our new Social Studies teacher.

Audubon: All permission slips are due on **Monday, August 25.** We are still in need of many more chaperones. Please consider joining us!

Inspirations: It was inspiring to see students be able to identify places where they could use language arts skills in their futures. The fifth graders really enjoyed using manipulatives when working with different division topics!



Sixth Grade:

- **Math:** Next week in sixth grade, we will be moving on from greatest common factor an least common multiple to fractions, mixed numbers, and decimals. At the beginning of the year, many of the students said they were most looking forward to working with fractions, so I am excited to see their engagement and enthusiasm towards this topic. We will continue to use our interactive notebooks and stations to understand these concepts.
- **Language Arts:** Students continue to master identifying elements of short stories. Soon we will begin work on writing our own short stories. Next week, students will be reading the short story, "Barney," by Will Stanton. Reading calendars are due September 2nd.
- **Science**: Sixth Graders are learning the difference between mass and weight, and exploring using measurement in experiments.
- **Social Studies:** Since we've used a zombie apocalypse to learn about geography we are going to bridge to current events and read about the Ebola outbreak in Africa. In addition, we are going to do some persuasive writing about disaster preparedness. We are making a major push to incorporate literacy in content areas, so a lot of reading and writing, speaking and listening will be taking place in Social Studies.
- **Advisory:** Students will participate in Olweus lesson 3. We will also start looking at organization and missing work.
- **Announcements:** Mr. Noah Stommel will be joining Paideia on Monday, August 25 as our new Social Studies teacher.

Seventh Grade:

2nd Grade/3rd Grade
