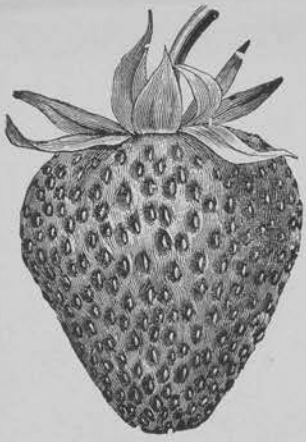

Friend Latham:-

In answer to your letter regarding a change in the spaces given to advertizers in the Horticulturist, I would be in favor of dividing the space equally and limiting each advertizer to one space.

The ads. on the outside cover occupy 9 inches. I should recommend that this be divided into spaces of one inch and one column in width. This arrangement would accomodate eighteen on each page, all would have the same sized space and as you say, would be on an equal footing. Something of this kind will be perfectly agreeable to us.

I suppose the present advertizers will have the same general positions when the spaces are re-arranged. We should like to retain the upper space in the left hand column of the back page of cover, which is a portion of that we have always occupied.

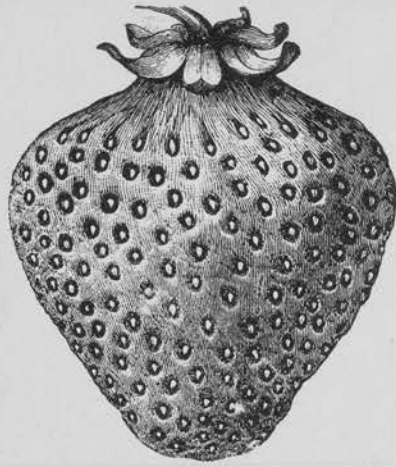
