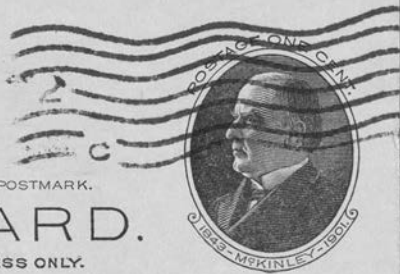

Dear Sir;—

I thank you for your card received today in regard to the apple I sent you recently. I SCARCELY believe, however that it can be the Northern Spy as the Spy comes late into bearing and these trees of my neighbor's are but eight years of age and have borne two crops.

The Spy has more color and a flavor that I believe I could detect in any company, and none of this apple attain the size of the best quality Spies.

This neighbor says he bought the trees of an agent for an Illinois nursery who called them Baxter and claimed his people were the sole propagators. The trees were sold at \$1.00 each. Other nurserymen upon viewing both tree and fruit have pronounced it a seedling of the Malinda.

Of course the trees have not had time to prove themselves hardy as yet, but in case they do prove hardy they must be of value. I intend to propagate a few of them this spring having a promise of some cions for the purpose, and if they don't "turn up their toes" some cold winter day you may hear from them again.

Though this may prove a valuable variety yet I expect it may have its superiors already in the field and whether it has or not I am going to try to produce one that will prove superior from seeds of this and other apples. I truly believe this seedling movement will produce surprising results.

Bailey's Nursery book came duly and is a much better thing than I expected.
