Last year I had a few apples left till the 4 of July.

It is 12 years old and has bore fruit for 6 years. One year there was about 2 bu on it

It has never blighted ~~or~~ or winter killed and the fruit sticks well to the tree in strong wind.

Last spring I planted ~~100~~ 1100 apple
grafts and some plums.

I have got 4 seedling trees (age 20)
No 2 and 4 I don't think is worth any

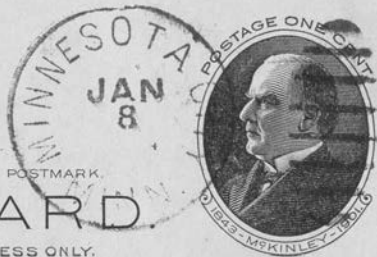

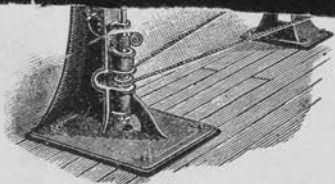

A W Lathorn Dear Sir yours of 23 Dec rec today I have read it over times and I think I could not have done much as well as you have done. I was inclined to think Mr Redpath had forgotten me when I got to Waterville wanting to have my feet comfortable I bought a pair cloth shoes felt soles a new pair No 12 Ante Over shoes to wear outside the cloth shoes the felts was so large that the Over shoes proved to small so I put them in one of the boxes. they was \$1.50 but Goudy's Broom. after finding from you that J A Howell of Hammond had such a lot North Western Greening I sent over had him bring one several lbs cions a bundle 4 in through as I intended to top with these on crab stock in the Spring believing they would do well in this way and such a good way to get choice fruit (3 years) then I gathered up all the thin paper to wrap apples again so that the contents of the boxes was to me worth at least \$3.00 the 2 boxes cost 32 cts one could be used again I of course would much rather have the boxes than the \$3.00 and now find the entire fault is with the Express as on their receipt and I feel very grateful to you and if the co do not give the boxes and pay for them I want to pay you for all this trouble And would you to thank Mr Redpath for making it possible to learn the boxes on the way. I want you to get acquainted with my Brother Dr Dwight Kenney he has lived in Ia who more than 20 years. was Orchard Inspector for the state and has was Orchard of Concordia that I sent him that never had a blight

on it and was the most productive I have ever seen
their climate got colder than ours so below you the con tell you
of a punker tree that is alone and good today that when I visited
him 15 yrs ago I profited on cow stock and is the only one left
since the climate killed all the rest then is when I got it installed
into me that here in Minn there is a great untired Possibil-
ities that must be worked out by some one and it will
