24 pt cases a day

Dear fellow member:

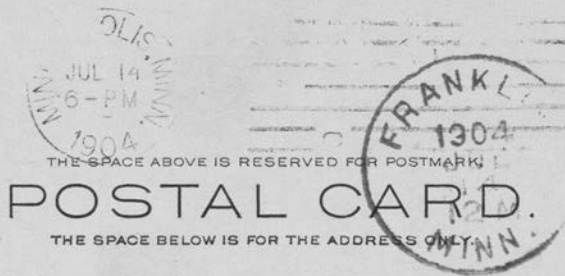
Excuse delay, as I have been

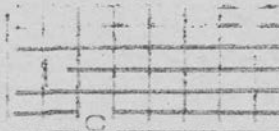

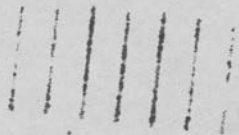
