You speak of my experience; I have so little of value to my own satisfaction, that it would not be of any benefit to others. My work is in the experimental stage and hope to be able to say something in a year or two.

The past winter brought home to us the necessity of protecting our trees especially the Wealthy, Osage and N.W. Gr. I think that subject should receive special discussion. One of the Underwoods should lead.

I will add Five Hundred Dollars to the \$1000⁰⁰ prize for a tree in hardiness equal to the Osage, but equal to the Wealthy and keeping quality equal to the Malinda. Sincerely yours
