In answer to your kind inquiry recently in regard to my "Silver Medal" from the St. Louis Fair. will say: Yes I received the "Medal" in June last summer. I also received a "Diploma" about a year ago and I think it is quite a recognition for my part.

In regard to planting apple seeds will say: I have planted a lot of different kinds this fall of seeds from apples inside of the limit and I may enter some of them, I have some which I planted in the months of Oct. and Novbr. 1905. those would probably not be eligible for that contest but I have the trees all right anyway.

Last spring I secured from Washington a few scions of different kinds of apples and had fairly good results ^{in grafting} (one of the grovenstein (if true to name) grew over 3 feet during the season. This fall I received some nice winter apples from the same

the other was called the "Roman Butte" a fine
yellow apple.
