My Dear Mr. Latham:

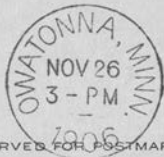

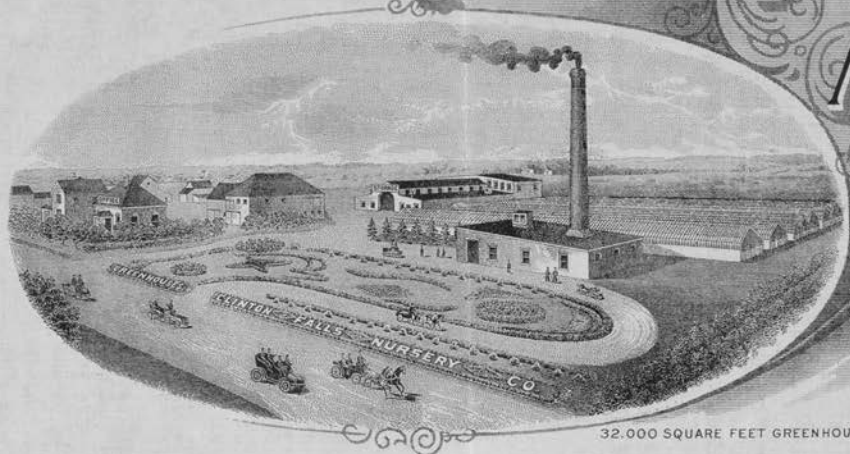

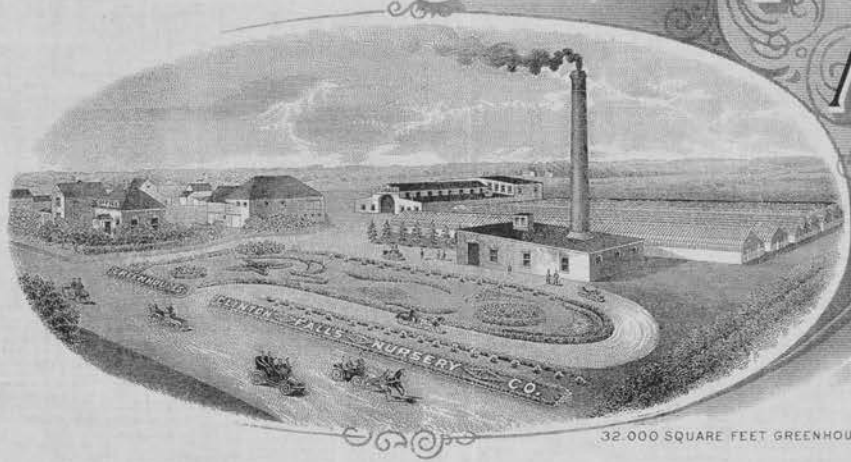

Dear Friend:-

Yours of Nov. 2nd arrived when I was deep in my political campaign and consequently was laid aside with some other unanswered mail and I just dug it up this morning. In reply will say that I will gladly make a report of the trial station of which I am sure and will be ready to give a two or three minute talk touching the most important points of the report.

I regret exceedingly that I will have no fruit from the Experimental Station to display this year. We had a fine lot of specimens packed and boxed in our cold storage building and I supposed they were perfectly safe and all right until the other day when I went to look them over and found them nearly all gone. Our men around the place had evidently broken into the boxes and eaten them. I do not know when I felt so badly about anything and it never occurred to me that it would be necessary to keep them under lock and key but I can see now where I was to blame, for you know that when 150 to 200 men and boys learn there are apples any where on the premises each one will take a sneak for them when they get hungry and they don't last long. If I had only sent the ones displayed at the State Fair over to the cold storage building in Minneapolis, it would have been all right but I was so anxious to have something better that I fell down completely. Well it cannot be helped and I have learned a lesson and will know better next time.
