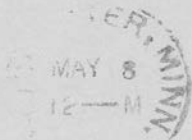

Am pretty well since being at that "Breeder's Meeting" at Lincoln. Met your Mr. Reynolds there. Hope that you are well and that your work is opening auspiciously at the opening days of the New Year. I was badly discouraged in the early fall, more so than at any time in my life. But the many appreciative words that I have received this year for the work that I have done, has helped to brighten the way. I never did like

palaver, or flattery; but none of
us are insensible to just and proper
recognition. I believe the one thing that
hurt me as much as any thing that
I have met in all my horticultural
experience was when I saw Mr. Giddens
and the last time - came into your hort-
icultural meeting in rags and tattered
garments. Some how I cant forget it.
Please pardon this reference to it.
