In answer to your letter of the 22nd, I think your idea of publishing the list of premiums in the Sept. number of the Horticulturist is an excellent one.

You wrote some time ago about premiums for canned plums, which Mr. Wedge had suggested. That would be a good thing and would undoubtedly stimulate the planting of plums. If we do this, why not also offer premiums on other kinds of canned fruits that are out of season in winter, such as the different kinds of berries, cherries, crabs etc. each exhibit to be accompanied by the recipe used in preserving, the same as in plums. Perhaps it is too late for anything of this kind this year, but if deemed advisable it could be taken up later.

We shall offer 50 trees 5 to 6 feet, 3 years old from the following varieties, Longfield, Striped Anis, Peerless, Repka Malenka, Yellow Sweet, Cross #413, Striped Winter-- to be used as a premium -- for you to place on anything you think best to help out the show at the Winter Meeting.

Your program is so good that it is hard to think how it can be improved upon.
