Dear Sir: As Vice Pres. for the
7th dist. I should be pleased to have
your instructions in regard to
the best way of gathering information
for the annual report.

I send you by mail today a box containing
3 apples of a seedling variety on my
father's grounds. The apples have
been kept in an ordinary cellar
in a basket without any rapping.
They are a little shrunken now but
otherwise are in good condition for
this time of year. The flavor I do
not think is quite as good now
as before they were any shrunken.
Of course they are rather small for
standard apples; the tree seems to
be perfectly hardy as it is about

10 years old and has never killed back during any winter, so far it has been entirely free from blight and is in a very healthy condition.

At this date all kinds of fruit trees and plants are in fine condition. apple trees that did not bear so heavy ~~a~~ last year are well loaded with fruit buds, and if season is favorable I expect a good crop - Strawberries are looking very nice.
