2^d other was some what-wilted, but the flavor was
still good in both. I have two trees of the same
variety in bearing this season.

This seems to be a valuable winter apple
The fruit is as large as the wealthy and somewhat
similar in color but of a different flavor and
much firmer.

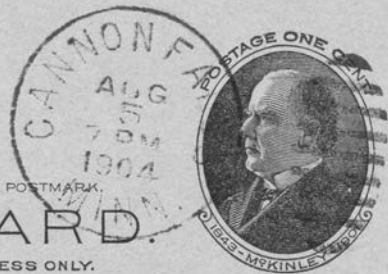
