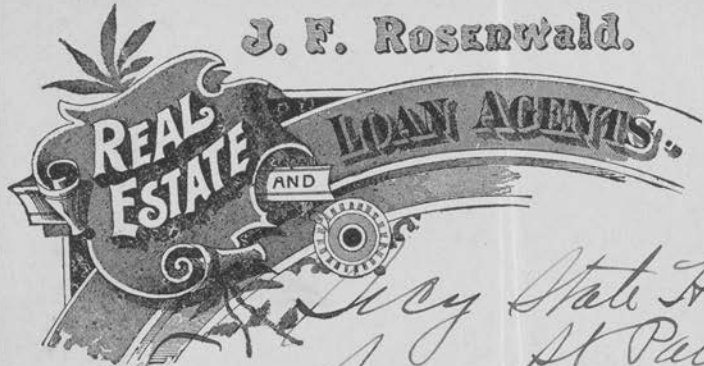

I am going to send in a list of Apples trees, and Plums which I am going to set out next spring. as I like to get all the experience I can in planting, how deep, and how far apart in the row, and mulching and cultivation. Is there a book out that will give all about this matter. I intend to plant on the south north side of a grove, and the land slopes to the west - good black soil on top and clay underneath.

And the plums on the east side of the apple trees which is on a more level.

I have been setting out a few trees ever year. I have about seventy apple trees growing, and half of them are bearing

^{some} already. They are planted surrounded by a grove. These trees that are bearing already are Wealthy Duchess. Longfield One, Minnesota. With only No 20. The Longfield does the best of any so far. I have two Bramptons which stood nine year already and have not bore an apples. The trees look healthy about 10 ft high branch well. they had a little blight on them last spring which I cut out. The surrounding trees are bearing, why are not these two bearing with as good a care.



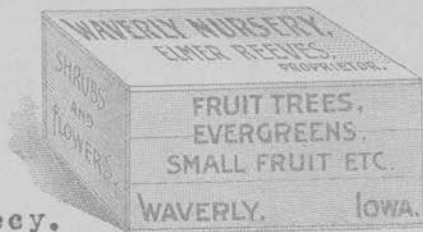
