The list of ornamental trees and shrubs hardy in Minnesota, prepared by my friends Messrs Nutter and Moyer is interesting and valuable. I think quite a number of additional species could be safely added to it. I notice that *Syringa pekinensis*, (the Japanese weeping lilac) is omitted, also *Rhodotypos kerrioides*, both of which I am quite sure are hardy. If I had time I would take this matter up a little more carefully and add to the list such varieties as my experience in Minnesota has led me to look upon as hardy. Just now I am extremely busy trying to get my plans in shape for spring.
