

I grow a few vines for our own use say 30 or 40
& do not wish to go to the expense of a sprayer
could I not put it on the vines (when is the
right time) with a fine rose on my watering pot
& what is the best spray to use. I grow Concord,
Delaware, Masses Early & several others this will
be the first year for fruit if not frosted late in

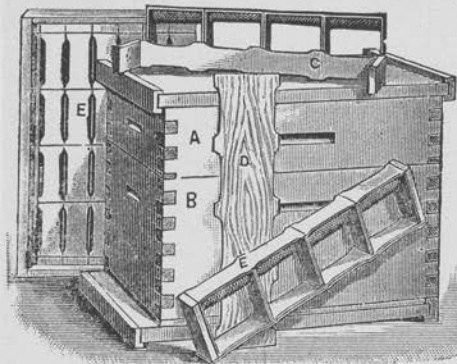
