

Graduated in Botany at the Shaw School of Botany in connection with the Botanical Gardens at St. Louis, Missouri; then specialized in Horticulture under Dr. J. C. Whitten at Missouri University.

Employed one year as Local Superintendent of Planting Work at St. Louis for the landscape firm of Frederick Olmstead & Company.

Post graduate work under Professor John Craig for Master's Degree in Horticulture at the Iowa State College in 1902, and elected Assistant in Horticulture at this institution.

The year following elected Assistant Professor of Horticulture. Since the resignation of Professor H. C. Price, who left to become Dean of Agriculture at Ohio State University, *he* ~~has~~ been the acting head of the department. At a recent meeting of the Board of Trustees, Professor S. A. Beach, of the New York Experiment Station, was elected head of the department, and Mr. Erwin made Associate Professor.

Professor Beach is regarded as one of the foremost workers of America in the field of Horticulture. His coming means much to northwestern Horticulture, and the securing of a man of wide experience and reputation to lead the work has received the cordial support of Professor Erwin.

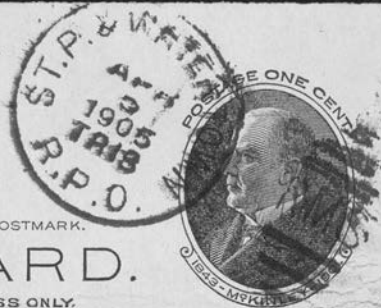

Dear Sir, I suppose I ought to have stopped the Horticulturist at the end of the year but I am very unwilling to do without it or while the dollar is out of the question now I hope to get it before the year is gone. My partner was caught by a falling tree last August, one leg broken in two places the other very badly bruised & he is still very lame. Of course that makes it more difficult for us but I am delighted with my new home, or what will be a home in a few years.

We have had a delightful winter, I have worked out of doors almost every day, stayed in two or three days because an inch or so of snow isn't so pleasant to work in & there was plenty to do inside. I have been making garden all this month, have something over a hundred fruit trees set. The deer destroy our small fruits but I hope to have some berries this year.

I miss the Horticultural Society & the public

library. Aside from these I prefer the Douglas Co  
mountains to Minneapolis. The only faults I  
have to find with this country is too little sunshine  
& bad roads. The first will improve when the  
lumbermen remove the fir trees & the last when  
we replace a few more wet feet with  
eastern people & that is being done quite  
rapidly. We are the last house on the trail,  
nearly five miles from P.O. & over twenty  
from Roseburg, the only town near us, but  
I am slowly making a home that I intend shall  
be the most beautiful in Douglas Co. You see  
I am quite ambitious enough to be a member  
of Minnesota Horticultural Society & I'll find a  
dollar to send you before the year ends.

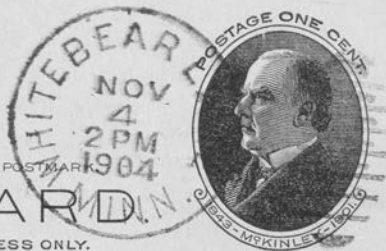
