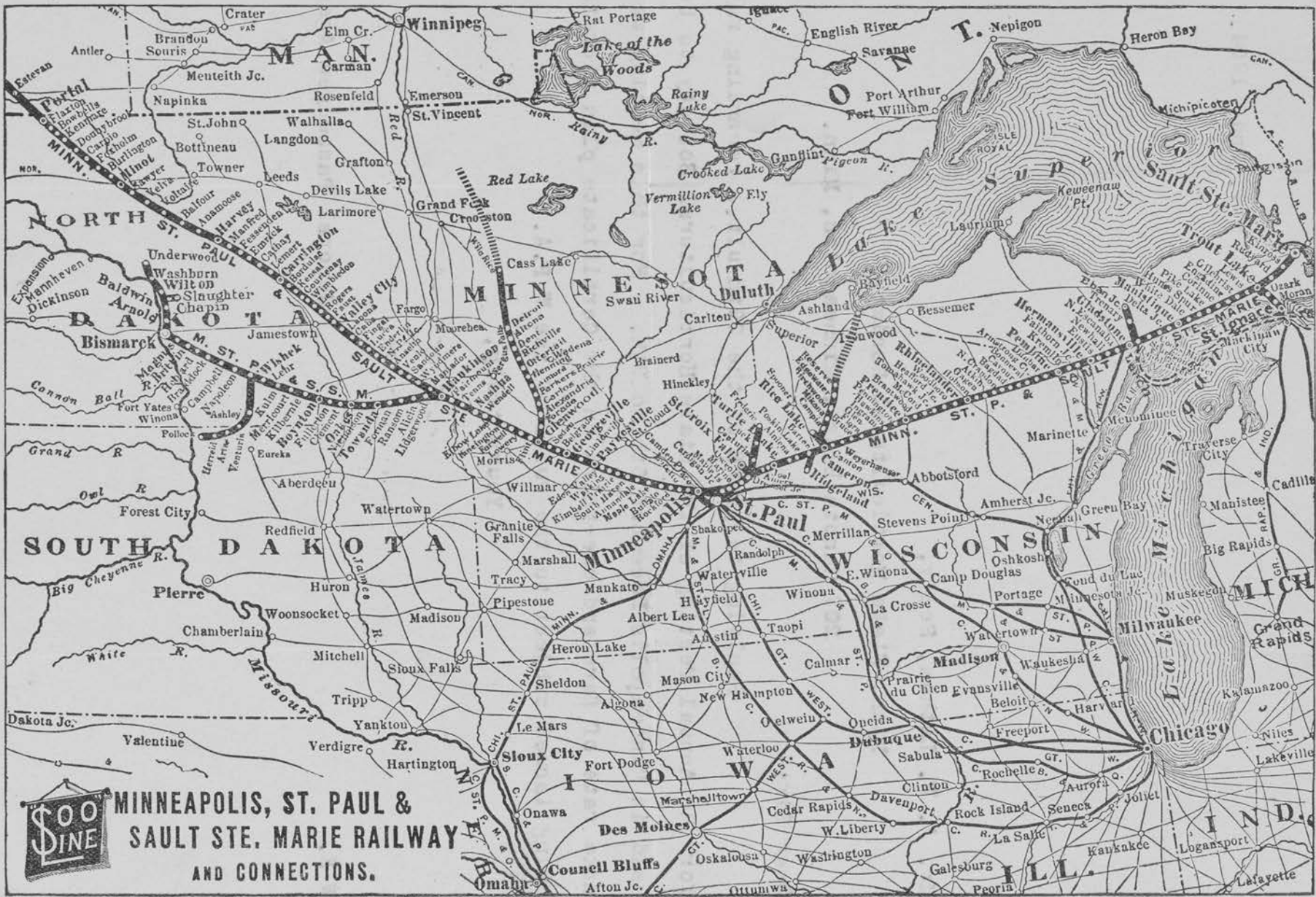

Dear Sir - By this mail I send you two specimens of *Asplenium* grown in Duluth. 1 Duchess of Q - 1. Maltby. they were taken from trees. procured from The J. W. M. Co. 5 years since - planted in Spring of 1900.

It is 2^d year of bearing. Trees are about 3" Caliper - low branched and about 9 or 10 feet in height at topmost measure, have received no very especial care - except liberal mulching - and - garden cultivation, i.e. all ground dug over or cultivated. have had no special protection - from birds etc. I send them to you that

others may know that - all of the Early maturing varieties of apples can be successfully and easily grown in this belt.

In yours of 22nd inst. will say the article will be ready for you, on time. I will try and present it in person. if business or will permit, us to little. there are no peccolianties in our methods here. they are based on Prof's Loomis - and Bailey's - teachings - and New England and Central New York - experimencs. Loomis we will do the best we can.


