an advantage over a number
of other fruits, and that
is its ability to hold its
fruit in wind storms
half of my Plums and apple
were torn from the trees
by exceptionally severe storms
yet my Bokara ^{No} 3 trees
did not loose a fruit

free from blemish will exhibit
if not it will be no use
to send or bring damaged fruit
