These apples are of fine quality and I will be glad to ship them to you ~~for~~ if you can use them in the quantity named. I have not enough selected apples of one variety to fill a barrel. Please let me know if you want these apples and send me directions as how, and when to ship. You will understand that these apples are for the St. Louis Exposition.
