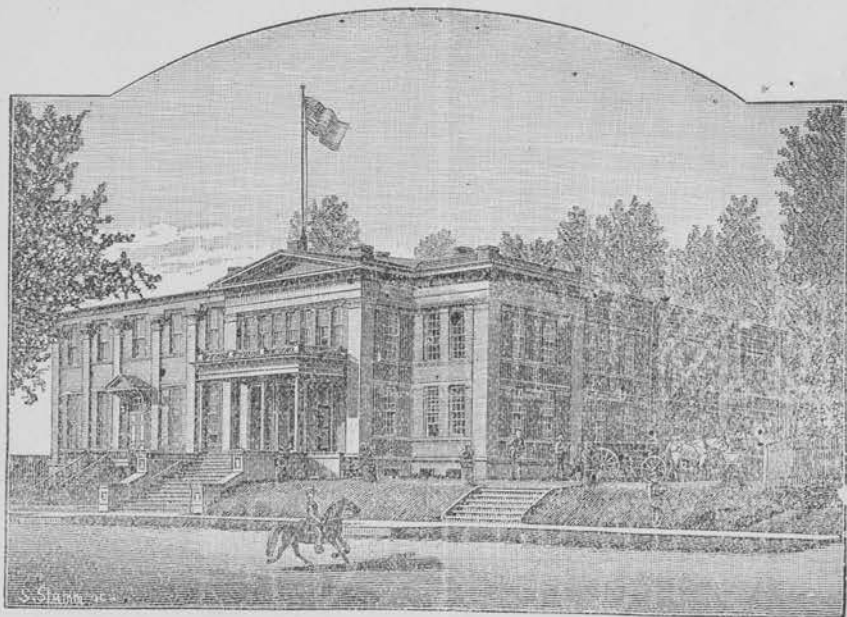

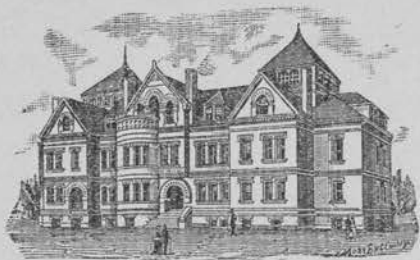

TO THE PRESIDENTS OF AMERICAN STATE HORTICULTURAL SOCIETIES:

DEAR SIR: You are probably aware of the able and useful and much needed work in Pomology done by the Department of Agriculture at Washington under Prof. H. E. VANDEMAN, who had charge of the Division of Pomology from its inception in 1886 until June, 1893. You are no doubt equally informed of the present unsatisfactory work, or lack of work, in the same Division and the reason therefor.

It is believed that the change of administration on March 4th may entail some changes in the Department of Agriculture and we, as horticulturists and officers of Horticultural Societies, are interested in securing a change that will lead to more efficient management of the work relating to pomology. Many of us who know PROF. VANDEMAN personally, and who have been familiar with his work as Pomologist of the Department of Agriculture believe him to be the best equipped man for the position, and think the interests of American fruit growers will be best served by his re-appointment. So far as known no complaint has ever been made against PROF. VANDEMAN'S ability, probity or judgment.

In order to bring our wishes before the new Secretary of Agriculture in time to secure a fair hearing we wish to secure the indorsement of PROF. VANDEMAN by the Presidents and Secretaries of every State Horticultural Society. To this end I have prepared the annexed memorial reciting PROF. VANDEMAN'S claims to be presented to the new Secretary soon after the latter takes charge.

Will you sign this memorial and secure if possible the signature of the Secretary of your Society?

Return paper to me and I will forward to proper officer. Please give this your immediate attention.




