 I am somewhat under the
 weather with Rheumatism
 myself & Wm. Pfender were
 coming also he to a bad
 cold a day or two before,
 and could not come. The
 meeting was a grand success
 in every respect,
 Well I am grafting all of 16000
 to 20000 Apple Root Grafts this
 winter and it keeps me very
 busy most of the winter

But I overdoating stick to
 it and expect to ~~the the see~~
 the end. So fore I have
 6800 ready. If everything will
 come my way I shall graft
 25000 to 30000. Next winter
 My trees in my Orchard have
 done very good the ^{past} ~~current~~
 summer. I have bin
 to quite a number of different
 Nurseries last summer &
 fall but none are kept
 as clean ~~as~~ and the trees
 that they are growing will
 please the public but not
 me. I want to grow trees with a
 low crown not over 12 to 16
 or 18 in. I think I sold all of
 500 trees of my own growing

last fall and not a tree
 left my place less than
 with 3 limbs & the most 5 limbs
 They look altogether different
 than the ones I buy of other
 nurseries, you know that I
 still believe in a New
 York tree they can grow
 a much nicer tree than
 we can. This was my dear,
 entitled I am growing trees.
 myself. And on that I believe
 that I shall grow trees just a
 well branched as they can in
 N. Y. also they must look just as smooth
 If I can not come to the next see.
 meeting I shall send a tree also
