Dear Sir :-

In reply to your favor of Feb. 12th, asking if I had any photographs of fruit suitable to illustrate the monthly magazine, will say that I have a photo I had taken here of a plate of the (4) Wolf River Apples, the same as was exhibited by a Mr Getchell, one of the proprietors of the Gideon orchard at Excelsior and I have been expecting to go down and take it to you ever since receiving your letter, but something has prevented. I now intend to go down next week and will take it down. It was too large and cumbersome to send by mail, being on heavy card board about 9 X 12 in size and might have got broken in the mail.

I had supposed that our agricultural department at Washington, was doing something in the way of encouraging fruit growers and in forestry but I cannot strike the bureau from which any information of value comes. I first wrote to Sec. Wilson, and he referred me to Mr. Galloway, Chief of "Bureau of Plant Industry," and enclosed his letter in answer to my inquiry.

I had supposed that the Department of Agriculture were distributing foreign seeds of fruit and evergreens but am somewhat disappointed to find it otherwise.
