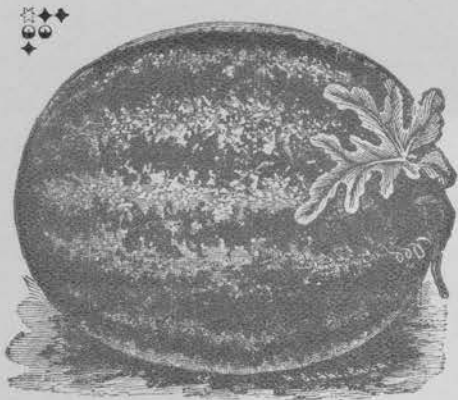

I have for many years known
and appreciated the society and
I am aquited with some of the
members. I have taken active
part in Public life and will
fare I belong to the Grain
growers association which
is now dead and cost me \$50⁰⁰
I have read Farm Stocks Home
for a number of years and got
a good deal of information in it

I am an old settler in the State came here with my parents in 1858 and have seen all the hardships of frontier life. Escaped the Indians in 1862 my mother and one brother was killed on the New Sweden Prairie in Nicollet county and Buildings all burned everything ruined but soon came good times again with plenty of money for a few years but came a decline and everything goes like the crab backwards money is only in Banks and not with the farmers I can not at present raise enough money to become a member of your Society with a farm of 240 acres and 12 good horses 25 cattle nearly 60 hogs and lots of property all in fair shape

I may become a member if I live long enough.

The State Agricultural School is doing a good work also the Farmers Institute which was here a short time ago and had good attendance.

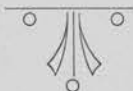
