We can not boast of having done ~~very~~ great things as a club as yet, but ["]the school house ground has been graded and seeded to lawn ~~seed~~ this summer. next spring we intend to plant shade trees, evergreens, shrubs and flowers, around the school house, and perhaps it will be an object lesson in horticulture, and improvement of the home yard for this neighborhood." let me say that most of the members of our club ordered some fruit and shade trees from Mr Keays, while he was here. 
