On August 26th, the Minnesota Department of Education released schools' MCA results to the public. These test scores are used both to measure individual students' progress and performance in Math (3rd-8th grades), Reading (3rd-8thgrades), and Science (5th & 8th grades) as well as assess the overall effectiveness of schools. In the Paideia Academy charter are outlined long-term academic goals for our school, and it is compared to these goals that we must measure our school's success. Based on our data, we certainly have reasons to celebrate, while we also have clear areas for growth. Below is a short summary of our results. So, what has Paideia already put in place for the 2014-2015 school year to increase the percentage of students who Meet or Exceed Standards on MCA tests?

- Increased rigor of DDI assessments Paideia has worked with a consultant from Friends of Education to strengthen our Reading and Math DDI assessments and train our teachers how to use the MCA Test Specifications, Depths of Knowledge, Lexile levels, and question types to create more rigorous interim assessments across all content areas.
- **Develop individual student learning goals** This year, to improve student performance and to be used as part of our teacher evaluation process, teachers will use DDI pre-test data to develop individual learning goals for each student on an end-of-year DDI post-test. The goal of this strategy is to better understand each student's strengths and challenges and develop instructional strategies to support each individual.
- Full-Day Kindergarten This is the first year that Paideia Academy has
 had full days of instruction for all Kindergarten students. By increasing the
 instructional time for our youngest students, we will be able to strengthen
 their foundational math and reading skills and ensure that we meet our
 Reading Well by Third Grade legislative initiative and support greater
 student success on MCAs and in the higher grades.

- 10 periods of Math and Language Arts in K-2 Our longer literacy and math blocks allow teachers greater opportunity to differentiate for diverse learners and use assessment more meaningfully to support instruction.
- **Title I program** Title I is a federally funded program designed to provide financial resources to schools to support proficiency on standardized tests. Based on parent and teacher feedback from last year, we have changed our Title I program to take place on Mondays after school throughout the year (instead of during breaks, as we did last year). We use the Daily 5 model to support our students in Math and Reading, and we use an online program, Study Island, for pre- and post-assessments, as well as the basis for our student learning goals and groupings.
- **Special Education** To better support our students with IEPs, the Special Education team is working together and collaborating with general education teachers and administration to develop strategies to assist <u>all</u> students in meeting the standards of their grade level, developing IEP goals that will support their success in the future, and providing specialized instruction, when needed, to support students in meeting those goals.

During the summer professional development week, our teachers analyzed individual student data to better understand the strengths and needs of each student, then, this Wednesday, they analyzed our summary data alongside data from Minnesota state as a whole and the averaged data from our comparison schools in District 196 (see above). Based on the data, each teacher was asked to brainstorm both immediate and long-term strategies for various members of the school community to implement in addition to the above approaches in order to support individual and school-wide improvement. The vast majority of these strategies will take place at school, but we must also ask for your help in supporting your children's learning at home. Soon you will be receiving information on activities your child can do at home to strengthen his/her Reading, Math, and/or Science skills to improve his/her performance on MCA tests.

I look forward to continuing to work with multiple members of the community to support increased individual, grade-level, and school-wide progress and performance on MCA tests. Please join us at the next Academic Excellence Committee meeting on September 9th at 6:00pm to join us in a discussion about what else the Paideia Academy community can do to support increased MCA scores as well as what we are doing to support the World's Best Workforce. We look forward to seeing you there!

Counselor Corner

August's Character Trait is Self-Control!

When kids melt down in the middle of a crowded store, at a holiday dinner with extended family, or at home, it can be extremely frustrating. But parents can help kids learn self-control and teach them how to respond to situations without just acting on impulse. Teaching self-control skills is one of the most important things that parents can do for their kids because these are some of the most important skills for success later in life.

Help Kids Learn Self Control:

By learning self-control, kids can make appropriate decisions and respond to stressful situations in ways that can yield positive outcomes. For example, if you say that you're not serving ice cream until after dinner, your child may cry, plead, or even scream in the hopes that you will give in. But with self-control, your child can understand that a temper tantrum means you'll take away the ice cream for good and that it's wiser to wait patiently.

Here are a few suggestions on how to help kids learn to control their behavior:

As kids enter school, they're better able to understand the idea of consequences and that they can choose good or bad behavior. It may help your child to imagine a stop sign that must be obeyed and think about a situation before responding. Encourage your child to walk away from a frustrating situation for a few minutes to cool off instead of having an outburst. Older kids usually better understand their feelings. Encourage them to think about what's causing them to lose control and then analyze it. Explain that sometimes the situations that are upsetting at first don't end up being so awful. Urge kids to take time to think before responding to a situation.

<u>Kindergarten</u>

Math: We will practice writing numbers six through eight, as well as the number word and filling in a tenframe. We will also asses writing numbers 1-5.

Inspirations: It has been inspiring to see the kindergartners gain their independence when coming into school in the morning. We love watching them unpack their blue folders and water bottles, come into the room, move their monkey on the SmartBoard, and get started on their morning work ALL BY THEMSELVES! Way to go independent kindergartners!

First Grade

Math: We will work on writing number sentences and math facts to 10. We will work in centers on Thursday and Friday.

Language Arts: We will work in Daily 5 centers. We will continue working on spelling words from Words Their Way. We will begin assessing the Dolch Sight Word lists.

Science: We will finish learning about the food chain. We will begin learning about life cycles.

Social Studies: We will continue learning about the 7 continents. We will learn the 4 oceans. We will practice coloring maps.

Advisory: We will do the third lesson in the Olweus program. We will make a list of ways to be kind. We will practice being kind to one another.

Announcements: If you would like a behavior calendar to show the color your child ended each day on, please send a purple folder to your child's classroom teacher. To find the detailed explanation of how the clip chart works please look in the Curriculum Guide under Behavior Management.

Second Grade
