Our Society is in bad shape, and has always been so as we receive no aid in any way from the state, and have never been able to get enough from membership fees to be able to publish reports. Upon one occasion, the State Board of Agr. gave them \$500 and they did make three reports, in three dis-connected years. I send you these under another cover. It does not receive the support that it should, from either the people nor the state, though they have asked every legislature for the last twenty years for help. I have only been in the state for a short time myself, and am anxious to make it amount to something, but the outlook is not bright. Would like to know to what extent your state aids the Society.

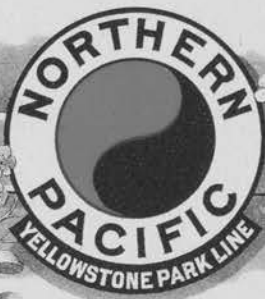

Answering your letter of October 22nd.

I take pleasure in advising you that for the meeting named above we will make ^{Superior} rate of a fare and one-third on the certificates plan from points in Minnesota, also from West subject to a total attendance of 100 or more paying full railroad fare of 50 cents or more going, under the following conditions.

Parties attending this meeting will purchase one way tickets at starting point, not more than three days prior to the opening of the meeting, take receipt therefor on form "SPECIAL RECEIPT AND CERTIFICATE", with which all of our agents are supplied. These certificates when properly filled out showing full fare paid going, not more than three days prior to the date of meeting, signed by the Secretary, showing that the holder has been in attendance at the meeting, and stamped by the joint agent appointed for the purpose, showing that the attendance has been sufficient, will be honored by our agents at St. Paul or Minneapolis up to and including three days after the close--(Sunday not included)--- for tickets to return to starting point in the territory named above at one-third fare, with a minimum charge of 25 cents.

We shall look to you to see that all interested are properly instructed as to the method of obtaining the reduced rate returning, as we will not hold ourselves responsible for the failure of those attending to secure the reduction owing to not understanding the proper method of obtaining the reduction.
