2% Formalin or Formaldehyde  
20% Alcohol  
78% Water.  $\text{F}$

Pick fruit when fully ripe and cover  
with the above

He put out about 7 acres of strawberries  
About how deep should we cover here.  
The morning of the 1<sup>st</sup> a severe frost  
myself, gardens on low land over

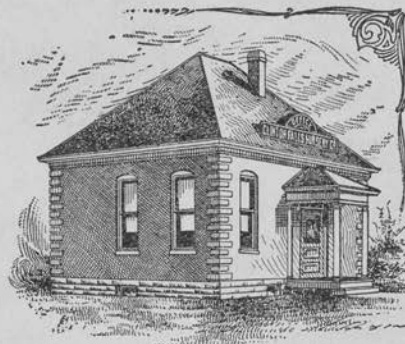

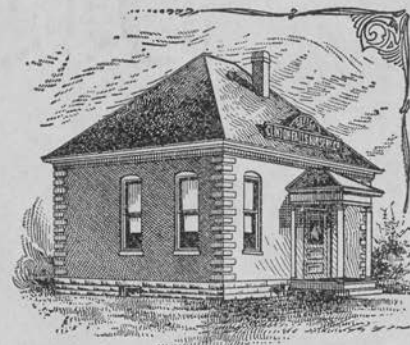

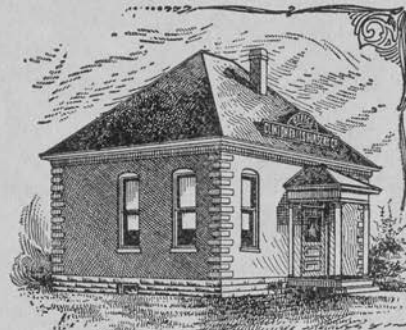
